The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 10:00 A.M. on Wednesday, January 4, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by State Statute 23-153. Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 9, 2012 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 9, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board reviewed the Interlocal Agreement for Emergency Management Services (Agreement). The Agreement is made by and between the County of Nance, County of Merrick and County of Boone, all political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska. The purpose of the Agreement is to make the most efficient use of each county's taxing authority and services regarding Emergency Management. The Agreement will begin on January 1, 2012 and remain in effect through June 30, 2014, unless the parties hereto agree in writing to modify, extend or terminate this Agreement prior to that time. Jan Zurcher is a certified Emergency Manager and started her duties on January 3, 2012. Nance County is the Agreement administrator with total expenditures as follows: Nance County 30%, Merrick County 35%, and Boone County 35%. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Interlocal Agreement for Emergency Management Services as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed Section 125 Cafeteria Plan materials left after the presentations of three companies' in 2011. The information received through the presentations from each company is comparable within their respective plans. The decision of the Board is to offer the NACO endorsed plan. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve providing the NACO endorsed Section 125 Plan proposal of First Concord Benefits Group, LLC to interested employees. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Boone County is a member of the ten county East Central Planning, Exercise, Training (PET) and Interoperable Communications Region established by the State of Nebraska. Boone County must appoint at minimum one person to serve as a member and participate in the Governing Regional Committee. Such appointment shall be reviewed each year at the annual County Board Reorganizational meeting. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to appoint Jan Zurcher to fulfill the duties as required by the Governing Regional Committee retroactive and effective January 1, 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Treasurer submitted a Semi Annual Statement for July 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to accept and approve the County Treasurer's Semi Annual Statement as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. submitted a request for assistance with advertising the annual Home, Farm & Garden Show scheduled for March 24, 2012. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road and bridge maintenance. Thorin received information from the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads (NDOR) regarding federal aid files. NDOR is in the process of reviewing local federal aid files and clearing out dormant projects. The necessary documentation regarding the eight federal aid projects will be an agenda item for the January 17, 2012 Board meeting.

Thorin provided a copy of a draft of NDOR's local bridge selection policy to the Board regarding a federal fund purchase program agreement allowing NDOR to purchase federal funds in exchange for state cash. NDOR is asking counties to review the proposal and comment within thirty days.

Leo Reilly, Greeley County Commissioner, discussed concerns regarding a county road known as 100th Avenue on the Greeley/Boone county line approximately three miles north of Highway 91 with the Board and Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent. Tim O'Brien, Marty McKay, and Dennis McKay, property owners in the area, presented their concerns with regard to 90% of the water comes from the east, sets in the wetlands, then the road is saturated and under water and not passable for a majority of the time in order to check livestock and get to hay ground. Thorin explained that the area in discussion is classified as wetlands; therefore, one cannot add or remove any dirt or vegetation in the wetland classification. Thorin said it is on the Boone County One & Six Year Road Plan and was planning to move it up to the One Year Road Plan in 2012. The 404 Permit was submitted a year ago to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Thorin has heard nothing from them to date. The permit request included building the road up to standards and adding another culvert for drainage. The group wanted to know if it was possible to haul in dirt now while it is dry weather, to build the present road up in order to be passable for the landowners to get to their property. The decision of the Board is to add dirt to build up the road without disturbing any of the adjacent wetland. That means no removing dirt/debris from the wetland and no dropping any dirt over the edge into the wetlands while building the road up. It was decided that both Boone County and Greeley County road departments will provide equipment and labor to haul in dirt to build the road up.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board and Board of Equalization Reorganizational Proceedings of January 4, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board and Board of Equalization Proceedings of December 27, 2011 as presented. Roll call vote: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Agenda items are to be submitted by noon on Friday preceding the Board meeting to the County Clerk's office that requires a Board decision. The Clerk of the District Court report was not submitted timely and will be placed on the January 17, 2011 Board agenda. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the following reports of the County Officials as presented for December 2011: Clerk - \$17,385.50 (State of Nebraska - \$11,732.34/County of Boone - \$5,653.16; Sheriff - \$5,809.20; Treasurer's Fees - \$8.00; and Treasurer's Office Miscellaneous Receipt Nos. 11737-11806 - \$160,361.69. Total collected by County Treasurer was \$2,594,848.07. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board, interested department heads and employees continued reviewing updates to the County Employee Handbook as provided by the updated NIRMA Personnel System.

Open discussion: Commissioner Schuele reported on the St. Edward City Council meeting he attended on January 2, 2012. The Board and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, viewed and discussed the North courthouse parking lot.

Vice Chairman Schuele declared the meeting adjourned at 2:57 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Tuesday, January 17, 2012.

MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, January 9, 2012 at 10:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Motion made by Commissioner Luettel, second by Commissioner Tisthammer to open said public hearing. Present for roll call were Commissioners Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and answer questions regarding the denial or approval to close or vacate the proposed one mile of a county road known as 190th Avenue. The hearing is concerning one mile of a county road known as 190th Avenue running north and south between the NW1/4 of Section 27 and the NE1/4 of Section 28 and the SE1/4 of Section 21 and the SW1/4 of Section 22, all in Township 22 North, Range 7 West, all in Boone County, Nebraska.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, had previously submitted a written feasibility study to the Board on November 28, 2011, recommending vacating one mile of a county road known as 190th Avenue. The road runs one mile north and south and upon vacation of said road, all right-of-way rights be relinquished to the owners of the adjacent real estate, one-half on each side thereof.

Walt Hoefer was present to answer questions regarding the Huisman property. The Huisman property auction is scheduled for February. John Temme, Auctioneer, asked who is responsible for locating the property lines upon vacation of said road. The County is responsible for location of the section corners and the land owners for the property lines.

The Board received no opposition to the vacation at the hearing. The road is not part of the road inventory listed with the State of Nebraska. The County Board instructed that a resolution be prepared to vacate that portion of 190th Avenue as presented for the Board's approval at the January 17, 2012 meeting.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to close said hearing at 11:05 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the vacation of a one mile segment of a county road known as 190th Avenue, beginning between the SW corner of the NW1/4 of Section 27 and the SE corner of the NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 22 North, Range 7 West and thence North 1 mile to the NE corner of the SE1/4 of Section 21 and the NW corner of the SW1/4 of Section 22, Township 22 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P. M., Boone County, Nebraska, as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.



BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 17, 2012 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, January 17, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. Chairman Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- Lisa Langan, County Court, provided the Board information for their review regarding 2011 LB 669 regarding the County Court staff and Clerk of the District Court staff entering into an Interlocal Agreement with approval by the Board of Commissioners for the courts to help each other out when staff is temporarily unavailable.
- Kelly Benson, Zoning Administrator, provided the Board a written report of activities.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Tom Schuele, Commissioner, discussed LB 970 introduced on behalf of the governor regarding the elimination of the inheritance tax that is paid to counties. Schuele reminded those present that the County Inheritance Tax Fund is what has kept the County tax request low.
- Jerry Tisthammer, Commissioner, commented on the progress of updating the County Employee Handbook to coincide with the updated NIRMA Personnel Policy.

Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, appeared before the Board to request approval for the purchase of a security camera. The security camera on the south side of the law enforcement building is in need of replacement, as the present camera is not recording properly. Bids were obtained for camera replacement. The camera Bosch WZ18 has a longer range and better visibility for night recording. Applied Connective Technologies estimated cost for a Bosch WZ18 is \$610.60. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve and authorize Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, to purchase a security camera as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, discussed with the Board the need for a more secure impoundment facility for seized property. Spiegel asked the Board if they would consider renting a facility where the seized property may be safely stored until execution or settlement.

The Clerk of the District Court shall on or before the fifteenth day of each month make a report to the county board, under oath, showing the different items of such fees, revenue, perquisites, or receipts received from whom, at what time and for what service and the total amount received by such officer since the last report, and the amount received for the current year. Clerk of the District Court submitted fees for the month of December 2011 to the State of Nebraska - \$228.00 and to the County Treasurer - \$1,076.76. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the monthly report of the Clerk of the District Court despite not being reported by the fifteenth day of the month according to Nebraska State Statute 33-106.02. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board and Public Hearings Proceedings of January 9, 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved two requests for advertisement funding.

The St. Michael's Parish submitted a request for assistance with advertising the annual St. Patrick's Carnival scheduled for March 11, 2012. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Albion Area Arts Council submitted a request for assistance with advertising the Local Jewels event schedule for April 1, 2012. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Shannon Landauer, County Economic Development, obtained another construction bid estimate of \$26,000.00 regarding renovation plans to the county annex building. The Board asked Landauer to obtain a second construction bid after the renovation presentation at the December 27, 2011 Board meeting. The county purchased the former SourceGas building in June 2009 for office space to be utilized by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (NDHHS). The NDHHS no longer provides an office in Boone County; therefore, the annex building is presently unoccupied. Landauer reviewed the floor plan and estimated renovation costs with the Board. Landauer explained that by changing the frontage to one window, the heating/cooling should be more efficient. The floor plan renovation includes a meeting room to accommodate board meetings. The Boone County Development Agency Executive Committee recommended a renovation budget of \$45,000.00 with a \$4,500.00 contingency overage. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the renovation project of the County Annex Building for use by the Boone County Development Agency with a meeting room that may be used by other boards with the renovation costs paid from the 2606 Business Development Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Vic Lee, CEO and Mandy Kumm, CFO, representatives for the Boone County Health Center, reviewed the Boone County Health Center September 30, 2011 audit report with the Board. One of the policies is to have 90 days cash on hand as a safety net in order to pay bills. The health center has no debt at this time. The health center has programs available that one may qualify for help when in need to pay health care costs. Kumm said that the future accounting reporting techniques would be changing due to the federal health program. The Hospital Foundation books are not a part of the Boone County Health Center audit. Lee's opinion is that the health care reform is favoring return of investments and not looking at the quality of life.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed road maintenance and projects. Thorin and the Board discussed repairing/replacing the Petersburg Road District shop furnace that is no longer functioning. Thorin received a quote from SourceGas for the replacement of the furnace. The consensus of the Board was to replace the furnace unit instead of repairing the old one.

The Board held a public hearing on January 9, 2012 regarding one mile of road known as 190th Avenue. No opposition was received regarding the vacation of said road. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2012-01, vacating a county road beginning between the SW corner of the NW1/4 of Section 27 and the SE corner of the NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 22 North, Range 7 West and thence North 1 mile to the NE corner of the SE1/4 of Section 21 and the NW corner of the SW1/4 of Section 22, Township 22 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, known as 190th Avenue and all right-of-way rights be relinquished and shall revert to the owners of the adjacent real estate, once half on each side thereof. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented a resolution for the Board to consider. Certain transportation facilities in Boone County, Nebraska, were designated as being eligible for federal aid transportation funds by the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads (NDOR) in compliance with federal laws. Boone County has previously entered into Agreements (Programs) with NDOR. NDOR is in the process of reviewing local federal aid files and clearing out dormant projects. NDOR recommends that Boone County withdraw these projects and cancel all agreements pertaining to such projects. If the County agrees to withdraw these eight projects, the State of Nebraska agrees not to seek reimbursement of the state costs incurred. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve as presented Resolution No. 2012-02, Boone County hereby requests that the NDOR withdraw the eight projects as listed in the resolution from the Federal Aid list. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented a resolution for the Board to consider. Boone County and Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) wish to enter into an Engineering Services Agreement to provide fracture critical bridge inspection and re-load rating services if necessary for the Federal Aid Project No. BR-NBIS(95), Control No. 00872 Statewide 2012 Fracture Critical Bridge Inspections. Upon execution of the agreement, the county will be billed 20% of the local fracture critical bridge inspection costs. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2012-03 regarding Federal Aid Project No. BR-NBIS(95) and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Agreement as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board discussed pending court cases and other personnel issues with John Morgan, County Attorney.

