BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 10, 2011 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 10, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. Commissioner Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board of Commissioners received one bid for the 2003 Ford Medtec E456 County Ambulance from the Petersburg EMTs for \$15,001.00, pending the fuel leak problem to be fixed. Motion by Luettel, second by Schuele to accept the bid of \$15,001.00 pending repair of the fuel leak problem, received by the Petersburg EMTs for the 2003 Ford Medtec E456 County Ambulance. Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Al Mittan, Prairieland RCD, and Jim Lightner were unable to attend the meeting due to inclement weather and will reschedule for a later date.

Barb Hanson, Boone County Zoning Administrator, was unable to attend the meeting due to inclement weather and will reschedule for a later date.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board on the status of the situation regarding the previous discussion with the Road Foremen held on December 20, 2010. Thorin advised the Board that the employee voiced his concerns regarding additional fuel expense and the possibility of his inability to make it to work at another district as a result of inclement weather due to the additional distance he would have to travel to get to work. Thorin indicated to the Board that he feels at this time it is best to leave this employee in his current district and not transfer him. Thorin feels that the issues that precipitated the transfer discussion have gotten better and that at this time, it would be best to leave the district assignments as is. Thorin also advised the Board that he is currently advertising to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Dennis Krohn. Further matters discussed were employee evaluations and comp time regulation.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, discussed several road, bridge maintenance and equipment issues:

- He advised the Board that the engine in the Freightliner semi tractor will need to be replaced or the vehicle replaced. He has checked with several dealers in the area regarding a replacement vehicle and advised that a comparable used vehicle with approximately 400,000 miles would cost in the neighborhood of \$70,000.00 to \$120,000.00. He said a refurbished engine with a 4 year warranty would cost about \$17,000.00. He advised the Board that he thought it best at this time to proceed with the refurbished motor.
- Thorin advised that with regard to the Cedar Rapids Bridge renovation project that he has received a statement regarding the conflict of interest issue. After a complete review, the Nebraska Department of Roads indicated that the county may proceed on.
- Thorin advised that with regard to the Prototype Girder Bridge to be located East of Primrose, that he was advised that there would be federal funds involved and that the County should have gone through the proper procedures and as a result, the County would not get that bridge. Thorin advised the Board that at no time

prior had he been told that there would be federal funds involved and that he contacted Nebraska Department of Roads regarding this. He indicated that since this is considered a research-type project is why federal funds are involved. He indicated that the alternative would be to buy a 40-foot bridge for approximately \$50,000.00 to \$60,000.00 but that it would not be this year inasmuch as it was not budgeted for. Correspondence was sent to Nebraska Department of Roads requesting information on what the County needed to do to be able to install the prototype bridge.

- Thorin advised the Board that Dr. Azizinamini, the County's current consultant with regard to the Cedar Rapids and Primrose bridge projects, will be leaving the University, however, he will remain as a consultant on the Cedar Rapids Bridge project.
- Thorin discussed with the Board the asphalt overlay project that was to be done this year on the Raeville road. Nebraska Department of Roads has notified the County that this would not be done this year due to an incorrect road classification which Thorin does not agree with but has resubmitted the project.

Joyce M. Sock, County Assessor, presented for the Board's review and consideration a Contractor Agreement between the County and Henry Thieman, for pickup work. Sock indicated that the rates provided in the agreement were contingent upon Thieman being able to use the county vehicle to conduct his inspections and that otherwise the contract was similar to one that was used with the previous service provider. Sock asked the Board that payment be paid one-half now and then the remaining one-half paid when the work was completed. Motion by Schuele, second by Luettel authorizing the Board Chairman to sign the Contractor Agreement as presented for the term of January 10, 2011 to March 31, 2011, with an additional 12 month period unless either party shall give the other party 60 days written notice to terminate said agreement. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the following reports of the County Officials as presented for December 2010: Clerk - \$13,072.50 (State of Nebraska - \$8,445.74/County of Boone - \$4,626.76); Clerk of the District Court - \$1,124.44 (State of Nebraska - \$729.00/County of Boone - \$395.44); Sheriff - \$1,552.59; Zoning & Planning - \$845.68; Treasurer's Fees - \$8.00; and Treasurer's Office Miscellaneous Receipt Nos. 10755-10847 - \$289,676.55. Total collected by County Treasurer was \$2,707,918.67. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General - \$73,770.24; Road - \$104,363.01; Reappraisal Fund - \$478.94; Boone Co Economic Development - \$2,440.42; 911 Emergency Management - \$4,011.42; Law Enforcement - \$48.50; Courthouse Bldg Fund - \$4,619.73; Ambulance - \$4,837.81 and Veteran's Aid - \$500.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board and Board of Equalization proceedings of December 20, 2010 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board Reorganizational Proceedings of January 6, 2011, as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Lorrie Nicklasson, Deputy County Clerk, submitted a quote received from MIPS for a Fujitsu Scanner FI-6130. Nicklasson explained to the Board that this scanner would be used in conjunction with the new real estate recording program that would be installed to eliminate part of the hand indexing of real estate records received. Motion by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the purchase of the Fujitsu Scanner for the sum of \$930.00 as quoted by MIPS. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff; Lisa Langan, Boone County Clerk Magistrate, and Ellen Hirsch, Clerk of the District Court, met with the Board to discuss and determine which budget would be used to pay for the courtroom scanner operator fees. Services incurred would cost approximately \$150.00 per month or a total of around \$1,800.00 per year. Sheriff Spiegel indicated that on some court days, a deputy would be in charge of operating the scanner but on those days when a deputy is not available, that it was necessary to hire someone to be available to handle those duties. Hirsch indicated that Judge Senff said that security was not the responsibility of the Courts. Sheriff Spiegel and Langan indicated that they could fit it within their budgets and Hirsch indicated that depending on their jury trial schedule, she may or may not be able to fit it within her budget. After further discussion, it was decided that for the remainder of this fiscal year, that the cost for an individual to operate the courtroom scanner would be paid from the Sheriff's budget. Motion by Schuele, second by Luettel that the cost for the courtroom scanner operator fees would be paid from the Sheriff's budget. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, asked for authorization to submit a grant application to the Nebraska Office of Highway Safety to receive an in-car digital camera system for the 2009 Dodge Charger. Sheriff Spiegel indicated that the cost would be \$3,995.00, with the grant being for \$2,995.00 and the remainder to be paid by the County of \$1,000.00. Sheriff Spiegel indicated to the Board that he had budgeted for the \$1,000.00 to be paid by the County. Motion by Schuele, second by Luettel to grant Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, authorization to pursue a grant for the purchase of an in-car digital camera system for the 2009 Dodge Charger. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Christopher C. Hays, met with the Board regarding his recent appointment as Boone County Surveyor. The Board and Hays reviewed the information previously provided by Hays regarding his fee proposal. Hays indicated that he would not require any county employee assistance other than for digging and in those cases, he would probably be in touch with the Highway Superintendent. Hays indicated to the Board that in addition to his private business, he was also appointed as County Surveyor for Polk, Clay and Thayer counties and that the exact same fee proposal was presented to those counties as well. The Board indicated that pursuant to state statute, they would need to enter into a contract with Hays to act as Boone County Surveyor. Motion by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to authorize the Board Chairman to enter into a contract with Christopher C. Hays to act as Boone County Surveyor. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the situation regarding the combination of the Communications Manager and Emergency Management Director, Emergency Services Coordinator and Homeland Security positions. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to authorize the Board Chairman to set up interviews for January 18, 2011, with the current Communications Manager and Emergency Management Director, Emergency Services Coordinator and Homeland Security, for the combined position. Roll call vote: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Open discussion: Jim Dickerson asked several questions of the Board regarding the current Emergency Manager and Communications Manager positions. Discussion was held regarding the latest audit for the Boone County Health Center. It was suggested that Vic Lee, CEO of Boone County Health Center, be contacted about meeting with the Board to go over the audit. Discussion was held regarding whether Health and Human Services would still be requiring space in the county owned building.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 11:50 A.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for January 18, 2011.

MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners called for a motion to open a public hearing on Tuesday, January 18, 2011 at 9:02 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Schuele, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Steve Boyer, representative for the applicant Third Planet Windpower dba TPW Petersburg LLC and Barb Hanson, County Zoning Administrator, were present to answer any questions. Also, present was Lavern Werner, an interested landowner of a ten acre tract with building site south of the proposed substation construction site. Chairman Tisthammer read the notice for the record.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions concerning the approval or denial of a Lot Split Application by Third Planet Windpower dba TPW Petersburg, LLC. Waldean and Karen Scholl are the property owners of the real estate referenced herein. The application request is to split off a tract of land comprised of $4.54\pm$ acres from farm ground for construction of a substation located in a fraction of the SW1/4NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska.

