



2015 REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 10:30 A.M. on Thursday, January 8, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Vice Chairman Tisthammer called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by State Statute 23-153. Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Vice Chairman Tisthammer noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint Jerry L. Tisthammer as Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2015. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Abstain: Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to appoint Hilary K. Maricle as Vice Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2015. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Abstain: Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint the following to be on the Health Board for Boone County as required by State Statute: County Sheriff, County Clerk and Boone County Health Center Chief of Staff for 2015.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel that the budget committee for the ensuing 2015-2016 budget year is the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Boone County Clerk and Boone County Treasurer.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to reappoint Richard D. Martinsen, Certified Public Accountant, Albion, Nebraska, to prepare the County Budget for the 2015-2016 budget year, to be paid from the County General fund.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to reappoint Darrel Thorin, Bartlett, Nebraska, as full time County Highway Superintendent under the supervision of the County Board for 2015.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to reappoint Christopher C. Hays, of Osceola, Nebraska, as Boone County Surveyor for a four year term commencing January 8, 2015 through December 31, 2018, per contract for services as provided in State Statute Section 23-1901.01.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to reappoint Jacqueline Lynne Wells as full time Boone County Veteran Service Officer under the supervision of the County Board for 2015. On August 26, 2014 the Board of Commissioners approved the appointed position of Boone County Veteran Service Office/Officer to be a full time (40 hour week) position effective August 22, 2014 with office hours 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. and 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday and a part-time administrative assistant (20 hours per week) from 8:00 A.M. to Noon.





Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to continue the contract for the services of Public Defender for Boone County with Jeffrey C. Jarecki of Jarecki Law PC LLO, Albion, Nebraska, pursuant to the terms of an Agreement dated October 15, 2013 that shall commence on January 1, 2014 and continue until December 31, 2015.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to reappoint Randall Bruland as the Administrator and Maintenance Director of the Boone County Ambulance Service under the supervision of the County Board for 2015.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to continue the agreement for patient billing and collection services for the Boone County Ambulance Service with EMS Billing Services, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska pursuant to an Agreement effective March 1, 2014 that continues to termination by one of the parties. Nicole Levander, Boone County Health Center, to serve as liaison for the Boone County Ambulance Service/EMS Billing Services for 2015.

Buettner was appointed part time Weed Superintendent (less than twenty hours per week) effective March 17, 2014 and to receive \$350.00 per month beginning April 2014 for paperwork/meetings and \$15.00 per hour for time clocked in for spraying hours.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to appoint Ken Luettel as Courthouse Custodian Supervisor for 2015.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to reappoint Jerry Tisthammer as Chairman of the County General Assistance Program with the emergencies being handled by a Commissioner. The County Clerk or Deputy County Clerk shall contact the assistance program chairperson or a Commissioner when there is a request on a day there is no scheduled Board meeting.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to appoint the Boone County Clerk as the contact person for Boone County for the NIRMA Insurance for 2015.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to give the County Clerk's office the authority to sign any documents that pertain to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools after June 30, 2000 under the supervision of the County Board for 2015.

Any surplus funds shall be invested to assure a beneficial rate of return to the County and confirmation of all pledged securities are on file.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle that the Boone County full time employees are to receive twelve paid holidays which include the observed nine holidays as set forth in the NIRMA Guide to Creating a Personnel System for Nebraska Counties Handbook together with Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Columbus Day; and that Arbor Day shall be a floating holiday to be designated for Thursday, December 24, 2015. The Courthouse "Closed" notices will be posted by Board directive.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel that full time employees are to receive vacation and sick leave as set forth in the Boone County Employee Handbook. The employee's vacation and sick leave records are recorded with the time clock/attendance system effective January 2014.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel that agenda items must be provided to the Boone County Clerk's Office no later than noon on the Friday preceding a Board meeting in order to be considered for said Board meeting.





Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle that the Boone County Board of Commissioners will hold their Board meetings on every Monday except for the first Monday of each month in the year, 2015, commencing at 9:00 A.M. Meeting dates/times are subject to change due to state statute regulations. Monday meetings that are on holidays will be held on Tuesday. The Accounts Payable Vendor meeting will be on the second Monday of the month and other Mondays will be regular public meetings. The Payroll meetings are subject to change from Monday to a different day for approval by the Board with the implementation of the time clock/attendance system and the 22/21 pay period. The Board meeting dates for payroll approval are as follows: January 26, February 25, March 25, April 27, May 27, June 24, July 27, August 26, September 28, October 26, November 25 and December 28, 2015. The County Clerk's office has charge and authority of the agenda for all meetings. The agenda will be made available for all meetings on the Boone County Website and the bulletin board located in the north courthouse entrance. Also, the following will be used to post notices in advance for emergency meetings and meetings that cannot be published in the legal newspaper(s): Boone County Website; Boone County Courthouse; lobbies of the Boone County Bank; Cornerstone Bank; Homestead Bank; and Albion News Office, all located in Albion, NE. In addition, the Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids, NE. Cornerstone Bank, St. Edward, NE and Petersburg State Bank, Petersburg, NE.

As required by law (Neb. Rev. Stat. §48-443), each Nebraska county must have a working safety committee. BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 12, 2015 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 12, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jeff Jarecki, Attorney, met with the Board regarding a decision concerning the public hearing held on October 14, 2014 for a Conditional Use Permit by MSJM Properties, LLC to construct a hog confinement facility. The Board tabled a decision to their November 10, 2014 Board meeting due to a court hearing scheduled for November 4, 2014. The Board tabled a decision on November 10, 2014 to their November 25, 2014 Board meeting; November 25, 2014 Board meeting to their December 8, 2014 Board meeting; December 8, 2014 Board meeting to their January 12, 2015 Board meeting. Jarecki said that the judge is still reviewing the case and asked the Board to table a decision to their January 26, 2015 Board meeting due to no court ruling. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to table/postpone a decision until the January 26, 2015 Board meeting in regard to the public hearing held on October 14, 2014 concerning an Application for Conditional Use Permit filed by MSJM Properties, LLC to construct a hog confinement facility. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Jeff Jarecki, Public Defender, has presented quarterly reports to the Board regarding the status of court cases since his appointment to the position in August of 2012. Jarecki reported that he was assigned approximately forty cases in 2014. Jarecki said that two of the cases were conflicts of interest and twenty-one of the cases are completed. Jarecki said he has been assigned two cases to date for 2015. Jarecki answered the Board's questions regarding closed/open cases and the conflict of interest cases. Jarecki explained that there are times when he cannot defend the assigned case since he is already defending one of the parties involved or has a client connection. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to accept the 2014 Public Defender report as submitted. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Jeff Jarecki, Public Defender, and the Board discussed amending the Public Defender Agreement signed on October 15, 2013. Jarecki said that the Public Defender may employ an Assistant Public Defender that is a member in good standing of the Nebraska State Bar Association in the Amended Agreement. In addition, the Amended Agreement includes reimbursement for the annual continuing legal education in the area of criminal law for the Public Defender and Assistant Public Defender. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the Amended Agreement between the County of Boone and Jeffrey C. Jarecki, Public Defender as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Aubrey Schriver, BCDA, Inc. Executive Director, introduced BCDA's new employee Mitchell Glesinger of Spalding to the Board. Schriver updated the Board regarding economic development activity, B & I Day for middle/high school students and BCDA website changes.





Ed Knott, Tom Krings, and Will Zoucha, Applied Connective Technologies, presented a new telephone system proposal for the courthouse. Employees in attendance asked questions regarding the type of service and the fiber optic connection capabilities. Several items discussed included the disposal of the old telephone equipment; fax numbers needing to be a separate number from the telephone number; faxes may come in as an email; email addresses of frontiernet.net may need to change to county-org; and all telephones will have hands free, call forward, caller ID and intercom capabilities. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented the December road maintenance, repair and project report to the Board for their review. Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. Thorin attended the January 9, 2015 pre-construction meeting for the Cedar Rapids Historical Bridge Project. The contractor plans to begin construction the first week of February.

Thomas R. Hartford, Silver Valley LLC, requested permission to trench a natural gas line to a grain dryer across a county road commonly known as 270th Street. The natural gas line commences from a gas line located on the south side of said road in the NE1/4 of Section 35; thence running north to a grain dryer located in the SE1/4 of Section 26, all in Township 20 North, Range 8 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2015-01, granting permission to trench a natural gas line to a grain dryer across 270th Street to the SE1/4 of Section 26, Township 20 North, Range 8 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Barb Hanson, Assessor, and the Board discussed assessment requirements and the hiring of personnel. Hanson informed the Board that a state liaison has worked with her to set priorities and a time line to complete the assessment requirements.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, February 17, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The County Safety Committee met at 9:00 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel, Denny Johnson, Mike McDermott, Rod Nelson, Tom Smith, Kathy Thorberg and Darrel Thorin. Nelson addressed old business regarding the road department signage compliance and the issues that have been corrected in the law enforcement building. The Board of Commissioners approved the addition of a representative from the Boone County Fitness Center to be a member of the County Safety Committee at their Reorganizational Meeting in January. The group welcomed Mike McDermott, Boone County Fitness Center Manager. Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, updated the group regarding the NIRMA ASSIST Program Grant. Smith applied for weather radios to be placed in the courthouse and fans/lights to be placed in the courthouse vaults. The county pays the matching share of \$155.92 for weather radios and \$111.84 for fans/lights. The committee discussed preventability and safety suggestions were addressed by the committee regarding worker's compensation claims. The committee discussed the overall condition of sidewalks and the use of the sloped sidewalk on the east side of the courthouse during winter weather conditions. The Safety Committee meeting was adjourned at 9:16 A M

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- Commissioner Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Commissioner Tisthammer emphasized that the Courthouse West Parking Lot-2 HR needs to be honored. The West Parking Lot is the best access entrance to the courthouse for the public and citizens with disabilities. County employees are asked <u>not</u> to park in the West Parking Lot during regular courthouse hours from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday.
- Shred Monster, Inc. of Columbus, Nebraska provides shredding of documents and computer hard drives. Rod Nelson, Maintenance, said that the shredding is 35 cents per pound and \$5.00 disposal fee per hard drive. Shred Monster will also dispose of printers, monitors, etc. at a fee per pound. Nelson plans to contact Shred Monster for a disposal date.
- Kathy Thorberg, County Clerk, asked if other offices would be interested in the installation of a Drop Box at the Courthouse North Entrance. Interested offices felt it would be beneficial for the public to





have access to a drop box when they are not able to complete their transactions during regular business hours.

- Kathy Thorberg, County Clerk, addressed the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims Budget Codes. The codes are provided by the State Auditor's office. Thorberg explained the code categories and why at times the submitting office will see a budget code changed on their claims.
- Commissioner Tisthammer addressed the Time Clock/Attendance System. He said the Courthouse hours are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. Employees are here to serve the public during courthouse opened hours. Courthouse employees should have no problem following the handbook and clocking in at 8:00 A.M. to begin work; clocking out for lunch and breaks and clocking out at 5:00 P.M. at the end of the day. There is no need to clock in before 5 minutes of start time or clock out more than 5 minutes at the end of the day. Occasionally there may be times when the department head asks and approves an employee to work more than the scheduled 40 hours per week due to office work structure. The road crew adjusted to a time clock in 2010 so all other county employees should be able to adjust.
- Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, submitted a copy of the Mass Warning and Notification System Policy to the Board. Smith addressed Siren Activation Protocol on page 11. Siren activation may be for more than tornado warnings, such as high winds, tennis ball size hail and hazard materials spill.
- Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, updated the Board regarding the purchase of a different Emergency Management Vehicle. The Region 44 Supervisory Committee will review the vehicle request at their March 4, 2015 meeting at the Nance County Courthouse in Fullerton.

Greeley County has approximately 206 veterans and several of the veterans already go to other counties for services. Wells said she already is providing services for 100 of the Greeley County Veterans. Reilly and the Board asked Wells if she would have time to serve one day a week or less in Greeley County to assist the Greeley County Veterans. Wells said that would be no problem. Copies of Interlocal Agreements regarding the sharing of the Veteran Service Officer and services were received from other counties. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, projects and equipment. Thorin updated the Board regarding the Cedar Rapids historic bridge renovation project. The paperwork for the historic bridge renovation project began in March of 2008. Thorin said he is pleased with the renovation construction to date.