Open discussion and Miscellaneous Public Comments: Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center, (Health Center) presented a Memorandum of Understanding prepared by the Health Center's attorney. The Health Center wants to terminate the resolution agreement regarding the County Ambulance Services with the Health Center. The Board did not sign the Memorandum of Understanding, as it was not an agenda item, is not in the best interest for the County and the referenced resolution is not the present resolution that is in effect. The Board asked that the Memorandum of Understanding be forwarded to NIRMA's legal counsel, who is the county's insurance provider. The County Clerk's office will email the other counties to find out how many across the state provide County Ambulance Service and have an Ambulance Fund within the county budgets.

The Board participated in a conference call with NIRMA legal counsel regarding the medical attendants aboard the County Ambulance. Further discussion will take place at the next Board meeting.

The Board received a quote of \$49,500.00 to repair the chassis and module on the 2010 Ambulance that was in an accident in November 2011.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 2:20 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for January 23, 2012.



BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 23, 2012 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:57 A.M. on Monday, January 23, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

An annual Weed Superintendent report is due January 31st each year and is submitted to Nebraska Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Plant Industry. The Boone County Weed Board is the same members as the Boone County Board of Commissioners. Russell Stokes, County Weed Superintendent, submitted the 2011 year end report for the Board to review. Stokes and the Board discussed problem weed/tree areas in the county. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the 2011 year end weed reports as presented. Roll call vote: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Employee Handbook addresses re-employment: "Former employees of the County are not eligible for re-hire without prior approval of the County Board." Joyce Sock, Assessor, asked permission for the Board to re-employ Lori Swerczek as a temporary employee, to help catch up the office workload. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the temporary re-employment as requested for the County Assessor's office. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board received a quote of \$49,500.00 to repair the chassis and module on the 2010 Ambulance that was in an accident in November 2011. The repair proposal is from Arrow Mfg., Inc. of Rock Rapids, Iowa with an approximate completion of sixty days. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to accept and approve the repair proposal and authorizes the Board Chairman to sign the necessary papers retroactive to January 17, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2012 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska at the 10:00 A.M. public hearing. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2012-04, adopting the 2012 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska as presented at the public hearing. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board Proceedings of January 17, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



It is recommended that the County advertise for temporary/seasonal help on an annual basis. All applicants must be able to speak, read and understand the English language. The returned applications will remain on file for one year, if any county department needs temporary help in 2012. The applications are for temporary/seasonal help within the courthouse, road department and law enforcement. Anytime the County of Boone has a full time or regular part time position open, the department with the opening will advertise separately. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to advertise the yearly temporary/seasonal applications for help one week only in the Albion News as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Payroll Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General \$83,375.90, BCBS \$34,302.86, Ameritas Ret \$5,755.99, EFTPS \$6,316.11; Road \$43,387.63, BCBS \$19,915.94, Ameritas Ret \$2,928.67, EFTPS \$3,292.72; Boone County Economic Development \$5,054.00, BCBS \$1,492.40, Ameritas Ret \$341.15, EFTPS \$375.68; Ambulance \$795.00, Ameritas Ret \$53.67, EFTPS \$60.81; Public Defender Contract \$3,250.00; Boone County Fitness Center \$9,167.26, Ameritas Ret \$511.74, EFTPS \$701.29, which is all reimbursed back to the County. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board, Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, and Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center, discussed coverage with regard to medical personnel when staffing the Boone County Ambulance during transfers to another hospital. Larry Pelan, NIRMA, discussed the issue by teleconference with the Board, Bruland and Lee. The Memorandum of Understanding that the Boone County Health Center Attorney proposed is not in the best interest of the County. The Board needs to review options and exposure to the County regarding medical personnel staffing of patient transfers. A survey conducted across the state by the County Clerk's office, indicated that less than twenty counties provide tax funds for ambulance services and even less operate/staff ambulance services. More information will be sought from other ambulance transport entities regarding coverage for medical personnel. Vic Lee said the hospital would not be able to afford operating the ambulance transport services; he will alert the nurses not to staff a transport for now; and they will just call in Midwest Ambulance Services.

Open discussion and Miscellaneous Public Comments:

- The Board discussed who would attend the various meetings scheduled this week.
- Commissioner Luettel reported on the Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Services meeting he attended last week.
- The Board asked the County Clerk's office to draft a letter expressing their opposition to LB 970, to eliminate Inheritance Tax.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 2:00 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 30, 2012.



2012 ONE AND SIX YEAR ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BOONE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, January 23, 2012 at 10:00 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Tom Schuele. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, was present to answer the 2012 Road Improvement Program questions. Notice of the hearing given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The public hearing is for the purpose of hearing testimony in favor of, or opposition to, and to answer questions in relation thereto the proposed 2012 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The hearing is to remain open for one hour.

Darrel Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2012 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The one-year road improvement plan consists of nine projects and the six-year plan consists of six projects. Thorin informed the Board that several projects were not on the plans due to reclassification as maintenance projects. Thorin discussed each of the projects with the Board and the public. Project No. 336 is moved from the six year to the one year as a three-phase project, as it has been on the road improvement program since 1993. Mark Wagner, Dave Schrad, Marilyn Schrad, Donna Iburg, and Carma Wilton were present to discuss Project No. 362 regarding 145th Street west of 190th Avenue. Thorin explained that federal aid transportation funds are no longer available for roads classified as collector roads. The federal and state regulations regarding bridge and road construction project funding is pushing more of the burden onto the County. Now in order to receive federal aid funding for a bridge project, the bridges need to be 100'/200' before any consideration by the federal/state departments.

Attached hereto as part of the proceedings is a copy of the 2012 proposed projects one-year plan and the 2012 and beyond proposed projects for the six-year plan as presented by Boone County Highway Superintendent, Darrel Thorin.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS AMENDMENTS TO THE BOONE COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, January 23, 2012 at 11:10 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Present for said public hearing were Commissioners Tisthammer, Luettel, Schuele and Kelly Benson, County Planning and Zoning Administrator. Benson was present to answer any questions with regard to the zoning regulation amendments. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The purpose of the pubic hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to and to answer questions in relation to the approval or denial of amendments to the Boone County Zoning Regulations with regard to setbacks distance. The amendments are concerning the Articles listed below for structures to be built up to 63 feet from the existing visual center of the county road, excluding the site triangles of intersections within the A-1, A-2 and A-3 Districts.

- Article 13: Agricultural-Secondary District A-2, Section 4, 4.3D
- Article 14: Agricultural-Transitional District A-3, Section 1, 3.8
- Article 16: R-M Mobile Home Residential Districts, Section 3, 3.1 and 3.6
- Article 17: C-1 Commercial Districts, Section 3, 3.8
- Article 18: I-1 Light Industrial District, Section 3, 3.8
- Article 19: I-2 Heavy Industrial District, Section 3, 3.2
- Article 20: PU Public/Semi-Public Use Districts, Section 3, 3.8

Kelly Benson, Zoning Administrator, explained that the present regulation states structures built at 83 feet. Benson said that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the regulation changes. No opposition was received with regard to the amended changes for structures to be built up to 63 feet from the existing visual center of county roads, excluding the site triangles of intersections. The amended changes will better fit the building of structures such as grain bins and storage buildings for easier access by the landowner. The Board asked Benson to prepare a resolution for the next Board meeting.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to close said hearing at 11:20 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to amend and approve the Boone County Zoning Regulations as stated above regarding the Articles listed for structures to be built up to 63 feet from the existing visual center of the county road excluding the site triangles of intersections within the A-1, A-2 and A-3 Districts as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:13 A.M. on Monday, January 30, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The state statutes require the Sheriff to make quarterly reports to the County Board describing fees and activities. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to accept and approve the County Sheriff's 2011 fourth quarter report as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, and Denny Johnson, Deputy Sheriff, were present to discuss the purchase of an In-Car Camera System with the Board. Sheriff Spiegel applied for an In-Car Camera System Mini-Grant Contract Application and Award to help offset the cost of the camera system. The Nebraska Office of Highway Safety approved the mini-grant. The mini-grant award reimburses the County \$2,995.00 of the \$3,995.00 in-car camera cost. The County is responsible for any extras, freight and installation fees. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the In-Car Camera System for the County Sheriff as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society representative, and the Board discussed the dates that the Ag Society will be asking for Special Designated License (SDL) to serve alcohol underneath the grandstand. Rolf will prepare the necessary papers for the requests and present them for approval at an April Board meeting.

The Board held a public hearing on January 23, 2012 to amend the Boone County Zoning Regulations with regard to setbacks distance. The amended Articles set out in the resolution refer to the A-1, A-2 and A-3 Districts, Structures to be built up to 63 feet from the existing visual center of county roads, excluding the site triangles of intersections. Motion made by Luettel and second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2012-05 amending the Boone County Zoning Regulations with regard to Setbacks distance as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve as presented the Proceedings of January 23, 2012 for the County Board, Board of Equalization, One and Six Year Road Improvement Program Hearing, and Amendments to the Boone County Zoning Regulations Hearing. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The Board; Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator; Dr. Tony Kusek; Amy Zaruba, Paramedic/Nurse; and Mandy Kumm, CFO for Boone County Health Center, discussed coverage with regard to medical personnel when staffing the Boone County Ambulance during transfers to another hospital. The continued discussion involves workers compensation coverage, professional liability coverage and exposure to the County with regard to medical personnel staffing patient transfers. Many questions and concerns have surfaced since the County Ambulance was involved in an accident in November 2011. The group is learning that there is a difference involving insurance coverage for an ambulance transport service like the County provides vs. volunteer emergency responding ambulances like the municipalities provide. The ambulance services discussion is scheduled to continue on February 13, 2012, allowing personnel to gather insurance coverage information for medical staff, EMTs and drivers as independent contractors vs. employees.

Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Lisa Langan, County Court, provided the Board information for their review regarding 2011 LB 669 at the January 17, 2012 Board meeting. Lisa Langan, County Court, Ellen Hirsch and Carolyn Fross, District Court, discussed with the Board their opinion concerning LB 669 and its implementation date of August 27, 2012. LB 669 now known as Neb. Rev. Stat. §24-507(3)(4), is regarding the County Court staff and Clerk of the District Court staff entering into an Interlocal Agreement with approval by the Board of Commissioners for the courts to help each other out when staff is temporarily unavailable. Langan felt that after reviewing the statute and material provided, it appears that the State is possibly transferring more of the State responsibility onto the county employees. Langan is more in favor of looking at the remote coverage within the state system. Langan, Hirsch and Fross are not in favor of signing an agreement at this time.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented and reviewed the 2011 Annual Highway Superintendent report with the Board. The report showed how and where the road funds were spent with regard to aggregate, freight to haul aggregate to the county yards, cost of the seven projects that were completed and repairs.

The Nebraska Department of Roads reviewed the status regarding the Cedar Rapids Bridge Renovation Project No. ENH-6(5). Thorin received a schedule for the Cedar Rapids project and it appears the funding may be in 2013.

