

2013 REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 7, 2013, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by State Statute 23-153. Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to appoint Tom Schuele as Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Abstain: Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to appoint Jerry L. Tisthammer as Vice Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele and Luettel. Abstain: Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Board authorizes and empowers the Boone County Treasurer to invest any surplus funds in the custody of the office. Any surplus funds shall be invested to assure a beneficial rate of return to the County and confirmation of all pledged securities are on file.

BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 14, 2013 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 14, 2013, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Schuele called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The primary use of the Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved two requests for advertisement funding.

The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. Home, Farm & Garden Show committee requested assistance to advertise the annual Boone County Home, Farm & Garden Show event scheduled for March 23, 2013. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Albion Area Arts Council requested assistance to advertise the Acoustic Eidolon Concert scheduled for March 24, 2013. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

It is recommended that the County advertise for temporary/seasonal help on an annual basis. All applicants must be able to speak, read and understand the English language. The returned applications will remain on file for one year, if any county department needs temporary help in 2013. The applications are for temporary/seasonal help within the courthouse, road department and law enforcement. Anytime the County of Boone has a full time or regular part time position open, the department with the opening will advertise separately. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to advertise the yearly temporary/seasonal applications for help one week only in the Albion News as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Treasurer submitted a Semi Annual Statement for July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to accept and approve the County Treasurer's Semi Annual Statement as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Clerk and County Treasurer submitted copies of pledged securities (collateral) for their respective offices as of December 31, 2012. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to acknowledge and approve the pledged securities (collateral) as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and the Board reviewed the road/bridge maintenance and repair report for the month of December, 2012. Thorin updated the Board regarding the Petersburg Northeast (Raeville Road) asphalt overlay, Primrose East and Cedar Rapids Renovation Bridge projects.

Thorin and the Board discussed minimum maintenance roads and preliminary road project ideas throughout the county for the 2013 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program hearing to be set in February.

Lower Loup Natural Resources District submitted a resolution for the Board to review. In partnership with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), the Lower Loup Natural Resources District has coordinated the development of a hazard mitigation plan for the benefit of local jurisdictions generally within the eleven county areas of Boone, Custer, Garfield, Greeley, Howard, Loup, Nance, Platte, Sherman, Valley and Wheeler Counties. The multi-year planning process received a FEMA grant in August 2008, to conduct a planning process that engaged the public, assessed the risk and vulnerability of impacts from natural hazards, and developed a mitigation strategy to reduce the potential harm to people and property before disasters occur. FEMA has approved the plan pending adoption by jurisdictions participating in the plan. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to adopt and approve Resolution No. 2013-01, the Lower Loup Natural Resources District Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Tisthammer asked that the "Exercise Trailer" that is used by the Rural Nebraska Medical Response System Partnership be an agenda item regarding damage to a fender and possible hail damage. Tisthammer attended the LEPC meeting on Thursday evening January 10, 2013 when damage to the "Exercise Trailer" was brought up for discussion. The trailer and its contents are referred to as the "Exercise Trailer" which was purchased in 2008 through a Healthcare Facilities Partnership Grant. This grant was awarded to a coalition that included four other Medical Response Systems and is referred to as the Rural Nebraska Medical Response System (MRS) Partnership that covers all of rural Nebraska except for the southeast corner. It is to be used by any of the hospitals throughout the Partnership area to practice setting up an Alternate Care Site. The contents of the trailers remain under the ownership of Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health Department, which serves as the fiscal agent of the grant. The 2008 proceedings of the Board refer to the Boone County Emergency Manager as having the responsibility of the hospital pods. Sheriff Dave Spiegel asked the Board to appoint two individuals to monitor/stock the trailer contents and appoint his office to log where the "Exercise Trailer" is being used for training. The Board made no change or decision in reference to the Sheriff's request, as they plan to check the alleged damages themselves.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve the County Board Proceedings, Board of Equalization Proceedings and Board of Equalization Public Hearing Proceedings of December 31, 2012 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Reorganizational Proceedings and Board of Equalization Reorganizational Proceedings of January 7, 2013 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- Sheriff Dave Spiegel discussed the three generators purchased by ECDHD that were placed in Boone County. Commissioner Schuele plans to attend the Region 44 Emergency Management Services area meeting tonight. Schuele plans to discuss the generators with Jan Zurcher, Region 44 Emergency Manager.
- Sheriff Spiegel commented that the livestock/horses have water, feed, and the Sheriff's office received no calls to the Majerus property the last couple of weeks.
- Ross Knott stopped by to discuss the horse/livestock/fence situation concerning the Jim Majerus property.
- Commissioner Tisthammer said his phone conversation with Majerus is that he will not let a state licensed veterinarian on his property without a court order. Tisthammer said area veterinarians are not interested in checking the horses/livestock.
- Commissioner Luettel discussed with the Board and Thorin his conversation with a county resident that purchased two culverts and proceeded to have them installed in his driveway and would like some reimbursement of the expenses. The consensus of the Board is that the County Highway Superintendent or his assistant were not contacted before the project was completed, they did not have permission to dig in the county road right-of-way and therefore feel the county does not owe any of the bill.

Chairman Schuele declared the meeting adjourned at 12:22 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Tuesday, January 22, 2013.



MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS ZONING APPLICATION FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

Tom Schuele, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, January 14, 2013 at 9:01 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Tom Schuele. Applicant Paul Groeteke and Mary Ziemba, County Zoning Administrator, were present to answer any questions. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the notice for the record.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions in relation to the approval or denial of a Conditional Use Permit Application.

