



#### 2016 REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 4, 2016, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Tisthammer called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by Nebraska State Statute. Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Tisthammer noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to appoint Ken Luettel as Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Maricle. Abstain: Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint Jerry L. Tisthammer as Vice Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year, 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Abstain: Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to appoint the following to be on the Health Board for Boone County as required by State Statute: County Sheriff, County Clerk and Boone County Health Center Chief of Staff for 2016.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel that the budget committee for the ensuing 2016-2017 budget year is the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Boone County Clerk and Boone County Treasurer.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to reappoint Richard D. Martinsen, Certified Public Accountant, Albion, Nebraska, to prepare the County Budget for the 2016-2017 budget year, to be paid from the County General fund.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to reappoint Darrel Thorin, Bartlett, Nebraska, as full time County Highway Superintendent under the supervision of the County Board for 2016.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to reappoint Christopher C. Hays, of Osceola, Nebraska, as Boone County Surveyor for a four year term commencing January 8, 2015 through December 31, 2018, per contract for services as provided in State Statute Section 23-1901.01.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to reappoint Jacqueline Lynne Wells as full time Boone County Veteran Service Officer under the supervision of the County Board for 2016. On August 26, 2014 the Board of Commissioners approved the appointed position of Boone County Veteran Service Office/Officer to be a full time (40 hour week) position effective August 22, 2014 with office hours 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. and 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday and a part-time administrative assistant (20 hours per week) from 8:00 A.M. to Noon.





Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to continue the contract for the services of Public Defender for Boone County with Jeffrey C. Jarecki of Jarecki Law PC LLO, Albion, Nebraska, pursuant to the terms of an Agreement that shall commence on January 1, 2016 and continue until January 1, 2018.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to reappoint Randall Bruland as the Administrator and Maintenance Director of the Boone County Ambulance Service under the supervision of the County Board for 2016.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to continue the agreement for patient billing and collection services for the Boone County Ambulance Service with EMS Billing Services, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska pursuant to an Agreement effective March 1, 2014 that continues to termination by one of the parties. Nicole Levander, Boone County Health Center, to serve as liaison for the Boone County Ambulance Service/EMS Billing Services for 2016.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to reappoint Todd Buettner as Boone County Weed Superintendent on a part time basis under the supervision of the County Board for 2016. Buettner was appointed part time Weed Superintendent (less than twenty hours per week) effective March 17, 2014 and to receive \$350.00 per month beginning April 2014 for paperwork/meetings and \$15.58 per hour for time clocked in for spraying hours.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to reappoint Mary Ziemba as County Zoning Administrator and Regulatory Zoning Investigator under the supervision of the County Board for 2016. The road clerical duties for the County Highway Superintendent's office are also included as part of the County Zoning Administrator duties.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to reappoint the Boone County Clerk as the Title VI representative for 2016.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to reappoint the Boone County Veteran Service Officer as the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator for 2016.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint the Boone County Sheriff and his staff to be the E911 Coordinator for 2016.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to appoint Jerry L. Tisthammer as Courthouse Custodian Supervisor for 2016.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to appoint the Board of Commissioners Chairman as Chairperson of the County General Assistance Program with the emergencies being handled by a Commissioner. The County Clerk or Deputy County Clerk shall contact the assistance program chairperson or a Commissioner when there is a request on a day there is no scheduled Board meeting.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to appoint the Boone County Clerk as the contact person for Boone County for the NIRMA Insurance for 2016.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to give the County Clerk's office the authority to sign any documents that pertain to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools after June 30, 2000 under the supervision of the County Board for 2016.





Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer that the depository for the Boone County Clerk account will be the Boone County Bank, A Division of Madison County Bank, Albion with Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account; and depository for the Boone County Imprest Vendor account will be the Boone County Bank, A Division of Madison County Bank, Albion with Commissioners Jerry L. Tisthammer, Hilary K. Maricle, Ken Luettel and County Clerk's office Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account.

The County Board authorizes and empowers the Boone County Treasurer to invest any surplus funds in the custody of the office. Any surplus funds shall be invested to assure a beneficial rate of return to the County and confirmation of all pledged securities are on file.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel that the courthouse hours shall be 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM with a one-hour unpaid break, and that all offices will post their hours, including the lunch break; and notice shall be posted if an office is to be closed when it otherwise would be open.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer that the Boone County full time employees are to receive twelve paid holidays which include the observed nine holidays as set forth in the NIRMA Guide to Creating a Personnel System for Nebraska Counties Handbook together with Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Columbus Day; and that Arbor Day shall be a floating holiday to be used in 2016 at the employees discretion. The Courthouse "Closed" notices will be posted by Board directive.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel that full time employees are to receive vacation and sick leave as set forth in the Boone County Employee Handbook. The employee's vacation and sick leave records are recorded with the time clock/attendance system effective January 2014.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle that agenda items must be provided to the Boone County Clerk's Office no later than noon on the Friday preceding a Board meeting in order to be considered for said Board meeting.





Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle that the Boone County Board of Commissioners will hold their Board meetings on every Monday except for the first Monday of each month in the year, 2016, commencing at 9:00 A.M. Meeting dates/times are subject to change due to state statute regulations. Monday meetings that are on holidays will be held on Tuesday. The Accounts Payable Vendor meeting will be on the second Monday of the month and other Mondays will be regular public meetings. The Payroll meetings are subject to change from Monday to a different day for approval by the Board with the implementation of the time clock/attendance system and the 22/21 pay period. The Board meeting dates for payroll approval are as follows: January 27, February 24, March 28, April 27, May 25, June 27, July 27, August 29, September 26, October 26, November 28 and December 28, 2016. The County Clerk's office has charge and authority of the agenda for all meetings. The agenda will be made available for all meetings on the Boone County Website and the bulletin board located in the north courthouse entrance. Also, the following will be used to post notices in advance for emergency meetings and meetings that cannot be published in the legal newspaper(s): Boone County Website; Boone County Courthouse; lobbies of the Boone County Bank; Cornerstone Bank; Homestead Bank; and Albion News Office, all located in Albion, NE. In addition, the Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids, NE, Cornerstone Bank, St. Edward, NE and Great Plains State, Petersburg, NE.

As required by law (Neb. Rev. Stat. §48-443), each Nebraska county must have a working safety committee. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle that (1) the following will serve on the Safety Committee for 2016: Region 44 Emergency Management Director; County Sheriff; Board of Commissioners; County Highway Superintendent; County Treasurer; County ADA Coordinator; Custodial Maintenance Supervisor; Boone County Fitness Center Manager; and (2) the Safety Committee meetings are tentatively scheduled for February 16, 2016, May 16, 2016, August 15, 2016 and November 21, 2016, commencing at 9:00 A.M.

The Grievance Procedure in the Employee Handbook says the County will use a Grievance Board consisting of five people. The Commissioners shall create the pre-designated list of ten impartial members to serve on the Grievance Board. The Board visited with county residents to create a pre-designated list. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, January 11, 2016, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Commissioner Hilary K. Maricle was absent. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General - \$66,844.41; Road - \$79,976.25; Boone County Visitor's Promotion - \$1,626.76; Reappraisal - \$15,234.93; 911 Emergency Management (2910) - \$4,095.12; 911 Wireless Service (2913) - \$668.30; Ambulance - \$3,226.11. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Jarecki was appointed Public Defender in August of 2012. The Public Defender Agreement proposes a monthly compensation of \$3,120.00 and limitation appointment to seventy-two cases annually. The initial term of the Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2016 and continue through January 1, 2018. The County Clerk and County Treasurer submitted copies of pledged securities (collateral) for their respective offices as of December 31, 2015. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to acknowledge and approve the pledged securities (collateral) as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, and the Board discussed the appointment of a representative to the East Central Region Governance Board. Boone County is a member of the ten county member East Central Planning, Exercise, Training (PET) and Interoperable Communications Region established by the State of Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to hereby appoint Thomas Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, as the Boone County representative to the Governing Regional Committee that makes up the East Central PET & Interoperable Communications Region as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, and the Board reviewed the nomination forms for the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network (NRIN) Board of Directors. NRIN is a locally-operated, regional and statewide wireless communication system that connects PSAPS, EOCs and local governments, allowing real time, on-demand communication to help mitigate emergencies and promote public safety. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to vote for Russell Kreachbaum of Central City, NE and Tim Hofbauer of Columbus, NE for the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network Board of Directors. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Board, Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, discussed the new County Communications Tower project. The generator and propane tank are installed at the County Communications Tower sight. The group discussed a protective cover for the generator and propane tank fuel tube due to the possibility of ice falling from the communication tower. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the purchase of a steel shelter built by Molt Manufacturing to protect the generator for \$2,500.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

In addition, Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, and Denny Johnson, Sheriff, updated the Board regarding the completion of the County Communications Tower project. Smith said that the County will receive state funding reimbursement for the generator and a portion of the new County Communications Tower and equipment. The Boone County Sheriff's office will administer the management responsibilities of the new County Communications Tower upon completion of the final work.