Marlin Conry and Dariusz Stachowiak, Invenergy representatives, and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a Road Agreement for the Board to review. Conry and Thorin said the Road Agreement is the same language that was prepared for the first Prairie Breeze Wind Farm. Conry addressed the Board's questions. Thorin said that JEO drives the road/routes and prepares a CD of the road conditions before the project begins and when the project is completed, the roads are to be returned to the same condition. Thorin said that in the past the construction crews have left the roads in better condition. Conry said that the towers belong to Invenergy and that the easement lease stays with the property. The project has three route designs due to more impact on Boone County roads and bridges with this project. The plans are to build the proposed Prairie Breeze Wind Farm II east of the first Prairie Breeze Wind Farm along the Antelope/Boone/Madison County line. Conry said the second wind farm proposal is for 41 turbines with one full circuit (approximately 14 turbines) to be located in Boone County. The plan is for the Prairie Breeze Wind Farm II to be in operation this fall. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve a Road Agreement by and between Boone County, Nebraska and Prairie Breeze Wind Energy II LLC in c/o Invenergy LLC 1 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Prairie Breeze Wind Energy II LLC asked permission to install 35kv electrical cable on the north side of 120th Street within the Boone County right-of-way beginning six and one-half miles west of the Boone-Madison County boundary and running west. The easement being the south thirty-three feet of the SW1/4 of Section 12, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-05, granting permission to Prairie Breeze Wind Energy II LLC to bore/install 35kv electrical cable on the north side of 120th Street within the Boone County right-of-way in part of the SW1/4 of Section 12, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Rod Nelson, Maintenance, provided information regarding Shred Monster, Inc. of Columbus, Nebraska. Shred Monster is certified to shred paper documents and electronic hard drive files. The shredded paper is baled and remains in their warehouse until a semi load is ready for distribution. The bales are transformed into wet pulp which is then made into paper towels, etc. None of their shredding is used for bedding or insulation. The Shred Monster truck is scheduled for the courthouse shredding for late afternoon on Monday, March 30, 2015 or the morning of Tuesday, March 31, 2015. The disposal of computer equipment, hard drives, etc. will be scheduled for a Friday at the end of March or early April. County employee(s) will deliver the electronic items to the Shred Monster location in Columbus and they will remain at the sight for the disposal of the hard drives. Disposal fees are 35 cents per pound and \$5.00 per hard drive.

The Clerk of the District Court office furnishings and files have moved to the former Board of Commissioners room. The Boone County Clerk's office became ex-officio Clerk of the District Court on January 8, 2015 via a vote of the registered voters in 2012. The office moving next to the County Clerk's office will provide better organization and efficiency for the office personnel. The Commissioner's Meeting Room will be where space is available on their scheduled meeting days until a decision is made. In May of 2002 Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Services, Inc. (NNJS) assessed the thirteen member counties a special assessment in the sum of \$10,000.00. It was determined that those counties who paid the special assessment would in time receive \$1,000.00 of credit to utilize for the purpose of housing youth at NNJS. The financial position of NNJS is at the point where the remainder of these funds can be returned to the said county either by credit or by check. The Albion Chamber of Commerce requested assistance to advertise a Chamber Easter Egg Hunt at the Good Samaritan Society-Samaritan Estates located in Albion on April 4, 2015. The Board discussed the Visitors Promotion Fund. The Visitors Promotion Fund is in regard to attracting visitors to patronize the businesses and use of lodging facilities. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and presented his February report. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- The Cedar River Historic Bridge restoration project is nearing completion with tentative plans to be open to the public the middle of April.
- Thorin is drafting an Interlocal Agreement to present to surrounding counties regarding maintenance on county line roads.
- Thorin and the Board discussed signage funding for bridges and railroads concerning federal regulations.
- Thorin plans to attend a bridge conference in April in Kearney, NE.





Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented an agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads regarding surveying services. The State desires the County to provide a Registered Land Surveyor to tie out land monuments prior to the construction of Project No. STPD-91-5(114)/Albion - N-45 and to tie out and re-establish monuments after construction. The State agrees to reimburse the County for the actual cost of the survey work. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Agreement as presented for Project No. STPD-91-5(114). Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented an agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads regarding surveying services. The State desires the County to provide a Registered Land Surveyor to tie out land monuments prior to the construction of Project No. STP-39-3(105)/St. Edward – Albion and to tie out and re-establish monuments after construction. The State agrees to reimburse the County for the actual cost of the survey work. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Agreement as presented for Project No. STP-39-3(105). Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, was appointed at the February 9, 2015 Boone County Board of Commissioners meeting to study the feasibility of re-classifying a certain county road. The feasibility study concerns the re-classification of one-half mile of road known as 255th Street between 140th and 145th Avenue from a minimum maintenance road to a local road. The estimated cost to bring the one-half mile of road up to a local gravel road standard is \$64,594.01. Thorin said that this evaluation is a very basic estimate and if the County Board of Commissioners would like to pursue this road re-classification any further, he would recommend a complete Hydraulic Analysis to determine a more exact drainage structure sizing at both locations. A complete Hydraulic Analysis may show that additional drainage will be required to meet the requirements of the flood plain regulations. The cost of a Hydraulic Analysis runs between \$4,000.00 and \$5,000.00 dollars. Preliminary data indicates that the west drainage area of the road is in a Class A Flood Plain and an Army Corps of Engineers Section 404 Permit would be required for any construction done on this portion of the road. The Board and Thorin discussed the state statutes protocol procedure for re-classification of roads and who pays for the construction upgrade.

Thorin submitted three options for the Board to consider regarding the re-classification request. (1) Leave the road as Minimum Maintenance and require the fence to be moved to the right-of-way line and stop watering the county road; (2) Request the road to be re-classified by the state with the cost of construction to be paid by those requesting the upgrade or (3) Request the road be re-classified by the state at county expense. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to leave the road as minimum maintenance. Amendment by Commissioner Maricle to add the language, due to the cost and need for Army Corps of Engineers approval because of location in flood plain area. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to follow up the road re-classification request with a letter of explanation to be sent to all legitimate petitioners that they have the opportunity to pay for the Hydraulic Analysis and all of the construction upgrade costs to re-classify the road per State Statute. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: Tisthammer. Motion carried.



Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a resolution requesting a public hearing for March 30, 2015 regarding narrowing a portion of 190th Avenue. Due to bank erosion of the Cedar River in the northeast corner of the NE1/4 of Section 16, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, the county road known as 190th Avenue is in jeopardy of being impassable. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-06, that a public hearing be held on March 30, 2015, to hear comments in favor of or opposition to narrowing the county road right-of-way to forty (40) feet, beginning at a point at the intersection of 360th Street and 190th Avenue, thence southeasterly for one-thousand three hundred and twenty (1,320) feet, known as a portion of 190th Avenue. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Andy Roberts, Valero, regarding additional lighting at the junction of State Highway 39 and 260th Street contacted Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent. Loup Power District has an existing pole at the intersection of State Highway 14 and Fairview/260th Street on the east side of State Highway 14. Loup Power District has the availability to install a 250W HPS unmetered rental area light on the existing pole for a monthly billing of \$11.03. Thorin and the Board discussed that the lighting of the intersection is a safety issue. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve an Equipment Use Contract between the County of Boone and Loup Power District for an unmetered rental area light and the monthly rental fee to be paid from the Road Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center CEO, informed the Board that the terms of Tim Kayton and Janet Groeteke, Boone County Health Center Board of Trustee members, expire at the end of June and replacements are needed. The Board will place an ad in the local newspapers to accept applications from interested persons in Boone County to serve on the Boone County Health Center Board of Trustees. The appointment is for a six-year term effective July 1, 2015. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to place an application ad for interested persons in Boone County to serve on the Boone County Health Center Board of Trustees in the four county newspapers the weeks of March 16 and 23, 2015 with the application deadline at 4:00 P.M. on Friday, March 27, 2015. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board heard a general assistance request regarding utilities. The Board explained the protocol procedure and guidelines regarding general assistance. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve a portion of a utility bill payable directly to the entity. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, discussed courthouse lawn care for 2015. The 4-Step Lawn Care Application has been alternated between the two local businesses for the last several years. The Board discussed consistency and that advertising for proposals should be addressed every five years. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to advertise for two weeks requesting proposals for the 4-Step Lawn Care Application for the 2015 courthouse lawn care. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Maricle attended the Region 44 Emergency Management Committee meeting. Maricle shared the committee meeting information with the Board members. Maricle and the Board members discussed the concerns regarding health insurance, employee evaluation and vehicle. The consensus of the Board was for committee member Maricle to complete the employee evaluation, trade in/sell the vehicle when the purchase of a different vehicle takes place and to compensate a third of the health insurance increase.



The Board discussed office space for the Board of Commissioners. Luettel met with the Department of Motor Vehicles supervisor from Grand Island last week. The Department of Motor Vehicles is interested in moving into the former Clerk of the District Court space in the courthouse. Luettel will contact the supervisor regarding their move from the multi-purpose room to the former Clerk of the District Court office. The Board of Commissioners will move their office space to the north end of the multi-purpose room.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, and Sheryl Machacek, Communications, updated the Board regarding the Communications Tower project. Machacek said that the Federal Aviation Administration has approved the new tower location in the southwest corner of the Boone County Fairgrounds. The next step is the soil test.
- Jim Ely, County Attorney, updated the Board regarding the horses' situation. Ely updated the Board regarding an Interlocal Agreement with Greeley County for Boone County Veteran Service Officer to provide services for veterans in Greeley County.
- The Board discussed attendance to the Northeast Nebraska Association of County Officials spring workshop scheduled for March 20, 2015 at the Northeast Community College, Norfolk, NE.
- The Board discussed disposal of county owned vehicles.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 12:51 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Monday, March 16, 2015.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, addressed the issue of spectators and people driving through a fire zone. There has been several fires the past weeks and there is state law regarding the issue of spectators in a fire zone. The fire department and law enforcement need the cooperation of the public, which are not authorized in the fire zone, to please stay home.
- Northeast NACO Workshop is scheduled for Friday, March 20, 2015 at the Lifelong Learning Center in Norfolk.
- Wellness Partners is scheduled for Tuesday, March 17, 2015 at the Boone County Courthouse for county employees that registered for the health screening.

Todd Buettner, County Weed Superintendent, presented a quote from Applied Connective Technologies for a new Latitude Laptop Computer. Buettner said he wanted a smaller touch screen computer to be able to take pictures of the weed problem areas. Headrick said that the supplemental insurance was only for the agricultural industry since the 1970's. The insurance company opened up to businesses and government entities in 2014. Headrick said Washington National offers a premium-return option that returns all of the premium you pay over the term of your policy. Headrick said it is unlimited, tax free with no cap and is per cause payments. Headrick said that Washington National pays more than the GAP insurance companies. (Example of GAP is: AFLAC and Colonial) The age you are when taking out the premium locks in the premium rate for as long as you pay the premium. The supplemental insurance is not a payroll deduction. The premium is automatically deducted monthly from an individual's checking/savings account. Headrick asked the Board permission to present the supplemental insurance to county employees. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve Mark Headrick, Washington National, to present the supplemental insurance to the county employees at a later date. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, projects and equipment. Thorin updated the Board regarding the Cedar River Historical Bridge project. Thorin and the Board discussed legislative bills.

The Board reviewed a feasibility study on March 9, 2015 submitted by Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent. The feasibility study concerned the re-classification of one-half mile of road known as 255th Street between 140th and 145th Avenue from a minimum maintenance road to a local gravel road. Petitions to re-classify a county road known as 255th Street were submitted on February 9, 2015 by the petition circulator and the petition language requested that a date and time be set for a public hearing. Thorin prepared a resolution to set a public hearing concerning the petition request. Thorin visited with the petition circulator regarding the feasibility study and the Board's discussion that was held on the March 9, 2015 Board meeting.

The petition circulator signed and submitted the following statement to be attached to the Resolution No. 2015-07:

To the Boone County Board of Commissioners:

A petition was submitted to the county requesting the Board of Commissioners hold a public hearing to consider the re-classification of a County Road from Minimum Maintenance to Local Gravel; (255th Street, between 140th Avenue and 145th Avenue).

As the circulator of the petition, I, David H. Figgner, state that those residents that signed the petition would like to forego the Public Hearing, but request the Board of Commissioner's require that the adjoining landowners abide by Nebraska State Highway and Bridge Laws Chapter 39.

39-301 Roads: Injuring or obstructing; penalties; exceptions.

In-Part: Any person who injures or obstructs a road by encroaching upon the same with any fence, by diverting water onto or across such road so as to saturate, wash or impair the maintenance, construction, or pass ability of such public road, or by allowing water to accumulate on the roadway or traveled surface of the road for more than five days shall upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor.