Lavern Werner, expressed his concerns with regard to the already bright lighting of the new NPPD and Laredo Ridge substations and the Laredo Ridge O & M building. Werner expressed his concerns regarding more bright lights with a third proposed substation being considered just east of the Laredo Ridge and NPPD locations. The Board discussed the present Interlocal Agreements with Albion, Cedar Rapids and Petersburg. The Board felt it would be possible to enter into a similar Interlocal Agreement with St. Edward if they so choose. The Council plans to set up a meeting with Barb Hanson, Zoning Administrator, to discuss the differences of the County Zoning and City of St. Edward Zoning regulations.

Tim Hofbauer, Platte County/City of Columbus Emergency Manager, explained the duties required by State Law regarding an Emergency Manager position. Sheryl Machacek, Boone County Emergency Manager/Communications Director, Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, and the Board discussed the combined full time position with Hofbauer. The Emergency Manager coordinates the yearly update of the Local Emergency Operation Plan (LEOP) and the rewriting of the policy procedure every five years. The LEOP explains everyone's roll in the event of a disaster. Funding for programs and a portion of the county budget expenses is provided from federal funding that is passed to the state and then to the local level. The appointed Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) assists with the writing of the plans. An Emergency Manager is a coordinator for training and policy procedures and a liaison between county and state when needed for disasters, not a first responder. Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) is a 50% match for full time employee salary, expenses and equipment. Hofbauer suggested speaking with NEMA to further clarify the requirements of the position to qualify for the EMPG.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. The 102nd Legislature has convened and introduced several bills with county impact. Several bills involve veterans, elections, revenue, budgets and state aid. The group briefly discussed some of the Legislative Bills. Commissioner Schuele has been in contact with Senator Sullivan regarding Legislative Bill 234, space maintained by counties for the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. Shannon Landauer, Economic Development, gave an update regarding projects and upcoming events. Sheriff Spiegel provided information regarding the NIRMA Assist program and an AED for the courthouse. The Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) is implementing a new wellness program. The Blue Cross Blue Shield county employee policyholder may participate in the new wellness program if they so choose. Commissioner Tisthammer acknowledged Barb Hanson as NACO Planning and Zoning Directors Vice-President and Jacqueline Wells as NACO Veteran Service Officers President and also an officer on several NE State Veterans Service Boards.



Matt Thieman, MIPS Programmer, demonstrated a new program designed for road department records. The Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed the program capabilities with Thieman. After the initial setup with the county road inventory, the program provides more efficiency for the annual reports that the Highway Superintendent must submit to the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR). The program information also provides a supply inventory, preventive maintenance, cost to operate each piece of equipment and signage maintenance. Therefore, the program provides more consistent information on forms submitted to NDOR vs. using the hand typed form where figures may be transposed.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of February 14, 2011 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board heard a general assistance request. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve paying one month of the utility bill less the taxes and late payment fees. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, discussed maintenance regarding roads, bridges, shop buildings and equipment with the Board. Thorin updated the Board regarding a new road employee planning to start on March 1, 2011.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, asked the Board to consider training another employee as a Responsible Charge (RC) person. Thorin is appointed as the RC for three federal aid projects in 2011. If more than one of the construction projects is at the same time, he may need an assistant to cover one of the projects, due to the projects being at the opposite ends of the county. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to authorize road employee Billy Frey to complete the training necessary for Responsible Charge (RC) person. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A designated Responsible Charge (RC) person is responsible for the project from planning through construction, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal aid project funding. Abby Johnson, Zoning Office Assistant, updated the Board regarding Conditional Use Permits and the protocol the office is using to contact the entities involved.

The Board discussed the chair quotes for the boardroom. The preference was fabric over leather. Tisthammer will inquire about available fabric colors.

Thorin acknowledged that the One Year Project Nos. 341 and 360 are for road reconstruction by Blattner Energy for the Third Planet Wind Farm project. The one-year road improvement plan consists of eleven projects and the six-year plan consists of sixteen projects. Thorin informed the Board that several projects were not on the plans due to reclassification as maintenance projects. Thorin discussed each of the projects with the Board and the public. Jim Dresch, Jerry Braun and Ron Braun were present to discuss water drainage problems on 110th Avenue. Concerned citizens asked if it was possible to split the project into two or three projects in order to begin work on the water drainage problem. GeoComm will provide Boone County with the following maintenance services: Digital Map Updates (wireline); Digital Map Updates (wireless); Master Street Address Guide (MSAG) and 9-1-1 Database Updates; and Address Updates. The GIS Data Maintenance Service is a five-year agreement with annual payments from May 1, 2011 through April 30, 2016. DEQ has regulations to follow if there is a need for decommissioning livestock facilities and the regulations depend on the age of the facility. Hanson visited with the City of St. Edward with regard to the possibility of a zoning agreement between the County of Boone and City of St. Edward for zoning services.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board with regard to the meeting he attended on March 8, 2011 with Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) regarding the bridge project east of Primrose. The County has already invested \$36,400.00 in hydraulic studies for construction of a prototype bridge for the project east of Primrose and the hydraulic study indicated a need for a 50' bridge. Thorin may be able to apply for some federal funding for the project through the "Federal Highway Research Funding" program. Thorin discussed several equipment and maintenance issues. Thorin will meet today with FEMA/NEMA regarding the June 2010 flood damages. Thorin received a list of sixteen bridges that NDOR wants to close. The road crews are making the suggested upgrades/repairs. Thorin said the road crew would begin ten-hour days on April 4, 2011.

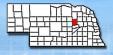

Federal transportation funds are made available to Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) through the Federal Highway Administration. NDOR will purchase certain federal funds, which have traditionally been made available to the Local Public Agencies (LPAs). NDOR will enter into an agreement with the LPA to purchase its federal funds. The state will purchase each dollar of federal funds with eighty cents of state cash. The LPA uses the state funds for local transportation projects, with minimal oversight. The Federal Funds Purchase Program has its benefits and unanswered questions involving the effect on the road-operating budget. The first signed agreement is for four years and then on a yearly basis thereafter, with the first available funds being March 1, 2014. The Board and Thorin discussed the NDOR Project Number STPE-2532(1) Petersburg Northeast asphalt overlay that may be delayed until 2012 due to a required environmental study.

Fred Bader, Bader's Highway & Street of Norfolk, Nebraska, was present to discuss an estimate quote for crack sealing. The estimate for sealing only new cracks on 255th Avenue north five miles is \$7,659.00 and Old Mill Road west is \$3,100.00. The estimate for sealing cracks, spider cracks and repair potholes at Bader's discretion for four asphalt areas in the county is \$12,631.00. The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. The County Board reported that the county surplus garage sale held on May 14, 2011 went well with very few items left for disposal. The Board asked that excess county inventory be kept minimal and visit with another office when in need of office furnishings before asking the Board for a new purchase. MIPS is installing the new main county computer (AS400) today. Shannon Landauer, Economic Development, reported that eighteen youth signed up for the June Entrepreneur Camp and the new part time employee in the Economic office is Megan Zoucha. Michelle Prothman will be the summer help in the Boone County Extension office. The group received information and discussed the NACO BCBS dental coverage changes. The updated NIRMA Personnel Manual has arrived, therefore the County Employee Manual needs updating. The present postage machine lease expires in June 2011.

Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator, Barb Hanson, County Zoning/Albion City Code Official, and the Board discussed zoning administration and the agreement with the City of Albion. The Board discussed staffing the zoning office by increasing the part time hours to 32 per week effective July 1, 2011 for budgeting purposes. At this point of time, the Zoning Administrator feels the City of Albion is not receiving a fair share of the office time. The Albion City property maintenance program appears complex and time consuming. Devine will look into ideas regarding the city property maintenance program.

Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center CEO, informed the Board that terms would expire at the end of June for two Boone County Health Center Board of Trustee members. A replacement is needed for Janice Rasmussen who will complete her second term. Richard Stephens completes his first term and is eligible for reappointment. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, July 18, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. Highway Superintendent indicated that the county is one step closer with regard to the Cedar Bridge. Steve Pritchard, Extension Agent, indicated that both the Boone and Nance County Fairs are completed with a few matters remaining to be finished up. Shannon Landauer, Boone Co Economic Development Director, reported that the new St. Edward website was to go live today and that Petersburg's new website will be up and running within a couple of weeks. She also reported that Community Attitude Surveys are being circulated in St. Edward with regard to a wastewater project and new community building. Community Attitude Surveys were also going to be circulated in Petersburg and Cedar Rapids in the near future. Landauer reported that there were six new businesses within the county and the Economic Development office was assisting with loan applications for two new businesses. Jackie Wells, Veterans Service Officer, indicated that the traveling Vietnam War Memorial was a big attraction at the Boone County Fair. She indicated that over 2,000 persons signed in to view the wall. Ken Luettel indicated that at the last Juvenile Detention meeting that he attended that it was discussed that Boone County would be receiving a refund of funds provided to the district by way of crediting future billing. No interest would be received. Tom Schuele spoke briefly about future redistricting regarding the County Commissioners districts. He noted this on a personal level since the redistricting would not affect any other offices directly. Officials and department heads were reminded about filing their office inventories by August 1st and submitting their budget worksheets before August 10th. The Board has received a proposal for a Section 125 (Cafeteria) Plan and indicated that the information was available for review, if any employees were interested. Depending on employee response, the Board will review and decide on the matter at a later date with any implementation to be effective January 1, 2012. Board indicated that they would be discussing at the July 25th Board Meeting budget issues concerning cost of living allowances and other matters related to budget preparation.