In addition, Tom Smith reported that the Boone County Local Emergency Planning Committee will meet on January 18, 2016 at 7:00 P.M. at the Albion Fire Hall and a tabletop emergency response exercise on Valero Renewables will be held on January 23, 2016 from 7:30 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. at the Cardinal Inn, Albion, NE.

The Cornerstone Bank of York, Nebraska, Albion Branch, is the named depository bank for the Boone County Clerk of the District Court checking account that is an interest bearing N.O.W. Account. Motion made by

The Boone County Ambulance Service submitted an uncollectible ambulance account, as all methods of collection have been exhausted. The recommendation for the September 2014 account balance due of \$538.74, is that the account balance be turned over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to write-off the uncollectible ambulance account in the sum of \$538.74, pursuant to the recommendation received from the ambulance service and turn the file over to the County Attorney for further collection. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Northeast Nebraska Area Agency on Aging received two nominations to represent Boone County on the Advisory Board for a three year term. Commissioner Luettel plans to visit with the nominees before making an appointment. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to table the appointment of a representative to the Northeast Nebraska Area Agency on Aging Advisory Board to the January 19, 2016 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented the December road maintenance, repair and project report to the Board for their review. Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects.

Luettel said he hauls grain from the area facilities to processing plants in eastern Nebraska and could back-haul gravel/rock for the county roads. After a lengthy discussion the Board plans to advertise for interested truckers to back-haul aggregate for the county and draft an agreement/contract with all interested parties. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to table the Non-Exclusive Contract with Ken Luettel Farm until the March 14, 2016 Board meeting, to allow for advertisement and drafting of an agreement/contract. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Abstain: Luettel. Motion carried.

The Board and department heads present at the meeting discussed employee compensation due to the closing of the courthouse during inclement weather. The employee handbook addresses employee compensation when the employee is unable to get to work when the courthouse is open during inclement weather. The employee handbook does not address employee compensation due to the courthouse being closed during regularly opened hours. The group reviewed policies from other counties. The "Bad Weather" policy in the County Employee Handbook will be reviewed with the department heads on February 16, 2016.

The County employee handbook review and updates need to be completed. The Board plans to discuss the preferred procedure to complete the handbook review with the department heads at the February 16, 2016 Board meeting. NIRMA legal counsel has been assisting with the wording structure/contents.

Commissioner Maricle said she has been asked who owns the Boone County Health Center facility. Maricle would like to have documentation on the ownership arrangement and responsibilities between the County of Boone, Boone County Health Center and Boone County Health Center Board of Trustees. County Attorney Ely said he would work with Maricle on this issue.

Open Discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- Rebecca Rayman and Roberta Miksch, East-Central District Health Department (ECDHD), presented information regarding the 2015 ECDHD public health activities in Boone County. Rayman and Miksch reviewed the priority health needs for Boone County that was selected by research data.
- Orrin Strand asked the Board if Thorin and Luettel could plan to meet with Strand and interested residents on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 at 1:30 p.m., due to the weather conditions last week the group did not meet on February 5, 2016.
- Commissioner Luettel reported on the Boone County Health Center Board meeting he attended last week.

Chairman Luettel declared the meeting adjourned at 12:22 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Tuesday, February 16, 2016.

#### 2016 ONE AND SIX YEAR ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BOONE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

Ken Luettel, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Tuesday, February 16, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. The public hearing is for the purpose of hearing testimony in favor of, or opposition to, and to answer questions in relation to the proposed 2016 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The hearing is to remain open for one hour.

Darrel Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2016 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The one-year road improvement plan consists of seven projects and the six-year plan consists of five projects. Thorin prepared a map to use as a visual aid showing the location of the proposed projects. The Board received no opposition at the hearing.

Thorin acknowledged that Project No. 382, East Fairview Street, Albion from the city limits to State Highway 14, is for storm sewer drainage and that the County of Boone and City of Albion will share the costs of construction. Thorin acknowledged Project No. 376, one mile of major road reconstruction on the road known as Central Highway east to the county line and will be a joint project with Platte County. In addition, the one-year projects include three bridge replacements and two other road projects. The federal and state regulations regarding bridge and road construction project funding is pushing more of the burden onto the county. Thorin suggested that the Board should start considering the replacement of at least one county timber bridge a year.

Attached hereto as part of the proceedings is a copy of the 2016 proposed projects one-year plan and six-year plan as presented by Boone County Highway Superintendent, Darrel Thorin.

Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The County Safety Committee met at 9:01 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Hilary K. Maricle, Denny Johnson, Laurie Krohn, Rod Nelson, Kathy Thorberg and Darrel Thorin. Nelson addressed old business regarding sidewalk assessment in the spring for removal and replacement. The following new business was discussed: (1) Nelson provided an informational Safety Committee Report for review that NIRMA provided regarding their inspection on January 27, 2016; (2) Injury/Accident report forms were handed out for department heads to utilize to help with the overall process of reporting accidents; (3) Nelson plans to complete building inspection forms provided by NIRMA in the spring and fall, this will provide documentation that the inspections were completed; and (4) updating of the defibrillators in the Courthouse and Law Enforcement Building. - Thorin said that the county road department is dealing with the mud issues with what gravel is left in the stock piles. The gravel that is available will need to be used to patch the worst road areas first.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2016 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska at the 10:00 A.M. public hearing. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2016-05, adopting the 2016 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska as presented at the public hearing. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the County of Boone, Nebraska and the City of Albion, Nebraska. The City of Albion has precipitated the evaluation and design of the Fairview Street Drainage Improvement project for the purposes of addressing





storm water drainage deficiencies that currently exist upon both the City of Albion streets and an adjoining Boone County Road. The project along Fairview Street from City Limits East to State Highway 14 is a mutual benefit to the city and county, and both desire to share equally in the cost of the construction. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign Resolution No. 2016-06, an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the County of Boone, Nebraska and the City of Albion, Nebraska regarding the Fairview Street Drainage Improvement project as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and department heads present at the meeting discussed employee compensation due to the closing of the courthouse during inclement weather. The employee handbook addresses employee compensation when the employee is unable to get to work when the courthouse is open during inclement weather. However, the employee handbook does not address employee compensation due to the courthouse being closed during regularly opened hours. The department heads reviewed policies received from other counties following the February 8, 2016 Board meeting. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Courthouse Closed Policy compensation as follows: (a) Courthouse open: Vacation leave will be deducted for employees unable to be present at work due to inclement weather. Employees shall be required to use earned compensatory time before using vacation leave for inclement weather instead of taking a reduction in vacation leave. If an employee's vacation and compensatory time have been exhausted, then the absence will be without pay. In the event that a non-exempt employee does not arrive at the normal starting time, a pro-rated amount shall be deducted; (b) Courthouse closed: Employees shall receive regular pay for the hours they were normally scheduled to work that day, such hours will not be considered as time worked when computing overtime. Employees on scheduled vacation or sick leave on a day that the County closes the courthouse, the employee is not allowed to alter their vacation or sick leave scheduled to take advantage of the closed day; and (c) Courthouse closed: Employees scheduled to work due to the nature of their department's job responsibilities and worked shall receive their regular rate of pay for hours worked. Employees that worked their scheduled shift shall receive compensatory hours for equivalent to hours courthouse was closed. Employees that worked but did not complete their scheduled shift shall receive their regular rate of pay for worked/scheduled hours and prorated compensatory hours for the hours actually worked. (Example: Employee scheduled to work 10 hours; only worked 2 hours; receives regular rate of pay for 10 hours; receives compensatory time based on the time worked while the courthouse was closed up to a maximum of total hours courthouse was closed). Nonscheduled employees receive no compensation. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

An Agreement between the County of Boone DBA Boone County Ambulance and EMS Billing Services, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska became effective on March 1, 2014. The basic life support call rate set in 2014 for BLS/Non-emergency - \$330.00 and ALS/Non-emergency - \$370.00. EMS said that the rates could use some increasing, just depends on the cost of running the county ambulance services. The Boone County Ambulance Service is a separate fund that is self-funded and no real estate/personal taxes are collected to help fund the ambulance services. The information EMS provided shows the current billing lower range of rates being BLS/Non-emergency at \$488.75 and ALS/Non-emergency at \$690.00. The suggested rate change for the county ambulance services is BLS from \$330.00 to \$425.00 and ALS from \$370.00 to \$600.00. The Board would like more information on the rates that the surrounding areas are using for ambulance services. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table any change to the Boone County Ambulance Service rates to receive more area information. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Mary Ziemba, County Planning and Zoning Administrator, updated the Board regarding zoning activities. Ziemba said that the Zoning Permit Application forms have been redesigned and updated. In addition, Ziemba said that the Planning and Zoning Commission Board have been discussing some type of action when landowners do not follow zoning regulations.