Thorin and the Board discussed road maintenance, signage and road projects. Thorin informed the Board that the Nebraska Department of Roads closed a bridge immediately that is located on 130th Street between 310 and 320th Avenue. The bridge was built in 1915 and the four tension arms show fractures. If one of the tension arms snaps, the bridge will go down. The road crew barricaded the bridge, as it is not safe to drive across.



The Board conducted a quarterly visit of the county jail. It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county once during each of its sessions in January, April, July and October of each year per Nebraska State Statute 47-109.

The Board and interested employees reviewed a portion of the Employee Handbook. The group discussed the response from NIRMA legal counsel regarding employee handbook questions submitted earlier for further clarification.

Open discussion and Miscellaneous Public Comments:

- The Board discussed who would attend the various meetings scheduled this week.
- The Board visited with Larry Pelan, NIRMA, by teleconference regarding the county ambulance insurance coverage and other matters for personnel aboard the ambulance for a patient transport.
- The Board discussed the 2010 County Ambulance repair issues by teleconference with Arrow Manufacturing, Inc. and Front Range Fire Apparatus. Medtec may not recertify or extend the warranty for the modular box due to a third party repairing it outside of Medtec's authorized service center.

BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS FEBRUARY 13, 2012 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:03 A.M. on Monday, February 13, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board; Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator; Dr. Tony Kusek; Amy Zaruba, Paramedic/Nurse; and Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center, discussed coverage with regard to medical personnel when staffing the Boone County Ambulance during transfers to another hospital. The continued discussion involves workers compensation coverage, professional liability coverage and exposure to the County with regard to medical personnel staffing patient transfers. The group is learning that there is a difference involving insurance coverage for an ambulance transport service like the County provides vs. volunteer emergency responding ambulances like the municipalities provide. Lee indicated that the Boone County Health Center (BCHC) is not interested in inheriting the ambulance unit or providing ambulance service as part of the BCHC services. Lee claims the BCHC attorney tells them not to be in the ambulance business. The County insurance company is telling the Board they are exposing the county by operating an ambulance transport service. Amy Zaruba said that medical personnel she visited with are okay with purchasing their own liability coverage. EMTs will also need to purchase liability coverage before staffing the ambulance for a patient transport. If the county continues to operate an ambulance transport service the drivers and medical personnel will need to be paid as county employees with the issuance of W-2s in order to be covered with workers compensation insurance in case of another accident. The Board suggested increasing the rates that the medical personnel receive when engaged in a patient transport to help offset the cost of their additional liability insurance. A new resolution will be drafted for review by both NIRMA legal counsel and BCHC legal counsel before a decision is made.

The Boone County Ambulance Service submitted four uncollectible ambulance accounts, as all methods of collection have been exhausted. The recommendation for the October 2009 account of \$1,700.00; September 2010 account of \$238.75; August 2011 account of \$1,594.00 and September 2011 account of \$1,244.00 for ambulance services is to turn the files over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to write-off the uncollectible ambulance accounts in the sum of \$4,776.75, pursuant to the recommendation received from the ambulance service and turns the files over to the County Attorney. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Providers enrolled in Medicare need to submit an initial enrollment application to establish a record in PECOS. The Boone County Ambulance Service accepts Medicare payments and therefore needs to complete a Medicare Revalidation Application for the year 2012 and submit a fee of \$523.00 to receive direct deposit payments. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the Medicare Revalidation application fee of \$523.00 for the year 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Joyce Sock, County Assessor, presented the proposed 2012 Ag Land values to the Board for review. Sock and the Board discussed the proposed changes. Sock proposed combining market areas one and three and leaving market area two separate. Sock indicated that there have been enough sales within the county for market area one and three to combine the area and will not need to use the six-mile radius from the out of county sales. PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS AMENDMENT TO THE BOONE COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, February 13, 2012 at 9:04 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Schuele, second by Commissioner Tisthammer to open said public hearing. Present for said public hearing were Commissioners Schuele, Tisthammer, Luettel; Kelly Benson, County Planning and Zoning Administrator; and Mark Jensen, member of the County Planning and Zoning Commission Board. Benson and Jensen were present to answer any questions with regard to the zoning regulation amendment. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The purpose of the pubic hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to and to answer questions regarding the proposed amendment to the Boone County Zoning Regulations concerning stockpiling of animal waste. The proposed amendment is to change the present conditional use permit regulation for livestock waste stockpiling setbacks from one mile to an area at least one-quarter mile from a neighbors' dwelling.

Ted Thieman spoke in opposition of the amendment. Thieman asked how the change in the distance from a neighbors' dwelling from one mile to one quarter of a mile of animal stockpile waste was serving the welfare of the public. Thieman said the zoning regulations need specific language for setback distance of one-quarter mile, permitted or conditional permit, volume of stockpile waste, cattle or hog waste and the ag district areas the proposed amendment affects. Thieman said at a public hearing the material presented should have the before and new language that is being proposed for all to review.

Jay Wolf felt it has not been a problem in the past but that it is a regulation that needs addressing. Wolf replied that Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) regulations limit the size of manure stockpiles. The size of stockpiles would be limited to agronomic rates permitted by NDEQ and waste is to be spread within a year.

Jensen explained that the Planning and Zoning Commission Board is in the process of updating the manual. It is the Planning Board's intent to have language consistency in the zoning manual and manure stockpiling to be a permitted use permit.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to close said hearing at 9:45 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jessica Hendricks, aide to Congressman Adrian Smith, updated the Board regarding Congressman Smith's involvement with the House Ways and Means Subcommittee on Trade. Congressman Smith has been involved in a series of discussions related to the development of the Trans-Pacific Partnership, or TPP. The core of the TPP proposal is a trade agreement that includes eight countries in addition to the United States. The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Boone County Historical Society submitted a request for assistance with advertising a Memorial weekend 'Decoration Day' event scheduled for May 28, 2012. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County of Boone and the City of Albion Police Department has had an Interlocal Agreement for several years with regard to a one-mile radius jurisdiction of the city limits of the City of Albion. It is a joint jurisdiction of the two law enforcement agencies for the one-mile radius outside the City of Albion. This agreement is reviewed on an annual basis. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2012-09, an Interlocal Agreement between the County of Boone and City of Albion for law enforcement purposes as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator, presented a Lease Agreement regarding leasing space in the old Albion fire station to the County. The two east bays of the west addition of the old Albion fire station building are available for use by the Boone County Sheriff's department. The lease shall commence on April 1, 2012 and the Lessee shall pay to Lessor the sum of one dollar per year. The lease drafted by the City included language that the Lessee shall pay for ten percent of all utilities for the entire premises and shall pay for fifty percent of maintenance to the portion of the building occupied by the Lessee. The Board asked Devine to address their questions regarding the utilities and maintenance. The maintenance pertains to the occupied space by the Lessee, not like a new roof if the City decided to put one on. The Lessee's percentage of the electricity will be billed every six months and the first billing includes the rental lease fee of one dollar. The Clerk's office receives more requests wanting copies of the document records emailed vs. faxed. The copier upgrade and networking will allow scanning and emailing of documents and save on copies that are made then faxed. PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS AMENDMENTS TO THE BOONE COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, March 26, 2012 at 9:01 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Present for said public hearing were Commissioners Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel, Tom Schuele; Kelly Benson, County Planning and Zoning Administrator; and Mark Jensen, member of the County Planning and Zoning Commission Board. Benson and Jensen were present to answer any questions with regard to the zoning regulation amendments. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The purpose of the pubic hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to and to answer questions regarding the proposed amendments to the Boone County Zoning Regulations concerning stockpiling of animal waste. The proposed amendments are to change the present conditional use permit regulation for livestock waste stockpiling setbacks from one mile to an area at least one-quarter mile from a neighbors' dwelling.

The Board, Jim Dickerson of Albion News, and approximately twenty interested citizens were present to discuss the proposed zoning regulation amendments.

Kelly Benson provided copies of the current Boone County Zoning Regulation Article 12: A-1 Agricultural-Primary District and the proposed language amendments for the public to review. The County Planning and Zoning Board members have discussed the manure stockpiling issue several times and recommended the proposed amendments to the county zoning regulations to the County Board of Commissioners.

The proposed amendments are to strike in its entirety Article 12: A-1 Agricultural-Primary District, Section 2, 2.21D and Article 13: A-2 Agricultural-Secondary District, Section 2, 2.21D.

The proposed amendments add the following to Article 12: A-1 Agricultural-Primary District, Section 1, 1.9 and Article 13: A-2 Agricultural-Secondary District, Section 1, 1.9: Stockpiling of animal waste manure shall be maintained in an area at least thirteen hundred and twenty (1,320) feet or one-quarter mile from any neighboring residence. Stockpiling of animal manure shall be maintained in a manner as to minimize manure from being carried into any roadway ditch, drainage area or onto a neighbor's property.

The present regulations treat manure stockpiling as a conditional use permit for livestock feeding operations and the setback distances are different for the size of the operation. The proposed amendment moves the stockpiling regulation from Section 2, Conditional Uses to Section 1, Permitted Principal Uses making the setback distance for manure stockpiling one-quarter mile for all sizes of operations.

Mark Jensen explained the County Planning and Zoning Commission Board's thoughts regarding the same setback distance for all sizes of livestock operations and why the board decided the regulation should be changed from a Conditional Use Permit to a Permitted Use.



John Veik spoke on cropland management and that manure is an organic product, therefore the nutrients in a manure stockpile are not available right away.

Tracy and Kim Coakes were concerned with runoff from manure stockpiles and asked about Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) involvement.

Several in attendance spoke in favor of the proposed amendments and appreciated the Board hearing their comments regarding the proposed amendments to the zoning regulations. Some felt that the present written zoning regulations appear to require a conditional use permit hearing each time a producer wants to stockpile manure. Several commented that livestock producers are good stewards of the land; that the livestock industry invented recycling; that manure is an organic product and a valuable commodity; that crops will grow where a manure stockpile sat for a year before removal; that manure is sold for yard/garden use; and that livestock producers may benefit from organic composting in the future.

Arlyn Wilke answered questions regarding NDEQ applications and regulations. Soil samples required by NDEQ are to be from twenty-four inches below the surface to check for soil nutrient leaching. NDEQ does not specifically address the size of manure stockpile. The size of stockpiles would be limited to agronomic rates permitted by NDEQ and waste is to be spread within a year. NDEQ regulations regarding manure stockpiles include a certain distance from wellheads, flowing waters and runoff is to be contained.

Ted Thieman, Ramona Thieman and Mitzi Fox spoke in opposition of the amendments. Thieman stated that concentration and volume is the question. The livestock industry is different today from years ago due to more confined livestock and large stockpiles of waste. Thieman presented and submitted a written testimony for the record regarding opposition to the recommended changes. Thieman proposed the following language changes:

- (1) The modified language should be kept under "Conditional Uses Section 2." There is too much risk to the health, safety and welfare of Boone County citizens to allow this activity to go on without oversight and monitoring.
- (2) The setback distance for livestock manure stockpiling should be proportionally connected to the setback distances of the livestock feeding operation generating the manure.
- (3) Any proposed change should be preceded by, "If stockpiling of animal waste manure is part of the manure management plan."

Thieman feels that NDEQ are not charged with quality of life and ground water issues, just surface water. Ted commended the Zoning Administrator regarding the informational material for the public hearing.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to close said hearing at 9:55 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Commissioner Schuele's observation is that the one-quarter mile setback is not unreasonable, manure stockpile is not offensive except when it is moved, livestock neighbors need to be good stewards and NDEQ regulations help with runoff control. The responsibility is on the producers to comply and make the regulations work.