39-302 Roads; sprinkler irrigation system; restrictions; violations; penalty.

In-Part: A sprinkler irrigation system which due to location or design diverts, or is capable of diverting, water onto or across a public road so as to saturate, wash or impair the maintenance, construction, or pass ability of such public road or allows water to accumulate on the roadway or traveled surface of the public road shall be equipped with a device which will automatically shut off the end gun of the irrigation system causing such diversion or accumulation of water. Any person who fails to comply with this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor, except that section 39-301 shall be controlling with respect to mechanical malfunctions and normal weather conditions.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to forego/deny Resolution No. 2015-07 requesting to set a public hearing date for the re-classification of a portion of a county road known as 255th Street and require that the adjoining landowners abide by Nebraska State Highway and Bridge Laws Chapter 39 as in the statement attached to the resolution. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.



Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the Boone County Veterans Service Office report for the month of February 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Jim Ely, County Attorney, presented an Interlocal Agreement between County of Greeley and County of Boone for Veterans Service Officer services for the Board to review. Greeley County Attorney prepared the Interlocal Agreement. Richard Good, Boone County Veteran Service Office Board Member, and Jacqueline Wells, Boone County Veteran Service Officer were present for the discussion. Good said that the Boone County Veteran's Board has not met to review the agreement to date. Good said he will schedule a meeting. Wells said she inserted some changes to the agreement that was presented from Greeley County. Nebraska Revised Statute Section 60-681 provides for limitations and restrictions for operation of vehicles, including trucks and commercial vehicles, on county roads for a total period of 90 days in any one calendar year when operated upon any highway under the jurisdiction of and for the maintenance of which local authorities are responsible whenever such highway by reason of deterioration, rain, snow or other climatic condition will seriously damage or destroy said highway unless use of vehicles, including trucks and commercial vehicles thereon are limited, prohibited or allowable weight restrictions are receded. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2015-09, authorizing the Boone County Road Department to erect and maintain signs designating the particular restrictions to a county road at each end of the portion of the road affected thereby, and this resolution shall not take effect until such signs are erected and maintained. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:01 A.M. on Monday, March 30, 2015 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings and Board of Equalization Proceedings of March 25, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Greeley County Board asked the Greeley County Attorney to revise the agreement to be more specific on the issue of mileage. The Boone County Board has not received or reviewed the changes made to the Interlocal Agreement with regard to the Veteran Service Office services. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to table the Interlocal Agreement regarding Veteran Service Office services to the April 13, 2015 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Jim Ely, County Attorney, presented a resolution for the Board to review regarding a Juvenile Diversion Program. The eligibility guidelines for the Boone County Juvenile Diversion Program were updated and adopted in March 2008 with Resolution No. 2008-15. Ely informed the Board that changes to the guidelines for juvenile diversion program eligibility are necessary in order to utilize grant funding available from Nebraska Crime Commission. The Nebraska Crime Commission grant funding will be beneficial for the law enforcement to provide educational presentations in the county school systems regarding substance abuse and supervision for those in the diversion program. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve and adopt Resolution No. 2015-11 to supersede all prior eligibility guidelines and that the modified eligibility guidelines for the Boone County Juvenile Diversion Program be effective immediately as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Barb Hanson, County Assessor, updated the Board regarding the valuation abstract submitted to the county liaison that was due on March 26, 2015. Hanson said that the residential homes in the villages, rural homes and farm buildings valuations are below the minimum market value. Hanson informed the Board that the best way to correct the issue is to have re-evaluations completed of all the residential homes in the villages, rural homes and farm buildings.

Lisa Langan, County Court Clerk Magistrate, presented quotes from Eakes Office Solutions for file cabinets to store probate records. The 42" file cabinets are \$1,884.00 each and the 36" file cabinets are \$1,561.00 each. Langan said that the County Court vault and file cabinets are full with no space left. Langan asked the Board if the County Court office may have the new file cabinets placed in the former Clerk of the District Court vault. The Board and Langan discussed the available space within the former District Court vault. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the purchase of two 36" file cabinets from Eakes Office Solutions for the County Court office. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.



The Board, Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, and Jim Ely, County Attorney, discussed the reclaiming of county road right-of-ways. The County Road Department installed curve signs, etc. and some of the signs have already been removed in order to plant crops beyond the boundaries of the landowner. Some fields are being planted too close and encroaching on county road right-of-ways. The planting of crops and fences that have been installed along county road shoulders and in road ditches can have serious consequences for the safety of those traveling county roads, as well as making the maintenance of county roads by road employees more difficult. Neb. Rev. Stat. 39-301 provides in part that "any person who injures or obstructs a public road by placing or leaving any other obstruction thereon, by encroaching upon the same with any fence, shall upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, and the Board discussed safety concerns during visitation of prisoners. Johnson asked the Board to consider a monitoring system for communications with prisoners and visitors each in separate locations. Johnson said that the new Law Enforcement Center in Antelope County is set up for the public to visit with prisoners by voice through computer technology and the visitors are not allowed in the prisoner cell area. Prisoner visitations in Boone County are currently inside the jail facility through a doorway and is not safe for the prisoner, visitor or law enforcement staff. Johnson and office staff will continue to look at other law enforcement building settings to see if there is a way to move equipment or re-arrange space in the law enforcement building without adding an addition to the current building.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- Commissioner Luettel delivered the music records left from the Class 1 Schools to the Boone County Historical Society Museum for display in the museum school house.
- The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) of the State of Nebraska is in the process of updating its records regarding the county owned devices connecting to the state network. The state will charge the rate of \$13.00 per month, per county device. Applied Connective Technology has been contacted to review what needs to be completed in order for the County to not be using the State network.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 12:01 P.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 13, 2015.



MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS

Jerry L. Tisthammer, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, March 30, 2015 at 10:00 A.M. in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Luettel to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Also present was Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and answer questions in relation to the proposed reduction of a county road right-of-way. The hearing is to consider narrowing the right-of-way of a certain county road located in the NE1/4 of Section 16, Township 18 North, Range 7 West, Boone County, Nebraska running in a southeasterly direction, commonly known as 190th Avenue.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, said that the proposed reduction of a county road right-of-way is due to erosion of the Cedar River bank. The Boone County Road Department will do the construction work. Thorin said that Boone County and the Natural Resources Conservation Service are working together on said project. After the county road is re-located, the ground to the east will be back slopped to the river for stream bank stabilization, with erosion control measures installed. The reduction request is on the existing road known as 190th Avenue for narrowing the county road right-of-way from sixty-six feet to forty feet. The request legally described as a section of road beginning at a point between the NE corner of the NE1/4 of Section 16 and the SE1/4 of Section 9, all in Township 18 North, Range 7 West, of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, thence southeasterly one-quarter mile. Thorin said that the East edge of the county road right-of-way is to be moved twenty-two feet to the Southwest on 190th Avenue for approximately one-quarter mile. The project is awaiting Army Corps of Engineers approval. No cost estimate is available at this time. No opposition or public testimony was received or present at the hearing.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to close said hearing at 11:00 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, April 13, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jeff Jarecki, Public Defender, presented a report to the Board regarding the status of court cases since his appointment to the position in August 2012. Jarecki reported that the cases assigned in 2012 and 2013 are all completed. Jarecki reported that the cases assigned in 2014 are completed with the exception of three juvenile cases. Jarecki reported that he has been assigned twelve new cases to date in 2015. Jarecki answered the Board's questions regarding closed/open cases and conflict of interest. Jarecki explained that there are times when he cannot defend the assigned case since he is already defending one of the parties involved or has a client connection. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to accept the 2015 first quarter Public Defender report as submitted. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the County Board Proceedings of March 30, 2015. Commissioner Luettel asked that the phrase "behind the minimum market value" be changed to "below the minimum market value" in paragraph six regarding the County Assessor update to the Board. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board Proceedings with the change from "behind" to "below" of March 30, 2015 and the Public Hearing Proceedings of March 30, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Maricle received a phone call regarding a request for the possibility of a mediator. The individual was asked to address the request in writing to be presented to the Board. Jerry Niewohner for MSJM Properties LLC attended the Board meeting and submitted a request that Boone County Court Case No. CR14-33 be referred to mediation. The Board asked County Attorney, Jim Ely, for guidance regarding the protocol procedure for a mediation request. Ely said that he knows mediation has been used for civil cases but not criminal cases. The Board suggested that Niewohner ask his legal counsel to discuss the issue with Jim Ely, County Attorney, due to the issue being a court matter.





The Board opened two proposals submitted for the courthouse lawn care at 10:00 a.m. The proposals were received from Jarecki Lawncare Greenhouse, LLC and Schrad's KLawn. The Board noted that the last several years the lawn care services have been alternated between the two businesses. Commissioner Luettel addressed the alternating of services each year due to the businesses both being located in Boone County and do a good job. The ad for bids described the request as a 4-Step Lawn Care Application. Steve Schrad was present at the Board meeting to present and answer questions regarding his proposal. Rod Nelson, Maintenance, called Jim Jarecki, Jarecki Lawncare Greenhouse, LLC on speaker telephone, in order for Jarecki to answer questions from the Board regarding his proposal. The prepay 4-Step application with grub control proposals were Schrad's KLawn for \$1,425.00 and Jarecki Lawncare for \$920.99. Maricle said it is challenging to compare the bids due to Schrad using liquid material and Jarecki using dry material. Nelson said that the ad for proposals should be more detailed and not just say 4-Step Lawn Care Application. Maricle and Luettel are comfortable with the continuance of alternating years for lawn care services. The Board asked that the communication between Nelson and Schrad be open so that the mowing and water correspond timely with the lawn care applications. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve with the option to take lawn care bids and/or rotate the lawn care services each year and approve the 2015 lawn care proposal for the courthouse lawn care from Schrad's KLawn for \$1,425.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Nays: Tisthammer. Motion carried.

Aubrey Schriver and Mitchell Glesinger, BCDA, Inc., updated the Board regarding BCDA activities. Schriver informed the Board that she has resigned from her position with BCDA, Inc. effective May 1, 2015. Schriver informed the Board that she did not feel there would be an increase to the BCDA, Inc. budget request for the next year. Schriver said that BCDA, Inc. received their Federal 501C-3 Non-profit status with an effective date of August 30, 2013.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff and Sheryl Machacek, Communications Director, updated the Board in regard to a new County Communications Tower. Machacek provided the Board a copy of a Geotechnical Engineering Report. Machacek said that the soil testing is completed and the project has received approval from the Nebraska Department of Aeronautics. The next steps are to work with a consultant for specs and advertisement for tower bids. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, reminded Machacek of advertisement procedures if federal funds are involved in the purchase of a new tower. The Board suggested that Machacek ask Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, for assistance regarding possible federal funds and advertisement for construction of a new communications tower. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and presented his March report. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- Several concrete culverts are cracking and need to be replaced. The concrete culverts will probably be replaced with steel culverts.
- Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, projects and equipment.





Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a resolution regarding the narrowing of a county road right-of-way. Thorin said due to bank erosion of the Cedar River, a portion of a county road will be lost. The county road is described as beginning at a point between the NE1/4 of Section 16 and the SE1/4 of Section 9, Township 18 North, Range 7 West, of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, thence southeasterly one thousand three hundred twenty feet, known as 190th Avenue. The said county road will need to be moved twenty-two feet to the southwest to allow for river bank stabilization to be completed. The adjoining landowner is willing to allow said road to be moved twenty-two feet to the southwest if said right-of-way is reduce from sixty-six feet to forty feet. The primary use of the Boone County Visitors Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee received two requests for advertisement funding.