Shannon Landauer, Boone County Economic Development Director, reported to the Board that approximately \$180,000.00 of housing grant funds were going to be turned back in/deobligated and reapplied for next spring as part of a new grant totaling \$300,000.00. It was hoped that the remaining funds could be used for Lot Acquisition Demolition; however, there was not enough time to purchase and clear lots before the funds are required to be used. Landauer was confident that the funds would be recouped as part of a larger grant next spring.

The fiscal year end audit of June 30, 2010 was received from Gary J. Pavel, CPA. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to accept and approve the fiscal year end county audit for June 30, 2010 as submitted. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ellen L. Hirsch, Clerk of the District Court, met with the Board regarding a Subgrant Agreement with the NE Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Children and Family Services. The agreement provides for reimbursement to the county for salaries, insurance, postage and supplies based on quarterly reports submitted by the Clerk of the District Court regarding child support enforcement. Last year approximately \$24,912 was reimbursed to the county. Hirsch indicated that in the past the agreement was signed every 5 years but will now be an annual agreement. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel, to approve the Subgrant Agreement between the NE Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Children and Family Services, and Clerk of the District Court and authorize the Board Chairman to sign said agreement. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved two requests for advertisement funding. The Primrose Rural Fire Department submitted a request for assistance with advertising for an event scheduled for September 4, 2011. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried. The St. Edward Fire Department submitted a request for assistance with advertising for an event scheduled for August 20, 2011. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried. The St. Edward Fire Department submitted a request for assistance with advertising for an event scheduled for August 20, 2011. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Pursuant to Nebraska State Statute 23-1704.04, the County Board shall furnish the Sheriff with such deputies as it shall deem necessary and fix the compensation of such deputies who shall be paid by warrant drawn on the general fund. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2011-35 to close the Law Enforcement-Operating Fund (2960) as of July 1, 2011 and authorizing the County Treasurer to transfer all money remaining in the Law Enforcement-Operating Fund (2960) on July 1, 2011, to the General Fund (0100). Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, Boone County Sheriff, and the Board discussed the position of Emergency Manager. It was reported that Antelope County, who had indicated it would be open to a possible consolidation of counties, had decided to remain in their present arrangement. Tom Schuele reported that he had received a call from Dennis Jarecki, Nance County Supervisor, about the possibility of meeting to discuss the consolidation of the position with Nance and Merrick Counties. Sheriff Spiegel indicated to the Board that at the present time the Nance County Sheriff and Merrick County Sheriff both act as Emergency Managers in their respective counties and that both Sheriffs would like to see the position combined. Sheriff Spiegel also indicated that a consolidated position with Nance and Merrick Counties would be a good fit since Boone, Nance and Merrick Counties are within the same governance region and would have the same regional director who handles most of the paperwork. While discussion took place, Dave Moore, Nance County Sheriff, called on behalf of Dennis Jarecki and talked to the Board about setting up a meeting to discuss the situation. It was decided that a meeting would take place on July 20, 2011 at 7 P.M. at the Nance County Courthouse and that Tom Schuele and Sheriff Spiegel would attend.

Mark Niewohner on behalf of Niewohner Farms Partnership, and Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board to discuss road access options regarding the Orford/Pioneer Cemetery. The Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) contacted Niewohner and Thorin regarding a request for access to the Orford/Pioneer Cemetery. Currently the cemetery is reached by parking cars along the highway and accessing from State Highway 14. Thorin was advised by the NDOR that following the completion of the overlay project on State Highway 14 in 2012 that parking will no longer be allowed along the highway and that a turnout will not be provided due to liability and monetary reasons and that access will need to be gained from the county road. It was discussed that access could be provided from Y Road approximately 3/4 miles off the state highway. Niewohner indicated that they would be agreeable to a turnout at that point and would be willing to provide an entrance gate. No action was taken by the Board at this time until further review.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the motor grader bid process. Thorin reported to the Board that originally Nebraska Machinery said they would not be submitting a bid, however, since that time Nebraska Machinery has indicated that they would like to bring a motor grader to demo. In addition, Thorin reported that John Deere had received the state bid for motor graders so the county could purchase through the state without having to obtain a bid from John Deere. John Deere also indicated that they would like to bring a demo out for their electric over hydraulic and standard machines. Standard control machines are approximately \$25,000 less than electric over hydraulic machines. The new motor grader will go to District 1 (Cedar Rapids) and that is where the demos will be held and the rebuilt machine will go to Petersburg with that old machine to be gotten rid of. Thorin indicated that the maintenance on John Deere machines is much easier, however, the John Deere machines do not have as high a resale value as Caterpillar, but the gap is narrowing. Further discussion was held regarding prices for off-brands, however, with off-brands issues can arise regarding parts, service and durability. It was suggested that a road employee from each district attend the demos.



Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, reported to the Board that because of citizen complaints, a notice was sent to a farmer regarding planting his beans too close to the road. Also, that during the course of watering the beans, the pivot end gun had caused some water damage to the road. Thorin indicated that the road crew could remove the beans, however after discussion, it was decided that Commissioner Luettel would speak to the farmer and ask that he shred the beans from the road to the bottom of the ditch and ask that the pivot end gun be fixed so as not to water the road.

On July 11, 2011, the Board held a public hearing regarding a petition received requesting narrowing the right-of-way of that part of a county road located in the SW1/4 of Section 5, Township 20 North, Range 8 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, running in a North-Northwesterly direction, commonly known as 230th Street, from 66 feet to 40 feet subject to stipulations. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2011-32, reducing the above described road right-of-way from 66 feet to 40 feet pursuant to the stipulations contained in said resolution. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, after review of the road records of Boone County, has informed the Board that no documentation can be found to verify that a certain county road, running North and South between Sections 20 and 21, all in Township 21 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, commonly known as 180th Avenue, was ever officially opened. Further, a previous agreement provides for the construction and maintenance of said road and that the Board feels it would be best to hold a public hearing regarding the matter. Thorin indicated to the Board that since the road was to be established pursuant to a Boone County Zoning directive, that a feasibility study would not be required. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2011-33, to schedule a public hearing for August 8, 2011 at 9:30 A.M. to consider opening said road and allowing for public comments, either for or against officially opening such county road. Additional discussion was held regarding language contained in prior documents referencing the road to be maintained as a minimum maintenance road. The Board indicated that this would be further discussed at the public hearing. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented Resolution No. 2011-34, Signing of the Federal Funds Purchase Program Agreement, for the Board's consideration. The resolution and attached Federal-Aid Transportation Fund Purchase-Sale Agreement, provides for payment of federal funds to the county through the State of Nebraska. Thorin advised the Board that the county would receive 80¢ on the dollar with the remaining 20¢ paid to the state to assume all liabilities for meeting federal aid requirements. When determining each county's proportional share, the number of rural residents (25%), number of rural motor vehicles registered in the county (25%) and number of centerline miles of classified rural road in the county (50%) is considered. The first payment will be made in March 2014 and based on money allocated in 2013, so the payment will always be paid a year behind. Thorin said the first payment is projected at \$102,000 for both roads and bridges; however, the amount is subject to highway allocation by the federal and state governments. Motion made by Jerry Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2011-34, authorizing the Board Chairman to sign the Federal-Aid Transportation Fund Purchase-Sale Agreement between Boone County and Nebraska Department of Roads. Roll call vote: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board, Public Hearings and Board of Equalization Proceedings of July 11, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

As a result of the 2010 census and population changes within the county, a review is required regarding possible redistricting of commissioners districts. The Board was presented with a spreadsheet and maps regarding the current population for each district pursuant to the 2010 census results. State statute provides that each district be within $\pm 5\%$ of the average number of voters within each district. At the present time, District 1 is 3% below the average, District 2 is 15% above the average and District 3 is 12% below the average. Options were provided to the Board as to how the discrepancy between districts could be corrected. Upon review of the information provided, the Board decided that a public hearing would be required to discuss the redistricting options and to allow public comment, either for or against such redistricting. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to authorize the Boone County Clerk to proceed with scheduling a public hearing to further discuss redistricting of commissioners districts within the county. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Luettel excused himself at 11:00 A.M.