Commissioner Luettel agreed with Commissioner Schuele's observation.

Commissioner Tisthammer commented that several years ago a one-quarter mile setback from stockpiling would not have worked in the rural area. The change in the rural population reflects fewer farms and larger livestock operations.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to amend and approve the Boone County Zoning Regulations as stated above regarding the Articles listed for livestock waste stockpiling setbacks from one mile to an area at least one-quarter mile from a neighboring residence; and change from a Conditional Use Permit to a Permitted Use within Articles 12 and 13; and prepare a resolution for the next Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, April 9, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board held a public hearing on March 26, 2012 and approved to amend the Boone County Zoning Regulations with regard to stockpiling. The approved amendments are to strike in its entirety Article 12: A-1 Agricultural-Primary District, Section 2, 2.21D and Article 13: A-2 Agricultural-Secondary District, Section 2, 2.21D.

The approved amendments add the following to Article 12: A-1 Agricultural-Primary District, Section 1, 1.9 and Article 13: A-2 Agricultural-Secondary District, Section 1, 1.9: Stockpiling of animal waste manure shall be maintained in an area at least thirteen hundred and twenty (1,320) feet or one-quarter mile from any neighboring residence. Stockpiling of animal manure shall be maintained in a manner as to minimize manure from being carried into any roadway ditch, drainage area or onto a neighbor's property.

The original regulations treated manure stockpiling as a conditional use permit for livestock feeding operations and the setback distances were different for the size of the operation. The approved amendments moves the stockpiling regulation from Section 2, Conditional Uses to Section 1, Permitted Principal Uses making the setback distance for manure stockpiling one-quarter mile for all sizes of operations.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve as presented Resolution No. 2012-11 amending the Boone County Zoning Regulations with regard to stockpiling. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2012-12 to authorize the Boone County Treasurer to transfer the sum of \$100,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund (2700) to the Courthouse Bond Fund (3000) for the 2011-2012 budget. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Boone County Historical Society submitted a request for assistance to advertise the museum with tri-fold color brochures. Questions have surfaced regarding event sponsorships on the County Visitors Promotion application requests. The Board suggested reviewing participant criteria availability.

Tom Krings and Jon Lantz, Applied Connective Technology, presented an enhanced telecommunications solution for the courthouse using new Panasonic technology. The proposed technology is SIP phone lines, one 10mb x 10mb redundant fiber internet connection and upgrade to internet fax lines. The new system provides much faster, more stable internet with built in redundancy. The proposed new phone system is \$25,065.91 or a 60-month payment program total of \$32,954.80. The proposed monthly phone charge of \$1,501.09 excludes the Sheriff 800 number and the 911 system billings. The monthly charge will not vary and includes unlimited long distance. They also proposed an Applied Partner Program Agreement for one year with a monthly maintenance fee of \$375.99. The Board plans to review the material presented before making a decision.

Senator Kate Sullivan reviewed the 2012 Legislative session that concluded on April 18, 2012 with the Board. Senator Sullivan highlighted some of the issues that involved child welfare/prenatal care and the TransCanada Keystone XL pipeline. Senator Sullivan addressed questions regarding school funding, indigent burials, road/bridge funding, and property owner's valuation concerns being inflated by surrounding high land purchases.

Christopher Schroeder requested permission to trench an electrical cable over and across a county road known as 190th Street for irrigation purposes. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed road maintenance and road/bridge projects. The Federal Communications Commission rules will no longer protect unauthorized wideband operations after January 1, 2013. The Narrowbanding compliance deadline is also January 1, 2013. Thorin received a quote of \$6,537.50 payable in the new budget year of July 2012 from Mid-Nebraska Communications, Inc. to upgrade the road department radios for Narrowbanding compliance. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the Mid-Nebraska Communications quote of \$6,537.50 for the Narrowbanding radio upgrade as presented. An Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska, Boone County Fitness Center and Centerstage Danzers for a term from January 1, 2012 to January 1, 2013 has been prepared which provides that the renter agreed to carry general liability insurance coverage. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, April 30, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Nebraska Department of Roads plans to construct highway improvement Project No. STPD-14-3(114), Albion to Petersburg. The construction may involve the obliteration or destruction of land survey corners and witness corners. The State requires the County provide a Registered Land Surveyor to tie out land monuments prior to the construction and tie and remonument after construction. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the Agreement for Project No. STPD-14-3(114) between Boone County, Nebraska and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for surveying services as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed road maintenance, signage and road projects. Thorin updated the Board regarding the Cedar Rapids and Primrose federal aid bridge projects. Thorin received the first shipment of Right of Way (ROW) signs to be placed in the county road right-of-ways. The Board and Thorin discussed obstruction and enforcement of the obstruction to the county road right-of-ways and obstruction within the sight triangles at intersections.

John Christensen, Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) representative, discussed with the Board by teleconference the assessment of the April 14, 2012 hail damage involving county vehicles and road department buildings located in Petersburg. The County has a \$500.00 deductible. Christensen was on site April 25, 2012 to assess the damage to the road department buildings, a sheriff patrol car and the weed department pickup.

Jeff Raugh, Keystone Project representative, presented a map identifying a preferred corridor to avoid the Sandhills in Nebraska. TransCanada has filed a report with the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) identifying a preferred corridor to avoid the Sandhills in Nebraska that includes Holt, Antelope, Boone and Nance Counties. The NDEQ is in charge of reviewing the report and the authority to approve the final route rests with Governor Heineman. The corridor avoids the Sandhills as defined by state and federal agencies and communicated to TransCanada by NDEQ in late December. The route in South Dakota has been approved after a review in that state and will stay the same, defining the entry point for the route in Keya Paha County. There will be a state review in addition to a federal review. TransCanada has worked with local power providers to design electric infrastructure necessary to serve the pipeline. TransCanada moves the product they do not own the oil.

Thorin asked Raugh the effect of construction involving county roads. Raugh replied that the construction crew would bore under the roads with the exception of minimum maintenance roads that they will trench across unless a study shows it heavily used. Thorin inquired why not just build a refinery in Canada. Raugh replied it is less costly to build a pipeline than build a refinery.



NDEQ has started their review and HDR from Omaha is the selected engineer. The completion of the review process is expected in the fall of 2012 and possibly a decision in the first quarter of 2013 with regard to the pipeline project. If the preferred corridor takes place along the eastern portion of Boone County, TransCanada will coordinate maintenance with the wind farms and other facilities.

To date they have not physically been on the property of the new preferred route. They plan to seek permission from landowners this month in order to view the land for the new preferred corridor. Surveyors are out to establish control points for reference in mapping a pipeline route. The pipeline is 36" welded steel pipe with one-half inch thick sidewalls and coated with external corrosion resistance. A hydraulic analysis determines where the pump stations are to be located, unlikely for Boone County to receive a pump station.

NDEQ has set up the following informational meetings in May: O'Neill on the 9th, Neligh on the 10th, Albion on the 16th from 4-7 p.m. at the Boone County Event Center and Central City on the 17th. In addition, there is a website for comments and questions. Go to https://ecmp.nebraska.gov/deq-seis/.

The Board discussed Public Defender services. Chairman Tisthammer is to visit with the County Attorney regarding the services.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, asked the Board Chairman to call for an emergency meeting as the next regular scheduled Board meeting is May 14, 2012. The emergency meeting is to request the Relaxation of Standards on Federal Aid Project No. STPE-2532(1): Petersburg, NE, Raeville asphalt overlay, from the Nebraska Department of Roads, Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards Department. Thorin received notification late on Monday afternoon, April 30, 2012 that the request for a relaxation of standards on said project needed submitting to the Nebraska Department of Roads by Friday, May 4, 2012 to be placed as an agenda item for the Classifications Board meeting scheduled for May 18, 2012.

Boone County is requesting approval from the Local Roads Division to relax standards on the Project No. STPE-2532(1), Control No. 31535, Petersburg Northeast. The proposed project will replace the existing badly deteriorated asphalt surface with new asphaltic concrete on the only surfaced road (110th Street) to Raeville. The road connects Raeville to N-14 approximately 1.5 miles west and 0.5 miles north of Raeville. The project is two miles long with 1.5 miles of the project qualifying for federal funding and the remaining 0.5-mile of the project (the portion in Raeville) funded locally.

It has become necessary during the process of final design to request a Relaxation of Minimum Design Standards from the Board of Classifications and Standards, for shoulder width, foreslope grade, vertical and horizontal alignment. Standards cannot be met at all locations within the limits of the project without violating the Categorical Exclusion (CE) stipulation that no grading will occur outside the hinge points. The CE cannot be amended in time to meet the Federal Buy Out Program deadline, and therefore there would be no federal funds to construct this project if relaxation of the standards is not granted.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2012-20 granting Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, authority to sign a letter requesting Relaxation of Standards for Federal Aid Project No. STPE-2532(1) as presented. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board discussed the Boone County Ambulance Service with Randall Bruland, County Ambulance Administrator and Donald Casper, an assistant driver. The 2010 County Ambulance is back in service following repair from damages sustained in a November 2011 accident. The ambulance unit drives great down the road with some minor repairs yet to be fixed. Bruland said the tire, seatbelt/holder and the sensor lights are scheduled for repair in the coming week. The slight whistling on the driver side will probably not disappear unless the cab is replaced with a new cab. The minor items are fixable and not everything is always perfect. The Board felt that they have a serviceable ambulance with the decision they made by repairing the damaged 2010 Ambulance that was bought new and had only been in use a year, when it was in the accident. The Board expressed that they do not appreciate personnel downgrading the County Board's decision to repair the unit instead of buying another new unit and downgrading the repair work by the company in Iowa. If a driver or medical personnel are not comfortable driving or riding in the 2010 County Ambulance, then the Board asks that one remove their name from the list of attendants to operate the County Ambulance. The Board asked the whereabouts of the cot that was purchased new in 2007 since the insurance company paid for a new cot in 2012. Casper said that the Albion Fire Department has possession of the 2007 cot and that it has issues.

Joyce Sock, Assessor, presented a Contract for Appraisal Services with Stanard Appraisal Services, Inc. of Central City, Nebraska for the Board to review. Sock informed the Board that a complete appraisal review is preferred every six years regarding commercial property. It is necessary to properly equalize property values in the county. The appraisal review is for 342 parcels of commercial properties in Boone County that have not received an update since 2003. The Contract established completion date of February 15, 2013 for the towns of St. Edward and Albion and February 15, 2014 for the towns of Petersburg, Cedar Rapids and Primrose. Compensation to Stanard Appraisal is \$56,430.00 based on 342 commercial parcels and any parcels in addition to the 342 will be billed at the rate of \$165.00 per parcel for the commercial properties. The compensation to be paid shall be \$15,000.00 before June 30, 2012 and the balance of \$41,430.00 paid in 24 equal payments of \$1,765.25 through June 1, 2014. • Presented Regulation 2012-01, Prevention of Public Health Nuisances and Insanitary Conditions. Regulation 2012-01 is still in the reviewing process with changes likely following review by the four County Boards and legal personnel. The purpose of the regulation is to remedy or prevent unsanitary or nuisance conditions that may affect the ECDHD area. The East-Central District Health Department consists of Boone, Colfax, Nance and Platte Counties.