The public hearing is to approve or deny an Application for Conditional Use Permit by Paul Groeteke, managing member for applicant Cedar River Feeders LLC. The application is to apply surface runoff from feed yard lagoon through a center pivot onto the S1/2 of Section 21, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska.

Mary Ziemba, Zoning Administrator, and Paul Groeteke, Applicant, were present to answer any questions with regard to the application. Groeteke said they purchased the property in May 2012. The application is to apply liquid waste through a center pivot from an existing three-stage lagoon system. The waste is to be pumped from the third lagoon onto the dryland property described as the S1/2 of Section 21, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Groeteke answered questions regarding visiting with the surrounding neighbors; number of head of cattle in the feedlot; DEQ requirements; and that the other two lagoons on the property are for runoff evaporation purposes.

Ziemba informed the Board that the County Planning Commission Board recommended approval of the request with a condition that when there is a straight West wind of 25 mph or greater, that they will discontinue the application at that time and restart when the wind is appropriate.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to close said hearing at 9:13 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Application for Conditional Use Permit submitted by Paul Groeteke for Cedar River Feeders LLC. The approval is for Cedar River Feeders, LLC to apply liquid manure through a center pivot from an existing three-stage lagoon system to the property described as the S1/2 of Section 21, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. 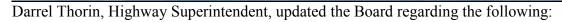
The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees. Chairman Schuele asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2013 ONE AND SIX YEAR ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BOONE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

Tom Schuele, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, February 11, 2013 at 10:00 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Luettel, second by Commissioner Tisthammer to open said public hearing. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Tom Schuele. Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, was present to answer the 2013 Road Improvement Program questions. Notice of the hearing given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The public hearing is for the purpose of hearing testimony in favor of, or opposition to, and to answer questions in relation to the proposed 2013 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The hearing is to remain open for one hour.

Darrel Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2013 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The one-year road improvement plan consists of fifteen projects and the six-year plan consists of six projects. Thorin discussed each of the projects with the Board and Jim Dickerson, Albion News. The Board received no public comments at the hearing.

Thorin acknowledged that Project Nos. 368 and 369 on the one-year plan are road reconstructions by the Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC construction company. Project No. 220, Raeville Road asphalt overlay; Project No. 315, Primrose East Prototype Bridge; and Project No. 337, Cedar Rapids historic bridge renovation, all require federal matching funds and have been pending for several years. The projects that have already received an Army Corps permit will need to be completed this year. The county purchased some millings in 2012 for use on the 2013 proposed projects. The federal and state regulations regarding bridge and road construction project funding is pushing more of the burden onto the county. Now in order to receive federal aid funding for a bridge project, the bridges need to be 100'/200' before any consideration by the federal/state departments.

Attached hereto as part of the proceedings is a copy of the 2013 proposed projects one-year plan and the 2013 and beyond proposed projects for the six-year plan as presented by Boone County Highway Superintendent, Darrel Thorin.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, February 19, 2013, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Schuele called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Michael Baird, Vice President, and James Williams, Development Manager, representing Invenergy/Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC met with the Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, regarding a Road Agreement. At the January 28, 2013 Board meeting Thorin submitted a preliminary Road Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC for the Board to review. The Board, Thorin, Baird and Williams discussed the Road Agreement and proposed wind farm.

- Baird and Williams answered questions regarding the proposed wind farm facility.
- Thorin acknowledged that the roads identified in the Agreement are in need of further road maintenance and are included in the 2013 Boone County One and Six Year Road Improvement Program.
- The developer has developed plans and intends to construct and operate a proposed wind farm consisting of approximately 120 GE 1.7MW turbines with the possibility of twenty of those towers to be located in Boone County.
- Baird and Williams reported on the meeting held February 18, 2013 in Elgin, NE with the landowners and general contractor representatives from Blattner Energy of Minnesota.
- Invenergy LLC has worked on the project since 2008; reached a power purchase agreement with Omaha Public Power District last fall; and plans to be in operation by the end of 2013 or early 2014.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the Boone County Road Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Laurie Krohn, Treasurer, discussed with the Board the microfilming of Tax List Books/Rolls for 1979 through 2001 that are stored in the courthouse basement. Upon the completion of the microfilming, the microfilmed records would be stored at the Nebraska Records Management Division/State Archives in Lincoln, NE. Anyone needing to access the records in the future may contact the State Archives for information. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the MIPS, Inc. Microfilming Division quote of \$3,000.00/\$3,500.00 for microfilming services as presented which also includes disposal of the old books. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.



- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Commissioner Schuele received a call from Ken McIntyre, Boone County American Legion Commander, regarding County Government Day. The Legion is asking if November 20, 2013 would be an acceptable date. Several present would like to see County Government Day held in October due to deadlines for several offices and subsequent increased workloads. Commissioner Schuele will visit with McIntyre regarding the concerns.
- Nebraska State Probation District #5 asked if the Boone County Courthouse would be available for a location to drop of books for AmeriCorps/RISE book drive. The project was developed by the InterCorps Council, a diverse committee of AmeriCorps members from across Nebraska, to promote literacy by increasing access to books for adults and youth statewide. The Rural Improvement for Schooling & Employment (RISE) collection drives should begin around April 1, 2013 with distribution around May 4, 2013, which is Join Hands Day. The Boone County Courthouse will be a location for the proposed program.
- Rod Nelson, Maintenance, informed the group that there are used file cabinets available that were removed from several offices. Contact Rod if you would like one of the surplus file cabinets moved to your office.
- GIS Workshop, Inc. is applying for a grant through the Nebraska State Resources Board to promote and help install a GIS system for the Boone County Assessor's office. Joyce Sock, Assessor, is asking for support letters from the county offices that may utilize the GIS System.
- The Northeast District County Officials meeting is scheduled for March 15, 2013 at the Northeast Community College in Norfolk.
- The Board of Commissioners attended their annual Board meeting last week in Kearney. They reported on some of the topics that were discussed regarding cyber security, legislative bills, road improvement funding and affordable care act.
- The Board addressed time sheet documentation of working hours for all employees, as some offices have not filed their January hours. Thank you to those that have cooperated.