The Petersburg Community Club submitted an application requesting assistance to advertise the Bash in the Burg event scheduled for August 8, 2015. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitors Promotion Fund for the Bash in the Burg event as presented. The EMS policy is to send a bill notification two/three times regarding an ambulance transport. If the bill is not paid after the third notice of balance due after insurance or a bill not paid after a second notice when the patient had no insurance on record, EMS will write that portion off their books and notify the county. Nicole Levander, Boone County Health Center, is the liaison for the Boone County Ambulance Service billings. The Board needs to address the process for handling ambulance service collections when EMS receives no response. The Board discussed having the liaison send a bill on behalf of the county with the balance due and that the patient is welcome to use a payment plan of a minimum of \$100.00 per month. If there is no response in thirty days the bill will be turned over to the County Attorney for collection. The Boone County Agricultural Society expense to date is \$11,498.24 for the development of a business plan and promotional material. Members of the Boone County Historical Society, Inc. have contacted the Board regarding roof repairs and maintenance/preservation for the Boone County Museum. The last budget filed by the Boone County Historical Society, Inc. was for the 1998-1999 fiscal year and last levy was in 1998. They have been operating with volunteers and donations since 1999-2000 fiscal year. In June of 2010 the Historical Society Board asked the Board of Commissioners for \$2,000.00 for the purpose of installing a telephone line and internet service in the museum. The Board has budgeted \$2,000.00 each fiscal year since 2010-2011 payable to the Boone County Historical Society, Inc. from the County General Fund to help cover the telephone/internet expenses. In order for the Boone County Historical Society, Inc. to submit a separate budget/levy for improvements it would need to be an Election approval by the vote of the citizens of Boone County. The Board of Commissioners may approve an amount each fiscal year for maintenance for a nonprofit county historical association or society that is not receiving funds from a levy. Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, appeared before the Board for the purpose of opening bids for the County Communications Tower. Five bids were received as follows:

- Platte Valley Communications \$259,407.68

Smith indicated that he would review each of the proposals and meet with Sheryl Machacek, E911 Communications Manager, and they would prepare a presentation for the June 8, 2015 Board Meeting for review by the Board prior to making their decision. Several additional matters were discussed with Smith regarding the new tower including a road to the site, groundwork and leveling, transfer of antennas and removal of the old tower.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- Mary Jane Noble, Patsy Boilesen and Paul Hosford, on behalf of the Boone County Historical Society, Inc., attended the Board meeting and discussed with the Board the possibility of the County providing financial assistance with regard to repairs and upgrades at the Boone County Museum. The Historical Society would like to repair the roof and provide additional insulation in addition to upgrading the heating/air conditioning system. The Historical Society provided information and bids with regard to the repairs contemplated. The Board reviewed the information presented and indicated that they would like to review the information further and consult with the County's accountant as to the budget ramifications.
- Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, presented a final draft of a letter and newspaper notice prepared with the help of the County Attorney and Craig Nelson, NIRMA counsel, with regard to planting crops in the county road right-of-way for the Board's information.
- Commissioner Maricle presented information for the Board's review regarding office furniture for the County Commissioners' Room.
- Denny Johnson, County Sheriff, presented the Board with information regarding deputy/dispatcher wages. Sheriff
 Johnson indicated that with the scheduled increase in the minimum wage to \$9.00, he feels the wages for the
 deputies and dispatchers should be increased. The Board advised that he needs to include this in his upcoming
 budget and they will review it at that time. Sheriff Johnson said he would contact the County Clerk about getting on
 the agenda regarding this. Sheriff Johnson also visited briefly with the Commissioners regarding the purchase of
 body cameras.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, June 8, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, and the Board discussed disposal of the laptop computer that was purchased in 2010 for data use during patient transports. A new computer was installed in the county ambulance unit in May of 2015. Bruland informed the Board that Applied Connective Technologies destroyed the 2010 hard drive. In addition, Applied Connective Technologies offered to apply credit to the county ambulance account for the old laptop. Tisthammer suggested that Bruland contact the hospital for adequate destruction of the old hard drive in regard to HIPPA compliance. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve and authorize Randall Bruland to accept the credit for the old laptop from Applied Connective Technologies as discussed. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of May 27, 2015 and the Board of Equalization Proceedings of June 1, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Emily Kobylarczyk, Nichole Goodman and Luke Hinkle, Invenergy, were present to commemorate the Prairie Breeze Wind Energy Center's 2014 Projects 1st year tax payment that includes nameplate tax and real estate tax. The first year payment for the 19 Prairie Breeze wind turbines in Boone County is for May through December 2014 in the amount of \$103,146.00. Hinkle said that the construction has started for Prairie Breeze Wind Farm III and that there are plans for Prairie Breeze Wind Farm III.

Vic Lee and Tanya Sharp, Boone County Health Center, and the Board discussed the purchase of a residential dwelling for the Boone County Health Center to use for internship students. The Boone County Health Center is interested in purchasing Lot 5, Block 1, South Fairview Addition to Albion, Boone County, Nebraska. The Boone County Health Center cannot own real estate, therefore, the real estate is owned by the County of Boone, Nebraska. The Boone County Health Center plans to reimburse the County of Boone for the real estate purchase. Lee said that there would be occupancy/renter insurance processed today with the present owners, due to the residential dwelling changing ownership. Lee said that the present owners may continue to occupy the residential dwelling until the residential dwelling they are purchasing is ready for occupancy. Lee said that the plan is to advertise the residential houses, known as Fox and Hellbusch, for sale to be removed from the property. Lee said there is future plans for expansion to the medical clinic. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the purchase of Lot 5, Block 1, South Fairview Addition to Albion, Boone County, Nebraska in the amount of \$150,000.00 plus \$450.00 appraisal fee with issuance of a check to Denny L. and Melinda L. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Cedar Rapids Community Club requested assistance to advertise the Cedar Rapids Community Picnic event scheduled for June 20, 2015. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The American Legion Post 162 and VFW Post #736 requested assistance to advertise the American Legion VFW fundraiser event scheduled for June 20, 2015. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to write-off the February 2014 account balance of \$93.04 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The recommendation for the February 2014 account balance of \$1,113.75; the August 2014 account balance of \$1,375.00; and the August 2014 account balance of \$2,185.00 is that the three account balances be turned over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to write-off three uncollectible ambulance accounts in the sum of \$4,673.75, pursuant to the recommendation received from the ambulance service and turn the files over to the County Attorney for further collection. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The service agreement between Applied Connective Technologies and Boone County Courthouse expired on May 31, 2015. The agreement covers the Gateway AV/Anti-Spyware/Intrusion Prevention subscription and onsite service to the county's network equipment and internet connection. The cost has remained the same for the year June 2015 through May 2016. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Managed Network/Firewall Services Agreement with Applied Connective Technologies, LLC as presented. Roll call vote: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ken McIntyre, Boone County American Legion Commander, phoned the County Clerk's office to have the County Clerk ask the Board if the date of Wednesday, October 21, 2015 would work for County Government Day. McIntyre said he has visited with the schools and that date works for the schools. The Board plans to discuss it with the officials/department heads at the Board meeting scheduled for June 15, 2015.

Commissioner Maricle invited Boone-Nance County Extension Board Members, Boone County 4-H Council Board Members and Boone County 4-H parents to attend the Board meeting today to discuss compensatory time vs. overtime pay for the extension office employee during the months of June and July in regard to county fair activities. There were eight representatives present for the county extension 4-H program. Commissioner Maricle proposed a temporary compensatory time system that could be used by the extension office during county fair time and other departments as needed during busy times. The draft proposal submitted for consideration by Maricle is for limited compensatory time for unique/specific circumstances with paper documentation allowed by the department heads. It was pointed out that the extension office is unique due to the extension educators being state employees and the office assistant/clerical is a county employee. Maricle said that the extension office assistant averages eighty extra hours in June and July regarding 4-H fair work. Several addressed the extra work hours for county fair preparation and the smooth flow provided by the extension office during county fair week.

Commissioners Luettel and Tisthammer commented that the new time and attendance clock system implemented in January 2014 will log the overtime hours at the end of each 40 hour week. The Labor/Wage laws provide time and half pay over forty hours in each designated work week. The employee will be paid the overtime hours at the end of each pay period. Commissioner Luettel said that compensatory time allows 1½ hours of time off for every hour worked over 40 hours per week by the employee and therefore the employer loses ½ hour of productive time by the employee and is not an efficient use of taxpayer money. When an employee is absent from work due to use of compensatory time another employee needs to cover their duties or





someone is usually being paid to sit in the office or the office is closed and the work still needs to be completed when they return to work.

The county clerk addressed the group with an example of county employee's paid benefits. The 2015 calendar year based on 40 hour work weeks is 2088 hours of paid work time. The county employees receive 96 hours per calendar year of paid holiday time. The county has a longevity program regarding vacation time and hourly wages. A county employee that has been continuously employed for 28 years receives 168 hours of vacation time. A county employee receives 56 hours of sick leave each calendar year that may be accumulated to 240 hours. Employee example: say the employee has 112 hours of sick leave available for use this year. If the employee decides to exhaust all available paid benefit hours of 376 less the 2088 hours for the year, that leaves the employee physically working 1712 hours on the job. Compensatory time adds to more time an employee is not present on the job working the scheduled hours the entity is open as a service to the public.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer a request to allow the Boone County Extension office employee to utilize temporary compensatory time in lieu of being paid overtime for the months of June and July, 2015 in regard to county fair activities. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle. Nays: Tisthammer and Luettel. Motion did not carry.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and presented his May report. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- Thorin said he is waiting for the Nebraska Department of Roads to finalize the load rating of the Cedar Rapids Historic Bridge in order to open it to the public. Thorin expects the bridge to have a 15 ton weight limit and 15 mile per hour limit.
- Thorin said he is still waiting for the Army Corps of Engineers permit to build the shu-fly in order to start construction on the bridge west of Petersburg.
- Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, projects and equipment.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board to discuss the heating systems in the county road buildings. Thorin informed the Board that his office and the county clerk's office have spent many hours the past several years on the phone discussing the billings with SourceGas. Several times the checks have been posted to accounts that are not even a Boone County account. Thorin said he would like to look into alternative systems for more efficient heating for the county road buildings. Thorin plans to research alternative heating systems and will report to the Board at a later date.

The state statutes require the Sheriff to make quarterly reports to the County Board describing fees and activities. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to accept and approve the County Sheriff's 2015 first quarter report as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Clerk submitted a copy of pledged security (collateral) for \$350,000.00. The increase of the pledge collateral from \$350,000.00 to \$700,000.00 is needed in order to pay the June Accounts Payable Vendor Claims that were filed for payment. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to acknowledge and approve the pledged security (collateral) as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Nebraska State Statute 80-101 refers to County Veterans Service Committee appointments and terms. The committee members are five-year terms. The term of Raymond Thieman expires in June 2015. Motion made





by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to reappoint Raymond Thieman of Petersburg to a five-year term expiring in June 2020 to the Boone County Veterans Service Board. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County of Boone's fiscal year budget ends on June 30 each year. The Board reviewed several Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed on the various funds for payment. The Board discussed the purchase of a paper shredder with the department head and partially rejected one of the Vendor Claims, #556, in the amount of \$742.99. The Board said that they had not approved the request of a paper shredder purchase for another department head last month. The Board is reviewing the Shred Monster, Inc. locking containers program. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed for payment from the various funds less the paper shredder amount of \$742.99: General - \$210,840.88; Road - \$254,535.32; Boone County Visitors Promotion - \$400.00; Reappraisal - \$28,650.67; Inheritance Tax - \$150,817.50; 911 Emergency Management (2910) - \$549.42; 911 Wireless Service (2913) - \$2,197.64; Ambulance - \$2,583.85; Boone County Fitness Center - \$9,321.00, which is all reimbursed back to the county. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to recess said Board meeting at 12:19 P.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to reconvene said Board meeting at 12:59 P.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager; Sheryl Machacek, Sheriff Communications; Denny Johnson, Sheriff; and the Board reviewed and discussed the five bids that were received and opened on May 27, 2015. Smith updated the Board regarding the meetings held to evaluate the bids since May 27, 2015. The Board and Smith thanked Machacek for assembling the bids into a packaged format for easier review. The group felt that the bids from World Tower Company, Inc. of Mayfield, Kentucky and Electronic Engineering Co. of Sioux City, Iowa did not provide sufficient material. The group felt that the bid from Allstate Tower, Inc. of Henderson, Kentucky did not include/specify answers regarding the specifications document. The group felt that the two contingent bids were Sabre Industries, Inc. of Sioux City, Iowa for \$256,209.00 and Platte Valley Communications, Inc. of Grand Island, Nebraska for \$259,407.68. Saber Industries bid set out a nice time line for completion of the work. All five of the bids had pluses and minuses. The group telephoned Platte Valley Communications to address the volume of concrete and receive assurance that the tower structure bid is for Structure Class III. Smith said that Homeland Security Funds may be available to cover a third of the costs providing the tower is completed by a certain date. The shelter/building may be provided by East Central District Health. The County Road Department will provide a road to the site, groundwork and leveling. The group discussed concerns regarding the project and removal of the current tower. Commissioner Luettel felt that no more difference than there is between the bids submitted by Sabre Industries, Inc. and Platte Valley Communications, Inc., that he favors keeping the business in Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and award the contract bid for a new free standing Structure Class III County Communications Tower to Platte Valley Communications, Inc. of Grand Island, Nebraska for \$259,407.68 to be located in the southwest corner of the Boone County Fairgrounds. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jeff Rauh, TransCanada, introduced Georgia Parment and updated the Board regarding the Keystone XL pipeline project. The Board and Rauh discussed the Boone County right-of-way agreements. Rauh said that about 90 percent of the right-of-way agreements are completed in Nebraska and nearly completed in Boone County. The eminent domain cases remain on hold until a ruling on a lawsuit is completed and there is a federal decision on the project. Rauh said that there is a continuing demand from refineries in Louisiana and Texas to process the heavy crude being produced in Canada.