The Board, Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., and Trent Kraus and Delmer Pelster, Boone County Raceway, discussed an additional/second liquor license under the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. (Ag Society) as the name of the corporation and premise trade name as Boone County Raceway (Raceway). The manager of the second liquor license representing the Raceway is Delmer D. Pelster. The additional Ag Society liquor license permit is for the grandstand area of the Boone County Fairgrounds. Rolf and Kraus informed the Board that with the Ag Society having two separate liquor licenses, if one license would happen to be suspended for a violation regarding an event, it would not affect the other license. Rolf informed the Board that the Ag Society will open a separate checking account for the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc./Boone County Raceway activities. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the additional/second liquor license Manager Application request for the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc./Boone County Raceway and a separate checking account for the Raceway activities as presented. Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Vic Lee and Tanya Sharp, Boone County Health Center, presented the Boone County Health Center audit report for year ending September 30, 2015 to the Board for their review. Sharp reviewed areas of the financial audit in regard to the daily operations and cash on hand graphs, financials on pages 8-11 and the financial/statistics on page 24. Lee said the Boone County Health Center has no long term debt and activity is increasing at the hospital and clinics. Lee said that the new electronic medical records (Cerner system) software conversion in 2014 significantly decreased the number of patients that providers were able to schedule daily and that decreased the cash flow. The new electronic system is beneficial to transport patient files to another medical location. They are working on scanning all of the prior patient records, but it is taking a lot of time. Lee said that the proposed clinic addition is on hold due to lack of funds and felt that the Affordable Care Act has taken an impact on rural medical facilities.

The Board reviewed an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Albion, NE and the County of Boone, NE for the demolition of the old city pool facility and construction of public parking improvements. The City of Albion owns the property known as the old swimming pool. The Boone County Health Center (BCHC) is planning public health care facility improvements for additional clinic/office space. Lee said that the BCHC will be responsible for the demolition of the existing pool facility and the improvements of the property for paved parking. The paved parking shall be used for public parking for Fuller Park, Albion Family Aquatic Center and the Boone County Health Center. The Board felt that the Interlocal Agreement should be between the City of Albion and Boone County Health Center. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table the Interlocal Agreement for updated dates and rewording of the document. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of February 24, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County of Boone DBA Boone County Ambulance Service and EMS Billing Services, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska signed an Agreement in March 2014. EMS Billing Services needs updated information regarding the Boone County Ambulance Service. The Board reviewed the information provided by EMS and decided to increase the following base rates: BLS Non-Emergency \$330.00 to \$400.00; BLS Emergency \$505.00 to \$550.00; and ALS Non-Emergency \$370.00 to \$450.00. The Board understands that the rate increases still fall in the lower range of the current industry rates. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the base rate for BLS Non-Emergency-\$400.00; BLS Emergency-\$550.00; ALS Non-Emergency-\$450.00 effective April 1, 2016 with a resolution prepared for the next Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board reviewed a state contract bid for a new Caterpillar 12M3AWD motor grader from Nebraska Machinery Company, Omaha, NE. Thorin presented the base cost of \$274,500.00 plus the option for an auto-articulate and blade control package of \$7,500.00 and snow-plus front tires for \$3,892.00. The new machine includes a product-link showing fuel usage and if it uses more than four gallons of fuel per hour then additional parts credit will be received. NMC's sales agreement includes \$14,000.00 customer parts credit and a five year/5,000 HR Premier extended warranty. The machine may be ordered now but will not likely be delivered until July or later. The purchase would be made from the 2016-2017 fiscal budget year. Thorin informed the Board that the County has twelve motor graders and that he would like to set up a program where one motor grader is replaced each year due to the high cost of repairs. StormReady provides emergency managers with guidelines on how to improve their hazardous weather operations.



Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, updated the Board in regard to the Region 44 Emergency Management and the Sheriff's office Emergency Notification System. This service allows fire, law enforcement and other emergency response agencies to issue emergency alerts to warn citizen of events such as need for immediate evacuation, crime/imminent danger and local area emergencies. To sign-up go to the Boone County website's homepage and click on the "Receive Emergency Alerts & Community Notifications" button. In addition, Smith updated the Board regarding several Region 44 Emergency Management activities and meetings.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- County officials reported on legislation to watch for possible changes that may have an impact on county budget revenues, valuations, elections and road projects.
- Employees parking in the courthouse north parking lot are asked to try and not hang over the curb on the north side during lawn mowing season.
- The group discussed the noise through the walls from other offices. It was mentioned that some voices just naturally carry more than others. A possible suggestion is for the office being bothered by sound to discuss it with the other office to let them know you can hear what is going on. The group continued the discussion on possibilities for sound proofing the courthouse offices.

The Board and department heads present continued reviewing the County Employee Handbook for changes/updates.

The majority of the discussion was in regard to adding bullying to the Harassment Policy and Complaint Procedure. At the March 7, 2016 handbook review meeting it was asked if there should be a separate bullying exhibit added to the employee handbook. Correspondence received from NIRMA specialist and NIRMA legal counsel indicated that it is outlined under the harassment policy and also under the rules section in the NIRMA model handbook, of which both are included in the Boone County Employee Handbook. In addition, NIRMA legal counsel said if you want to explicitly address bullying (a good idea, particularly if it is a problem), I recommend adding an additional prohibition in the list of rules in the rules section of the Handbook: "Bullying behavior, including but not limited to verbal, physical, by gesture, or by exclusion." Some felt it is already covered under the harassment policy and some had concerns with the additional wording. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to add to the rules section of the employee handbook, per NIRMA consultant recommendation, "Bullying behavior, including but not limited to verbal, physical, by gesture, or by exclusion." Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle. Nays: Tisthammer and Luettel. Motion did not carry.

The group reviewed the Catastrophic Illness Donation policy for changes. NIRMA legal counsel asked permission to share the County's policy with an outside firm to ensure the policy complies with all applicable IRS regulations. #### BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS APRIL 18, 2016 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, April 18, 2016, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Hilary K. Maricle and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jeff Jarecki, Public Defender, presented a report to the Board regarding the status of court cases since his appointment to the position in August 2012. Jarecki reported that the cases assigned in 2012, 2013 and 2014 are all completed. Jarecki reported that he was assigned forty-four cases in 2015 with two cases being a conflict of interest and eight cases remain open. Jarecki reported that he has been assigned sixteen new cases to date in 2016 and eleven cases remain open. Jarecki answered the Board's questions regarding conflict of interest and closed/open cases. Jarecki explained that there are times when he cannot defend the assigned case since he is already defending one of the parties involved. In addition, Jarecki asked the Board to review extraordinary additional expenses for consideration of reimbursement regarding an appointed public defender case. Commissioner Luettel thanked Jarecki for the updated report and his diligent services.

Steve Pritchard, Extension Educator; Sonya Glup, Extension Assistant; Vanessa Cumming, David Figgner and Roger Voichoski, Boone County 4-H Council; and Mark Grundmayer and Ken Schriver, Boone-Nance Extension Board, met with the Board of Commissioners regarding Sonya Glup's position as a state employee with UNL Extension. Pritchard said that the UNL Extension dean is re-constructing the Extension Services across the State of Nebraska. The UNL Extension Educators/Assistants Regional Experts chose one of the reconstructed areas of the following responsibilities: Beef Systems; The Learning Child; Community Environment; Community Vitality Initiative; Innovative Cropping & Water Systems; Food, Nutrition & Health; or 4-H Youth Development. Pritchard said that five UNL Extension Assistant state employee positions are being asked to either relocate to the metro area, find a different job or ask if their County will absorb them as a county employee. Pritchard presented proposed staffing changes by UNL Extension to add a full time Beef Systems Educator as a state employee for a seven county area that would be headquartered out of the Fullerton Extension office. The other change would be to no longer fund a state employee Extension Assistant position. Beginning in January 2017 through June 2020 the proposal would gradually shift the Boone-Nance Extension Assistant position from a state paid employee to a county paid employee. At present, all salary and benefits totaling \$64,315.00 for Extension Assistant Sonya Glup are paid by UNL through the end of 2016. Under the proposal, on a 50-50 basis, Boone-Nance would begin paying a gradually larger share of this salary and benefits starting at \$8,040.00 for January through June of 2017 and continuing to increase through fiscal year 2020, when the two counties would pay the full salary/benefits cost and the university would pay none. The 4-H Council/Extension Board representatives pointed out the 4-H programs and several new programs that Glup is involved in both counties and provides Medicare Part D assistance. The extension representative members pointed out that the 4-H programs build the skills of youth in many areas, including decision-making, communications and leadership. The Board plans to review the information and visit with the Nance County Board. No action taken at this time.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings of April 11, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Navs: None. Motion carried.





Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, has registered to attend the annual County Veteran Service Officers schooling in Grand Island, Nebraska from April 25-28, 2016. The Board received information that other County Veteran Service Officers may carpool with Boone County to Grand Island. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve other Nebraska County Veteran Service Officers to occupy/operate the Boone County vehicle that is being used to carpool to the annual schooling in Grand Island, NE. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board held their monthly meeting with the officials and department heads or employees.

- County officials reported on activities with regard to their respective office.
- County officials highlighted legislative bills that have passed with possible impacts on the county budgets.
- Boone-Nance Extension will be hosting an UNL intern student for a couple of months beginning May 16, 2016. Pritchard asked those present to let him know if anyone knows of a place for the intern to rent for a couple of months.
- The coffee pot in the breakroom may be nearing its last days of operation. Commissioner Maricle asked if there was interest in a Keurig where one brings their own flavor of coffee. The majority present at the meeting said that they do not drink coffee. Further discussion will be made with the employees that drink coffee.

Barb Hanson, Assessor, presented quotes for two new computers for the office. Hanson said that the one computer keeps freezing up and the other is a used laptop from another office. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the approximate quote of \$2,703.62 from Applied Connective Technologies for two new Optiplex 9020 Minitowers with Dell 22" Widescreen Monitors, etc. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- Thorin and the Board discussed the hiring of two additional road employees. Thorin felt that having two employees as a construction crew for bridge maintenance, signage maintenance, culvert replacement and shoulder work would help the road department to get caught up with road maintenance. The proposal would be beneficial regarding road maintenance that is neglected when the employees are pulled to work on the construction projects. The Board took the proposal under advisement. The Board plans to visit with local contractors to discuss cost and if they are interested in contracting with the County to replace culverts and other construction projects.
- Thorin presented information from an Iowa/Kansas study regarding the stress to County Roads and Bridges regarding over weight trailers, manure spreaders, etc. Thorin said that if LB624 passes it will impact the expenses in Boone County greatly for bridge and culvert repair/replacement.
- The 2004 pickup with 170,000 miles needs extensive engine repairs. The cost of the repairs is more than the book value. The pickup was the one used to haul the District 3 fuel to the equipment operators. The consensus of the Board is for Darrel Thorin to look for a used pickup locally.

The purchase of an additional snow blower had been discussed following the February 2016 blizzard. The county owned snow blower broke down during the blizzard. The Board opened and reviewed quotes for a new snow blower. The quotes received as follows: Nebraska Environmental Products, Lincoln, NE - Snogo MP-3D - \$170,373.00 or two for \$335,746.00; Midwest Service and Sales Co., Schuyler, NE - Fair Snow Blower 9481C - \$92,270.54 or two for \$166,398.10. Ambrose Placzek, Midwest Service and Sales Co., was present to answer any questions regarding the snow blower quote. The Snogo will need an additional attachment for a





side to side shift, where the Fair Snow already includes the side to side shift. They both include wireless remote control and a camera to view what is in front of them. Discussion: Commissioner Maricle said we need to weigh the wants/needs, do we need three snow blowers being one at each road shop, even though the county received an excellent bid. Commissioner Luettel said that one available at each area of the county would have been beneficial for the 2010 and 2016 snow storms. A snow blower throws the snow out where a maintainer/pay loader piles the snow straight up and the opening of the road drifts back in easily. If we do not use them for a couple of years that is good, but when the roads need opening they pay for themselves, especially if emergency services are needed. Motion made by Luettel, second d by Tisthammer to approve the purchase of two new 9481C Fair Snow Blowers for \$166,398.00 from Midwest Service and Sales Co. payable from the Inheritance Tax Fund. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, held a lengthy discussion regarding the planting of crops in the county road right-of-ways. The Board said that there is a need for marking the county road rights-of-way to prevent the planning of crops inside the area, and other obstructions such as signs along the right-of-way. One obvious area near the fairgrounds was noted. The commissioners decided to have Thorin first measure and mark right-of-way boundaries on priority roads where there are safety issues throughout the county. If there are complaints from landowners, the county will then have the right-of-way surveyed.

Commissioner Maricle met/discussed concerns regarding the Boone County Fairgrounds boundary lines and lease agreements with Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator. Commissioner Maricle had heard that there may be interest in extending the present camper site at the fairgrounds further to the south. The Board decided it may be best to have a survey completed of the Boone County Fairgrounds boundary lines and then possibly follow up with surveys and revised agreements with the location of each entity's area within the fairgrounds. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Chris Hays, Hays Land Surveying, to complete a survey of the Boone County Fairgrounds property owned by the County of Boone for the exact boundary lines. The Board and Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, held a lengthy discussion regarding the general road conditions. Commissioner Maricle noted that the contracted aggregate back-haul services for the month of April was quite high. Thorin noted the distance that aggregate is being hauled from south of Grand Island and by Ord and on an eight hour day the county road employee may get two loads hauled. Despite the volume of gravel hauled in April, it is not keeping up with the need and there is a shortage of good gravel. Commissioner Luettel suggested using a bonnell road drag for some of the road maintenance. Commissioner Tisthammer commented on the poor road conditions and that the bus/mail routes and heavily traveled roads need to be the priority maintained roads. Thorin acknowledge the poor road conditions, but citizens need to be patient as each motor grader operator has 65 to70 miles of road to cover and the weather conditions have not been favorable. The road base, culverts and bridges were not constructed for today's heavy equipment and traffic. Following adverse weather conditions everyone wants their road worked on first, but that is impossible.

The County Safety Committee met at 9:02 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Hilary K. Maricle, Denny Johnson, Laurie Krohn, Rod Nelson, Tom Smith, Kathy Thorberg and Darrel Thorin. Nelson addressed old business regarding Injury/Accident report forms utilized by department heads, NIRMA inspection/audit report and defibrillators. The following new business was discussed: (1) Nelson contacted Boone County Concrete for a quote to replace a portion of the courthouse north steps and sidewalk; (2) defibrillators were updated as pads are to be changed every two years unless used then replaced at that time and batteries every four years; (3) a reminder to employees that it is tornado season time and the procedure to use is on the wall at the entrances to the courthouse if a tornado is sighted; (4) discussed contacting NIRMA for an employee CPR training; (5) Tom Smith plans to prepare an Emergency Action Plan for Boone County; (6) Jail Standards plans to help with updates for the law enforcement facility; and (7) NIRMA is going to conduct a county road shop and sign audit. Nelson reported no accidents for last quarter. The next safety committee meeting is scheduled for August 15, 2016. The Safety Committee meeting was adjourned by Nelson at 9:24 A.M.

Laurie Krohn, County Treasurer, presented a bond payment, per Nebraska State Statute, for the Board to review. The Boone County School District 0001 (Boone Central Schools) General Obligation Bonds were issued in 2015 and 2016. The Boone Central Schools General Obligation Bonds, Series 2015 first payment is due June 15, 2016 for \$278,824.66 and Series 2016 first payment is due June 15, 2016 for \$25,644.44. The name of the fitness center and the foundation has changed over the past thirty years. There is a Corporation Warranty Deed on file dated August 29, 1986 deeding the real estate including the building and all its appurtenances to Boone County, Nebraska, a political subdivision. The deed also includes a thirty year statement/reverter. The County is seeking clarification of the contents of the deed regarding ownership of the fitness center facility. The concerns include employee status as county government employees or Boone County Fitness Center, Inc., a domestic non-profit corporation employees. With the federal/state regulation changes over the years regarding health insurance, property insurance and other employee benefits, a clarification of the operation and ownership is necessary. As presently payroll is under the County ID number and the operation of the facility is under a non-profit ID number. A good discussion took place and questions will be forwarded to NIRMA and NACO. center will obtain insurance quotes for general liability, building & contents and worker's compensation. The group plans to further discuss the concerns on June 27, 2016.

## BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS MAY 31, 2016 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, May 31, 2016, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Hilary K. Maricle, Ken Luettel and Jerry L. Tisthammer. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, introduced Josh Aspegren, intern from Aurora. Smith provided information to the Board regarding the possible placement of a Mutual Aid Base Station at the Boone County Communications Tower site. Smith said that a Mutual Aid Base Station is for the first responders that have radios in the area in order to communicate with each other. Smith said that Howard, Platte and Polk have Mutual Aid Base Stations. If a Mutual Aid Base Station is placed at the Boone County Communications Tower that Homeland Security Funds would help with the initial installation, but then the equipment and maintenance will become the responsibility of the County, thereafter. Some of the questions regarding the Mutual Aid Base Station were: (1) will it help connect communication in the gap areas of the hills; (2) will the communication reach within the whole county; and (3) will communication reach outside of the county, if so how far. Smith suggested to the Board to wait on a decision in order to review a map from OCIO State Agency showing mapping area that each base station may cover. The consensus of the Board is to wait for the map to see if a Mutual Aid Base Station would enhance the communication in Boone County and surrounding area.