- Presented the 2011 Annual and 2012 First Quarter reports and reviewed them with the Board.
- Rayman and the Board discussed the primary health needs identified at the Boone County Area Health Needs Assessment meeting held on June 7, 2012. The health needs identified for preventing and/or reducing were youth drug and alcohol use, cancer prevention, mental health treatment, reducing childhood obesity and bullying. ECDHD helps direct resources to meet these needs. Schuele commented that groups were formed at the June meeting to address the identified health needs for Boone County. Statistics show that Boone County ranks very high with regard to youth substance abuse. Rayman commented that marijuana is the new alcohol youth are using.
- ECDHD emphasizes radon testing of homes as a tool for cancer prevention. Radon test results are showing Boone County at a very high level of radon above the acceptable level amount. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer.
- ECDHD offers mental health services and staffs a full time psychiatrist.
- ECDHD received grants for construction of a new building in Columbus to be completed in 2015. The new building will be located near Columbus Community Hospital.

The Board and County Clerk reviewed language for preparation of a resolution regarding county credit card procedures. A resolution for approval by the Board will be placed on the June 25, 2012 agenda.

Bernard Batenhorst, Pit Manager for Central Sand and Gravel Company, presented gravel prices that take effect July 1, 2012 for the pits located in Columbus, Genoa and Grand Island. Batenhorst said it was a 5% increase from the 2010 prices. The Board, Batenhorst and Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, discussed gravel prices, availability of gravel in Nebraska and the EPA/government regulations in areas of wetlands that make it near impossible to open a new gravel pit.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed road maintenance and road/bridge projects. Thorin said that today road reconstruction begins on County Project No. 328 two miles South of Cedar Rapids on 170th Avenue. The vibrating compactor discussed at previous meetings for the county road department to use on some county roads, before a decision is made to purchase the equipment, has not arrived as of today. The repeater presently in the road department will not convert to narrowband in order to use the new radios. A complete updated radio digital system may cost over \$20,000.00. MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS ZONING-APPLICATION FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

A motion made by the Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, Jerry L. Tisthammer and second by Commissioner Tom Schuele to call to order a public hearing on Monday, July 16, 2012 at 10:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Notice of the hearing was published in advance and said hearing was open to the public. Present for roll call were Commissioners Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele, Ken Luettel and Planning and Zoning Administrator, Kelly Benson.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions in relation thereto the application for Conditional Use Permit by Keith and Morgan Mogensen and The Maschhoffs. The information submitted for the Board of Commissioners agenda reads that the permit application is to apply liquid manure from the SW1/4 of 29-18-8 to farm ground located in the S1/2 of 28-18-8, all located in Boone County, Nebraska.

The applicants, Keith Mogensen, Morgan Mogensen and The Maschhoffs, LLC, filed an Application for Conditional Use with Boone County Zoning office dated June 25, 2012 and paid the application fee on June 14, 2012. Keith Mogensen and Morgan Mogensen are the property owners of the real estate (S1/2 of 28-18-8) as referenced on the application. The Application for Conditional Use is made for the purpose (to bury plastic pipe from hog facility to two center pivots).

The application was approved with the following: Conditions and requirements pending approval of application for a proposed operation and waste disposal plan from the DEQ or other applicable State Agency, Boone County Planning and Zoning Commission requirements are as stated in the minutes. The attached minutes are of the June 25, 2012 Boone County Planning and Zoning Commission hearing.

Kelly Benson, Zoning Administrator, and Morgan Mogensen, Applicant, and Gale Schaefer, representing The Maschhoffs, LLC explained that all parties signing the application are responsible for the permit. Schaefer explained that Mogensens' recently purchased the S1/2 of 28-18-8 and are developing the land. The Maschhoffs, LLC already spread liquid waste from a lagoon located in the SW1/4 of 29-18-8 through center pivots in the area on four parcels of land and that the additional two quarters would provide a wider base to spread the liquid waste. Schaefer said that the liquid waste nutrients would benefit Mogensens as they develop the crop ground. Schaefer answered questions regarding management plans for effluent applications, crop rotation effect on effluent application amount and yearly inspection of the hog unit. Schaefer explained that The Maschhoffs, LLC have a computer tracking system of the facilities and are able to control/shut down pivots electronically through the managers cell phones and have their own environmental department.

Mogensen answered questions regarding the settling basins (buffer strips), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) requirements, timeline planned for completing buffers/spill way drainage, and fall crop. The NRCS helped with the designs based on a ten-year moisture event for construction of the settling basin structures. Mogensen agreed to a five-year application of the manure/liquid waste from The Maschhoffs, LLC livestock operation. Only waste from The Maschhoffs, LLC facility is to be spread on said property and no manure will be stockpiled on Mogensens' property.



Jim Vanderloop, nearby property owner, expressed his concerns for the property owners down stream in the Timber Creek watershed. Vanderloop said down stream will pay the price for contaminated water and runoff from the newly developed farm ground. Vanderloop has contacted Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) to discuss lack of compliance with their regulations in the area.

The Board expressed their concerns regarding runoff to the Timber Creek. The permit is to be reviewed in five years to determine if all conditions are being met and effective. The Board expressed to Mogensen to take the extra steps to prevent runoff and comply with all the regulations. The Board added an additional condition to the Planning and Zoning Commission's conditions, to add a fourth settling basin (buffer strip) on the East edge of M5, before any waste applications are applied to the newly developed farm ground. The County Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the request with conditions.

MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners made a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, July 30, 2012, at 1:00 P.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska, second by Commissioner Schuele to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in support of, protest against, and to answer questions concerning whether the consolidation of the Clerk of the District Court and County Clerk's offices for Boone County should be submitted to the registered voters for approval at the next General Election.

Chairman Tisthammer explained that the Board had been considering this for some time and that with the recent trend in Nebraska over the last two years of counties consolidating certain offices to simplify and reduce government, felt it was time to proceed to the next step.

Ellen Hirsch, Clerk of the District Court, indicated that the duties stated in the published notice did not accurately reflect the duties of her office. Hirsch indicated that her office duties include maintaining all filings in civil cases; domestic relation cases, including dissolutions, paternity, child support and custody; protection orders, both harassment and domestic relations; felony cases; and appeals from County Court and Small Claims Court. In addition, Clerk of the District Court acts as acceptance agents for obtaining passports but has nothing to do with issuing the passports, and is also the jury commissioner for the county. Hirsch indicated that her office does work with child support enforcement but does very little as far as collection since the State of Nebraska and not the Boone County Attorney, is in charge of enforcement.

Hirsch indicated that while the consolidation will not personally affect her since she will be retiring at the end of her term, that it should be noted that a Deputy Clerk of the District Court is necessary in order to sign certain documents. She felt that the Deputy Clerk of the District Court should remain the Deputy.

Carolyn Fross, former Deputy Clerk of the District Court and taxpayer, had the following concerns:

- Reiterated the need for a Deputy Clerk of the District Court since the distance between the two offices
 within the courthouse would make it hard to maintain privacy for protection orders if citizens were
 required to go from one office to another to obtain a signature.
- Fross brought up the fact that the County Clerk and her staff often work after 5 P.M. and that if it was necessary to do so in order to complete the work of the County Clerk, then how did the Board expect them to also do the work of the Clerk of the District Court. Commissioner Schuele indicated that in addition to the County Clerk and her staff, there would be a full-time employee located in the Clerk of the District Court's office as well.
- Fross asked the Board why the public meeting was scheduled for 1:00 P.M. when only retired persons could attend. She felt the meeting should be held when working citizens would have the opportunity to be present. Commissioner Schuele indicated that the meeting was to gather input and determine whether the issue should be put on the ballot and that if the issue did go to the voters of Boone County, then informational meetings would be held at various times in order to reach as many voters as possible.

Shirley Petsche, concerned citizen and former Boone County Economic Development Director from 2001-2008, read a statement indicating that in her opinion the office does not require two full-time employees and recommended that the issue be put to the vote of the people. Petsche indicated that her comments were no





reflection on the staff of the office but felt due to economic reasons and population decline that the offices should be consolidated.

Lisa Langan, Clerk Magistrate, indicated that she agreed that two full-time employees were not necessary, however, it would be necessary that trained staff be available and questioned whether the County Clerk or her staff would have time to take the necessary training in order to meet the education requirements.

Lorrie Nicklasson, Deputy County Clerk, indicated that while a definite plan was premature due to the fact that it is unknown whether the voters would approve such a consolidation and the fact that there would be another election in 2014 which could result in a change in personnel in the County Clerk's Office before any consolidation would take place in January, 2015, that it was hoped that one full-time employee would be able to take care of the duties of the Clerk of the District Court except for regular court days and trials or when there were staff issues such as vacation or sick leave. In those particular instances, then the County Clerk staff would supplement or fill in for the Court staff. In addition, Nicklasson stated that if the measure were to pass, that it would not be implemented until January, 2015, and that cross-training could occur in the two year interim between the offices.

Shelley Towey, current Deputy Clerk of the District Court, indicated that at this time she had no opinion until she knew more about what plan would be put in place.

Commissioner Schuele indicated that currently there are 38 counties that have an ex-officio Clerk of the District Court. He stated that he had visited several of those counties and that there were four counties within close proximity. He inquired as to how they handle the matter of Clerk of the District Court. He said that each county did something a little different and that if the consolidation passed, then the matter would need to be researched within the two year interim to be sure it was correctly implemented. He said currently it was his understanding from the NACO attorney that there could only be one deputy position. Hirsch responded saying that regardless of the title, that the person who will be running the District Court should be compensated adequately to reflect her duties and responsibilities. Commissioner Schuele concurred and stated that while there was no set number for adequate compensation that it was in the County's best interests to provide a competitive wage to keep good people. Commissioner Schuele indicated that it was necessary to streamline employment and cut administrative costs in order to provide competitive wages.

Sheriff Spiegel indicated that the consolidation of offices is becoming more common and indicated that the day is coming when such consolidation of services would affect law enforcement. Spiegel indicated that he felt the Board should proceed with the consolidation of the offices provided it resulted in increased efficiency and no disruption of services.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to close said hearing at 1:40 P.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to submit to the voters of Boone County, Nebraska, to consolidate the offices of Clerk of the District Court and Boone County Clerk for approval at the upcoming General Election. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, July 30, 2012, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board Proceedings of July 23, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the 2012 Boone County Board of Equalization Proceedings, July 23, 2012 Board of Equalization Proceedings and July 25, 2012 Board of Equalization Proceedings as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Gene Atwood, Albion, Nebraska, met with the Board regarding concerns he had relating to his land valuation. Mr. Atwood was concerned that he was being taxed for 6 acres of road and had questions regarding land classifications/soil types. He indicated that he had spoke with the County Assessor and that he felt the matters had been resolved. No action was taken by the Board.

Jeffrey C. Jarecki, Attorney at Law, met with the Board and reviewed the Agreement prepared regarding his employment as Public Defender for Boone County. Jarecki indicated that the Agreement was acceptable as prepared. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to hire Jeffrey C. Jarecki as Public Defender for Boone County and to authorize the Board Chairman to sign an Agreement with Jarecki for Public Defender services. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jarecki also discussed with the Board the matter of certain real estate that was deeded directly to the Boone County Hospital in the past and the fact that the hospital is not an existing entity and not capable of owning real property. Jarecki presented the Board with three Corrective Quitclaim Deeds for their review and signature. The Board reviewed the deeds and indicated that the matter would be put on the agenda for August 13, 2012, after review by the County Attorney.