Barb Hanson, County Zoning Admininstrator/City Code Official, discussed her report with the Board regarding permits issued, requested variances and Conditional Use Permits. Hanson indicated to the Board that her office is currently researching airport zoning regulations and advised the Board that new airport zoning regulations will need to be adopted. Hanson indicated that she has been in contact with Ron Levander and that the Albion City Council will be reviewing the matter in the future. Hanson updated the Board regarding the progress of her new employee and indicated that she is pleased with her work. Hanson noted regarded the trees that had not be planted and water tests that had not been provided to her office pursuant to stipulations contained in a previous agreement. She noted no odor on the south side of the facilities and only a faint odor on the North side of the facilities where the fans were located. The Board advised Hanson to contact Niewohner regarding the deficiencies that need to be corrected. Hanson indicated to the Board that there were several zoning violations for structures without permits and that letters would be sent regarding those violations.

Commissioners Tisthammer and Schuele conducted a quarterly visit of the county jail. It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county once during each of its sessions in January, April, July and October of each year per Nebraska State Statute 47-109.

Open discussion and Miscellaneous Public Comments: Tom Schuele will be attending with Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, a meeting with Nance and Merrick Counties regarding possible consolidation of the Emergency Manager position. Lorrie Nicklasson, Deputy County Clerk, informed the Board that the County Clerk's Office was looking into the possibility of adding more all-mail precincts.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 12:03 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for July 25, 2011.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, July 25, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding motor grader demonstrations and road projects. Thorin received a notice to proceed with the Cedar Rapids Bridge project. Thorin updated the Board regarding his RC position with a Nance County Bridge project.

The Board and department heads discussed issues regarding the 2011-2012 budget preparation. The NACO Blue Cross Blue Shield Health Insurance premium increased 7% for July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. A full time employee benefit is the full health insurance premium paid by the county. The monthly or hourly base wages within the Employee Handbook are for starting new employees and used when figuring the cost of living, if given, in January each year. The County established a Longevity Program for full-time employees several years ago. The elected and appointed officials and department heads are not eligible for the Longevity Program. The Board proposed setting the cost of living increases taking into account the employee's receiving/not receiving the Longevity Program. Over the last twelve months, the consumer price movements have fluctuated from a -.8 to 37.3 percent, which includes food, energy, commodities, etc. The average before seasonal adjustment is 3.6 percent. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve cost of living percent increase computed on the base wage as follows: 3% for all full time employees that participate in the Longevity Program; 3% for elected part time officials (Attorney and Commissioners); 3% computed on the hourly wage for Ambulance and Weed, with no change for the bookkeeping services; 5% for the appointed full and part time positions of Economic, Highway Superintendent, Veteran, and Zoning; 5% for full time elected officials; and 50 cents per hour increase for permanent part time employees effective January 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the possibility of consolidating Emergency Management Services with Merrick County and Nance County. Nance County Sheriff asked that each county run an ad for a full time position regarding Emergency Management with an application deadline of Monday, August 15, 2011. BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS AUGUST 8, 2011 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, August 8, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

As a result of the 2010 census and population changes within the county, a review is required regarding possible redistricting of commissioners districts. The Board was presented with a spreadsheet and maps regarding the current population for each district pursuant to the 2010 census results at the July 18, 2011 Board meeting. Section 32-553 of the Nebraska statutes require redistricting after each federal census. After research and discussion with Clerks/Election Commissioners within the State by the Boone County Clerk's office, they did not see any requirements that a special public hearing is necessary. Supreme Court rulings have allowed a plus or minus 5% variance in equal numbers of citizens represented by each governing board member. Presently District 1 is 3% below the average, District 2 is 15% above the average and District 3 is 12% below the average. Upon the review of the options, the redistricting preference is to move Boone Precinct to Commissioner District 1 and Dublin/Bonanza Precinct to Commissioner District 3 at this time. As the rural population declines adjustments need to be made within the County Commissioner voting districts. The Commissioner District precinct lines need to be contiguous. The redistricting will not require changing the current precinct boundaries. After redistricting, Beaver, Boone and Cedar Precincts will comprise Commissioner District 1; Commissioner District 2 will consist of Southeast Manchester and Southwest Manchester Precincts; and Commissioner District 3 will be Dublin-Bonanza, North Manchester, North Branch-Shell Creek and Oakland Precincts. District 1 would be 6% below the average, District 2 would be 2% above the average and District 3 would be 4% above the average. This option allows more flexibility for the future of the 2020 census without changing voter precinct boundaries. The decision of the Board is scheduled as an agenda item for the August 29, 2011 regular Board meeting.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed road maintenance with the Board. Thorin updated the Board regarding the progress of the road and bridge construction projects. Thorin received an approval letter regarding the Federal Funds Purchase Program Agreement. Thorin is scheduled to attend a meeting regarding the Cedar Rapids bridge project on August 19, 2011.

The installation of the curve signing materials is complete in accordance with the applicable sections of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The County is responsible for the future maintenance of the signage. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve and authorize the Board Chairman and County Highway Superintendent to sign the Certification of Compliance for Project No. HRRR-STWD-(84)-Horizontal Curve Signage as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

SourceGas Distribution, LLC submitted an Owner/Tenant Consent form for approval. The consent form is for the proposed construction and installation of an anode bed (approximately 150' in length) buried a minimum of 42" on the E/W County Road located in the SW1/4 of Section 5, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

No one appeared before the Board regarding the general assistance request, therefore no action taken at this time.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to accept and approve the Boone County Sheriff's 2011 second quarter report. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the County Board and Public Hearings Proceedings of August 8, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. Rod Nelson, Maintenance and Safety Committee, provided a handout regarding NIRMA online courses that employees may take. The Board, Nelson, and safety committee members met with Chad Engle, NIRMA Safety Specialist, on August 8, 2011. Highway Superintendent indicated that lightning struck the fiberglass radio antenna and as a result, the county road crew has been without radio contact for three weeks. A new metal antenna has been ordered. Lisa Langan, County Court State Employee, questioned the legality regarding the Cost of Living percentages suggested for January 2012 within the July 25, 2011 Board Proceedings. The Board asked the County Clerk to forward the information to NACO legal counsel for review. Veteran's Day is August 29, 2011 at the Nebraska State Fair. The second half of Real Estate and Personal Property Tax is delinquent September 1, 2011. Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, is receiving quotes to replace 911 Communication Recording System that quit. The Sheriff's office is working on converting the wideband operation to "narrowband" as the facilities must comply with the Federal Communications Commissions narrowbanding rules by January 1, 2013. The St. Edward Fire Department is installing the E911 resident address signage in their area and Albion Fire Department is soon to start. Boone County Economic Development plans to apply for funds to help demolish ten houses in the county. Steve Pritchard, UNL Extension Educator, indicated that preparation is taking place for the Nebraska State Fair in Grand Island. Assessor's office is working on valuations and certification letters. Northeast Association of County Officials meeting is scheduled for September 16, 2011. NACO convention is December 14-16, 2011 in Kearney. The Board is meeting with Richard Martinsen, CPA today to begin the budget preparation. The Board is not pleased with the discontent of some employees regarding the cost of living allowance.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the progress of road and bridge construction projects. Thorin and the Board received complaints regarding the maintenance and condition of rural roads. Thorin feels no county road operator intentionally creates a dangerous road.



A public hearing was held on August 8, 2011 regarding the opening of approximately 0.8 miles of a county road known as 180th Avenue. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2011-38 to open approximately 0.8 miles of road between Sections 20 and 21, Township 21 North, Range 7 West known as 180th Avenue with 66 feet right-of-way as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Resolution 2011-37 approved on August 8, 2011 has an incorrect legal description. The legal description should read: A County Road, running East and West between the SE1/4 of Section 19 and the NE1/4 of Section 30 all in Township 19 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska, commonly known as 320th Street. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2011-39 correcting the legal description of and supersedes Resolution No. 2011-37 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Richard Martinsen, CPA and the Board discussed preliminary preparation of the 2011-2012 County Budget. The County Attorney budget was not completed or returned in order for Martinsen to complete a General Fund total for a preliminary figure. The Board and Martinsen used figures from the previous year and salary figures as approved pursuant to the July 25, 2011 Board Proceedings, in order to continue budget preparation. The Board and Martinsen plan another budget work session on August 22, 2011.

Open discussion and Miscellaneous Public Comments: Sue Warner, BCBS representative, was in the area and stopped by to answer any questions the Board may have regarding BCBS insurance coverage.

Vice Chairman Schuele declared the meeting adjourned at 3:35 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for August 22, 2011.





MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, August 15, 2011 at 11:30 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Courtroom in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Schuele, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Also present was Barb Hanson, Zoning Administrator and Natalie Pugh, Zoning office personnel. In attendance for applicant were Jerry Niewohner and Dana Cox. In addition, approximately fourteen interested citizens attended the hearing.