The Board and department heads present at the meeting discussed budget preparations for the 2016-2017 FY budget, possible wage adjustments and other budget matters. The current county employee pay/benefit policy is an annual cost of living in January, a longevity program and full family health insurance premium paid. The County Assessor felt that the chief deputy should receive more than 65% of the official's salary. It was explained that a chief deputy with longevity program years makes more than 65% of the official's salary (example: 18 years longevity is 81% of official's salary). The lengthy discussion ranged from possibly eliminating longevity program that has been part of the wages since the early eighties, possible merit-based pay system and possible change in county paid benefits. The Board agreed that any changes regarding the above discussion will require working meetings with department heads in the future and is likely a gradual process that may take years to implement.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings of May 25, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of May 25, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The consensus of the Board is to have the NIRMA labor/employment attorney's draft a resolution for the adoption of the revised Boone County Employee Handbook to be available for the June 13, 2016 Board meeting.

The revisions of the Boone County Employee Handbook are being reviewed by Woods & Aitken LLP labor and employment attorneys. Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) are assisted by Woods & Aitken LLP to assist counties in adopting personnel policies. In regard to the ambulance services, the





workers must be classified in one of the categories, either employee, independent contractor or volunteer. The same employee may not receive a set amount for part of their job description and an hourly salary for the other part of their job description. The ambulance services personnel have full time jobs with other employers. The consensus of the Board is to have the handbook review attorney's review the Boone County Ambulance Service information and resolution for determining the classification of workers regarding the ambulance services. The classification determination will help determine payment as an hourly employee (W2) or contracted services (1099).

Todd Buettner, County Weed Superintendent, updated the Board regarding weed control activity. Buettner and the Board discussed a paper log system with date, time, where and what activity was completed regarding weed control and activity. During the spraying season months the county owned weed pickup/spraying unit sets in his rural residence yard. When the weed vehicle is located at a road department shop the availability to use the time clock is accessible. When he conducts an inspection or the vehicle is at his residence driving to a road shop is probably not feasible and then the paper log will be used. Buettner plans to ask FSA to send reminders to area landowners regarding their responsibility to control noxious weeds. The Board discussed with Buettner that the same employee may not receive a set amount for part of their job description (\$350.00 per month for meetings/records) and an hourly salary for the other part of their job description (\$15.58 per hour for spraying/inspections). Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to change the structure of the County Weed Superintendent to an all hourly paid position for all logged worked hours per FLSA and recommendation from the labor attorney's that assist NIRMA effective July 1, 2016. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to go into executive session at 11:29 a.m., per the Open Meeting Act §84-1410(D), Evaluation of the job performance of a person when necessary to prevent needless injury to the reputation of a person and if such person has not requested a public meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Board conducted an employee evaluation. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to come out of the executive session at 12:06 p.m. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried. An employee evaluation, no action was taken by the Board.

Commissioner Tisthammer excused himself at 12:35 p.m.

The communication system between prisoners and visitors would include cameras and audio/video monitors. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, said that the type of video surveillance system for the law enforcement building and courthouse is dependent on Nebraska Jail Standards approval. No system approval had been received to date.

The requested vacation begins at a point at the SE corner of NW1/4 and NE corner of the SW1/4 of Section 26, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, thence West one thousand sixty-one (1,061) feet to a point located on the east ROW line of the Nebraska Central Railroad between the NW1/4 and the SW1/4 of Section 26, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. Boone County, Nebraska, known as 270<sup>th</sup> Street. The said portion of road currently ends at the railroad tracks. Roberts presented a plan for new installation of about 8,000 feet of additional rail siding that would cross said portion of 270<sup>th</sup> Street.

The Board reviewed a preliminary survey prepared by Chris Hays, County Surveyor, regarding the county owned real estate commonly known as the fairgrounds. Hays' preliminary survey is drawn over an aerial map that shows the buildings, etc. within the fairgrounds boundary lines. The aerial map survey includes the boundary lines of the real estate legal descriptions of record.

It appears that the south fairgrounds fence line is not straight. The area to the east of the road entering into the fairgrounds from the north includes the Boone County Historical Society Museum, Albion City Park and the Albion City Campground. This area appears to need some real estate transaction corrections as to ownership and boundary lines.

Chris Hays, County Surveyor; Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator; Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society; Steve Pritchard, UNL Extension; and the Board reviewed the survey/map and discussed the area. There is a housing development project currently right to the east of the fairgrounds. Concerns were





expressed as to what may become of the property right south of the fairgrounds. If more housing development continues or begins to the south, there probably will be a need to remove the archery and shooting range from the fairgrounds. Discussion then led to the dam right south of the fairgrounds that is known as the "Kohtz City of Albion Dam" that was built years ago to help control storm water drainage. It was then discussed possibly starting to look at drainage and erosion control as a priority. Devine said that the City of Albion has installed a street curb in the Aquatic Center area to help detour the water flow away from the pool following the incident that damaged the Aquatic Center area. Devine said that the storm water drainage still runs through the camp site and park. Devine said that the City Well #2 is capped and decommissioned and that the city is planning to remove the facility/equipment. The Board and those present felt it was a good discussion to have with all entities involved, so they can try to work together to solve the drainage problem, the possible expansion of the camp site to the south and to decide which entity is responsible for what area.

Chuck Rolf and David Noble, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., updated the Board regarding the 2016 Boone County Fair. Rolf and Noble said that the weather cooperated, a good crowd was present, the concert was well attended and all went fairly smoothly with no major issues. The Board inquired of the balance that is left to pay on the Event Center Building that was erected in 2006. Rolf said that they just renewed the loan for another ten years and that there is approximately \$171,000.00 left to pay. The Ag Society usually makes two payments in a calendar year totaling approximately \$22,000.00.

The Reappraisal Fund (1100) in the past years has been a separate tax request/levy. The Boone County Board of Commissioners have determined that there is no longer a need to have a separate levied reappraisal budget. The reappraisal budget will become part of the County General Fund with the 2016-2017 fiscal year. The Reappraisal Fund (1100) will be closed as of August 31, 2016. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2016-33, to close the Reappraisal Fund (1100) as of August 31, 2016, direct the County Treasurer to transfer all money remaining and automatically transfer any future collections from the Reappraisal Fund (1100) to the General Fund (0100). Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Courthouse Renovation Bonds were retired in May 2016 and the Boone County Board of Commissioners determined that there is no longer a need for the Courthouse Bond Fund (3000). Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2016-34, to close the Courthouse Bond Fund (3000) as of August 31, 2016, direct the County Treasurer to transfer all money remaining and automatically transfer any future collections from the Courthouse Bond Fund (3000) to the General Fund (0100). Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Navs: None. Motion carried.

CK Family Farms LLC, c/o Charles Krohn requested permission to trench a 11/2" water line under a county road commonly known as 270<sup>th</sup> Street running East and West between Sections 27 and 34, all in Township 20 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The trenched water line is for residential purposes. The water line commences from a well located in the NW1/4 of Section 34, thence running north across 270<sup>th</sup> Street to a residential site to be located in the S1/2SW1/4 of Section 27, all in Township 20 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2016-35, granting permission to CK Family Farms LLC to trench a 11/2" water line under a county road known as 270<sup>th</sup> Street to the S1/2SW1/4 of Section 27, Township 20 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, to a residential site. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.



Darrel Thorin, Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board requesting the County Board to appoint Darrel D. Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, to complete a feasibility study. The feasibility study is with regard to a Petition to Vacate County Road submitted by Andy Roberts, Valero Renewables for a portion of 270th Street beginning at a point between the SE corner of the NW1/4 and the NE corner of the SW1/4 of 26-20-6, thence West 1,061 feet to a point located on the east ROW line of the Nebraska Central Railroad between the NW1/4 and the SW1/4 of 26-20-6, in Boone County, Nebraska. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve Resolution No. 2016-36 appointing Darrel D. Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, to do a feasibility study regarding the vacation of a portion of road known as 270th Street. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, presented the Board quotes for their review from Applied Connective Technologies, LLC and Safe-N-Secure Security Equipment for replacement of the surveillance security camera system located in the law enforcement building and the courthouse. Johnson informed the Board that both quotes will satisfy the State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division suggested requirements for security surveillance system following their review/study of the jail facility. Each entity submitted quotes for law enforcement building separately and one that includes the courthouse building. The Board plans to review the quotes for comparability and make a decision on how many surveillance cameras to install. It was suggested to install cameras on the outside of the buildings facing the east ramp, north steps and both parking lots. The Board discussed the respective office budget requests submitted for fiscal year 2016-2017 for possible adjustments with each elected official or department head. The Board proposed 2016-2017 FY County Budget be forwarded to Rick Martinsen for final budget preparations.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a resolution regarding vacation of a portion of a county road known as 240<sup>th</sup> Avenue, beginning at a point between the SE1/4 of Section 32 and the SW1/4 of Section 33, all in Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, thence running north approximately one (1) mile. The Board reviewed a signed petition request at their August 8, 2016 Board meeting, appointed Thorin to complete a feasibility study, reviewed the feasibility study and held a public hearing on August 22, 2016. The Board heard comments in opposition to vacation of the north half of said road and no opposition to the vacation of the south half of said road known as 240<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The Board appointed Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, at the August 22, 2016 Board meeting to complete a feasibility study regarding the vacation of a portion of county road known as 265<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Thorin presented the feasibility study for the Board to review. The feasibility study is in regard to a Petition to Vacate County Road submitted by Andy Roberts, Valero Renewables, for a portion of 265<sup>th</sup> Avenue commencing at a point between the NE corner of the SW1/4 and the NW corner of the SE1/4 of Section 26, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, thence South approximately 2,505 feet to a point located on the north right-of-way line of the Nebraska State Highway 39, between the SW1/4 and the SE1/4 of Section 26, Township 20 North, Range 6 West, of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. The cable is for the benefit of Valero Ethanol Plant. The County of Boone has received some requests/questions for installation of One/Two Hour Parking limit signage be installed by the ramp located at the east side of the courthouse. Some residents prefer to use the ramp area instead of the courthouse parking lots when there is several cars in the parking lots. Commissioner Tisthammer will visit with the City of Albion regarding the concerns and possible signage.