Denny Johnson, Sheriff, and the Board briefly discussed dispatch and deputy wages due to the Nebraska minimum wage to increase to \$9.00 per hour on January 1, 2016. The wages for all departments will be discussed during the 2015-2016 budget preparation.

The Board continued their discussion regarding furniture/chairs for the multi-purpose/commissioners room. The Board plans to discuss the matter with department heads at the Board meeting on June 15, 2015. Eakes Office Products may be contacted to bring one of the folding tables on rollers for the group to view before a decision is made.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, June 15, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- Commissioner Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective offices.
- Boone County Government Day is set for Wednesday, October 21, 2015.
- The group present discussed informational articles from each of the county offices for the Albion News. The County Sheriff's office periodically has informational articles for the public. The Board asked the group if informational articles are prepared, do they plan to send it to all four county newspapers. Some said they only provide news articles to the papers that call and ask for news worthy items/information. Some offices said they send the informational articles to all four county newspapers. No formal decision was made addressing informational articles submitted by county offices.
- The Board was asked by some county employees if they would consider the possibility that the county would pay for an employee membership or half of an employee membership to the Boone County Fitness Center as a wellness benefit program. The group present discussed the benefit for employees. There is no decrease in the health insurance premium for an employee participating in a wellness program. The idea of a wellness program is to help an individual manage their health with less claims and emergency room visits. A membership fee by an employer is taxable to an employee as wages, to be included on their W-2 and subject to Federal, Social Security and Medicare Tax. The Board plans to make a decision regarding a wellness benefit plan at a later date.
- Shred Monster, Inc. of Columbus, Nebraska has a "Locking Containers" program. A 65 gallon locked bin rental is \$39.00 each time the Shred Monster truck is in the Albion area to shred the contents. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the services of Shred Monster, Inc. for a 65 gallon locking container bin, to use for the security of documents from all of the county offices, until the shred truck arrives to Albion on their scheduled route. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.
- The Nebraska Public Employees Retirement Systems announced that employees vested in the "Cash Balance Fund" as of December 31, 2014 will be receiving a dividend of 5.8% either in the second or third quarter of 2015.





- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, informed the group that the Mobile Food Pantry will be at the Boone County Fairgrounds Casey's Building on Saturday, June 27, 2015. Johnson said that there is no Mobile Food Pantry in July, due to July 4, 2015 being a Saturday. All volunteer help is appreciated.
- Employees are reminded to re-fuel the county vehicles at White Star Oil Co. and sign the fuel ticket after each use of the vehicles. A vehicle log is in each of the county vehicles to be completed by the employee using the vehicle. There is three county vehicles that may be used for county business/meetings vs. the county paying employee's mileage.
- Commissioner Maricle asked the group present for input on suggested furnishings for the multipurpose/commissioners room. The Board is looking at tables that foldup with rollers for easier storage. The tables are either four foot or six foot and to justify a purchase, should some of both sizes be purchased or all the same size and how many. Eakes Office Products may be bringing a table for demonstration.

The Board reviewed the County Board Proceedings of June 8, 2015. Commissioner Luettel asked that the phrase "the employer loses 11/2 hours of productive time by the employee" be changed to "the employer loses ½ hour of productive time by the employee" in paragraph twenty regarding compensatory time for employees. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings with the change from "11/2 hours" to "1/2 hour" of June 8, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Barb Hanson, County Assessor, and the Board discussed part-time help for the Assessor's office in order to equalize the values of county property. Hanson informed the Board that she discussed the possibility of another county office providing data entry services into the Assessor's programs with MIPS and Wendy, State Field Liaison. The State and MIPS said there is no problem if another county office provides data entry services into the Assessor's programs. Hanson then asked for permission to advertise for a full time clerical position for the office. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve another county office providing data entry services into the Assessor's programs and authorize Barb Hanson, County Assessor, to advertise for a full time position in order for the office to complete the equalization of values of county properties. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

An Agreement with Donna Johnson to provide meals for the prisoner(s) held in the Boone County Jail was signed February 25, 2015. At that time there was no change to the daily meal fees that were set in 2011. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, asked the Board to review the prisoner meal agreement due to the increase of food costs. The present amounts are \$22.00 a day for the first prisoner and \$14.00 a day for each additional prisoner. The requested amount is \$25.00 a day for the first prisoner and \$16.00 a day for each additional prisoner. In addition, the county pays into the county retirement system for the employees, the employees receive 96 hours of holiday pay in a calendar year, earned vacation and sick leave. The Board, elected officials and department heads have worked the past several years together to put an employee handbook together for protection of the County Government for some consistency and structure for the employer and employees.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to increase the base wage (starting salary for new employees) \$1.00 per hour for the Zoning Administrator, Veteran Service Office, Clerical, Office Assistant and Sheriff office personnel, excluding law enforcement deputies; \$.58 per hour for the road employees, law enforcement deputies, courthouse maintenance, ambulance and weed, with the \$1.00 or \$.58 respectively added to the employees present hourly wage at the end of the 2015 year, for the 2016 calendar year. The Elected officials and Highway Superintendent are to receive a 4% cost of living increase on their base wage and the four chief deputies to receive 65% of the respective elected official's cost of living, all being effective December 22, 2015 to coincide with the 22/21 pay period. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county once during each of its sessions in January, April, July and October of each year per Nebraska State Statute 47-109. The Board visited the Boone County Jail per Nebraska State Statute.

- Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding an audit of the county bridge files, which was contracted by the Nebraska Department of Roads.
- Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road projects and said that on Monday of this week the road employees changed back to working five, eight hour days.

The Board accepted the termination of the Agreement with Donna Johnson for providing meals for the prisoner(s) held in the Boone County Jail, effective September 1, 2015 at their August 26, 2015 Board meeting. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, informed the Board on August 26, 2015 that Darla McIntosh was interested in assuming the position in regard to prisoners' meals. A new Agreement with Darla McIntosh to provide meals for the prisoner(s) held in the Boone County Jail will be at the rates that were effective July 1, 2015. The amount is \$25.00 a day for the first prisoner and \$16.00 a day for each additional prisoner. The amounts of \$25.00 and \$16.00 include labor and food. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the amounts per day of \$25.00 for the first prisoner and \$16.00 for each additional prisoner, effective September 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016, with the understanding that the Agreement may be extended on the same terms and conditions by written Agreement of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff, and Darla McIntosh, Independent Contractor. Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) provides a Guide to Creating a Personnel System for Nebraska Counties to assist counties in creating a personnel system that complies with applicable Nebraska and federal law. BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS SEPTEMBER 14, 2015 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, September 14, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Hilary K. Maricle and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board and Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, reviewed the two bids that were received for a new County Ambulance unit. Jeff D. Horn, representative for North Central Emergency Vehicles, presented their bid for a new 2016 Braun Chief XL Type 1 Ambulance on a 2016 Ford F450 4x4 chassis. The Braun Chief XL is all aluminum, fully welded, seamless Type 1 Ambulance and provides optimum room for storage and comfort. The seamless welded frame also provides the ability to remount in the future on a different chassis. The North Central Ambulance Sales and Service bid is \$236,055.00 without trade-in or \$226,055.00 with trade-in of the County Ambulance 2010 Medtec unit. Michael Semerad, representative for Danko Emergency Equipment, emailed a bid for a new PL Type 1 Classic Ambulance on a 2016 Ford F450 4x4 chassis. Bruland said that the interior of the PL Type 1 Classic Ambulance is made out of wood and fastened together with screws and glue. The Danko Emergency Equipment bid is \$219,108.00 without trade. Both bids included a Stryker power load system and diesel 2016 Ford F450 chassis. The Board and Bruland favored the safety features and one-piece patient treatment area on the Braun ambulance. Bruland said the county has received good service from North Central Ambulance Service. The Board decided to see if there is any interest from area community fire/rescue departments wanting to purchase the 2010 County Ambulance before deciding on a trade-in.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the purchase of the 2016 Braun Chief XL Type 1 Ambulance from North Central Ambulance Sales and Service of Lester Prairie, MN for \$236,055.00 with option to trade in the 2010 Medtec Ambulance as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board, Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and Lee Diessner discussed the driveway request off of the county road known as 140th Avenue south of 255th Street. Diessner completed an application requesting a driveway off of a county road on September 2, 2015. Diessner said that the driveway would not be used every day and that he has a load of gluten delivered by truck on the county road approximately every fourteen days. Thorin prepared different scenarios regarding the distance from the top of the hill to the bottom where the requested driveway would come out onto the county road. One of Thorin's scenarios is a grain truck or tractor/wagon pulling onto the county road from the driveway and a school bus on the gravel road coming over the top of the hill. The distance from the hilltop to the proposed driveway is not enough for the school bus to stop safely. The Board and Thorin said that there are safety issue concerns involving the county road and allowing a driveway at the bottom of a hill. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table the driveway request and physically investigate the area for possible driveway options. Thorin is to review liability issues regarding a driveway built in a county road right-of-way. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and presented his August report. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- Thorin informed the Board that some of the motor graders have been down for repair and the excavator is down for repair that was being used on the Cedar River bank stabilization project.
- The bridge project west of Petersburg is being held up to determine whether the project would impact the American Burying Beetles' habitat and waiting for a letter of concurrence from the State Historical Society that the project will not destroy any historical sights.
- Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, projects and equipment.

Eric Lordemann requested permission to trench a 1" natural gas pipeline across a county road commonly known as 230th Avenue running north and south between Sections 5 and 6, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The trenched natural gas pipeline commences from the pipeline currently located in the SW1/4 of Section 5, Township 22 North, Range 6 West, thence running West across 230th Avenue and continuing North through the SE1/4 of section 6, Township 22 North, Range 6 West, to a point located in the NE1/4 of Section 6, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska where a new residence is being constructed. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-31, granting permission to Eric Lordemann to trench a 1" natural gas pipeline across a county road known as 230th Avenue to a new residence being constructed in the NE1/4 of Section 6, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed the information received regarding the City of Albion Street Improvement District #2015-01 project. The County of Boone owns real estate along Harrison Street that is used by the Boone County Road Department. The public hearing for the project is set for October 13, 2015. In the spring of 2015, it was requested by property owners in the Harrison Street area that the City of Albion begin the Street Improvement District creation process for City streets in the area that have never been paved. The City of Albion has been working with JEO Consulting Group to estimate the project costs for such an improvement. The project information indicates that there are seventeen property owners of record which directly abut the proposed paving improvements. If more than 50% of the property owners of record object to the creation of the Street Improvement District then the ordinance is repealed and the paving improvements will not take place. If 50% or less of the property owners of record which directly abut the proposed paving improvements object to the project, then the paving project will proceed. If the paving project proceeds, the estimated assessment for the County of Boone footage is \$36,557.00. Commissioner Maricle felt the street improvement project should be supported to help with economic improvements.

The Board held a lengthy discussion in regard to the street improvement project. In addition, the Board discussed the possibility of finding an area to relocate the county road department. The County Road Department District #2 Shop building has very little frontage off of State Highway #14 to move motor graders and trucks around in and out of the shop building. Commissioner Luettel suggested selling the County of Boone property and move the county road department out of the city limits of Albion to an area where there is room for a building large enough to work on a truck or motor grader inside and a yard with room enough to turn the road equipment around in.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve the County of Boone estimated assessment cost of \$36,557.00 regarding the City of Albion Street Improvement District #2015-01 project for the purpose of economic improvements. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: Luettel. Motion carried.



Judd Allen, NACO Benefit Services, introduced himself to the Board and explained the services provided to the counties by NACO. Allen is a marketing representative for NACO Benefit Services. Allen addressed questions from the Board.