Chuck Rolf and Dave Noble, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., (Ag Society) updated the Board regarding activities, liquor license and a future construction plan.

- Rolf said when the Ag Society applies for the Boone County Fair Special Designated License there will be a change on the application for Saturday night, from underneath the grandstand to the beef barn due to the bull ride event.
- In 2013, the carnival will arrive on the grounds on Saturday. Last year they arrived on Sunday.
- The Krohn family decided to retire from managing the racetrack after sixteen years of operation. Bryan Molt, a native of Cedar Rapids, will begin operation in 2013 with the racetrack to be known as Albion Speedway. The operator rents the track from the Ag Society.
- A group of county residents has approached the Ag Society regarding the planning of a new livestock building with an indoor arena to be available for use year round for multiple events, livestock shows and horse riding. The proposed building would require advance fundraising, replace the present livestock buildings and old office/restroom facilities. In addition, an endowment fund would need to be set up to keep up the insurance and repairs. The plans are to have a scale model ready for the public to view during the July 2013 Boone County Fair.



Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the following:

- Legislative Bills, if passed that may have an impact on road construction projects.
- Thorin upgraded the county cell phone he carries to keep in contact with the office when out in the field. No iPad purchase is necessary.

Darrel D. Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, presented the feasibility studies to the Board regarding the request to vacate or abandon approximately one half mile of road known as 120th Avenue and one mile of road known as 190th Avenue at the February 11, 2013 Board meeting. Thorin recommended a public hearing to vacate one half mile of road known as 120th Avenue with the county retaining full right-of-way rights in the event of future development. Thorin recommends a public hearing to vacate one mile of road known as 190th Avenue with all right-of-way rights reverting to the adjacent landowners, thirty-three feet on each side from the center of the section line. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2013-08 to advertise a public hearing to allow for public comments either for or against the vacation or abandonment of certain county roads at 10:00 A.M. on March 11, 2013 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Much of eastern Nebraska consists of soils that are highly susceptible to erosion and stream degradation. The erodible streambeds of eastern Nebraska are unstable and are widening due to degradation, which results in damage to public and private infrastructure such as bridges, culverts, utility lines, loss of farmland, etc. The Hungry Canyon Alliance, Inc. is a coalition of counties in Iowa, which was developed specifically to research and implement solutions to the problem of stream channel erosion and degradation of western Iowa. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2013-09 that the Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, would support a similar coalition of counties seeking county, state and federal funding sources to limit stream channel degradation in the impacted region of eastern Nebraska. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed the purchase of new/used vehicles for the County Road Department. 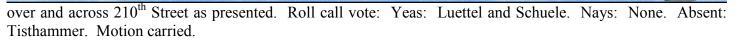

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, March 25, 2013, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Schuele called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Tom Schuele, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The primary use of the Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund Committee met on Monday, February 25, 2013 to review the 2011-2012 fiscal year applications, expenditures and revenue. The committee discussed the application form, financials and guidelines for organizations to receive advertisement reimbursement. Shannon Landauer and Jenice Stevenson, Economic Development, met with the Board to present new guideline changes on behalf of the Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund Committee. Landauer and Stevenson explained the committees reasoning for guideline changes, a plan to notify the organizations and possibly electronic application processing. A brochure will be prepared with the changes/funding guidelines and a letter outlining guidelines and application process is to be mailed to all past organization applicants. A newspaper article will appear in area papers to educate organizations and the public regarding the Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve the following guideline changes as presented from the Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund Committee effective July 1, 2013: (1) Funds are disbursed to an organization only, individuals may not apply. (2) Requests must be submitted a minimum of 30 days prior to the event. (3) Reimbursements must be submitted to Boone County Clerk within 90 days following event or application will be considered void. (4) A survey will be mailed with approval letter requiring documentation of the event. Should the survey not be returned the application would be considered void. (5) Request amount will be reduced to \$400.00 per application with a \$1,600.00 cap per organization by county fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2013. (6) Postage will not be a reimbursable expenditure. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and discussed the following topics:

- Thorin updated the Board regarding the road/bridge projects.
- The Petersburg Northeast (Raeville Road) project bid letting is scheduled for April 18, 2013.
- The Boone County Road department will begin working four ten hour days on April 1, 2013.
- Thorin said there is a new hazard rural road signage program for bridges. He plans to apply for approximately 400 signs for bridge signage as the county presently has 192 bridges to maintain. There is no cost to the county for the signs upon grant approval.
- Thorin discussed the possible purchase of a software program that is a word reader filler to install on the computers to complete easement forms, etc. in order to replace typewriter usage.

Thorin and the Board discussed the repairs needed for a JD862 Paddle Scraper. The Board and Thorin decided there is no need for the county to own three scrapers. The consensus of the Board is to not repair the scraper and authorize Thorin to try to sell the scraper in its present condition.