The Board reviewed the quotes for a new IP Surveillance System submitted by Denny Johnson, Sheriff, at the Board meeting on August 15, 2016. The quotes for a new IP Surveillance System are from Applied Connective Technologies, LLC of Albion, Nebraska and Safe-N-Secure Security Equipment of Sioux Falls, South Dakota for replacement of the surveillance security camera system located in the law enforcement building and the courthouse. Johnson informed the Board that both quotes will satisfy the State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division suggested requirements for security surveillance system following their review/study of the jail facility. Johnson said he would like the security surveillance system to be included in a law enforcement remodeling project. Wells said that the part-time help in the office should take care of any extra hours for herself and understands that the part-time is to be under 20 hours per week. A Memorandum of Understanding was received for the Board to review and approve regarding Juvenile Services grants. The purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to designate the Madison County Attorney's Office as the official applicant and "lead county" for the Nebraska Crime Commission's 2016 Community-Based Juvenile Services Aid Grant and Enhancement Grant application for Madison and Boone Counties. As such, the Madison County Attorney's Office will serve as the fiscal agent for the grant application program. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Memorandum of Understanding for the Nebraska Crime Commission's 2016 Community-Based Juvenile Services Aid Grant and Enhancement Grant as presented. The County Board in each county shall examine into each inventory statement so filed, and, if said statement is correct and proper in every particular, the County Board shall deliver each of said inventory statements to the clerk of the county for filing as a public record in said county clerk's office in a manner convenient for reference. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the County Offices' 2015-2016 Inventories of county personal and real estate property as presented from the various offices and file the submitted inventories with the County Clerk's office as a public record in a manner convenient for reference. The budget message must include a list of all cash amounts being held by officials that do not appear in the County Treasurer's Office six month balance reports. The Board has approved and authorized accounts within County Offices to receive and disburse fees, etc. Some of the accounts balance to zero and some accounts have a beginning balance. The Governing Body of the County of Boone, by a majority vote by the Boone County Board of Commissioners, resolves that: the 2016-2017 property tax request be set at \$3,635,029.00, which is different from the 2015-2016 property tax request of \$3,271,759.00; and the 2016 county tax rate is at 0.151013, which is different from the 2015 tax rate of 0.149127. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2016-49 at the September 8, 2016 public hearing to adopt and approve the County Budget for 2016-2017 as published and presented with the above property tax requests. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The 2016-2017 County Budget public hearing for the County of Boone, Nebraska was held at 9:01 A.M. on September 8, 2016. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve increasing the total restricted funds authority by an additional 1% growth for fiscal year 2016-2017. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to set a Board of Equalization meeting to be held on September 26, 2016 at 11:00 A.M. to set the 2016 tax year levies. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Chairman Luettel declared the meeting adjourned at 10:10 A.M., the next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 12, 2016.





### PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS 2016-2017 COUNTY BUDGET

Ken Luettel, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Thursday, September 8, 2016 at 9:01 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Tisthammer, second by Commissioner Maricle to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Jerry L. Tisthammer, Hilary K. Maricle and Ken Luettel. Richard Martinsen, CPA was present to answer budget questions. Chairman Luettel read the notice for the record. Jim Dickerson, Albion News, was present for the budget hearing.

The public hearing was for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2016-2017 Boone County proposed budget in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Sections 13-501 to 13-513. Also, to set the final tax request for the 2016-2017 Boone County proposed budget at a different amount than the prior year tax request in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Section 77-1601.02 The hearing was open for one hour and the proposed budget was published in the August 31, 2016 issue of the Albion News, Albion, Nebraska.

The County Board and those present for the hearing discussed with Martinsen the differences from last year's fiscal budget in the areas of asking dollars, land valuation, tax rate, property tax requirement and fund balances. Martinsen provided answers to questions asked with regard to the proposed budget and publication. The proposed property tax request for 2016-2017 is \$3,635,029.00, which is different from the 2015-2016 property tax request of \$3,271,759.00, being an increase of \$363,270.00 from fiscal year 2015-2016. The proposed tax rate for 2016 of 0.151013 is higher than the 2015 tax rate of 0.149127. It takes a 75% vote to exceed the 2.5% lid limitation by an additional 1% budget authority growth. The levy authority of 50 cents includes the County levy and all the entities such as Agricultural/Historical Societies, Fire Districts, etc. added together. The County allowable levy limit is 45 cents of the 50 cents. The 2016 County valuation is \$2,407,095,340.00 compared to the 2015 valuation of \$2,193,945,513.00 an increase of \$213,149,827.00.

The adopted 2016-2017 County Budget has a tax request expense increase from the 2015-2016 County Budget. The County of Boone, Nebraska financial contribution to the BCDA, Inc. is 80% of the corporation budget and is from the Inheritance Tax Fund, no longer from County General Fund. There are pending road projects that were not completed.

Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to close said public hearing at 10:01 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Discussion: The county tax rate will be 0.151013. If it were not for the use of inheritance tax dollars, the county rate would be increased in order to maintain the current level of services that are both mandated under state law and that our county taxpayers deserve and expect.



Martinsen explained that Inheritance Tax funding is considered a local tax. Inheritance Tax funds stay in the respective county and benefit the respective county taxpayers with a lower property tax rate. If the legislature removes the Inheritance Tax funding, then the state and federal levels will receive the taxes generated from "Inheritance" and the local county level will need to increase their property tax rate to maintain mandated services.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve and adopt the County Budget for 2016-2017 as published and presented with an Unused Budget Authority created for next year of \$180,565.48; and set the 2016 County Tax Rate at 0.151013, which is different than the County Tax Rate of 0.149127 for 2015. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board expressed their appreciation to Martinsen for his assistance with the County Budget preparation throughout the years.

The Boone County Sheriff's office submitted a renewal Agreement with the rates remaining the same that were approved and effective on July 1, 2015. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Maricle to approve an Agreement with Darla McIntosh to provide meals for the prisoner(s) held in the Boone County Jail, effective July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017, with the understanding that the Agreement may be extended on the same terms and conditions by written Agreement of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff, and Darla McIntosh, Independent Contractor. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The General Fund receives the real estate and personal property taxes with a designated percentage transferred to the Road Fund on a monthly basis. The Boone County Treasurer is authorized to use all property tax collections, which would include real estate and motor vehicle taxes, to be in the transfer of funds. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2016-53, authorizing the Boone County Treasurer to transfer funds from the General Fund (0100) 44.69% to the Road Fund (0200) for the 2016-2017 Tax Year on a monthly basis not to exceed \$1,623,383.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The Board appointed Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, at the August 29, 2016 Board meeting to complete a feasibility study regarding the vacation of a portion of county road known as 270<sup>th</sup> Street. Thorin presented the feasibility study for the Board to review. The feasibility study is in regard to a Petition to Vacate County Road submitted by Albert VanDeWalle, for a portion of 270<sup>th</sup> Street commencing at the SW1/4 corner of Section 30 and the NW1/4 corner of Section 31, running thence east for approximately one (1) mile to the SE1/4 corner of Section 30 and the NE1/4 corner of Section 31, all in Township 20 North, Range 5 West, of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. Boone County, Nebraska. This portion of road is not included in the county's current inventory with the Nebraska Department of Roads and will have no effect on the State Highway Allocation funds received by the County. The road may currently be driven on by four-wheel drive vehicles from 280<sup>th</sup> Avenue, but for less than one-quarter mile and at that point it becomes impassable. It does not appear that vacating said road will land lock any landowners in this section and Thorin said there is no reason not to vacate said portion of road. Thorin recommends that the one mile section of 270<sup>th</sup> Street be vacated and all right-of-way rights revert back to the adjacent landowners, thirty-three feet on each side where applicable as long as all landowners adjoining said road are in agreement. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2016-52, to set a public hearing to be held on October 17, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. to hear comments in favor of or opposition to the vacation of a portion of road known as 270<sup>th</sup> Street as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