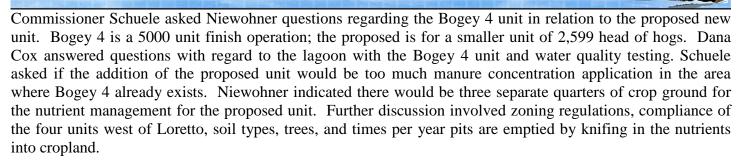
The public hearing is to approve or deny the application for a Conditional Use Permit by Niewohner Farms Partnership to construct a Class I Livestock Feeding Operation, Hog Confinement Unit (301-1000 Animal Units) to be located on a Fraction of the NE1/4 of Section 5, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska. Niewohner Bros., Inc. owns the property hereinto referenced. After receiving testimony from the proponents and opponents the Board has the option to approve, deny or postpone the decision.

Chairman Tisthammer opened the floor for the applicants. Jerry Niewohner, Applicant, indicated that the request is to build a new planned confined swine finisher operation. Niewohner said the new modern facility for raising hogs is a better environment for the hogs than raising them in open pens. The plans are for an eight-foot concrete lined manure pit under the building. An eight-foot pit can hold approximately ten months of waste. Niewohner indicated three quarters of cropland is available nearby to receive direct injection of manure from pit. Niewohner and Dana Cox addressed concerns regarding set back requirements; distance between the new proposed facility, Bogey 4 unit and occupied residential homes; nutrient management plan; and truck traffic.

Following the applicant, Commissioner Tisthammer opened the floor for proponents and opponents. Ted Thieman read his testimony of opposition and provided a copy to the Board and Hanson. Thieman referenced Boone County Zoning manual pages, conditions not followed on previous units, DEQ report, and protection of ground water and land for the future generations. Marion Kunzman said the already increased truck traffic over the years is an infringement on her rights and she can no longer walk safely on the road around the section as in the past. Joan Luettel indicated it was unsafe to walk on the roads due to increased heavy truck traffic and the creation of dangerous road conditions. Luettel further noted that livestock confinement odor and dangerous road conditions are keeping the younger generation from moving back to the area. Luettel read a statement from her husband indicating to the Board to follow rules as written, bending rules for one sets a precedence. Chairman Tisthammer asked twice for any further testimony, hearing none he asked for a motion to close said hearing.

Motion made by Luettel and second by Schuele to close said hearing at 12:08 P.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Barb Hanson, Zoning Administrator, provided the Board and Applicant with the Boone County Planning Commission hearing proceedings of June 27, 2011, the compliance status of the conditions as of July 14, 2011 for the four previous Conditional Use Permits, along with other material. The Planning Commission recommended approval subject to Niewohner meeting the previous conditions set by the Boone County Board of Commissioners as referenced in the Board Proceedings of November 13, 2007 for four livestock hog confinements west of Loretto.



Commissioner Tisthammer questioned Niewohner about non-compliance issues with regard to the four units west of Loretto. Niewohner indicated that DEQ has the reports; he will furnish a copy to the county. The reports to be furnished to the county are the manure application dates/locations and annual water quality test results. Tisthammer commented that it is best to keep the lines of communication open when equipment or facility breakdowns occur. An obvious spill needs to be reported right away such as the one west of Loretto and an open line of communication of what happened, so several assumptions are not floating around the community.

Joan Luettel, Ramona Thieman, Jack Kunzman, and Joan Majerus expressed their concerns with increased truck traffic deteriorating the roads, additional livestock odor and protection of ground water.

The newer technology of knifing has improved manure application and lingering odor, but there is no way to avoid some livestock odor.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to table decision to the August 22, 2011 Board meeting after receiving and reviewing the requested information. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS AUGUST 22, 2011 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, August 22, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Commissioner Schuele attended a meeting in Fullerton on August 18, 2011 regarding the possibility of consolidating Emergency Management Services with Merrick County and Nance County. The county representatives discussed consolidating services and agreed on some details regarding a future agreement. No Interlocal Agreement has been drafted to date. The consensus of the group is that the Emergency Manager position is not a full time position for one county, but a workable shared position. Details discussed included: one county will administer the shared position; a percentage used for a cost share budget; Boone and Merrick have larger populations and higher valuations than Nance; and possible consolidated services to begin January 1, 2012. Nance and Merrick have already advertised the position. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to advertise a possible consolidated Emergency Management Services position in the four Boone County newspapers with an application deadline of September 16, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

No report was received from Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent; he was working at a construction site.

Richard Martinsen, CPA and the Board reviewed the 2011-2012 preliminary county budget figures. The preliminary budget figure expense as submitted increased 9.7% over last fiscal year. The Board lowered the preliminary percentage to 8.1% by decreasing some expense request figures and transferring \$450,000.00 from Inheritance Tax. The Inheritance Tax transfer is \$100,000.00 for Courthouse Bond and \$350,000.00 for Road. The State Auditor's Office recommends a budget cash reserve of 20%. The Board will review the information received from NACO legal counsel regarding the cost of living for January 2012 referenced in the July 25, 2011 Board Proceedings and in Resolution No. 2010-1 for elected officials. The 2011-2012 County Budget Hearing is scheduled for Monday, September 12, 2011 at 11:00 A.M.

The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved one request for advertisement funding. The Primrose American Legion Auxiliary submitted a request for assistance with advertising a Patriotic Freedom Walk event scheduled for September 11, 2011. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, and Sheryl Machacek, Communications Director, discussed replacement of the 911 Communication Recording system. The old recorder has been out of service for some time and is not repairable. Machacek presented bids from DSS Corporation and Midland Telecom/Wahltek for digital logging recorders. Wahltek bid for \$14,390.00 plus installation and maintenance contract and DSS Corporation bid for \$17,167.00 plus installation and maintenance contract and DSS Corporation bid for \$15,525.00 that includes upgrades, plus installation. The DSS Corporation equipment includes the latest technology. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the County Sheriff to purchase a DSS Equature NG9-1-1 Communication Recording System with the five-year payment plan from DSS Corporation. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed a general assistance request with regard to rent. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve a portion of the general assistance request, with the county paying two months of rent directly to the landlord. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



A public hearing was held on August 15, 2011 to approve or deny the application for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) by Niewohner Farms Partnership to construct a Class I Livestock Feeding Operation, Hog Confinement Unit, to be located on a Fraction of the NE1/4 of Section 5, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska. The Planning Commission recommended approval subject to Niewohner meeting the previous conditions set by the Boone County Board of Commissioners as referenced in the Board Proceedings of November 13, 2007 for four livestock hog confinements west of Loretto. The decision was tabled from August 15, 2011 to the August 22, 2011 Board meeting after receiving and reviewing the requested information from the hearing. Dana Cox presented the requested water test results and information on manure applications for Niewohner Farms. The Board reviewed compliance reports. The water tests and manure application reports were not supplied before the hearing and tree-planting stipulations have not been met. A report submitted for nutrient management showed manure applied to wrong areas. The Board discussed a DEQ investigation dated October 21, 2010 and the report states poor management regarding an overflow of one of the storage facilities. Schuele drove through the area of the present four units and proposed new unit after the hearing. Schuele liked the looks of the units, no offensive odor and crops look great. Schuele is not in favor of approving this CUP until he can see improvement in management operation of the four units, following regulations and conditions, and review another year of reports. Tisthammer liked the proposed size of the unit but is dissatisfied with the violation not being reported in a timely manner and indicated that better communication is needed. Luettel wants another year of reports before consideration of another unit and proof they can manage the present four units within the regulations and conditions. Barb Hanson, Zoning Administrator, informed the Board that the four units west of Loretto do not have Zoning Permits. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, August 29, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Frank Lautenberg, United States Senator for New Jersey, has sponsored and received unanimous support for his resolution, S. R. 237, "A National Moment of Remembrance at 1:00 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time on September 11, 2011" to stop and remember those we lost in the September 11th attacks. The Senator calls for counties, cities and towns across America to sound sirens and ring bells at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time. This year we mark the 10th anniversary of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, a day that changed America forever. The Moment of Remembrance will take place for one full minute at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time on September 11, 2011. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to adopt said Resolution 2011-40, County of Boone, Nebraska joining in the National Moment of Remembrance of the 10th Anniversary of September 11th. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Albion Area Arts Council submitted a request for assistance with advertising the annual Enchanted Trail event scheduled for October 1, 2011. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road and bridge projects. Thorin updated the Board regarding the status of the asphalt overlay for the Raeville road and the engineering negotiations for the Cedar Rapids Historical Bridge project. Thorin has had several requests for widening of rural driveways due to larger trucks and equipment. Presently there is no policy in place for upgrading existing driveways. Thorin will draft a policy for the next Board meeting to address the requests. Thorin shared information of a study by the Kansas Department of Roads regarding heavy equipment damage to asphalt roads. Thorin asked the Board to consider adding an additional eight hours for office clerical help. Presently the road part time clerical is twenty-four hours per week; no decision was made at this time.