Board discussed the matter of a new phone system for the courthouse. Schuele indicated that any expenditure for a new phone system should be included in this year's budget and paid for out of the inheritance tax fund. The Board agreed that they needed additional information regarding the proposal submitted by Applied Connective Technologies before proceeding but needed to provide for any expenditure in this budget year. The Board requested that this be put on the agenda for August 13, 2012 for further discussion.





Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to go into an executive session at 9:50 A.M. for the prevention of needless injury to an individual, if such individual has not requested a public meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Board, Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and Billy Frey, Road Foreman discussed personnel issues. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to come out of executive session at 10:37 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Motion carried. Disciplinary action was approved against more than one unnamed County Road employee. Reason for the disciplinary action was not stated.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and Billy Frey, Road Foreman, updated the Board regarding the following:

- Thorin indicated that all the documentation had been found with regard to the projects currently being audited. The information was located at Kirkham-Michael and had been submitted to the Nebraska Department of Roads for review last week and will then be forwarded to Federal Highway.
- Frey told the board that approximately 7000 lbs of shingles had been dumped on a county road located by South Branch Church on or around Sunday, July 22nd. The shingles were removed and taken to Newman Grove at a cost to the county of \$94.50. Frey indicated that he reported this to the Sheriff's Office.
- The topic of planting in the road right-of-ways was again discussed. Thorin indicated that there were some instances of this happening again this year. Schuele stated that perhaps the county needs to be tougher when enforcing this and do things similar to what the State of Nebraska does.

The Board conducted a quarterly visit of the county jail. It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county once during each of its sessions in January, April, July and October of each year per Nebraska State Statute 47-109.

The Board and John Morgan, County Attorney, discussed correspondence that was forwarded to the Board by Pam Bourne which she received from the County Attorney's office regarding two matters. Ms. Bourne is an attorney with NIRMA who represents the County on employee issues. The correspondence dealt with the following:

- Inquired as to whom pays for her services when the County contacts her for legal services and what had been spent to date on such services. Commissioner Schuele indicated that her services are provided by NIRMA, however, when she was present at the Commissioners' meeting regarding employee handbook issues, the County was responsible for and paid her legal fees on that occasion.
- Elimination of the "office manager" job title as a result of the recent County Employee Handbook update. Commissioner Tisthammer explained how the "office manager" job title came about. John Morgan indicated that he was aware that his employee was going to be contacting Ms. Bourne with her concerns but did not know the content of the correspondence until just recently. Commissioner Schuele commented that the information contained in the correspondence was second-hand information inasmuch as neither the County Attorney nor his staff was present at the meeting when this matter was discussed. Furthermore, the elimination of the "office manager" position did not result in a decrease in pay for this particular employee. The Commissioners recommended to the County Attorney that he make an effort to be present at the Commissioners' meeting when they meet with the elected officials and department heads in order to obtain accurate information that can be passed onto the employee. In addition, Commissioner Schuele further stated that it was the decision of the County Board and not the County Clerk to eliminate the "office manager" job title. Commissioner Schuele indicated that the County Attorney should deal with the situation and no further action was required.



Miscellaneous Public Comments:

- Chairman Schuele indicated that in order for the ballot measure to consolidate the offices of County Clerk and Clerk of the District Court to succeed it will be necessary to educate the people and indicated that this should be done without using government time or resources.
- Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, informed the Board that Boone County is the only dispatch center in Nebraska where OnStar requests are transferred directly to the County Sheriff's office. Sheriff Spiegel thanked the County Board for making the resources available to keep the 911 Center up to date and Sheryl Machacek for her work.
- No further update regarding the Majerus horse situation. The next deadline is August 10th to further reduce the number of animals. Sheriff Spiegel indicated that he had received calls from people offering to donate hay and that those donation requests had been forwarded to the Humane Society.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 1:53 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 13, 2012.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Tom Krings and Jon Lantz, Applied Connective Technology, presented an enhanced telecommunications solution for the courthouse using new Panasonic technology at the April 23, 2012 Board meeting. The Board reviewed the material regarding the proposed technology upgrade using SIP phone lines, one 10mb x 10mb redundant fiber internet connection and internet fax lines. The new system provides much faster, more stable internet with built in redundancy. The proposed new phone system is \$25,065.91 or a 60-month payment program total of \$32,954.80. The proposed monthly phone charge of \$1,501.09 excludes the Sheriff's 800 number and the 911 system billings. The monthly charge will not vary and includes unlimited long distance. They also proposed an Applied Partner Program Agreement for one year with a monthly maintenance fee of \$375.99. The Board asked Krings and Lantz several questions regarding the proposed new telephone system. The Board and Krings discussed the disadvantage for rural and small communities across the United States with regard to bandwidth infrastructure in providing faster internet connections. Great Plains Communications has installed fiber optic cable close to Albion and Krings felt they might work with them to use their bandwidth. The monthly maintenance covers hardware, software and trip/mileage charges. The Board said it sounds like a very complex system, Krings replied that the new system is easy to use. The Board felt they should obtain another competitive bid proposal before making a decision.

Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, and the Board discussed various issues.

Laurie Krohn, County Treasurer, discussed with the Board her request to purchase two new computers for the office. Krohn received quotes from MIPS and Applied Connective Technologies. The two main computers need to be compatible for sharing programs and information. The Applied Connective Technologies quote for Dell equipment with 2010 software is \$1,300.00 for each computer. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. Chairman Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Rod Nelson, Maintenance, informed the group that Green Fiber would continue to pickup shredded paper. Nelson also explained a recycling promotion being set up by Green Fiber.
- Department heads were reminded that their respective office inventory is due August 24, 2012 in the County Clerk's office and are to reflect the purchases/deletions for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.
- Department heads were reminded to file all Interlocal Agreements with the County Clerk's office, as the Clerk's office needs to report them to the State Auditor of Public Accounts.
- Lisa Langan, County Court, informed the group that two judges that presently serve Boone County are retiring. There is no longer a floater employee to help cover Boone/Nance County Courts, which means when both court personnel are absent on the same day the offices will be closed.
- The employees present discussed a new proposed phone system submitted by Applied Connective Technologies. Several questions regarding the new system such as monitoring long distance calls; faster internet connections; and Boone/Nance County Court's lines to be able to receive forwarding calls for each other.

Joyce Sock, Assessor, discussed storage cabinets for the Assessor's office use to be located in the computer/back room connected to the Assessor's office with the Board. Sock said after the renovation the Assessor's office did not receive any storage improvements and actually lost space in the computer/back room. Sock would like to have a counter built so that the new cadastral maps would be able to lie out and have less handling to prevent damage to the new books. The Board asked Sock to obtain bids and present them at a future Board meeting.

The Board, Dave Spiegel, Sheriff and Jan Zurcher, Emergency Manager, discussed a letter received from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement. The letter is concerning Juvenile Services County Aid funding (non-competitive) as well as other competitive juvenile justice grant funds through the Nebraska Crime Commission. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding county road and bridge projects. A milling machine is scheduled to arrive August 21, 2012 to begin the project west of Petersburg. The Cedar Rapids bridge and Petersburg (Raeville road) projects are waiting on the environmental review from Nebraska Department of Roads. The landowners involved with the Primrose project are requesting compensation for the right-of-ways. Thorin was not able to obtain any of the millings from the State Highway 14 Albion to Petersburg renovation. Werner Construction indicated to Thorin that they might have to obtain millings elsewhere as there will not be enough millings to relay three layers back on State Highway 14.

The Board and Thorin discussed at length the mowing of ditches running along landowner's property. It is by Nebraska State Statute Section 39-1811, the duty of the landowners to mow all ditches running along their lands at least twice each year. The Board and Thorin commented that some landowners take care of the ditch mowing very well while other landowner ditches never appear mowed even one time. The Board and Thorin discussed alternatives such as contracting the mowing and attaching the unpaid invoice to the real estate tax payments. Thorin will check into contract fees for mowing the ditches that landowners are not taking care of and the protocol for charging the contracted fees to the landowner.

Thorin presented armor coating proposals for the Board to review. The 2012 armor coat project includes approximately 5.3 miles for the cemetery, fairgrounds, golf course and Petersburg west roads. Thorin and the Board discussed the proposals. Thorin is a Class A Licensed County Highway Superintendent, a licensed Street Superintendent and a full time employee for the County of Boone. Thorin is a full time salaried employee of Boone County and Thorin will be an independent consultant/contractor with the City of Albion pursuant to the approved Interlocal Agreement. All parties on an annual basis shall review the Interlocal Agreement. The Board and Richard Martinsen, CPA, worked on the 2012-2013 County Budget. The budget request amounts submitted by the county offices total \$3,637,630.00, which is an increase of \$179,422.00 more than the 2011-2012, adopted budget. The proposed budget includes a \$300,000.00 transfer from Inheritance Tax Fund to the Road Fund in order to buy down the increased percentage to 5.188%. The Board and Martinsen discussed transferring of funds of \$300,000.00 from Inheritance Tax (2700) to Road (0200); \$50,000.00 from Inheritance Tax (2700) to Courthouse Bond (3000); and \$100,000.00 left in the Courthouse Building (4000) to the Courthouse Bond (3000). The proposed \$450,000.00 transfer of funds would make the county levy estimated at .29235 for 2012-2013. The County 2011-2012 levy was .311368. Commissioner Schuele said by using the Inheritance Tax dollars as a transfer to other funds it decreases the asking dollar amount and lowers the county tax levy.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS 2012-2013 COUNTY BUDGET

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, September 10, 2012 at 11:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Schuele to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Richard Martinsen, CPA was present to answer budget questions. Chairman Tisthammer read the notice for the record.

The public hearing was for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2012-2013 Boone County proposed budget in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Sections 13-501 to 13-513. Also, to set the final tax request for the 2012-2013 Boone County proposed budget at a different amount than the prior year tax request in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Section 77-1601.02 The hearing was open for one hour and the proposed budget was published in the September 5, 2012 issue of the Albion News.

The County Board and Albion News representative discussed with Martinsen the differences from last fiscal year's budget in the areas of asking dollar increase, land valuation, tax rate and property tax requirement. Martinsen answered and explained the questions with regard to the proposed budget and publication. The proposed property tax request for 2012-2013 is \$3,585,619.00, which is an increase of \$127,411.00 from fiscal year 2011-2012. The proposed tax rate for 2012 of 0.292361 is lower than the 2011 tax rate of 0.311368 due to increased valuation. It takes a 75% vote to exceed the additional 1% lid. The levy authority of 50 cents includes the County levy and all the entities such as Agricultural/Historical Societies, Fire Districts, etc. added together. The County allowable levy limit is 45 cents of the 50 cents; Boone County is currently at .292361. The 2012 County valuation is \$1,226,437,534.00 compared to the 2011 valuation of \$1,110,651,547.00, an increase of \$115,785,987.00.