In addition, while Thorin was researching the road records regarding the above feasibility study and performing an on-site study of said road it was found that there are five additional sections of roads in Township 20 North, Range 5 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska that Thorin recommends to be vacated at this time. Thorin said that the five additional sections of roads are not included in the county's current inventory with the Nebraska Department of Roads and will have no effect on the State Highway Allocation Funds received by the County. Thorin recommends the following to be vacated:

- 1. One-half (1/2) mile of 270<sup>th</sup> Street: (commencing at a point between the SW1/4 corner of Section 29 and the NW1/4 corner of Section 32, thence east ½ mile to the SE corner of the SW1/4 of Section 29 and the NE corner of the NW1/4 of Section 32, Township 20 North, Range 5 West). It is not accessible by vehicle, as the one-half mile east of this section was vacated on June 19, 2006 and both sides of the right-of-way are currently being farmed. Currently the same landowner owns both sides of the right-of-way.
- 2. Three-quarter (3/4) mile of 290<sup>th</sup> Avenue: (commencing at a point between the SE corner of the NE1/4 of Section 31 and the SW corner of the NW1/4 of Section 32, thence north for approximately three-quarter (3/4) mile to the NW corner of the S1/2 of the SW1/4 of Section 29 and the NE corner of the S1/2 of the SE1/4 of Section 30, Township 20 North, Range 5 West). The south one-quarter (1/4) mile from 280<sup>th</sup> Street north was vacated June 19, 2006.
- 3. One-half (1/2) mile of 305<sup>th</sup> Avenue: (commencing at a point between the NE corner of the NW1/4 and the NW corner of the NE1/4 of Section 33, Township 20 North, Range 5 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, thence south one-half (1/2) mile.
- 4. One-half (1/2) mile of 295<sup>th</sup> Avenue: (commencing at a point between the SE corner of the SW1/4 and the SW corner of the SE1/4 of Section 29, Township 20 North, Range 5 West, thence north approximately one-half (1/2) mile to the center point of Section 29. This road is not accessible as 270<sup>th</sup> Street to the east was vacated, 270<sup>th</sup> Street to the west is being farmed and 295<sup>th</sup> Avenue to the south was vacated June 19, 2006.
- 5. One (1) mile of 275<sup>th</sup> Street: (commencing at a point between the SW corner of the NW1/4 and the NW corner of the SW1/4 of Section 34, Township 20 North, Range 5 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska.



A public hearing has been set for October 17, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. to hear comments in favor of or opposition to the vacation of a portion of a county road known as 270th Street. Thorin recommended to include the five additional sections for road to be vacated and heard at the scheduled public hearing on October 17, 2016. Thorin will notify in writing all of the adjoining landowners to the above described roads that the county is considering the vacation of said roads advising them of the date and time for a public hearing for comments. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint Darrel D. Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, to proceed with the protocol procedure to notify in writing the adjoining landowners of the above described roads that the county is considering for vacation and that a public hearing has been scheduled for October 17, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. to hear comments. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

In addition, while Thorin was researching the road records regarding a feasibility study he discovered that the following two and one-half (2 1/2) miles of 300<sup>th</sup> Avenue: one (1) mile between Sections 4 and 5; the north one-half (1/2) mile between Sections 8 and 9; one (1) mile between Sections 32 and 33; and one (1) mile of 290<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Sections 17 and 18, all in Township 20 North, Range 5 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, have no record of ever being officially opened by the County. All of these sections of roads may be officially opened based on Nebraska State Statute §39-1401(2) Public roads shall mean all roads within this state which have been laid out in pursuance of any law of this state, and which have not been vacated in pursuance of law, and all roads located and opened by the county board of any county and traveled for more than ten years. These roads are included in the county's current inventory with the Nebraska Department of Roads and are used as a basis for State Highway Allocation Funds. No public hearing is required and the roads will need to be opened with the existing right-of-way as is at the time of opening. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to appoint Darrel D. Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, to proceed with the process to officially open said portion of 300<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 290<sup>th</sup> Avenue as presented. Ken Luettel, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, September 26, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of September 26, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board Public Hearing Proceedings of September 26, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.



The Board and Denny Johnson, Sheriff, held a lengthy telephone conference with Don Prochaska and Bill Huey, Prochaska and Associates of Omaha, Nebraska, regarding possible renovations to the law enforcement building. Prochaska works with the State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division, to make sure that the renovation project satisfies the requirements for security and safety issues following the review/study of the county jail facility by the State of Nebraska, Jail Standard Division. The new IP Surveillance System has already been installed in the law enforcement and courthouse buildings and the two parking lots. The phase one project discussion included the surveillance camera system, along with three additional observation windows in the jail cells, replacement of facility restroom areas, installation of automatic lock doors between certain areas and installation of video visitation equipment for inmates to be located in the courthouse building. Also, discussed was the possible renovation of the dispatch area to allow for more convenience and safety. Don Prochaska suggested a second phase project to plan for future changes and renovations in the law enforcement building. The firm assures compliance with the State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division when they produce plans and specifications. Prochaska estimated phase one planning/specifications costs to be approximately \$20,000.00-\$25,000.00. The first phase would meet the immediate safety compliance needs suggested by State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize Denny Johnson, Sheriff, to work with Prochaska and Associates and proceed with phase one to meet the safety and compliance issues as approved by State of Nebraska, Jail Standards Division. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board and presented his September report for the Board to review. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- Thorin updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects.
- Thorin updated the Board regarding the contracted culvert replacement project.
- Thorin and the Board discussed the possible purchase of a new signage program for the road department. The program may be compatible with a tablet to be used for the picture and location of the signage, then download the information to the office computers. The new program and tablet would save time by the office staff, as they would no longer manually re-enter the information into the office computers, which is picked up in the field. Thorin said that a government rate for a tablet at Verizon would add approximately \$10.41 to the current Verizon monthly road department billing. The consensus of the Board was for Thorin to proceed with the software/hardware updates for the signage programs.
- The Board, County Highway Superintendent and County Sheriff received information that a non-approved driveway/approach has been installed in a county road right-of-way. The county road department removed a driveway in the same area in 2015, due to safety issues of the driveway being in the county road right-of-way below a hill. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to authorize the Boone County Road Department to remove the non-approved driveway/approach located in the county road right-of-way with the assistance of county law enforcement. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, presented a quote for the Board to review for the purchase of a used pickup for the county road department. The quote from Schalk Auto, Inc. of Albion, NE is for a 2014 Ford F150 Pickup with 3,326 miles for \$30,995.00 less trade in of \$9,095.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve and authorize Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, to sign the necessary papers for the purchase of a used 2014 Ford Pickup from Schalk Auto, Inc. for \$21,900.00 as presented. The safety concerns are the intersection of Fairview Street that serves the hospital nursing home and assisted living facility; intersection to vehicle repair building, Shopko, government building and a professional building; intersection for Dollar General; intersection for Albion Fire Department/Rescue Squad and the motel.

The group discussion included informing state leaders of the safety issue; lowering the speed limit; no parking signs on the west side of the highway; state department of roads widen their intersection from the highway onto 260<sup>th</sup> Street; and staging areas within the Cargill property off of the state highway and 260<sup>th</sup> Street. The group discussed the possibility of all trucks stage only on the east side of the highway with the south bound trucks turning around at the area of the mini park along the State Highway 14-39 junction area in order to be north bound and stage on the east side of the highway. - Thorin updated the Board regarding the county bridges that are showing structure deficiency according to the latest Nebraska Department of Roads bridge inspections.
- Thorin informed the Board that LTAP will be in Boone County on Wednesday, November 16, 2016 for hands on motor grader operator instructions. Thorin plans to have all the county employee motor grader operators to participate in the training.





• Thorin informed the Board that he plans to notify the truck drivers that signed a non-exclusive contract for services to back-haul aggregate for the county, that the county will not need the back-haul services again until in the spring of 2017.

An annual certification of a County Highway Superintendent is due each year by December 31<sup>st</sup> to the Nebraska Department of Roads per Nebraska Revised Statutes §39-2501 through §39-2505. The performance of the duties listed in the certification determines federal highway allocation funds incentive payments. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Certification for the Nebraska Department of Roads of Darrel Thorin, Boone County Highway Superintendent, for the calendar year 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

On October 26, 2016 the Board; Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent; Denny Johnson, Sheriff; Brent Lipker, Albion Police Department; Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager; Jay Olson, Cargill Northwest Region Operations representative; Jonathan Petersen and Terry Reicks, Cargill representatives; and Andy Roberts and Michael Pugh, Valero Renewables representatives, met to discuss safety concerns. The hazardous safety issues discussed were in regard to when truck traffic is staging on State Highway 14-39 and County Road known as 260<sup>th</sup> Street while waiting to unload grain at Cargill.