The 2015-2016 County Budget public hearing for the County of Boone, Nebraska was held at 10:30 A.M. on September 14, 2015. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve exceeding the lid limit by an additional 1% budget authority growth for fiscal year 2015-2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Budget Act (State Statute Section 23-904) requires a budget message to be completed by the budget making authority outlining the fiscal policy for the budget period. The budget message must include a list of all cash amounts being held by officials that do not appear in the County Treasurer's Office six month balance reports. The Board has approved and authorized accounts within County Offices to receive and disburse fees, etc. Some of the accounts balance to zero and some accounts have a beginning balance. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-32 authorizing the accounts within County Offices as stated in the resolution. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the County of Boone passes by a majority vote a resolution setting the tax request at a different amount. The Governing Body of the County of Boone, by a majority vote by the Boone County Board of Commissioners, resolves that: the 2015-2016 property tax request be set at \$3,271,759.00, which is different from the 2014-2015 request of \$3,433,986.00; and the 2015 county tax rate is at 0.149127, which is different from the 2014 tax rate of 0.180253. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-33 at the September 14, 2015 public hearing to adopt and approve the County Budget for 2015-2016 as published and presented with the above property tax requests. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator, submitted an Interlocal Agreement for renewal between the County of Boone and City of Albion. The City of Albion requires a Street Superintendent and desires the Street Superintendent to be licensed with the State of Nebraska. Darrel D. Thorin is a Class A Licensed County Highway Superintendent, a licensed Street Superintendent and a full time employee for the County of Boone. Thorin is a full time salaried employee of Boone County and City of Albion desires to remit payment directly to Boone County on a monthly basis for each month of this agreement. All parties on an annual basis shall review the Interlocal Agreement. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign Resolution No. 2015-34 an Interlocal Agreement between the County of Boone and City of Albion for licensed Highway and Street Superintendent services in effect for one year commencing on January 1, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.



The Board received information from Mary Ann Borgeson, Douglas County Commissioner, regarding Stepping Up: A National Initiative to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails. The National Association of Counties (NACo), the Council of State Governments (CSG) Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Foundation (APF), in partnership with the U.S. Justice Department's Bureau of Justice Assistance, will launch a new initiative to support counties of all sizes in reducing the number of people with mental illnesses in jails. As part of the Call to Action for Stepping Up, NACo and partners are calling on counties to pass a resolution or proclamation to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in the county jail. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to prepare a resolution regarding Stepping Up: A National Initiative to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails for approval at their September 21, 2015 Board meeting.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- The Board discussed who would attend the various meetings scheduled this week.
- The Board discussed a power outage policy for the courthouse. No action at this time.
- Ed Miller discussed his concerns with the Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, regarding a culvert for cattle to walk through, a county road right-of-way southwest of Primrose and the minimum maintenance road known as 110th Avenue south of 300th Street. Thorin explained the protocol procedure regarding the maintenance of designated minimum maintenance roads. Thorin plans to physically inspect the area of concern.
- Orrin Strand discussed his concerns with the Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, regarding maintenance on county roads east of Petersburg and possible erosion issues. Thorin explained that trees, shrubs, etc. are not to be disturbed/removed between April 1st and September. 1st. Strand asked the Board if one of them would attend a meeting with the area residents to discuss their concerns. Strand plans to inform the Board when the area residents have made arrangements for a meeting and to discuss road improvement options.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Hilary K. Maricle and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jeff Jarecki, attorney for MSJM Properties LLC, and Mary Ziemba, Boone County Zoning Administrator, appeared before the Board regarding the Conditional Use Permit currently before the Board for approval. Jarecki indicated that all requirements had been met for approval of the Conditional Use Permit and requested that the permit be approved. Jarecki indicated that at the current time, the Court has entered a temporary injunction concerning the building of the facility and that the court issue was a separate matter from the issue regarding approval of the permit. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the issuance of the Conditional Use Permit to MSJM Properties LLC. Tisthammer noted that there are pros and cons regarding the issuance of the permit and the Board was in agreement that all requirements for the issuance of the permit had been met. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings and Board of Equalization Proceedings of September 14, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve the 2015-2016 County Budget Public Hearing Proceedings of September 14, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Commissioners met with the officials, department heads and employees for their monthly reports as follows:

- Barb Hansen, County Assessor, reported that her office was caught up with the rural updates and would be entering the values. Land use updates are required by March 2016.
- Jacqueline Wells, Veterans Service Officer, updated the Board on the meetings she had attended. Wells indicated that there were
 a lot of changes coming but felt they would not affect Boone County office as much as they would affect the Greeley County office.
 Commissioner Tisthammer indicated that he would like to set up a meeting at a later date with Wells and Greeley County
 Commissioner Diessner regarding the cooperative agreement between the counties for the Veterans Service Office.
- Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, advised the Board that the armor coating was completed on September 18, 2015 and that
 it looked good. Thorin reported that it was discussed at the Northeast District meeting that federal highway and Nebraska
 Department of Roads are going to require the resigning of bridges due to the classification of trucks. The resigning of bridges
 would require a lot of time and expense on behalf of the county. This change was originally proposed in 2008 and is now being
 enforced.
- Steve Pritchard, Extension Agent, reported that the State Fair activities have been wrapped up and that Boone County exhibitors did well. He indicated that they were preparing for the livestock show at Aksarben in Omaha and that the 4-H Achievement ceremony is scheduled for October 4, 2015.
- Mary Ziemba, Zoning Administrator, stated that she has been busy with several different applications and attending meetings regarding highway administration.
- Lorrie Nicklasson, Deputy County Clerk, advised that the office had completed the processing of the petition pages regarding the Death Penalty Repeal; was preparing for a mass mailing of voter registration ID cards and indicated that September 22, 2015 was National Voter Registration Day and that online voter registration was scheduled to begin on that date. In addition, it was brought





to the attention of those officials, department heads and employees attending the meeting that County Government Day is scheduled for October 21, 2015 and a tentative agenda of events was outlined.

- Hilary Maricle, County Commissioner, indicated that after speaking with the Emergency Manager, there is a need for individuals to
 volunteer for the CERT team. She indicated that if there is anyone interested, to let her know. Maricle also advised that the
 communications tower is making progress and that transfer from the old tower to the new tower is scheduled for the end of
 September.
- Ken Luettel, County Commissioner, advised of the upcoming changes as a result of LB 610 concerning the gas tax. Also talked about the procedure of "bundling" regarding bridge and road projects and the impact of bundling at the local level.
- Jerry Tisthammer, County Commissioner, indicated that he would be attending the LEPC meeting. Tisthammer asked everyone to
 be mindful of the upcoming harvest season with increased farm machinery on the county roads. Tisthammer further advised that
 after discussion it was decided that the county would not pursue purchasing a generator for the courthouse in the event of an
 electricity outage inasmuch as such outages do not occur very often.

The Board received a Certificate of Cost Allocation Plan and Computation of Indirect Costs from Sequoia Consulting Group for their review. The completed county wide Cost Allocation Plan is based on actual costs for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2014. The Computation of Indirect Costs is for the county's July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 fiscal year. The indirect costs reimbursement relates to the office space provided in the courthouse for Nebraska Health and Human Services when needed and the Clerk of the District Court – IV-D Child Support services. Sequoia Consulting Services receives a percentage of the indirect cost recovery reimbursement received by the county from Nebraska Health and Human Services. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the Cost Allocation Plan with Sequoia Consulting Group for fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners adopted the 2015-2016 County Budget on September 14, 2015 and approved an interfund transfer from the Inheritance Tax Fund (2700) to the Courthouse Bond Fund (3000). Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2015-36, authorizing the Boone County Treasurer to transfer funds from the General Fund (0100) 37.62% to the Road Fund (0200) on a monthly basis not to exceed \$1,147,100.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-37, Stepping Up Initiative to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails. Roll call vote: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Rusty Bruland appeared before the Board on behalf of the Boone County Ambulance Service. He reported to the Board that Petersburg was no longer interested in acquiring the current ambulance but that Spalding was still interested. He advised the Board that he had disclosed the information regarding the ambulance concerning the transmission, that it had been wrecked and the air conditioning issues. The Board directed Bruland to contact the Spalding representative and indicate if they are interested in acquiring the ambulance, to submit a bid before the next meeting on September 28, 2015. The disposition of the current ambulance unit will be discussed further at the next board meeting on September 28, 2015.

Vic Lee, Boone County Health Center CEO, appeared before the Board regarding the Boone County Health Center budget. Lee reported the new budget year begins on October 1, 2015 and that the budget was approved by the Board at its last meeting. Lee reported that total operating revenue is projected at \$29,656,473 and total operating expenses is projected at \$29,534,990, with total operating income projected at \$121,483.00. The health center will also have non-operating revenue, including investments and grants, which will increase its projected net to approximately \$187,444.00. Lee informed the Board that capital equipment purchases, both



small and large, is budgeted at \$915,000.00, with the majority of the improvements to be related to technology upgrades. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to accept the Boone County Health Center budget as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Vic Lee also advised the Board that work had begun on the Spalding Clinic and plans for the Albion Clinic were currently being completed.

Barb Hanson, Assessor, appeared before the Board regarding the contract between the County and Larry Petsche for pickup work. Hanson advised the Board that she had consulted with the State regarding the contract and that the State advised that the contract be written to show Petsche as a Contractor/Lister. The term "Lister" was included inasmuch as a Contractor can assess values and Petsche does not do this. Hanson also indicated that in the past, payment to Petsche was not on a regular schedule so the new contract sets out the terms of payment in order to provide Petsche payment on a regular basis. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, and the Board discussed the progress of the new County Communications Tower and damage to the transmitter building. Smith has been in contact with Tom Schommer, Telebeep, Inc. d/b/a Telebeep Wireless, regarding the Telebeep antenna/space that they rent on the present county communications tower. Smith said that if the Board agrees to leave the yearly rent at \$600.00, Telebeep is interested in moving their antenna to the new County Communications Tower. Smith informed the Board that Telebeep is responsible for contacting and paying for moving their line/antenna from the old tower to the new tower. Smith informed the Board that the priorities for antenna placement on the new tower will be the new high frequency antenna and sheriff's antennas at the top of the new County Communications Tower, next will be the microwave dishes for the State NRIN system and followed by local and Telebeep. The consensus of the Board is to allow Telebeep to move their antenna at their expense to the new County Communications Tower as long as it does not interfere with the required antennas, State NRIN system and sign a new Agreement with the \$600.00 a year lease payment.

In addition, Smith discussed the damage to the transmitter building upon delivery. Smith had pictures before the building was removed from its previous location in Dakota City, Nebraska and pictures of damage to the building upon delivery. Smith said most of the damage to the concrete building is cosmetic damage that occurred when it was unloaded by the delivery company. Some of the electrical equipment was missing from the building when it arrived, as the before pictures at the previous location shows the difference. East Central Region Governance Board through Homeland Security funds paid for the used transmitter building. Smith said that Homeland Security funds will pay for the generator and that the Homeland Security Grant will reimburse approximately one-third of the new tower materials and labor construction. The consensus of the Board was to have Smith pursue a settlement with the delivery company regarding the damage to the building. Smith informed the Board that the plans are to have the new County Communications Tower in operation on October 9, 2015 or at the latest October 15, 2015.

Smith and the Board visited with Ed Meedel, Platte Valley Communications, regarding the old communications tower maintenance requirements. Meedel informed the Board that FAA regulations require a tower over 200' to have strobe flashing white during day and red at night; or if just a red flashing light on top then the tower needs to be painted red/white. The old communication tower (Kohtz tower) is 260 feet.

- Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge projects.
- Commissioner Luettel asked Thorin if anything had been done on Leo Diessner's driveway on 140th Avenue, north of Highway 91. Thorin replied nothing had been done at this time. The road closure is for 150th Street, located between Sections 30 and 31, all in Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska; commencing at the junction of 220th Avenue and 150th Street, thence east one mile on 150th Street and terminating at the junction of 150th Street and 230th Avenue. If Telebeep, Inc. can reach an agreement with the new (Kohtz Tower) owner they may not be interested in an agreement with the County to transfer their antenna to the new County Communications Tower. The quote for the new tower project work is approximately \$3,150.00. The Board and Denny Johnson, Sheriff, discussed the concerns brought forth by Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager and Sheryl Machacek, Sheriff Communications, regarding the Loup Public Power District proposal. Parment informed the Board that TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP (Keystone), filed an application with the Nebraska Public Service Commission which seeks approval of a route for a major oil pipeline under the Major Oil Pipeline Siting Act. The Public Service Commission formerly accepted and recognized the keystone pipeline application on October 5, 2015 and has seven to twelve months to make a decision. The 374 page filing with the Nebraska Public Service Commission can be reviewed on the Nebraska Public Service Commission website. Parment informed the Board that Keystone has now voluntarily moved to dismiss the eminent domain actions filed in Nebraska. Parment said that Keystone has easements for 91% of Nebraska property and 9% was under the eminent domain. Keystone has secured easements on 25.50 miles of the 28 miles in Boone County. Keystone proposes to construct, operate and maintain a crude oil pipeline and ancillary facilities from Hardisty, Alberta, Canada to Steele City, Nebraska, referred to as the Keystone XL Pipeline project.