Ron Levander and the Board discussed revisions to Resolution No. 2005-37 regarding the county burial policy. The present burial policy does not address cremation disposition. Levander and the Board discussed adding "County Commissioners may request services of County Sherriff's Department to review and confirm personal asset items." The 2005 Resolution addresses accounts and funds, but not personal assets when applying for assistance for a county burial. The suggested revisions address a more complete review of personal assets, mileage rate, and language for cremation. A new resolution will be drafted with the suggested revisions for the next Board meeting.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board and Board of Equalization Proceedings of August 22, 2011 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



As a result of the 2010 census and population changes within the county, a review is required regarding possible redistricting of Commissioners districts. The Board was presented with a spreadsheet and maps regarding the current population for each district pursuant to the 2010 census results at the July 18, 2011 Board meeting. Section 32-553 of the Nebraska statutes require redistricting after each federal census. After research and discussion with Clerks/Election Commissioners within the State by the Boone County Clerk's office, they did not see any requirements that a special public hearing is necessary. Supreme Court rulings have allowed a plus or minus 5% variance in equal numbers of citizens represented by each governing board member. Presently District 1 is 3% below the average, District 2 is 15% above the average and District 3 is 12% below the average. Upon the review of the options, the redistricting preference is to move Boone Precinct to Commissioner District 1 and Dublin/Bonanza Precinct to Commissioner District 3 at this time. As the rural population declines adjustments need to be made within the County Commissioner voting districts. The Commissioner District precinct lines need to be contiguous. The redistricting will not require changing the current precinct boundaries. After redistricting, Beaver, Boone and Cedar Precincts will comprise Commissioner District 1; Commissioner District 2 will consist of Southeast Manchester and Southwest Manchester Precincts; and Commissioner District 3 will be Dublin-Bonanza, North Manchester, North Branch-Shell Creek and Oakland Precincts. District 1 would be 6% below the average, District 2 would be 2% above the average and District 3 would be 4% above the average. This option allows more flexibility for the future of the 2020 census without changing voter precinct boundaries. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2011-41, hereby establishing Commissioner District 1 consisting of Boone, Beaver and Cedar Precincts; District 2 shall consist of Southeast Manchester and Southwest Manchester Precincts; and District 3 shall consist of Dublin-Bonanza, North Branch-Shell Creek, North Manchester and Oakland Precincts as adopted this 29th day of August, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The July 25, 2011 Board Proceedings regarding a cost of living for employees effective in January 2012 was questioned at the August 15, 2011 Board meeting. The Board asked the County Clerk to forward the information to NACO legal counsel for review. The Board discussed the NACO legal counsel review of the July 25, 2011 proceedings, longevity program and Resolution No. 2010-1. The review of Resolution No. 2010-1, salaries for all elective offices for calendar years 2011 through 2014, did not distinguish a cost of living rate increase between full-time and part-time elected officials. The resolution reads cost of living increase "based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor". The resolution did not reference a specific calculation of CPI use. Legal counsel suggested that the CPI calculation decided upon be recorded in the minutes for record since there is no clarification in the resolution. As for non-elected employees, there is no statutory requirement to provide salary increases and the Board can recommend a zero-increase. There is a statute regarding the salary for one full-time deputy and it shall not be less than 65 percent of the elected official's salary. Since the 2011-2012 County budget has not been adopted to date, the Board may rescind their July 25, 2011 motion. The consensus of the Board is to use the CPI annual average rate for elected officials' cost of living as set forth in Resolution No. 2010-1. The Board rescinds the motion of July 25, 2011 regarding the cost of living effective January 25, 2012.

The NACO Blue Cross Blue Shield Health Insurance premium increased 7% for July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. A full time employee benefit is the full health insurance premium paid by the county. The monthly or hourly base wages within the Employee Handbook are for starting new employees and used when figuring the cost of living, if given, in January each year. The County established a Longevity Program for full-time employees several years ago. The elected and appointed officials and department heads are not eligible for the Longevity Program. The Board proposed setting the cost of living increases taking into account the employee's receiving/not receiving the Longevity Program. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve cost of living percent increase computed on the base wage as follows: 3% for all full time employees that participate in the Longevity Program; 3% computed on the hourly wage for Ambulance and Weed, with no change for the bookkeeping services; 5% for the appointed full and part time positions not participating in the Longevity Program for the Economic, Highway Superintendent, Veteran, and Zoning offices; 50 cents per hour increase for permanent part time employees; and the average annual CPI rate (3.6%) for elected officials. This motion supersedes the July 25, 2011 motion and is effective January 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Shannon Landauer, County Economic Development Director, and the Board discussed renovation and interior painting/carpet for the county annex building now vacated by DHHS. The Boone County Economic Development office plans to move into the annex building once renovation is completed. No renovation plan or dollar amount has been agreed on to date.

Also, to set the final tax request for the 2011-2012 Boone County proposed budget at a different amount than the prior year tax request in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Section 77-1601.02 The hearing was open for one hour and the proposed budget was published in the August 31, 2011 issue of the Albion News.

The County Board and Albion News representative discussed with Martinsen the differences from last fiscal year's budget in the areas of asking dollar increase, land valuation, tax rate and property tax requirement. Martinsen answered and explained the questions with regard to the proposed budget and publication. The 2011-2012 proposed property tax request is \$3,458,208.00 with a proposed 2011 tax rate of .311368. It takes a 75% vote to exceed the additional 1% lid. The levy authority of 50 cents includes the County levy and all the entities such as Agricultural/Historical Societies, Fire Districts, etc. added together. The County allowable levy limit is 45 cents of the 50 cents; Boone County is currently at .311368. The 2011 County valuation is \$1,110,651,547.00 compared to the 2010 valuation of \$1,037,312,181.00.

The 2011-2012 County Budget adopted tax request increased 7.7446% more than the 2010-2011 fiscal year budget request. The 2011-2012 County proposed property tax request is asking for \$248,576.00 more than the 2010-2011 fiscal year. The majority of the County Budget increase reflects the proposed Courthouse renovation project over a 10-year period, 7% health insurance increase, various cost of living wage increases and loss of state aid that was addressed in LB 383.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to close said public hearing at 12:03 P.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve exceeding the lid by an additional 1% growth for fiscal year 2011-2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the 2011-2012 County Budget as advertised and presented with an Unused Budget Authority created for next year of \$75,087.41; and set the 2011 County Tax Rate at .311368, which is different than the County Tax Rate of .309418 for 2010. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board expressed their appreciation to Martinsen for his assistance with the County Budget preparation throughout the years.

In accordance with the





revised rules and regulations, it is necessary to approve a resolution for the change to be effective in Boone County. The Public Service Commission (PSC) established a permanent funding mechanism for Wireless 911 Service. The money will come from the State each month and will be used to implement and update equipment related to the PSAP. The QWEST trunk line billings for the 2010-2011 budget year were paid from the 911 Emergency Management Fund (2910). A percentage of the trunk line billings may be paid from the 911 Wireless Service Fund (2913). The feasibility study is in regard to the reclassification of a county road, running East and West between the SE1/4 of Section 19 and the NE1/4 of Section 30 all in Township 19 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska, commonly known as 320th Street. After reviewing the road records of Boone County, Thorin has informed the Board that no documentation can be found to verify that this section of road was ever officially opened. Thorin and the Board discussed the feasibility study. The Board tabled a decision at this time. Thorin will visit with Matt Schriver regarding the road reclassification request.

The increase in the size of farm equipment and length of trailers has resulted in numerous requests for the widening of existing driveways to accommodate the increased size. The Board wishes to establish a standard policy for the upgrading of those existing driveways for the purpose of ingress and egress off of county roads. Driveways that qualify under this policy will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Driveways that do not qualify under this policy shall be subject to the policy as stated in a resolution dated January 6, 1976. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. Chairman Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. County Government Day is scheduled for Wednesday, November 16, 2011 from approximately 8:30 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. County officials reported on the Northeast Association of County Officials meeting they attended on September 16, 2011. Commissioner Luettel and Highway Superintendent Thorin reported on the NDOR Highway Superintendent/RC meeting they attended on September 15, 2011. Commissioner Schuele reported on the joint meeting he attended with Merrick and Nance County regarding the Emergency Management Services position. There were fourteen applications for the possible consolidated Emergency Management Services. The county representatives narrowed the applications to seven for review/interviews. The next meeting for representatives of the three counties is scheduled for September 29, 2011.