The 2012-2013 County Budget adopted has an expense increase of 3.684% more than the 2011-2012 fiscal year budget requests. The majority of the County Budget increase reflects the proposed Courthouse renovation project over a 10-year period, road fund, various cost of living wage increases and reappraisal fund for a complete revaluation of commercial properties.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to close said public hearing at 12:00 Noon. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Discussion: The county tax rate will be 0.292361. If it were not for the use of inheritance tax dollars, the county rate would be increased to 0.320898 in order to maintain the current level of services that are both mandated under state law and that our county taxpayers deserve and expect.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve exceeding the lid by an additional 1% growth for fiscal year 2012-2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

- Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, reported that Petersburg Fire Department started installation of the E911 resident address signage in their respective area.
- Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, informed the group the East-Central District Health Department (ECDHD) plans to install a MedReturn Drug Collection Unit in the Boone County Sheriff's office. The secured MedReturn Drug Collection Unit collects unwanted or expired household medicine and prescription medication. The collection units keep medicine away from our children and out of our water supply. ECDHD will release more information when the MedReturn Drug Collection Unit is installed.
- Lisa Langan, County Court, informed the group that the Boone County Court office will be closed September 19-21, 2012 while she attends the annual statewide County Court officials meeting.
- Commissioner Schuele reminded department heads that office inventory items need to remain on an inventory until it is no longer in county possession. If the item is in storage it still needs to be logged on inventory.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding county road and bridge projects. An educational presentation and training seminar for road equipment operators is scheduled for October 25, 2012 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Boone County Fairgrounds with Nebraska Machinery Company. Thorin said that other counties are invited to attend.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, submitted for review and approval the annual Standardized System of Annual Reporting (SSAR). The annual report is submitted to the Board of Public Roads Classification and Standards pursuant to Neb. Rev. Statute 39-2510. The report includes a cost per mile/hour for the road department equipment. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the annual SSAR report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2012 as presented. The motor grader has received visible replacement parts, but the engine keeps missing and there is excessive smoke during operation. The next step is to either overhaul the engine or purchase a different one. The Board and Thorin reviewed an estimate from NMC (CAT) of Norfolk for \$23,387.75 to overhaul the engine. The Petersburg Community Club Punkin Chunkin Committee requested assistance to advertise the annual Punkin Chunkin event scheduled for October 28, 2012. The Board; Dave Spiegel, Sheriff; Denny Johnson, Deputy Sheriff; John Morgan, County Attorney; Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent; Jim Dickerson, Albion News: and Ross Knott discussed the horses/livestock owned by Jim Majerus in right-of-ways, running at large and the lack of containment. Majerus' poor fences allow his horses/livestock to continuously endanger the public roadways. Spiegel and Morgan said that the livestock being out is not a criminal matter but it is a hazard. It may be possible to file a civil law suit for repair of the fences.

Ross Knott submitted copies of Nebraska Revised Statutes Chapter 23-174.10, 28-1008 to 28-1017, 28-1019, and 28-1020. Boone County has zoning regulations and Section 23-174.10 refers to regulations that the county board, by resolution, may enact to promote public health, safety and welfare. The 23-1008 through 28-1020 refers to abandoned and cruelly neglected animals; penalty for one knowingly neglects an animal; violations; and liability for expenses. Knott asked that the Board discuss with the County Planning and Zoning Commission to review the statutes and develop regulations regarding conditions of fences and livestock, subject to penalties or assessment of services attached to the landowner property. It is time to put some teeth into enforcement of the regulations already in place.

Thorin has started paper work with Morgan to clean and retrieve the county road right-of-way from Majerus, with no more extensions granted. Majerus has had several years to construct a fence and several notices to remove his materials from the county road right-of-way. Thorin said statutorily the road department can clear the county road right-of-way, but cannot go onto a landowner's private property to remove and rebuild a fence. Thorin has many pictures of the right-of-way destruction. Thorin will take pictures of each item removed before and after to document the county road right-of-way if it comes to the county removing the materials.

The Sheriff's office has received many complaints regarding this matter. Johnson suggested that photos be taken for documentation each time the horses/livestock are out on the county roads. The Board will place the matter on the Planning and Zoning Commission agenda. Morgan is to research fence regulations from other counties and prepare a draft of a regulation for the Planning and Zoning Commission's review.

The main idea here is to protect the public that travels county roads from livestock that is continuously roaming the county roads. The majority of the residents are good neighbors and take care of their livestock and property. Zoning regulation would provide concrete and tangible rules for enforcement that would back up the law enforcement, court actions and fines assessed to landowner's property. If a zoning regulation is passed, one needs to remember to draft the language to address a chronic situation not an occasional incident.

The Department Heads are to review their respective office regarding the power point and present changes to Steve Pritchard, UNL Extension Educator. The Department Heads are to review their respective office regarding the scavenger hunt and present changes to the County Clerk's office.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding county road maintenance and projects. The Board and Thorin discussed county road right-of-ways. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and the Board reviewed the road/bridge maintenance, repair and signage report for the month of November 2012. Thorin updated the Board regarding the road/bridge projects. Thorin received an engineering services proposal from Kirkham Michael for review. Thorin and the Board decided not to sign the engineering services agreement. They felt it is in the best interest to review each road project separately.

Seven concerned citizens discussed the horse/livestock situation west of Petersburg with the Board. Also in attendance were Denny Johnson, Deputy Sheriff; Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent; Jim Dickerson, Albion News and Jim Majerus, land/livestock owner. Glen Jochem was not present at the Board meeting and according to Majerus some of the starving horses belong to Jochem. Majerus heard the complaints and concerns from the public regarding fences and starving horses/livestock on his property. Ted Thieman said this is not an overnight problem; it has been an ongoing 20-30 year problem with fences that are not good enough to keep livestock off the county roads and is now compounded with starving horses/livestock. Majerus said that he had a veterinarian out from Madison that checked the horses and said the majority are in good shape. Majerus said he has talked to Ed Naughtin about building fences. Tricia Griffith said it is the worse case of horse/livestock starvation in years. Tisthammer directed a question to Majerus concerning the horse that he put down on December 2, 2012 that did not have enough energy to move off the county road. Linda Pelster directed several questions to Majerus regarding the horse he put down, feed, fences and livestock starvation. Majerus answers seemed conflicting as first it was an older horse of his, second the horse belonged to Jochem and the third time Majerus said that someone dropped the horse off on his property. Pelster said many would not make it through the cold winter weather in their present condition. Pelster said she felt the Board would try to keep Boone County from receiving any more press like that earlier in the year when the Humane Society showed up to seize horses from the Majerus property. The group felt the County Attorney should have filed charges long before now as Majerus received a letter stating the horses need to be removed by August 10, 2012; another letter for removal by September 1, 2012 and now it is December 10, 2012 with the same problem at the same residence. Gail Starman expressed her concerns regarding road safety with livestock constantly in the roadway. Ramona Thieman expressed her thoughts to Majerus regarding the ongoing situation.

Tisthammer had copies of papers showing charges filed in County Court against James P. Majerus and Glen F. Jochem on December 6, 2012 and charges also filed in District Court against James P. Majerus. Majerus kept asking for March 1, 2013 to dispose of the horses. The group informed Majerus that talking is done; since he has had plenty of time to correct the problems. It is now time for action and removal of the horses/livestock.

It was the consensus of the group present, Majerus and the Board, that water is needed at all times. A neutral veterinarian with horse background will check the health of all horses/livestock on Jim Majerus property and Majerus pays the veterinarian expenses. A deputy sheriff and/or Commissioner will be present when the veterinarian is on the property to conduct the livestock inspection. The Board was asked to research their options for outside attorney assistance when it appears the County Attorney is not doing his job.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings and Board of Equalization Proceedings of November 26, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Brenda Wilson of GIS Workshop, Inc. gave a presentation to the Board, Zoning Administrator and Assessor's office. Wilson said grant funds have been available through the Nebraska State Resources Board to promote





and help install GIS systems in the counties. Wilson writes the grants for the counties. If the county receives grant funds, GIS receives the funds and deducts the amount from the county's contract. GIS services are located in all but eleven of Nebraska counties. The foundation of a GIS system is in the County Assessor's office. GIS features more accurate digital mapping, aerial photography and data software that has the capability to analyze land use calculation, parcel boundary land use type and soil types. A GIS system may expand to assist the road, zoning, emergency management, weed and other offices. The GIS programs would replace the Agri Data program currently used by the Assessors' office. The Board asked Wilson to submit a proposal for review at the December 20, 2012 Board meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Employees present were reminded of the annual Nebraska Counties "Do a Good Deed-Feed Those in Need" food drive that ends November 20, 2012. The donations collected during the food drive challenge are delivered to the local county food banks.
- The Board commended the officials and department heads effort and preparation for County Government Day that took place on November 14, 2012 and felt that the day was informative and went well for all of those in attendance.

Ralph Schmadeke, Schmadeke Inc Insurance and Riley Tonkins, Employers Mutual Casualty Company (EMC), met with the Board to discuss bid letting when the time comes for the county to renew their liability, property, crime, workers compensation, etc. insurance coverage. Schmadeke provided insurance for the County prior to the County of Boone becoming a member of the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) in 1988. Dennis Michael requested permission to bore an electrical line for irrigation purposes under a county road known as Old Mill Road. The request commences from a utility pole located on the North side of Old Mill Road in the SW1/4 of Section 16, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, and running thence to an irrigation well located in the NW1/4 of Section 21, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2012-47, granting permission to bore an electrical line under Old Mill Road as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Luettel. Motion carried.

Ronald Coakes requested permission to trench an electrical line and 6" water line for irrigation purposes over and across a county road known as Y Road. The electrical line request commences from a utility pole on the Northeast side of Y Road and running thence Southwesterly to a pivot; and the water line is to run from a well on the Southwest side of Y Road running thence Northeasterly to a pivot. Both the electrical and water lines to be contained in the same trench. The Nebraska Legislature scheduled an Inheritance Tax Interim Study Hearing for Friday, November 30, 2012. County officials are encouraged to attend a hearing of the Legislature's Revenue Committee to present ideas for





alternative sources of revenue if inheritance taxes are eliminated. The hearing is part of LR 644, an interim study introduced by the Revenue Committee. Because counties could lose \$48 million or more if inheritance taxes are eliminated, all ideas for replacement revenue, large or small, are encouraged. The Boone County Board of Commissioners wishes to express their opposition to the elimination of inheritance tax funding for counties. The 2012 Boone County tax rate of 0.292361 is one of the lowest in the state. The property tax rate for fiscal year 2012-2013 would be four cents higher if it was not for the use of the Inheritance Tax Fund. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to submit letters as written to Senator Kate Sullivan and Nebraska Association of County Officials, as written testimony for the hearing on November 30, 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of November 19, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board, John Morgan, County Attorney, and Joyce Sock, Assessor discussed the letter from Rembolt Ludtke, LLP, attorneys for Jim Pillen/GGP Partners. The Board, Assessor and Treasurer discussed the letter at the November 19, 2012 Board meeting and felt that the County Attorney should provide a letter in response. The letter disputes the 2008, 2009 and 2010 back taxes/penalties charged against the facility. Apparently, real estate tax statements were issued but no property tax was assessed on the real estate improvements in question for 2008, 2009 and 2010. The Assessor's office mailed a letter in October 2008 requesting the dimensions and contents of the improvements in question and received no response. The file in the Zoning office contains a Conditional Use Permit issued with amended extensions but no building permit. It appears that there are several protocol procedures and responsibility errors on both sides of the issue. There are several statutory regulations involved regarding the taxes/penalties. Morgan is to meet with Rembolt Ludtke, LLP to sort through the regulations/responsibilities and negotiate the issue.