The water heater located in the Petersburg Road District shop building needs replacing. Loup Power District has a rental program that includes installation, maintenance and replacement of water heaters. The Equipment Use Contract for a 40-gallon water heater is a monthly rental fee of \$4.15. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Equipment Use Contract for \$4.15 per month water heater rental with Loup Power District as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) is currently conducting a review of the National and Sate Functional Classification Systems. The NDOR submitted a National Functional Classification and State Functional Classification of the latest Boone County maps for review by the Boone County Board. Thorin reviewed the maps regarding the collector and arterial road classifications. Thorin found no changes for the National/Federal Classification map. Warner provided health care reform informational material explaining the PPACA requirements regarding Women's Preventative; Excise Tax; Reinsurance Fee; and PCORI Fee. These fees are for the government to administer the PPACA program. Warner presented the estimated cost for the requirements from January through June 2014 to be 2.05 % of the BCBS premium. Warner said that the health care program is presently 2,000 pages and estimated to be 18,000 pages when all the requirements, rulings, administration of program and implementations are settled.

There will be no changes to the NACO BCBS deductible and coinsurance on the medical plans. The prescription drug copayments for all PPO plans are changing. The premium rate increase is 12% on medical and no premium rate increase on dental for the period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. The County Clerk's office plans to distribute a copy of the premium rates and prescription drug changes with the employees May payroll. 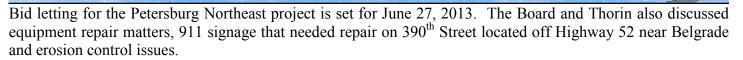

Seda explained the situation that the buyer is trying to secure a loan preferably before August 1st due to interest rates. A public hearing is scheduled with the Board of Commissioners for 9:00 A.M. on August 12, 2013 regarding the Seda property Conditional Use Permit request. Sheriff, Dave Spiegel and Donna Johnson, office manager, discussed base (starting) salary for dispatchers. Spiegel provided the Board information in regard to comparable size counties starting dispatcher salaries. Spiegel told the Board that the dispatching personnel has more work each year due to state mandates. Spiegel said you cannot compare law enforcement/dispatch responsibility and stress with other county offices duties. The law enforcement office has personnel on duty 24 hours a day that means someone is covering weekends, nights and holidays, which needs to be taken into consideration when addressing base salaries for each department. Spiegel stressed the importance of the staff when 911 calls are received, responsibility of inmates and verbal abuse from inmates. Johnson said that the employees are extremely grateful for the insurance, longevity program and other benefits, but a starting (new hire) monthly salary of \$1,600.00 (\$9.23/hr.) before training/\$1,700.00 (\$9.81/hr.) after training is not competitive enough for hiring a new employee. As the Board pointed out that in the past the jail dispatcher positions was a secondary income for families, in today's society there is more single parents as head of household. Commissioner Schuele is on the NACO Board to review elected official salaries across the state and to set guidelines for the 2014 elected position salaries. The Board has discussed setting a timeline to re-evaluate all of the county base salaries (new hire) every four years to coincide with the change of the elected officials in order to be consistent and fair to each respective office. The sheriff office personnel thanked the Board for listening and the Board appreciated the information provided as they re-evaluate the respective base wages (new hire) to be effective January 2015.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance and projects. Increased budget requests were noted in several other areas such as GIS and employee health insurance benefit. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The primary use of the Boone County Visitor's Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee previously approved a request for advertisement funding. The Boone County American Legion requested assistance to advertise the America Supports You Freedom Walk scheduled for September 11, 2013. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the recommendation for disbursement of funds from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings and Zoning Public Hearing Proceedings of August 12, 2013 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Abstain: Schuele. Motion carried.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- Commissioner Schuele thanked everyone for cards/gifts, visits and concerns regarding his recent hospitalization.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Groundbreaking was held August 13, 2013 for the new Albion City Swimming Pool.
- The revised Open Meeting Act poster is posted with an effective date of September 6, 2013.
- The postcard reminders to renew your motor vehicle licenses will be mailed from the State of Nebraska, Department of Motor Vehicles beginning October 2013. Previously the respective County Treasurer offices have been mailing the renewal reminders each month.
- The employees present were reminded that the annual County Office Inventory Statements are due in the County Clerk's office on August 21, 2013.
- The Northeast Nebraska Association of County Officials fall workshop is scheduled for Friday, September, 20, 2013 at St. Benedict Center, Schuyler, Nebraska.
- Nebraska State Fair is scheduled for August 23 through September 2, 2013 in Grand Island.
- The local Teammates program is in need of a coordinator.



Becky Lynch, USA Communications, presented a phone/internet services option to the Board and employees present. Lynch explained the company's fiber connection services opposed to the present courthouse phone system DSL connection. The proposal is for digital e-fax system software, replacing the present analog system. USA Communications piggybacks off of Nebraska Link and Charter lines. USA Communications proposal has nothing to do with hardware. Lynch estimated a monthly billing savings of \$363.00 and answered questions from employees. The offices that presently have one phone/fax line would have an additional \$16.95 per month cost for e-fax capability, which would change the estimated monthly savings. Lynch was not sure if the proposed software would be compatible with the time clock when it is implemented. The offices with frontiernet.net email addresses would need to change their email address. USA Communications is working to get redundancy in place and upgrade internet speed. Offices with fax machines know when a fax has arrived verses digital e-fax where one would have to keep checking the computer screens. The Board may visit with Nance and Merrick County regarding the USA Communications services. No decisions were made at the meeting.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and discussed the following topics:

- Cedar Rapids Historical Bridge project papers have been approved by the Nebraska Historical Society and forwarded to the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads Planning, Specifications and Expenditures division for final review.
- Vandalism occurred on August 11, 2013 to the county excavator that was left at the project site west of Loretto on minimum maintenance road 220th Street. The windows were shot out, a shell casing was found and a nearby transformer was also shot out. As soon as the County Highway Superintendent receives the Sheriff's Office report, the information will be forwarded to NIRMA.
- Mailed notices regarding irrigation watering the county roads and two notices to mow weeds.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented an agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads regarding surveying services. The State desires the County provide a Registered Land Surveyor to tie out land monuments prior to the construction of Project No. RD-52-3 (1009) and tie and remonument after construction. The State agrees to reimburse the County for the actual cost of the survey work. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve the Agreement as presented for Project No. RD-52-3 (1009), Belgrade North and East, Boone and Nance Counties. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed property access/road issues regarding approximately three quarters of a mile of 165th Avenue with Rob Robinson, Carma Wilton, Doug Belgum and Donna Iburg. Robinson stated his concerns regarding access, specifically a locked gate, trees in the way, center of road higher than sides and road too narrow for equipment to the SW1/4 and SE1/4 of 30-22-7 especially during planting and harvest season. Wilton is property owner of the NW1/4 of 30-22-7 and said she locked the gate because people have not shut the gate which results in the livestock roaming onto neighboring properties. The NE1/4 of 30-22-7 is owned by Mark Iburg and it is fenced.

The road in question was opened in July 1880 with a 66' right-of-way. In 1903 the road right-of-way could be set between 40' and 66'. In 1953 legislation was passed allowing the Board to set County Road right-of-way at any width as is deemed necessary by the County Board. One needs to study all options looking to the future of changes such as is there access to all four quarters besides 165th Avenue; is a survey necessary to determine the exact location of the open road established in 1880; determine the road right-of-way or narrow the right-of-way; if the road remains open to the creek, then no locked gates will be allowed; and as long as it is an open road, access cannot be denied to the creek. A public hearing will need to be held to change the record status in any way regarding the open road of 165th Avenue and 66' right-of-way.

Thorin presented possible resolutions for the access/road issue: (1) fence the open road on both sides to the creek with the 66' right-of-way, thus eliminating the locked gate issue; (2) fence the open road on both sides with a narrower right-of-way set by a Board resolution; (3) vacate all of the open road in question with right-of-way reverting equally to the adjacent landowners; (4) the property owners may sign an ingress/egress easement agreement if said road is vacated; or (5) vacate only the south portion of the road in question lying between the SE1/4 and SW1/4, eliminating public access to creek.

Wilton is willing to install a fence on her property regarding said road in question, but she feels that there is two sets of rules and the rules are not being applied equally to the property owners.

The Board heard at length both sides of the situation with no action taken today and will take the matter under advisement. No matter what is decided regarding the portion of road in question a public hearing will need to be held to make a decision of one of the possible options mentioned.

Nebraska State Statute 80-101 refers to County Veterans Service Committee appointments and terms. The committee members are five-year terms. Sam Fuehrer retired from the committee. The term of Sam Fuehrer expires in June 2014. The County Veterans Service Committee recommended Leon Magsamen of Albion to complete Sam Fuehrer's term and serve on the County Veterans Service Committee. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to appoint Leon Magsamen to complete the term of Sam Fuehrer expiring in June 2014 to the Boone County Veterans Service Committee. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, and the Board discussed the hours Wells proposed for the Veteran Service office to be open for the public. Wells is an appointed part time department head scheduled to work twenty hours per week. Wells discussed hours with the County Veterans Service Committee in the past and said she conducted a poll since January 2013 regarding week day traffic, time of day, availability of assistance from the Pension Center in St. Paul, Minnesota and the state offices. Results of the poll showed a high need of Wells being available in the afternoon for the veterans. Wells said it is impossible to reach the Pension Center on Mondays and seems everyone leaves early on Fridays at the state level. Wells asked that the twenty hours be scheduled for Tuesday and Thursday from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and Wednesday from 8:00 A.M. to Noon. The Board and Wells discussed the request. The Board asked Wells if adding four hours and being available all day on Wednesday would be helpful assisting the public. The Veteran Service Officer is an appointed part time position, therefore the Board may change the designated employee hours to fit the veteran's needs. The Board said they will try the proposed hours and if it appears the needs are not being satisfied, then another change would be made. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, part time being twenty hours a week with Tuesday and Thursday each from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and Wednesday from 8:00 A.M. To Noon, effective September 2, 2013. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, asked for part time clerical employment for the Veterans Service office. The Board and Wells discussed if the part time clerical twenty hours should coincide with Wells' hours or be set differently. The proposed hours for the part time clerical will be Monday thru Friday from 8:00 A.M. to Noon. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve part time clerical hours for the Veterans office to be Monday thru Friday from 8:00 A.M. to Noon effective August 20, 2013 and the hiring of Jane Klassen, as part time clerical effective August 20, 2013. Roll call vote: Luettel, Tisthammer and Schuele. Nays: None. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS 2013-2014 COUNTY BUDGET

Tom Schuele, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, September 9, 2013 at 11:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Tom Schuele. Richard Martinsen, CPA was present to answer budget questions. Chairman Schuele read the notice for the record. Also, present for the budget hearing were Steve Pritchard, Extension; Sheryl Machacek, Sheriff Communications; Jan Zurcher, Region 44 Emergency Management; Laurie Krohn, Treasurer; and Jim Dickerson, Albion News.