Sheryl Machacek, Sheriff Communications, said she plans to meet with Ed Knott, Applied Connective Technologies, at the county communications tower location today. Telebeep Wireless plans to visit with Ed Knott regarding the Telebeep antenna on the communications tower that Applied Connective Technologies is purchasing from the County of Boone. Machacek plans to inform the Board when the new County Communication Tower is in operation. A Bill of Sale needs to be prepared and signed with an effective date of transfer of the communications tower a/k/a Kohtz tower to Applied Connective Technologies, LLC. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, October 26, 2015 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Hilary K. Maricle. Commissioner Ken Luettel arrived at 9:05 A.M. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board of Commissioners asked members of the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. to attend today's Board meeting in order for the Board to be more aware of the operation and functions being held at the county fairgrounds. Dave Noble and Chuck Rolf, members of the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., discussed a variety of issues with the Board. Trent Kraus and Delmer Pelster, members of the racing committee, were in attendance to listen to the discussion regarding the county fairgrounds activities.

The County of Boone owns the real estate and leases to the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. requests a budgeted amount each fiscal year that is funded through a tax levy. Noble said that there are four payments over a two year period left to pay for the event center building. Noble said that the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. bylaws, the lease with County of Boone, and the Articles of Incorporation are being reviewed by Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Law, LLO, PC. The Articles of Incorporation is dated August 5, 1975 and the Lease is dated January 10, 1978. The Board noted that the facilities and events at the fairgrounds have changed over the years. In addition, the fair board members responsibilities have changed from just operating the fair every year to multiple activities at the fairgrounds all year long.

The Board inquired on how the bartenders were paid when working at events scheduled at the fairgrounds. The Board has concerns regarding accountability and verification of payment for employees. Rolf said that the last two years the employees have been paid with a check. Rolf said he has monthly reports available, the qualifying employees are sent 1099's and they have someone completing the quarterly tax reports.

The members of the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. have agreed to hire Ron and Mari Melcher, operators of the US 30 Speedway, Columbus, Nebraska, to operate the Boone County Raceway for the 2016 season. Nothing has been finalized regarding the raceway to date. They are still working on various aspects of the raceway operation. Melcher's are not interested in managing the concession/alcohol sales at the racetrack.

Rolf said that they would like to amend the liquor license to include the concrete area east of the Casey's building and south of the event center building and possibly the grandstand. If this proposal is approved, then it would eliminate the Special Designated License applications for fair time and events that want a beer garden outside of the two buildings.

Rolf said there has been talk about expanding the campground site by thirty-two campsites to the south of the existing campground, which would possibly require the shooting range area to be moved.

The group discussed the proposed Ag/Expo Center. The discussion included who would have ownership of the proposed new facility; in what order and who would be the chain of command to oversee the operation of the new facility and/or other fairground buildings; events in all buildings; raceway and the original event known as



the Boone County Fair. The Board of Commissioners expressed that at this time they are not interested in joint ownership with the City of Albion regarding the Ag/Expo Center facility.

The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. meetings are held on the third Monday of the month except there is no meeting in December. The Board of Commissioners and members of the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. agreed to attend each entity's meetings on a quarterly basis to keep the line of communications open.

- Thorin informed the Board that he tried to receive a second bid for a used pickup. The dealer did not have a used pickup at this time for the type the road department was looking for and suggested the purchase of a new pickup. The purchase of a used pickup will be an agenda item for the November 16, 2015 Board meeting.

Timothy J. Kayton, Trustee, requested permission to trench a water line for livestock purposes across a county road commonly known as 240th Avenue running north and south between Sections 20 and 21, all in Township 19 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The trenched water line commences from a well located in the NW1/4 of Section 21; thence running west across 240th Avenue to the E1/2NE1/4 of Section 20, all in Township 19 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. This water line is to replace an existing line which will be abandoned. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2015-41, granting permission to Timothy J. Kayton, Trustee, to trench a water line across a county road known as 240th Avenue for livestock purposes to the E1/2NE1/4 of Section 20, Township 19 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.



The Board, Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and Gayle Noble discussed drainage issues for home owners along Valley View Drive southwest of Albion. Noble said that a ditch was never constructed in the housing development area on the east side of Valley View Drive. During rain storms water flows down the roadway and into residential basements along Valley View Drive. Several of the residential homes along Valley View Drive set lower than the road. Noble said he created a ditch and installed a small culvert on his property for drainage. It has helped some but does not resolve the problem during heavy rain storms. Noble said that he is only speaking for himself and is not committing any of the other landowners regarding the drainage matters. Noble asked Thorin if construction of curb/gutter on the east side of Valley View Drive would solve some of the water flow problems. Noble said that he is willing to do his share.

Thorin said his research indicated that Valley View Drive is platted to be a 66' road and that the county has been maintaining Valley View Drive. Thorin said that his research of the recorded records did not find where the paperwork was completed for Valley View Drive to be an officially opened county road. Valley View Drive has never been officially opened as a county road, but the neighboring Hill View Drive has an official county road designation.

Thorin suggested the best resolution to this problem would be installation of curb and gutter, because several of the homes are lower than the street. Concrete roadway with curb and gutter was suggested for both Valley View Drive and Hill View Drive. Thorin said he would get some cost estimates for an engineering study on possible road improvements for Valley View Drive and Hill View Drive.

Thorin explained protocol procedure for a county road project. The cost of construction would possibly be the expense of the residents. The Board would likely need to make some resolutions, hold public hearings, and find out if the residents along Valley View Drive and Hill View Drive are interested in a county road improvement district cost share project. Before making the improvements the Valley View Drive would need to be designated an official county road through the protocol procedures.

Thorin researched the protocol procedure for starting a project known as a county road improvement district. Thorin plans to contact Noble to see if he is interested in circulating a petition for signatures for a county road improvement district. The interest/no interest of a signed petition would help guide the County Board of Commissioners whether to have a study completed by an engineering firm for said suggested project.

It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county per Nebraska State Statute 47-109. The Board conducted a routine visit of the Boone County Jail per Nebraska State Statute.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- The Board discussed who would attend the various meetings scheduled this week.
- Rod Nelson, Courthouse Maintenance, informed the Board that several of the courthouse air/heat unit dampers are not working properly. The courthouse has 33 thermostats and 32 dampers, because there is no damper in the courtroom. Nelson received a quote of \$90.00 each to replace the present dampers, with a 5 year life. Some of the dampers currently made the five years, while others did not. A power open/close damper which is somewhat different than the current dampers are quoted at \$157.00 each,



with a 10 year life. The technician charge is \$85.00 per hour to change the dampers. The information is for the Board to review prior to their November 16, 2015 meeting.

- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, updated the Board regarding possible effects of the passage of LB605. The sentencing of inmates/medical responsibilities may become more expensive to the counties. In addition, Johnson updated the Board regarding other law enforcement matters.
- Jim Ely, County Attorney, and the Board discussed the June 2015 transaction regarding a donation of real estate located in Greeley County to the County of Boone for a new Boone County Health Center Medical Clinic.
- Jim Ely, County Attorney, Mary Ziemba, Zoning Administrator, and the Board discussed several County Zoning matters that were discussed at the Boone County Planning and Zoning Commission Board meeting on October 26, 2015. During the discussion Commissioner Maricle said that County Zoning regulations are local decisions, not state decisions. Ely asked the Board if they would consider hiring David Ptak, Attorney, to help him with the County Zoning regulations. The Board did not respond to his request at this time. The Board suggested that Ziemba contact David Potter, JEO, for guidance and input on the regulations.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 12:15 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Monday, November 16, 2015.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, November 16, 2015, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The County Safety Committee met at 9:00 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel, Denny Johnson, Rod Nelson, Tom Smith, Kathy Thorberg and Darrel Thorin. Nelson addressed old business regarding a second exit for the courthouse basement. Nelson said a second basement exit is not cost effective due to ADA requirements. Nelson said that the grinding down of the raised sidewalk by the steps at the northeast corner of the courthouse block did not repair the issue. The Board and Nelson will discuss sidewalk replacement in the spring of 2016. The group discussed widening the ramp in the north parking lot at the same time sidewalk is replaced. Installation of a security camera that would cover all of the courthouse/law enforcement block was discussed under new business. Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, invited all to attend the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) meeting at 7:00 P.M. tonight at the Albion Fire Hall. Smith said that the same type of meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 19, 2015 in Fullerton. Smith plans to pursue the National Weather Service program StormReady. Being a part of a Weather-Ready Nation is about building community resilience in the face of increasing vulnerability to extreme weather and water events. StormReady helps arm America's communities with the communication and safety skills needed to save lives and property before, during and after the event. Nelson said no accidents to report for last quarter. The Safety Committee meeting was adjourned by Nelson at 9:22 A.M.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board Proceedings of November 9, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Kathy Thorberg, County Clerk/Register of Deeds, presented a Memorandum of Understanding regarding Electronic Recording (E-Recording). The Memorandum is between the Boone County Register of Deeds, County of Boone, Nebraska and Corporation Service Company of Wilmington, Delaware. There is no cost to the County to use the program and the County will not incur any liability for the E-files transmitted by the Corporation Service Company. Nebraska State Statute legally authorizes the County to receive qualifying documents for filing/recording electronically. The parties acknowledge that Electronic Recording permits its customers (submitters) to prepare and sign documents, transmit them in electronic format and that the transmitted electronic likeness of the original documents can be considered as the "original" record of the transaction in substitution for, and with the same intended effect as, the original paper documents. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the County Clerk to sign the Memorandum of Understanding with Corporation Service Company as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion Carried.





Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding the Cedar River bank stabilization project. The County plans to complete the road shoulder work after the NRD has completed the seeding of the bank and laying the matting.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a purchase contract for a used 2013 Chevrolet Silverado pickup for the Board to review. Thorin contacted the local dealers regarding the purchase of a used pickup for the road department. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the County Highway Superintendent to sign the purchase contract for the 2013 Chevrolet pickup from Schalk Auto, Inc. for \$20,995.00 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The County Zoning Administrator report was not available for the Board to review.

Rod Nelson, Maintenance, and the Board discussed the courthouse air/heat unit dampers. Nelson brought the air/heat unit dampers issues to the Board on November 9, 2015. The courthouse has 33 thermostats and 32 dampers, because there is no damper in the courtroom. The courtroom has its own rooftop unit. The current dampers are spring form and are quoted at \$90.00 each, to replace with an approximate five year life span. A power open/close damper system quote is \$157.00 each, to replace with an approximate ten year life span. The labor is approximately \$85.00 per hour and is not included in the damper unit quotes. The courthouse windows do not open and it is more cost effective to have temperature control. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize Rod Nelson, Maintenance, to proceed with the courthouse air/heat damper replacement as presented with Engineered Controls, Inc. of Lincoln, Nebraska for the power open/close damper system quote of \$157.00 each and the \$85.00 per hour labor for their services. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- Commissioner Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, informed the group that the Mobile Food Pantry will be at the Boone County Fairgrounds on Saturday, December 5, 2015. The Mobile Food Pantry is scheduled to be in Boone County once a month for all twelve months in 2016. All volunteer help is appreciated.
- Chad Engle, NIRMA, has been contacted to conduct an in person training session regarding harassment in the work place for all county employees to attend. The County Clerk's office will contact Engle for open training dates available in January or February in 2016.
- A county employee appreciation meal was discussed. The small group in attendance discussed the pros and cons of three ideas that were presented. The group decided on Pizza Hut pizza/pop for Monday, December 14, 2015 from 11:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. to accommodate different noon hour schedules for employees.
- The Resolution No. 2012-28, addresses the implementation and policy for the NACO Purchasing Card Program. The Board plans to review the policy regarding allowable purchase transactions following today's discussion.