The Board received a written resignation from Natalie Pugh, County Zoning office employee. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele regretfully accepting the resignation of Natalie Pugh with an effective date of September 28, 2011 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the appointment of an interim Zoning Administrator until a decision is made regarding the status of the position. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to appoint Barb Hanson as the interim Zoning Administrator effective September 19, 2011 not to exceed eight weeks. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board and Public Hearings Proceedings of September 12, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jessica Whalen, Community Liaison for Congressman Smith, and the Board discussed the growth in government regulations. Whalen indicated that the majority of the population is not happy with the reform. A recent report published by the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs confirmed an additional 4,257 new regulations and rules are currently in the works. These taxing regulations will continue to hamper job creation by tying the hands of small business owners and placing undue burden on America's job creators. One of the regulations included on this list is the Environmental Protection Agency's farm dust rule, which directly impacts Nebraska agriculture industry. Congressman Smith is co-sponsoring the Farm Dust Regulation Prevention Act (H.R. 1633). Congressman Smith has not issued a particular view regarding the pipeline issue. The U. S. needs to be independent from foreign oil. Smith would like to see what is best scientifically for the U. S. as a whole while still have safety and protection for the aquifers. The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed the Federal Funds Purchase Program pros and cons with Whalen.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the progress of road and bridge construction projects. Thorin updated the Board with regard to Highway Superintendent and RC regulations, as it appears the responsibility is shifting from the state consultants to the local level. Trees are an increasing concern along county road right-of-ways and intersections. A site plan for tree distance may need to be discussed for safety reasons with regard to intersections.

The Board discussed the renewal of the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Albion regarding zoning services. The present agreement ends September 30, 2011. The consensus of the Board is to table a decision at this time due to the Zoning Administration office vacancy positions and no applications received for the position to date. The Nebraska Department of Roads regulations allow a classified minimum maintenance road to be maintained a minimum of three times a year. The Board received a petition with thirty-six signatures requesting the Board to repair and keep three miles of asphalt and replace the one mile of asphalt that was torn up located from State Highway 14/32 junction and 145th Street going west of Petersburg for four miles to the junction of 145th Street and 170th Avenue. The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed the asphalt road conditions with eight of the petitioners. Thorin explained that the Federal Aid asphalt overlay project was cancelled when the State eliminated collector road classifications. The removal of the one mile of asphalt is to rebuild the base as the high water table is causing problems. The petitioners asked for assurance that the removed asphalt will be replaced once a solid base is established. The crushed white rock on the roads creates severe dust and safety hazard. The severe dust is the immediate problem that needs addressing. The group discussed the "No Trucks" sign posted for the four miles of asphalt, but truck drivers ignore it. The group asked if at certain times of the year, the posting of a weight limit with enforcement, would help preserve the asphalt. The idea would be helpful, but the road department cannot enforce it. Judd Wagner discussed several different grades and types of aggregate with Thorin and the Board.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the progress of road and bridge construction projects. Thorin and the Board discussed liability issues regarding minimum maintenance roads.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, visited with Matt Schriver regarding the 320th Street feasibility study. No documentation can be found to verify that this section of road was ever officially opened. Schriver prefers reclassification of the said portion of 320th Street verses a private drive. Thorin indicated that said reclassification request of a county road, running East and West between the SE1/4 of Section 19 and the NE1/4 of Section 30 all in Township 19 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska, commonly known as 320th Street is not used for residential or mail route. Therefore, the Board may request cost sharing to upgrade a minimum maintenance road. The Board cannot justify the cost to reclassify a portion of a minimum maintenance road to a local road, that does not lead to a residence or mail route. The Board tabled a decision at this time. Thorin will visit with Matt Schriver regarding the road reclassification request.

Boone County and Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) wish to enter into a Project Program Agreement setting out the various duties and funding responsibilities for a Federal Aid project. The NDOR Project No. IBRD-6(6) is to construct a prototype Folded Girder Bridge on 300th Street approximately 0.25 miles east of Primrose, Boone County, Nebraska located between the SW1/4 of Section 10 and the NW ¼ of Section 15, Township 19 North, Range 8 West, Boone County, Nebraska. The County of Boone, Nebraska is an eligible unit of a general local government. The County is authorized to file an application under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as Amended for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program and Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990 (HOME Program) funds distributed by the Department of Economic Development through the Nebraska Affordable Housing Program (NAHP).

The public hearing is a formality to answer any questions concerning 09-TFHP-2012, a funded application to the Department of Economic Development. This grant is available for local affordable housing activities.

Lisa Hurley, Shannon Landauer and the Board discussed the NAHP. Boone County received \$320,900.00 for a Purchase/Rehabilitation/Resale single-family affordable housing program in which \$259,000.00 could be used for direct housing costs, \$32,100.00 for housing management costs, \$7,500.00 for lead-based paint testing/abatement and \$22,300.00 for general administration of the grant. Homebuyers contribute \$1,000.00 each towards closing costs. All NAHP funds benefit low and moderate-income people. This project did not result in persons being displaced, however the County follows the adopted plan to minimize displacement of people as a result of NAHP activities and for assisting persons actually displaced.

County of Boone received a Final Performance Report for the Project Title 09-TFHP-2012, Purchase/Rehabilitation/Resale Single Family Housing Program, from Northeast Economic Development District. Lisa Hurley answered questions and explained the Nebraska Affordable Housing Trust Fund (NAHTF) guidelines. Boone County Project 09-TFHP-2012 NAHTF total approved was \$320,900.00 with a total activity cost of \$157,537.00 leaving an unobligated NAHTF balance of \$163,363.00. NeighborWorks Northeast Nebraska inspected seven additional properties for buyers, six additional properties for Spec, performed work write ups on seven properties and processed three applications for projects that were not able to be completed due to infeasibility or ineligibility. Two houses were completed instead of the target of five. The additional funds of \$163,363.00 are being de-obligated. The unutilized balance of \$163,363.00 will be returned to the state project pool. No positive or negative comments were received from the public.

Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jerome Anderson discussed with the Board concerns that he had regarding the proposed Dohmen lot split scheduled for hearing on October 17, 2011. He inquired whether or not the same access road would be used to get to the grains bins and building after the lot split. Barb Hanson, interim Zoning Administrator, indicated that it was her understanding that the same access road would be used. The Board thanked Mr. Anderson for his inquiries and encouraged him to attend the meeting set for October 17th, if he had any further concerns.

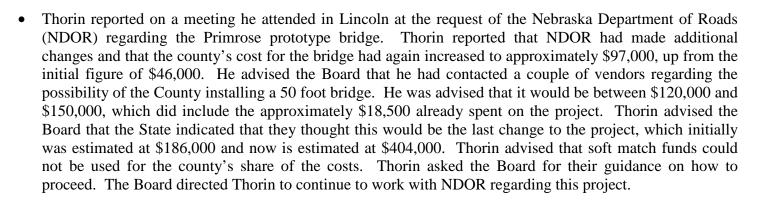

Sheriff Spiegel indicated that the current chairs being used have been there for a number of years and since they are used 24/7, that they receive a lot of wear and tear. He indicated that he had contacted several vendors, including locally, and that he has decided on two chairs from Eakes Office Supply for a total for both chairs in the sum of \$898.00. Motion by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the purchase of two chairs for the dispatch area from Eakes Office Supply in the total sum of \$898.00. The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. Sock presented the Board with an agreement and a schedule for payment based on the type of pickup work to be performed. Sock advised the Board that Thieman was not sure he would be available to do the pickup work and wanted to wait until after the Board approved the agreement before making a final decision. Sock indicated that if Thieman was unable to do the pickup work that she would probably advertise the position and the pay would be based upon experience. It was the Board's opinion that whoever was doing the pickup work should be required to use a county vehicle rather than their personal vehicle due to liability issues. Motion was made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the Contractor Agreement with Henry Thieman as presented and authorizes the Board Chairman to sign said agreement. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, came before the Board to report on the following road issues:





- Thorin advised the Board that they would be finishing up the Third Planet Windpower project within a day or two.
- The Board inquired regarding the fuel audit being conducted by the IRS. Thorin reported that the information had been gathered and that it appeared that approximately 3,000 gallons was included in the report that was not eligible for refund.
- Thorin reported that with regard to the 320th Street issue, that he had spoke to Matt Schriver and that he did not want the road considered a private driveway and that he would be preparing a resolution for the Board's approval to set a public hearing to open approximately one mile of 320th Street as a minimum maintenance road between Sections 19 and 30, all in 19-6, Boone County, Nebraska.
- Kinder Morgan had contacted the Highway Superintendent regarding a gas line located under 330th Street running between the NE1/4 11-21-5 and NW1/4 12-21-5, all in Boone County, Nebraska, which is presently lying only 2" to 3" below the surface of the road due to road wear and erosion. Kinder Morgan indicated that they intend to put a cement mat over the line and then will fix the road over the top. Thorin indicated that this work would be done following harvest, weather permitting.