The Board met with Richard Martinsen, CPA, to discuss the bond levy portion of the Cedar Rapids Public School District No. 6 budget that was set in 2011 for the fiscal year 2011-2012. The County Treasurer's office called attention to the issue because of the December 15, 2012 bond payment being \$197,087.50 and the collections in the County Treasurer's office being \$160,834.45. The bond payment fund is presently short by \$36,253.05. The firm of Pekny & Associates, PC prepared the budget for Cedar Rapids Public School District. Martinsen apologized for the error when calculating the fiscal year 2011-2012 bond levy. The bond budgeted figure on Schedule C is what Martinsen picked up verses the bond budgeted figure on page 3 making the difference in the levy percentage for the bond payment. Martinsen discussed the issue by phone with the accountant from Pekny & Associates that prepared the budget for Cedar Rapids Public School. The last payment of the 20-year bond is due December 15, 2015. The accountant informed Martinsen that the school district has enough money on hand to cover the \$36,253.05 for December 2012 payment and that the school is to send a check to the County Treasurer when it is time to make the bond payment. The Board told Martinsen that we are all human and allowed a few errors. If there is ever a good time to make a mistake, it was now as it is a positive mistake, since the school has enough funds to pay off the bonds. The school plans to pay off the bonds in its entirety in December 2013.





The County Safety Committee met at 1:00 P.M. to discuss routine business.

Miscellaneous Public Comments:

- Dave Spiegel, Sheriff, discussed various issues with the Board.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Cedar Rapids Community Club requested assistance to advertise the Community Club Santa Claus Day event scheduled for December 15, 2012. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Ambulance Service submitted two uncollectible ambulance accounts, as all methods of collection have been exhausted. The recommendation for the June 2012 account of \$1,120.00 and July 2012 account of \$2,550.00 for ambulance services is to turn the files over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to write-off the uncollectible ambulance accounts in the sum of \$3,670.00, pursuant to the recommendation received from the ambulance service and turn the files over to the County Attorney for further collection. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Steve Pritchard, Boone-Nance Extension Educator, presented a board member recommendation from the Boone-Nance County Extension Board. The Boone-Nance County Extension Board has four representatives from each county. The board members may serve two consecutive three-year terms. The board meets quarterly, alternating the meetings between the counties.

The Boone-Nance County Extension Board recommends the appointment of Hilary Maricle of Albion to serve her first three-year term on the Boone-Nance County Extension Board beginning January, 2013. Maricle replaces Sharon Baker who has completed her sixth year on the board. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to appoint Hilary Maricle to serve a three-year term on the Boone-Nance County Extension Board beginning January 2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dave Spiegel, County Sheriff, discussed the Stop Fund along with a request to purchase a new light bar unit for the 2012 Ford Explorer in open discussion at the November 26, 2012 Board meeting. The Stop Fund is funds received from individuals paying fees for classes with regard to traffic violations. The request is \$1,469.64 from Chief Supply Corporation. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the light bar purchase payable from the Stop Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and the Board reviewed the road/bridge maintenance, repair and signage report for the month of November 2012. Thorin updated the Board regarding the road/bridge projects. Thorin received an engineering services proposal from Kirkham Michael for review. Thorin and the Board decided not to sign the engineering services agreement. They felt it is in the best interest to review each road project separately.

Seven concerned citizens discussed the horse/livestock situation west of Petersburg with the Board. Also in attendance were Denny Johnson, Deputy Sheriff; Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent; Jim Dickerson, Albion News and Jim Majerus, land/livestock owner. Glen Jochem was not present at the Board meeting and according to Majerus some of the starving horses belong to Jochem. Majerus heard the complaints and concerns from the public regarding fences and starving horses/livestock on his property. Ted Thieman said this is not an overnight problem; it has been an ongoing 20-30 year problem with fences that are not good enough to keep livestock off the county roads and is now compounded with starving horses/livestock. Majerus said that he had a veterinarian out from Madison that checked the horses and said the majority are in good shape. Majerus said he has talked to Ed Naughtin about building fences. Tricia Griffith said it is the worse case of horse/livestock starvation in years. Tisthammer directed a question to Majerus concerning the horse that he put down on December 2, 2012 that did not have enough energy to move off the county road. Linda Pelster directed several questions to Majerus regarding the horse he put down, feed, fences and livestock starvation. Majerus answers seemed conflicting as first it was an older horse of his, second the horse belonged to Jochem and the third time Majerus said that someone dropped the horse off on his property. Pelster said many would not make it through the cold winter weather in their present condition. Pelster said she felt the Board would try to keep Boone County from receiving any more press like that earlier in the year when the Humane Society showed up to seize horses from the Majerus property. The group felt the County Attorney should have filed charges long before now as Majerus received a letter stating the horses need to be removed by August 10, 2012; another letter for removal by September 1, 2012 and now it is December 10, 2012 with the same problem at the same residence. Gail Starman expressed her concerns regarding road safety with livestock constantly in the roadway. Ramona Thieman expressed her thoughts to Majerus regarding the ongoing situation.

Tisthammer had copies of papers showing charges filed in County Court against James P. Majerus and Glen F. Jochem on December 6, 2012 and charges also filed in District Court against James P. Majerus. Majerus kept asking for March 1, 2013 to dispose of the horses. The group informed Majerus that talking is done; since he has had plenty of time to correct the problems. It is now time for action and removal of the horses/livestock.

It was the consensus of the group present, Majerus and the Board, that water is needed at all times. A neutral veterinarian with horse background will check the health of all horses/livestock on Jim Majerus property and Majerus pays the veterinarian expenses. A deputy sheriff and/or Commissioner will be present when the veterinarian is on the property to conduct the livestock inspection. The Board was asked to research their options for outside attorney assistance when it appears the County Attorney is not doing his job.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings and Board of Equalization Proceedings of November 26, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Brenda Wilson of GIS Workshop, Inc. gave a presentation to the Board, Zoning Administrator and Assessor's office. Wilson said grant funds have been available through the Nebraska State Resources Board to promote





and help install GIS systems in the counties. Wilson writes the grants for the counties. If the county receives grant funds, GIS receives the funds and deducts the amount from the county's contract. GIS services are located in all but eleven of Nebraska counties. The foundation of a GIS system is in the County Assessor's office. GIS features more accurate digital mapping, aerial photography and data software that has the capability to analyze land use calculation, parcel boundary land use type and soil types. A GIS system may expand to assist the road, zoning, emergency management, weed and other offices. The GIS programs would replace the Agri Data program currently used by the Assessors' office. The Board asked Wilson to submit a proposal for review at the December 20, 2012 Board meeting.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Mary Ziemba, County Zoning Administrator, submitted a written report of activities for the Board to review.
- Clerk Thorberg will contact Shred Monster, Inc. of Columbus for the availability of their services on February 4, 2013.
- Nebraska Administrative Services, State Accounting Division, notified the County Clerk's office that effective January 1, 2013 the standard mileage rate will become 56.5¢.
- Clerk Thorberg thanked the employees that participated in the annual Nebraska Counties "Do a Good Deed-Feed Those in Need" food drive in November. The Boone County Food Pantry received the donated items.
- Commissioners reported from the NACO Convention regarding time clocks for all departments coming in 2013 and A-FAN (Alliance for the Future of Agriculture in Nebraska).

The Boone County Employee Handbook addresses re-employment: "Former employees of the County are not eligible for re-hire without prior approval of the County Board." Steve Pritchard, Extension Office, asked the Board to approve the re-employment for Carolyn Fross as a temporary employee, when the Extension Office employee is absent the same day as UNL staff Pritchard and Glup. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the temporary re-employment as requested for the Extension Office. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board in accordance with Nebraska Revised Statute §77-2318 approves the applications and authorizes the deposit of county funds in designated banks as County Depositories each year. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed with the Board the disposal of road surplus inventory. The consensus is to dispose of the metal items at weigh up price. Thorin updated the Board with regard to the road/bridge projects. The Board and Thorin discussed concerns, reviewed the traffic count data and discussed the next step for the area north of Albion regarding 260th Avenue.

Randy Benson requested permission to trench an electrical line for irrigation purposes over and across a county road known as 180th Street. The request commences from a pole located in the fence line of the SW1/4 of Section 12, Township 21 North, Range 5 West; thence south across 180th Street to an irrigation pivot located in the NW1/4NW1/4 of Section 13, Township 21 North, Range 5 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2012-50, granting permission to trench an electrical line over and across 180th Street as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Spencer Neely and Tony Martin, Great Plains Communications, presented and discussed with the Board a new telephone system proposal for the courthouse. Neely and Martin answered questions regarding the 24-talk path Panasonic equipment with a T1 Feature, installation to provide connection with the annex building where Economic Development is located and the Law Enforcement building. The 911 System located in the Law Enforcement building is separate from the telephone system. The Board asked if Great Plains installs SIP telephone systems. Great Plains has the availability to bid and install a SIP system but shy away from them, as they are internet based and if your internet goes down so does your phone system, with the contact for SIP line communication problems being located in Texas. The Board plans to review the proposals submitted by Applied Connective Technologies, Froniter Communications and Great Plains Communications. The Board commented that the internet appears to be the problem more than the telephones. No decision made at this time.

The Board discussed fences and the horses/livestock situation with Jim Majerus and Glen Jochem. Majerus commented that he was told charges would not be filed against him in court if he cooperated. Majerus feels he has been cooperating this year. Jochem said the majority of his horses (mares) are in cornstalks and not on the Majerus property at this time. Commissioner Tisthammer asked Jochem where he was taking his horses after the cornstalks, Jochem replied not sure at this time. Jochem said he has a handful of geldings (6 or 10) on the Majerus property. Majerus said there is approximately 40 head of horses and 70 head of cows in his possession and has purchased hay and corn stalk bales. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent and Majerus discussed the minimum maintenance road by his property known as 190th Avenue. Majerus and Jochem are to remove the old wire and other items out of the ditches. Thorin said the county would remove the trees from the ditches after they remove the wire, etc. first. Tisthammer said the veterinarian contacted is to come sometime in January to check the horses/livestock on the Majerus property.

The State of Nebraska has installed new fiber optic cable and port switch in the county computer room. The county was informed that if the county does not remove their devices from the state port switch, that the state will charge a fee per month per county line connected to the state equipment. Applied Connective Technologies has been completing follow up work behind the state personnel to transition the counties equipment. Applied Connective Technologies presented a quote for a County Ethernet 48 Port Switch in order to remove the county lines from the state equipment. Motion mad by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the quote with Applied Connective Technologies for \$1,778.01 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jan Zurcher, Region 44 Emergency Manager, presented a comprehensive plan for the Board to review. The Nebraska Crime Commission contacted the Board in July making them aware that Boone County is entitled to a minimum of \$4,865.00 of Juvenile Services County Aid funding. The purpose of the grant funds is to assist





communities in the implementation and operation of programs or services for youth. To be eligible to receive County Aid funds, each county must have a current comprehensive county juvenile services plan in place. Zurcher has joined the C.A.R.E. Team (Community Advocates Reaching Everyone) at the Boone County Health Center. The C.A.R.E. Team and Zurcher prepared a comprehensive plan. Zurcher needs to submit the plan and application for funding by January 4, 2013 to the Nebraska Crime Commission for approval. The group is planning a character camp involving the 9-12 grade students as leaders of the curriculum to show responsibility to the elementary/junior high youth. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Boone County Juvenile Services Comprehensive Community Plan as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The GISW Team anticipates the GIS project build-out completion before June 30, 2014. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to accept and approve the GIS build-out services for \$85,000.00, Assessor Tab on WebGIS for \$4,800.00 and the additional costs of variations and/or additions to those tasks/features services as presented.