The public hearing was for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2013-2014 Boone County proposed budget in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Sections 13-501 to 13-513. Also, to set the final tax request for the 2013-2014 Boone County proposed budget at a different amount than the prior year tax request in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Section 77-1601.02 The hearing was open for one hour and the proposed budget was published in the August 28, 2013 issue of the Albion News.

The County Board and those present for the hearing discussed with Martinsen the differences from last fiscal year's budget in the areas of asking dollar increase, land valuation, tax rate, property tax requirement and fund balances. Martinsen provided answers to questions asked with regard to the proposed budget and publication. The proposed property tax request for 2013-2014 is \$3,837,584.00, which is an increase of \$251,965.00 from fiscal year 2012-2013. The proposed tax rate for 2013 of 0.250248 is lower than the 2012 tax rate of 0.292361 due to increased valuation. It takes a 75% vote to exceed the 2.5% lid limitation by an additional 1% budget authority growth. The levy authority of 50 cents includes the County levy and all the entities such as Agricultural/Historical Societies, Fire Districts, etc. added together. The County allowable levy limit is 45 cents of the 50 cents. The 2013 County valuation is \$1,533,513,853.00 compared to the 2012 valuation of \$1,226,437,534.00, an increase of \$307,076,319.00.

The 2013-2014 County Budget adopted has a tax request expense increase of 7% more than the 2012-2013 fiscal year budget requests. The majority of the County Budget increase reflects the Courthouse renovation bonds, road fund projects that have been on the books for several years, 1.8% cost of living wage increases, 12% health insurance benefit increase and reappraisal fund regarding GIS project.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to close said public hearing at 12:00 Noon. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Discussion: The county tax rate will be 0.250248. If it were not for the use of inheritance tax dollars, the county rate would be increased to 0.276332 in order to maintain the current level of services that are both mandated under state law and that our county taxpayers deserve and expect.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve exceeding the lid limitation by an additional 1% growth for fiscal year 2013-2014. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve and adopt the County Budget for 2013-2014 as published and presented with an Unused Budget Authority created for next year of \$686.37; and set the 2013 County Tax Rate at 0.250248, which is different than the County Tax Rate of 0.292361 for 2012. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board expressed their appreciation to Martinsen for his assistance with the County Budget preparation throughout the years.

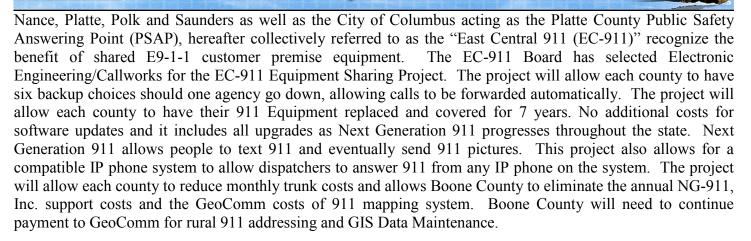

In order to proceed with the EC-911 Equipment Sharing Project the EC-911 Board needs all current participants to confirm they are going to participate and agree to sign the needed Inter-Local Agreement. The proposed project cost share for Boone County is \$135,209.98 with a maximum of \$140,296.54. Boone County presently has enough revenue in the 911 Emergency Management Fund (2910) and 911 Wireless Service Holding Fund (2914) to cover the proposed EC-911 Equipment Sharing Project. Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to approve commitment to participate in the EC-911 Equipment Sharing Project. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. The measurements from the south and north corners as located for Section 30 indicated that all of the existing trail/road is on the Iburg property and part of the Robinson gates are on Iburg property. Thorin and the Board reviewed options similar to the ones discussed at the August 19, 2013 Board meeting. Thorin plans to meet at the site with Iburg, Robinson and Wilton all at the same time to explain the survey measurements and discuss the situation.

Jon Strom, Great Plains Communications, requested permission to bore fiber optic cable for the Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC wind towers under several Boone County roads. The fiber optic cable to be bored under several Boone County roads will begin in Township 22 North, Range 6 & 7 West to the Antelope/Boone

County line, all located in Boone County, Nebraska. Maps are attached to the resolution. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele to approve Resolution No. 2013-51, granting permission to bore fiber optic cable under several Boone County roads to service Prairie Breeze Wind Energy LLC wind towers as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, requested that the funds regarding the new Highway Bridge Buyback Program Fund 0650 be set up as a separate revenue account by the County Treasurer and that the earned interest be credited to Fund 0650 beginning with the 2013-2014 fiscal budget year. The funds projected from the state is scheduled to be disbursed in March 2014. The bridge portion has to be used on bridge projects, the road portion may be used on either road or bridge projects. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the County Treasurer to establish a separate revenue account for the Highway Bridge Buyback Program Fund 0650 and to include the credit of earned interest. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board heard a general assistance request for utility deposits. The Board explained the general assistance guidelines and that the guidelines include county residency for six months prior to granting a general assistance request. The requestor is presently working in Boone County, but is not/has not been a resident of Boone County. The requestor withdrew the request, due to not residing in the county.