Darrell Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented to the Board for approval Resolution No. 2011-51, Federal Aid Project ENH-6(5), regarding the Cedar River Bridge Renovation Project. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel, to approve Resolution No. 2011-51 as presented and authorizing Jerry Tisthammer, Board Chairman, to sign the Preliminary Engineering Agreement. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented to the Board for approval Resolution No. 2011-52, Haul Route Agreement, with TransCanada Keystone Pipeline LP. Thorin explained to the Board that this agreement was similar to the agreement entered into with the wind farms which provide that TransCanada will maintain the roads and be responsible for making sure the roads are in the same condition at the end of the project as they were when the project started. Thorin will go out with a TransCanada representative and videotape the roads before work begins and the information will be put on a DVD. Thorin also indicated that if the pipeline does not proceed, then the agreement will be void. Motion made by Tisthammer, Second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2011-52 as presented and authorizing Jerry Tisthammer, Board Chairman, to sign the Haul Route Agreement. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.



TransCanada Keystone Pipeline LP requested permission to install, construct and maintain a 36" pipeline across 110th Avenue and 390th Street located in Sections 29 and 32, all in 18-8, Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2011-53 granting permission to install, construct and maintain said pipeline as described. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A resolution regarding Federal Aid Project IBRD-6(6), Primrose Prototype Bridge, was not taken up by the Board at this time due to a change in the agreement. The resolution will be presented to the Board at a later date after the agreement has been revised.

Cornhusker Public Power District requested permission to trench an electrical cable over and across 130th Street. The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office. The 2012 schedule was distributed to county offices regarding due dates for filing accounts payable and payroll claims. The Board rescheduled the Employee Handbook review to the December 27, 2011 meeting.

The Board, Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, and Shellie Rathjen, Conrad Fire Equipment, discussed several options with regard to the replacement/repair of the Boone County Ambulance that was in an accident on November 28, 2011. The Board asked Rathjen is to provide concrete figures for purchase of the rental unit, new chassis/box unit, salvage value of chassis/box and refurbished chassis/box unit. If the damaged box were refurbished, the box would need inspection and recertification from Medtec in order for the warranty to continue. Rathjen visited with the owner of the rental unit during the Board meeting and the owner offered the unit to the county for \$8,500.00. Rathjen is to follow up on the offer, as it appears it may be several months before a new/refurbished unit is available.

Joyce Sock, County Assessor, presented a proposal from Stanard Appraisal Services, Inc. of Central City, Nebraska with regard to the commercial properties in Boone County. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the appraisal bid of \$165.00 per parcel for commercial properties as submitted by Stanard Appraisal Services. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board and Public Hearing Proceedings of December 12, 2011. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Nebraska Revised Statutes provide that salaries of all elected officers of the County shall be fixed by the County Board prior to January 15th of the year in which a General Election will be held for the respective offices. The position of County Commissioner District No. 2 is the only county elected office to be on the 2012 General Election ballot. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2011-74 to set the salary for County Commissioner (part-time) at \$21,000.00 to be effective commencing January 1, 2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve as written Resolution No. 2011-75 to accept and approve the written applications of the following designated County Depositories of the County Funds for 2012: Boone County Bank, Albion; Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids; Cornerstone Bank of York, Albion and St. Edward Branches; First Bank & Trust of Fullerton, St. Edward Branch; Homestead Bank of Cozad, Albion Branch; Great Western Bank, Albion Branch; Petersburg State Bank of Petersburg and alternate investment NPAIT, Lincoln. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed the additional documentation that the Federal Highway Administration is requesting of the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR), regarding access to the Orford/Pioneer Cemetery along Highway 14 between Albion and Petersburg. The present turnout for the cemetery along Highway 14 is not included in the highway overlay project. Citizens have contacted NDOR inquiring about where an access will be located for the cemetery. Thorin will discuss the responsibility issue regarding access to the cemetery, entrance gate, etc. with the landowner and NDOR.

- The Board discussed who would attend the various meetings scheduled this week.
- Thorin and the Board discussed information received at the NACO Convention last week regarding the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) buyout program involving federal funds and soft match credit audits.
- The Board and Thorin discussed fracture critical bridges. The classification of a fracture critical bridge may be due to the design and not necessarily the present condition of the bridge.
- The Board and Thorin discussed road drainage issues and property lines when closing/vacating county roads.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 1:20 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 27, 2011.



The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, December 27, 2011, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Shannon Landauer and Megan Zoucha, County Economic Development, submitted an estimate cost and renovation plans to the Board for their review regarding the county annex building. The county purchased the former SourceGas building in June 2009 for office space to be utilized by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (NDHHS). The NDHHS no longer provides an office in Boone County; therefore, the annex building is presently unoccupied. Landauer and Zoucha explained that the floor plan renovation includes a meeting room to accommodate board meetings. They reviewed the estimated costs for construction, floor coverings, painting, furniture, networking, wiring, signage and frontage with the Board. Landauer feels the estimated renovation project bid of \$44,870.00 is on the high end. Landauer feels the renovation project could be completed under the estimate. The Board made no decision at the meeting and asked Landauer to obtain another construction bid. The Board felt that more than one bid is necessary before making any decision.

Kelly Benson, County Zoning Administrator, presented a November report to the Board regarding permits issued and zoning activity.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board with regard to road maintenance and projects.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented a "Traffic Sign Management and Retroreflectivity Maintenance Program" (Program) to the Board for approval. The purpose of the Program is to establish an organized procedure for the maintenance, repair and replacement of county road signs that have been stolen, vandalized or exceeded their useful life expectancy to help ensure the safe travel of streets and avenues for the public in Boone County. The county hereby resolves to proceed with the implementation of the policy beginning January 1, 2012. The Program is in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the "Traffic Sign Management and Retroreflectivity Maintenance Program effective January 1, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners adopted the 2011-2012 County Budget on September 12, 2011. An interfund transfer from the Inheritance Tax Fund (2700) to the Road Fund (0200) was approved as needed. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2011-76, authorizing Laurie Krohn, Boone County Treasurer, to transfer the sum of \$150,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund (2700) to the Road Fund (0200) as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board Proceedings of December 19, 2011 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





A discussion was held with regard to access to the Orford/Pioneer Cemetery located in Section 14, Township 21 North, Range 7 West, Boone County, Nebraska at the Board meeting on July 18, 2011. The Board took no action at that time until further review. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, has been in contact with the Nebraska Department of Roads and Mark Niewohner, landowner, regarding access to the cemetery. The Board received an email from Harry and Linda Jordan regarding the Orford/Pioneer Cemetery and it is attached to the proceedings herein. Mark Niewohner had previously stated that he would allow walk-in access through his property to the cemetery and would allow for a gate to be installed large enough to accommodate riding lawn mowers for the purpose of mowing the cemetery. The Board and Thorin discussed the county constructing a parking area for vehicles and providing a sign on County "Y" Road that identifies the location of the cemetery access. Also discussed was a procedure to notify the concerned citizens as to the location of the cemetery access. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to accept Mark Niewohner's offer of a walkin access located approximately 3000 feet northwest of the intersection of County "Y" Road and Nebraska Highway 14; the county will construct a vehicle parking area and install signage; and the Board will notify the concerned citizens as to the location of the access upon the approval of the Board proceedings. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, submitted a Memorandum of Understanding to the Board for approval. The Memorandum of Understanding is between the State of Nebraska Department of Veterans Affairs (NDVA) and County of Boone, Nebraska, on behalf of the Boone County Veterans Service Center (County). The purpose of the memorandum is to arrange for the shared use of the VETRASPEC system by the NDVA and County. The Veteran Service Office will benefit by using the web based system including cost savings, consistency and reporting time. The office will be almost paperless with the implementation of the VETRASPEC system. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the Memorandum of Understanding through June 30, 2012 with an automatic renewal for two additional twelve month periods and pay an annual user fee as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the courthouse north parking lot. The parking is tight when it is full due to extended cab pickups and vans. It was suggested to extend the parking lot ten feet to the south. The Board took no action at this time until further review.

The Board rescheduled the Employee Handbook review to the January 9, 2012 meeting.

Open discussion:

- Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, updated the Board regarding law enforcement matters.
- The Board, Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, and Shellie Rathjen, Front Range Fire Apparatus, discussed several options with regard to the replacement/repair of the Boone County Ambulance that was in an accident on November 28, 2011. The group discussed the replacement/repair of the County Ambulance on December 19, 2011 and continued with a lengthy discussion today. The Board visited with John Christensen, NIRMA, by teleconference regarding the replacement/repair options and coverage of equipment.
- The Board discussed the various meetings scheduled for the week.
- Commissioner Schuele and Luettel plan to take the Emergency Manager vehicle to Nance County today for Jan Zurcher, Boone, Nance and Merrick County Emergency Manager, who begins duties on January 3, 2012.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 12:45 P.M. with the Reorganizational Board meeting scheduled for Wednesday, January 4, 2012 and regular Board meeting scheduled for Monday, January 9, 2012.