- Commissioner Maricle asked at the November 9, 2015 Board meeting if there was a possibility to purchase office supplies as a group vs. each individual office ordering their own office supplies. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Payroll Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General \$89,735.58, BCBS \$43,767.69, Ameritas Ret \$6,204.73, EFTPS \$6,700.26, Section 125 Fees \$10.00, Wellness Program \$97.51; Road \$47,012.42, BCBS \$22,822.18, Ameritas Ret \$3,173.33, EFTPS \$3,547.63; Ambulance \$2,650.00, Ameritas Ret \$75.61, EFTPS \$202.71; Public Defender Contract \$3,000.00; Boone County Fitness Center \$6,361.00, Ameritas Ret \$329.99, EFTPS \$486.61, which is all reimbursed back to the County. The County road runs east and west and is commonly known as 110th Street between Sections 5 and 8, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The plowing of the fiber optic cable will be commencing at the southeast corner of 230th Avenue/110th Street intersection, thence plowing easterly on the south side of 110th Street, a distance of 3200 feet to a point of termination. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2015-42, granting permission to Great Plains Communications to plow fiber optic cable on the south side of 110th Street as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Great Plains Communications requested permission to plow fiber optic cable on the south side of 100th Street, commencing at the southwest corner of 100th Street and 230th Avenue intersection, thence easterly a distance of 3500 feet. The County road runs east and west and is commonly known as 100th Street between Section 32, Township 23 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Antelope County, Nebraska and Section 5, Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The plowing of the fiber optic cable will be commencing at the southwest corner of 230th Avenue/100th Street intersection, thence plowing easterly on the south side of 100th Street, a distance of 3500 feet to a point of termination. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2015-43, granting permission to Great Plains Communications to plow fiber optic cable across 230th Avenue and on the south side of 100th Street as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board received a proposal from Ferrellgas for a 500 gallon above ground refurbished propane tank. The propane tank is a backup for the generator located at the new Boone County Communications Tower. The Board reviewed the proposal as submitted. No other proposals were received. The Board would like to receive proposals from other local businesses before making a decision. The purchase of a propane tank will be discussed further at the November 30, 2015 Board meeting.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska (BCBSNE) has worked to protect the health and information of the members they serve. BCBSNE has teamed with AllClear ID to offer all eligible members access to AllClear Secure identity repair and the option to enroll in AllClear Pro credit monitoring. BCBSNE is asking all groups to choose one of three available options: (1) Opt in and receive the services; (2) Opt out and not participate in the program; and (3) Delay your decision until the IRS clarifies the taxability of the benefit. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve NACO's recommendation to delay the decision until the IRS determines if this is a taxable benefit. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, November 30, 2015 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of November 25, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the Boone County Board of Equalization Proceedings of November 25, 2015 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle arrived at 9:05 A.M.

The Board continued the discussion that was tabled at their November 25, 2015 Board meeting regarding the purchase of a 500 gallon, above ground, refurbished propane tank. Sheryl Machacek, Sheriff Communications, informed the Board that she had contacted other local businesses for a proposal. Machacek was informed that they are not allowed to provide that service due to a Non-Compete Agreement. The new transmitter building for the new Boone County Communications Tower is electric. The propane fuel is for operating the backup generator, when needed, which is located at the new Boone County Communications Tower. Commissioner Luettel plans to contact another business that provides propane services for a proposal. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table a decision regarding the purchase of a used 500 gallon propane tank to their December 14, 2015 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ken Luettel, County Commissioner, and Denny Johnson, County Sheriff, are the Boone County representatives on the Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Services Board. Commissioner Luettel presented a Juvenile Services Agreement between the County of Boone, Nebraska and the Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Services, Inc. (NNJS). Several counties paid to construct the Juvenile Facility in 1997 and the bonds have been repaid in full as of December 1, 2015. The County acknowledges that the Juvenile Facility is now owned by Madison County. The need for juvenile detention continues following the termination of the previous Juvenile Services Agreement, and the County of Boone is, along with other counties, prepared to commit to an agreement for juvenile detention services with a term through June 1, 2027. The parties agree that the Board of Directors of NNJS may authorize special assessments on each of the NNJS member counties in order to pay for capital improvement, repair and maintenance, debt service or other costs of the Juvenile Facility. The County agrees to pay any such special assessment in such amount (or amount per capita based on the population of the County), at such time and in such manner as determined by the Board of Directors of NNJS. The County shall be charged a fee for each day or portion of a day that a juvenile detainee is placed with NNJS.





The Board reviewed the Juvenile Services Agreement and agreed that there is still a need for juvenile detention services. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Juvenile Services Agreement effective December 1, 2015 through June 1, 2027, as such term may be extended, as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The First Concord Benefits Group submitted the Section 125 Cafeteria Plan re-enrollment forms for calendar year 2016 and Cafeteria Plan-IRC Section 125 key employees questionnaire/highly compensated employee forms for 2016. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign all necessary documents regarding the Section 125 Cafeteria Plan re-enrollment and maintain the grace period plan for 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ed Knott and Will Zoucha, Applied Connective Technologies, met with the Board to discuss the Directory Listing for the County Government telephone numbers. A new telephone system was installed in the courthouse/sheriff building in 2015 by Applied Connective Technologies. The telephone service is from Greenfly Networks, Inc. DBA Clearfly Communications. The discussion is in regard to a \$5.95 charge per month per telephone number listed in a data base for directory listing in the white/blue pages of telephone books. The Board felt that \$71.40 paid each month for twelve telephone numbers to be listed in the white/blue pages of telephone books is excessive. Knott and Zoucha plan to research other options regarding data base telephone number listings charged to government entities. Knott and Zoucha plan to visit with Clearfly Communications for further clarification of the directory listing fees and other concerns.

In addition, Ed Knott, Applied Connective Technologies, presented a proposal regarding management security and software services. The security management includes removal of current anti-virus from all county owned equipment and the installation and configuration of Symantec managed product. This service provides all anti-virus installation to be completed on all county equipment at the same time with the renewal each year at the same time. Presently each office is responsible to keep the anti-virus up to date. Knott said that the SonicWall will need additional Anti-Malware/IPS, configuration and content filtering. The Service Agreement will be an agenda item for the Board meeting scheduled for December 14, 2015.

The Board reviewed information concerning compensatory time. Compensatory time is addressed under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). Unlike the private-sector employers, the County Government may provide compensatory time off in lieu of monetary overtime compensation based on a policy. Employees who are deemed nonexempt under the Fair Labor Standards Act and who work in excess of forty hours per week are eligible to receive overtime at a rate of time and one-half for all hours worked over forty in a work week. The Board approved the removal of Compensatory Time and language from the Boone County Employee Handbook in December of 2014 and any overtime earned to be paid out each pay period, because the Board felt their were only a few employees that accumulated compensatory time. Commissioner Maricle said for the morale of employees, compensatory time needs to be reinstated. Commissioner Luettel said he still feels that compensatory time is an additional cost to the county, due to decreased productivity and that the work still needs to be completed when they return to work. Commissioner Tisthammer felt that there should be little need for overtime accumulation by employees on a daily basis and that the compensatory time system had been abused in the past. The County of Boone, NE payroll new time/attendance system pay period is 22/21, with direct deposit to the employee's account on the last working day of the month.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Compensatory Time under the following conditions: (1) Upon proper authorization, up to forty (40) hours of compensatory time may be accumulated by employees; (2) The employee shall be required to use earned compensatory time before using vacation leave; (3)





Compensatory time accumulated over the above forty (40) hours, in any pay period, shall be paid out to the employee; (4) All unused compensatory time remaining will be paid out each year with the payroll ending December 21st at the employee's current hourly rate; (5) No compensatory time will be carried over into the next year's payroll; (6) An employee leaving employment shall be paid any unused compensatory time at the employee's current hourly rate; and (7) The compensatory policy is effective January 1, 2016 and will coincide with the 22/21 pay period that starts on December 22, 2015. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: Tisthammer. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed a meal policy from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the State's travel policy from the Nebraska State Auditor's office. Meal reimbursement was discussed at the November 16, 2015 Board meeting, due to some employees feel meal reimbursement of \$12.00 limit for noon and \$12.00 limit for evening was not enough, while others felt it was plenty. The current County policy for breakfast is a \$7.00 limit if not provided at the meeting or no continental breakfast provided by the hotel. The Boone County employees are not reimbursed for incidentals. The UNL and State overnight travel policy generally includes reimbursement for actual expense up to the Federal limit rates of \$11.00 for breakfast, \$12.00 for lunch and \$23.00 for supper. The State does not reimburse for one day travel but if they do, it is added to the employee W-2. When an employee leaves for overnight travel and departure is necessary before 6:30 A.M. breakfast may be reimbursed. If return is necessary after 7:00 P. M. supper may be reimbursed. Commissioner Tisthammer said he felt that the \$23.00 for supper is excessive and reminded those present that we are expected to use tax paying dollars wisely. Commissioner Maricle and Jim Ely, County Attorney, said that the County should follow the State's policy for meal reimbursements and be updated each year the State changes the reimbursable dollar amount.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve changes to the County meal reimbursable dollar amount to coincide with the State's overnight travel policy: (1) Includes reimbursement by submitting an itemized receipt for actual expense up to \$11.00 for breakfast, \$12.00 for lunch and \$23.00 for supper; (2) No reimbursement of meals for one day travel; (3) If an unforeseen situation occurs for one day travel and return is after 7:00 P.M., the meal may be reimbursed and will be taxed and added to the employee W-2; (4) Receipts are required for all travel expenses; and (5) The meal reimbursement changes are effective January 1, 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: Tisthammer. Motion carried.

Chad Engle, NIRMA, provided a list of available dates in January/February 2016 for the NIRMA Harassment Training for the county employees. The training will be set up in two sessions in order to accommodate all of the County of Boone employees. The Board decided on Wednesday, January 27, 2016 in the courtroom located in the courthouse with training sessions at 10:30 A.M. and 1:30 P.M. The County Clerk's office will contact NIRMA to confirm the date and times.

Open discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

• Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, updated the Board regarding the new County Communications Tower project. The generator is due to arrive sometime the week of December 7, 2015.

Chairman Tisthammer declared the meeting adjourned at 11:25 A.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 14, 2015.

Thorin indicated that the bus routes were located in the snow removal policy and that all maintainer drivers had the bus routes in their machines. VanDeWalle indicated that with the recent rain and snow that several roads needed gravel and that he had talked to a road employee about getting some gravel put on the roads but that nothing had been done. VanDeWalle indicated that the poor road conditions had resulted in bus repairs. Thorin indicated that he was not aware of the request and that future requests should be made to him. Thorin indicated that getting gravel, especially good gravel, is hard. Thorin said he would take a look at the roads to see what needed to be done. The consensus for notification is for the school bus route drivers to notify VanDeWalle of a problem, then VanDeWalle will be in contact with Thorin.

Andy Roberts, Valero Renewables of Albion, discussed a portion of 265th Street with the Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent. Roberts said that Valero would like to expand the rail siding. If the project is approved, the siding could contain enough rail cars for two complete unit trains. The expansion project would involve the closing of the portion of 265th Street southeast of the plant. Thorin explained the procedural steps for the vacation of a county road. Thorin suggested that Roberts contact the natural gas company and Cornhusker Public Power first as they may need easements to access their equipment. Roberts plans to visit with the natural gas and electrical companies regarding the proposed project. Thorin suggested that Roberts bring a petition for vacation of that portion of 265th Street with signatures from the natural gas and electrical companies to initiate the road vacation.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- Commissioner Tisthammer asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- Denny Johnson, Sheriff, said that the County Jail facility passed the Jail Standards inspection.
- Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, informed the group that penalties can be assessed to veterans who have both Obamacare health coverage and private health insurance. Wells said that the VA Health Care System is considered Obamacare.

Commissioner Tisthammer reiterated his statement from December 14, 2015 regarding cooperation that on days when there is no staff in the County Extension office, that there is no part-time sitting in the County Extension office, as the new courthouse telephone system provides the capability to forward the telephone calls to another telephone line outside of the courthouse and/or county. Tisthammer noted that the County Extension office has used the telephone transfer system the last few months and appreciates the cooperation. The Boone County Extension office will be closed December 28-31, 2015.

The Board, elected officials and department heads that were present reviewed some of the current pages/contents of the Boone County Employee Handbook. The group reviewed possible updates/revisions for several hours. The majority of the contents/structure of the present Boone County Handbook follows the NIRMA Guide to Creating a Personnel System for Nebraska Counties (Guide). The Guide is intended to assist counties in creating a personnel system that complies with applicable Nebraska and Federal law. NIRMA is assisted by a premier law firm with particular expertise in labor and employment law and human resources issues to update the Guide. Commissioner Maricle questioned/disapproved of several of the contents/structure of the NIRMA Guide and current County Employee Handbook. The County Clerk's office plans to forward the contents/structure in question to the NIRMA legal counsel for further review and their opinion. Commissioner Luettel questioned if NIRMA legal counsel would defend the County, if needed, if we change a lot of the wording structure/contents provided in the NIRMA Guide.