Pursuant to State Statute Section 23-347, each county officer shall make, acknowledge under oath, and file with the County Board of his or her county an inventory statement of all county personal property in the custody and possession of said county officer after the close of each fiscal year. Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Offices' 2012-2013 Inventories of county personal and real estate property as presented from the various offices and files the submitted inventories with the County Clerk's office as a public record in a manner convenient for reference. The County Budget Act (State Statute Section 23-904) requires a budget message to be completed by the budget making authority outlining the fiscal policy for the budget period. The budget message must include a list of all cash amounts being held by officials that do not appear in the County Treasurer's Office six month balance reports. The Board has approved and authorized accounts within County Offices to receive and disburse fees, etc. Some of the accounts balance to zero and some accounts have a beginning balance. Motion made by Schuele, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2013-52 authorizing the accounts within County Offices as stated in the resolution. The Governing Body of the County of Boone, by a majority vote by the Boone County Board of Commissioners, resolves that: the 2013-2014 property tax request be set at \$3,837,584.00, which is different from the 2012-2013 request of \$3,585,619.00; and the 2013 county tax rate is at 0.250248, which is different from the 2012 tax rate of 0.292361. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, September 16, 2013, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Schuele called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Tom Schuele and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Schuele acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Boone County Economic Development/Boone County Development Agency (Agency) representatives Shannon Landauer, Tim Kayton, Richard Good, Dean Hamling, Bob Racek, and Corey Worell presented a proposal to restructure the Boone County Development Agency to the Board. Jeff Jarecki, Attorney, has been researching and preparing documents to change the Boone County Development Agency, Joint Public Agency Agreement filed with the Nebraska Secretary of State October 26, 2000, to a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation to be known as Boone County Development Agency, Inc. Jarecki said the structure for funding is not changing. The funding of the Agency will still be taxpayers' dollars being County@80%, City of Albion@10%, City of St. Edward@2.5%, Village of Cedar Rapids@2.5%, Village of Petersburg@2.5%, Albion Economic Development, Inc.@2.5%, and Village of Primrose@\$750.00. Albion Economic Development, Inc. has agreed to fund an additional \$20,000.00 above their allotment to help with a second full time employee in the Agency. Albion Economic Development, Inc. presently has no employee as in the past years. Jarecki said an amendment with regard to wording of the present Agreement is being drafted and the 501(c)(3) Corporation will allow for the Agency to be more beneficial to operate as an economic business structure with more flexibility. The proposed Agency will be on its own as a business and no longer tied to the County Government rules and statutes. The employee(s) will not be county government employees. The Agency runs into stumbling blocks being under county government statutes to try to accomplish some of the goals and possible infrastructure to attract businesses to the area. Landauer said that Rick Martinsen, CPA, has agreed to process the payroll for the Agency and that the Agency will pay the accounts payable with a two signature check system. Racek said the meeting was very informative with some details not thought about by the Agency. The details have not been worked out to date regarding the County owned building, inventory, equipment, guaranteed loans and effective date of restructure. Racek said that the Boone County Development Agency is a unified county wide effort for economic development. Commissioner Schuele acknowledge the volunteer time committed by the Agency non-compensated board members. The Agency Board is scheduled to meet on Wednesday, September 18, 2013 to vote on the restructure proposal.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials, department heads, or employees.

- Commissioner Schuele asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- County Government Day is scheduled for October 23, 2013. The County Clerk's office will contact Ken McIntyre, Boone County American Legion Commander, for details.
- Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, introduced Jane Klassen, part time employee in the Veteran Service Office.
- The courthouse lawn is landscaped and the majority is seeded. The underground sprinklers have been moved and are hooked back up. The sidewalk/lawn project is looking good.

- Beginning October 1, 2013, the Department of Motor Vehicles will be mailing the motor vehicle license reminders. The reminder will arrive as a threefold letter where you remove the bottom portion to take to the County Treasurer to renew your vehicle license. What the County currently retains from each registration fee will be reduced by 50 cents beginning October 1st, to cover the postage expense incurred by Department of Motor Vehicles. Previously the County Treasurers' offices have been mailing renewal postcards each month.
- The Freedom Walk was well attended on Wednesday, September 11, 2013.
- Commissioner Schuele provided a handout regarding workplace gossip, following up with an inside housekeeping that was addressed earlier with personnel involved. There is an article also available "Dealing with Difficult Employees" for anyone interested in reading. Commissioner Schuele received the articles from NACO legal counsel.

Rod Nelson, Maintenance, received a proposal to replace one of the courthouse roof top air/heat units. The courthouse rooftop units consist of three new units that were installed when the courthouse was remodeled beginning in 2009 and four old units. The old unit number RTU-4 controls the majority of the north side of the courthouse building. The compressor is not working and the unit has received several repairs. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve and accept the Eller Heating, Air Conditioning & Plumbing, LLC proposal of \$10,123.00 to replace the old Lennox Roof Top unit number RTU-4 with a new unit as presented. Rod Nelson, Maintenance, and the Board discussed part time cleaning position for the courthouse. The Board posted internally regarding the cleaning position. The water line commencing from a well located in the SE1/4 of Section 30, running thence west to a hydrant to provide water for livestock to be located in the SW1/4 of Section 30, all located in Township 20 North, Range 6 West, Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Schuele

to approve Resolution No. 2013-54, granting permission to trench a 1" water line over and across 225th Avenue as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Schuele and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented an agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads regarding surveying services. The State desires the County provide a Registered Land Surveyor to tie out land monuments prior to the construction of Project No. STP-91-5(124) and tie and remonument after construction. The State agrees to reimburse the County for the actual cost of the survey work. The indirect costs reimbursement relates to the office space provided in the courthouse for Nebraska Health and Human Services when needed and the Clerk of the District Court – IV-D Child Support services. Sequoia Consulting Services receives a percentage of the indirect cost recovery reimbursement received by the county from Nebraska Health and Human Services. • The hearing is concerning approximately three-quarters of a mile of a county road known as 165th Avenue. The road runs north and south between the NW1/4 and the NE1/4 of Section 30, to a part where the Beaver Creek intersects the SW1/4 and the SE1/4 of Section 30, all located in Township 22 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, had previously submitted a written feasibility study for the Board's review dated October 25, 2013 recommending that approximately three-quarter mile of 165th Avenue be vacated with all right-of-way rights reverting back to the adjacent landowners, 33 feet on each side.

Present for the Public Hearing were landowners Mark Iburg, owner of the NE1/4 of 30-22-7; Carma Wilton, owner of the NW1/4 of 30-22-7; and Rob Robinson, owner of the SW1/4 and SE1/4 of 30-22-7. Also, present at the public hearing were Jerry Bode, Walter and Deanna Stokes, and Jim Dickerson, Albion News.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, highlighted his feasibility study regarding 165th Avenue and all present received a copy of the feasibility study. According to records filed in the Register of Deeds Office, Boone County, Nebraska the road in question was opened June 1880 with a sixty-six (66) foot right-of-way and was opened on the half mile line of Section 30 and was to follow that line as close as possible. This road is not part of the County's road inventory registered with the State of Nebraska and as a result has no bearing on the amount of funds received from the State Allocation Trust Fund. This road, other than at the very north end, does not service any residential dwellings, nor are there any other building structures to the south. This current road is not regularly maintained by the County Road Department. It was determined that none of the south half of Section 30 would be isolated, as the landowner has access from 170th Avenue.

Rob Robinson submitted google maps of the area and read his concerns/request concerning 165th Avenue. Robinson feels the County should abandon 165th Avenue between the SE1/4 and SW1/4 of his property and leave 165th Avenue open between the NE1/4 and NW1/4 in order to access his property. Robinson feels that if 165th Avenue is vacated, the County should assign the present road/trail right-of-way to him. Robinson's attorney, Tom Maul, submitted a letter by email.

Mark Iburg expressed that the existing road/trail appears to be on his property and was advised by his attorney concerning liability if/when an accident occurs. Iburg requested the road be moved off of his property to where the records indicate it is to be located or vacate all of that part of 165th Avenue that is in question. Iburg said that access to the four quarters, locked gates, disagreements, trespassing, etc. has been an issue for several

years. Iburg asked the Board to make a decision to vacate all of 165th Avenue or relocate the road according to records and leave all of 165th Avenue open. Let's get 165th Avenue settled and be done with the issue.

Carma Wilton expressed equal treatment regarding 165th Avenue, either vacate all of it or none of it that is in question. Robinson is not land locked since he has access from 170th Avenue. We all know that when the water table is high that is not when you try to remove hay bales or crops.

Walter and Deanna Stokes were just interested neighbors. Jerry Bode hauls hay for all three land owners.

The measurements from the south and north corners as located for Section 30 indicated that all of the existing trail/road is on the Iburg property and part of the Robinson gates are on Iburg property, according to the records on file in the Register of Deeds office. Thorin said the north and south corner survey stakes were located and GPS was used to locate the center of Section 30.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Schuele to close said hearing at 11:10 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Schuele and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

After the public hearing the County Board shall by resolution at its next meeting or as soon thereafter as may be practicable vacate or abandon or refuse vacation or abandonment, as in the judgment of the Board the public good may require.

If the Board decides to leave 165th Avenue as an open road for public access, technically there can be no locked gates. The Board asked Thorin to contact the State for clarification of the 10 year road establishment provision. The 10 year provision question is regarding a road/trail location that has been maintained for 10 years or a road/trail location that has not been maintained for 10 years.

Motion made by Schuele, second by Tisthammer to table the decision until a later date. Roll call vote: Yeas: Schuele, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Promotion Fund revenue is generated from the two percent County Lodging Tax that began July 2006. The Visitors Promotion Fund shall be used generally to promote, encourage, and attract visitors to come to the county and use the travel and tourism facilities within the county (Nebraska Statute 81-1255). The Visitors Promotion Committee and the Board of Commissioners set the guidelines regarding the type of organizations/activities and type of advertisement that is reimbursable from the Visitors Promotion Fund. Due to the restructure of the Boone County Development Agency to a non-profit corporation, the organization will no longer be under the county government regulations. Therefore, all of the Boone County Visitors Promotion Fund activity will be streamlined through the Boone County Clerk's office beginning January 1, 2014.

The primary use of the Boone County Visitors Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee received three requests for advertisement funding.

The Cardinal Inn requested assistance to establish an internet website. This request was tabled at the November 12, 2013 Board meeting for further review and discussion. The Board discussed the request being quite different from community events with Yosten and Pals. The guidelines established by the Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee does not address such a request. It is apparent that some guidelines regarding website advertising needs to be established so it is clear what is acceptable, not acceptable and type of businesses that can apply. The Visitors Promotion Committee meets annually to review the guidelines, usually in February. The Board of Commissioners then approve/disapprove the guidelines and advertisement reimbursements. Denny Johnson and Donna Johnson, representing the County Sheriff's office, and the Board continued the November 25, 2013 Board meeting discussion regarding the base (starting) salary for dispatchers. The proposal is for a base wage increase from \$1,600.00 to \$1,700.00 for dispatcher position and \$1,600.00 to \$1,850.00 for the communications/dispatcher position.