The Board invited Kevin Domogalla, Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) District 3 Highway Engineer, to participate in the ongoing discussion of safety concerns and possible solutions for truck staging on the state highway during certain times of the year. The following participated in the discussion: Board of Commissioners; Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent; Denny Johnson, Sheriff; Brent Lipker, Albion Police Department; Jonathan Petersen and Terry Reicks, Cargill representatives; and Andy Roberts and Michael Pugh, Valero Renewables representatives, and Kevin Domogalla, District 3 NDOR Highway Engineer.

Domogalla said that the trucks are not allowed to stage on the highway and that the southbound lane or west side of Highway 14-39 has been posted for no parking. Domogalla said the enforcement of the no parking signs is up to local law enforcement. Discussion was held on a possible safety improvement to eliminate trucks staging on the southbound side of State Highway 14-39 by using the highway junction and connecting spur to the south. Trucks could use that as a turn-around area, so that all grain trucks would be northbound and staging on the east edge of the highway as they wait to turn onto 260<sup>th</sup> Street. The short turning radius onto 260<sup>th</sup> Street was listed as a drawback to the plan, although it could be safer because there are fewer driveways south of the 260<sup>th</sup> Street intersection. Domogalla reiterated that the state cannot allow trucks staging on the highway, no matter the location. Getting the staging trucks off the highway is ultimately the best solution. Cargill noted they have added more staging area within its facility and have room for 40 semi-truck/trailers. Cargill noted that they unload about 96 percent semi-truck/trailers and only about four percent straight trucks.

The group referenced a traffic study that was completed in 2009. The group discussed a possible reduction of the speed limit in the vicinity of State Highway 14-39 and 260<sup>th</sup> Street. It is currently 45 mph in that area and also noted that there are more businesses in the area than there were when the last traffic study was completed in 2009. A suggested reduction to 35 mph would reduce the danger from lack of visibility at the intersections when trucks are staging on the highway. Domogalla said that the 2009 traffic study did not indicate sufficient traffic to reduce the speed limit. The group believes that the traffic volume on the highway is higher than it was in 2009 and that a new traffic study would prove that. Other suggestions were to add a flashing amber light at the intersection and install an electronic roadside speed monitor sign in that area to notify drivers of their speed. It was suggested that this could be done as a cost share project between the city and county. Plans for possibly widening the turning radius at the intersection of State Highway 14-39 and County Road 260<sup>th</sup> Street was



discussed. The right-of-way is owned by the State of Nebraska, but Domogalla said this is a county road intersection, so a widening construction project would be at the county expense.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Domogalla said he will check into a new traffic study of the area and gather traffic data from Cargill and Valero. Domogalla said the waiting time for a traffic study is usually four to six months.

The Board served a written notice to Sequoia Consulting Group, terminating the agreement regarding Indirect Costs Allocation for fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, effective October 11, 2016. The Board and Wesley J. Ehlers, Sequoia Consulting Group, discussed the Indirect Costs Allocation services via telephone conference. The County of Boone, Nebraska has received a letter from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) denying the requests dated September 15, 2014 and September 21, 2015, for payment for office space in regard to indirect costs. There is confusion regarding what allocation funds were recently denied by DHHS that the Sequoia Consulting Group submitted for Indirect Costs Allocation services reimbursement for the county. In January DHHS finance department and internal audit reviewed DHHS practice of receiving invoices from counties for free space, running the costs through a cost allocation plan, and reimbursing counties for the space with federal dollars. DHHS concluded that it was not able to properly claim federal funds for this space for the current and future cost allocation plans. Ehlers expressed his thoughts on the recent action by DHHS and asked the Board to reconsider continuing to use Sequoia Consulting Group services. Ehlers said that that the consulting groups are possibly proposing legislation to clear up the issues that recently surfaced following an internal audit of the DHHS finance department. The Board made no decision at the meeting and plan to call Wesley Ehlers, Sequoia Consulting Group, on Monday, November 21, 2016 to further discuss the issue.

Open Discussion and miscellaneous public comments:

- The Board discussed various meetings scheduled this week.
- The Board, Denny Johnson, Sheriff, and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, discussed the generator inspections conducted by NMC. The generator located at the County Communications Tower and the generator located at the Sheriff's office are both in need of some maintenance repairs. The consensus of the Board was to have the necessary repairs completed on both generators.

Commissioner Luettel declared the meeting adjourned at 12:20 P.M. with the next Board meeting scheduled for Monday, November 21, 2016.

The Board and Chuck Rolf and David Noble, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., discussed the recent real estate purchase by the County of the approximate thirty-five acres south of the present fairgrounds property. Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. Thorin said that the wet snow last week caused the sloppy road problems. In addition, the hard rain received on Sunday helped pack some of the area road surfaces.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The Board discussed the Boone County Ambulance transport services base rate pay for drivers and medical personnel at their December 12, 2016 Board meeting. The ambulance personnel have been receiving a base rate of pay depending on the distance of the transport from Boone County medical facility to a larger medical facility. The ambulance personnel are not full time county employees, but are considered county employees when operating the county ambulance transport service due to the county owning the ambulance. The type of pay structure change is from a base rate to an hourly rate. The Board proposed an hourly rate for ambulance personnel to review. The Board and Randall Bruland, County Ambulance Administrator, discussed the Board's proposed hourly rates and the ambulance personnel suggested hourly rates. The Board plans to adopt a resolution regarding the hourly pay rates for ambulance personnel at their December 28, 2016 Board meeting. Motion made by Luettel, second by Tisthammer to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of December 12, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Tisthammer and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried

The Board, Boone County Fitness Center, Inc. board members Jay Wolf, Dave Skillstad, and Bryce Spann, and Anji Kendrick, Fitness Center Manager, discussed several changes involving the Boone County Fitness Center, Inc. (Fitness Center). Wolf presented a complete financial report, along with a membership and usage report for the Board to review. Wolf pointed out that the Fitness Center's membership has grown from 261 members in 2006 to 405 members in 2016. The present membership includes 212 that live in the city limits of Albion; 81 that live outside city limits with an Albion address; and 114 that do not have an Albion address that live within Boone County and surrounding counties. Wolf said there is probably no longer a need for the Park and Recreation Board if a lease is signed and the Boone County Fitness Center, Inc., a nonprofit 501(C)(3) organization operates on its own federal identification number. The insurance and payroll have been handled by the County for several years with the Fitness Center reimbursing the County each month. Therefore, in regard to county audits they appear on paper to be county government employees. The fitness center members said they hope that the Board of Commissioners will continue to attend the Fitness Center Board meetings. County representatives were also invited to take a tour of the facility. Commissioner Luettel invited the Fitness Center Board member's to attend an upcoming meeting in March that will be held in Albion for non-profit organizations. UNL Extension will provide training to non-profits on how to remain in compliance.





The Fitness Center Board met on December 13, 2016 to take action regarding the operation of the Boone County Fitness Center, Inc. that has been discussed the past several months. Boone County, Nebraska, a political subdivision, has owned the fitness center building, real estate and all of its appurtenances since August 29, 1986 per a Corporation Warranty Deed recorded in the Boone County Register of Deeds office. The county will continue to carry property insurance on the building through the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA). The Fitness Center will continue to reimburse the County for the cost of coverage. The Fitness Center will carry its own general liability, workman's compensation and director/officer's coverage starting January 1, 2017. The Fitness Center payroll will be handled by Schmeits, Mueller and Martinsen, P.C. effective January 1, 2017. A lease agreement at a nominal fee of \$1.00 per year will be signed and all previous agreements/resolutions will be rescinded. The Lease Agreement draft will be reviewed by NIRMA before the Board of Commissioners sign the document. Motion made by Maricle, second by Tisthammer to approve the Boone County Fitness Center, Inc. proposed operation changes and the payroll to be processed through the Fitness Center identification number effective January 1, 2017. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Tisthammer and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Steve Pritchard, Extension Educator, presented the Boone-Nance County Extension Board's member recommendation. The Boone-Nance County Extension Board has four representatives from each county. The board members may serve two consecutive three-year terms. The board meets quarterly, alternating the meetings between the counties. Jane Prothman has completed two consecutive three-year terms. Brian Andreasen has resigned from the Boone-Nance County Extension Board. The Boone-Nance County Extension Board recommends the appointment of Amanda Berg of Cedar Rapids to complete the term of Brian Andreasen and Roger Voichoski of Albion to serve his first three-year term on the Boone-Nance County Extension Board beginning January, 2017. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to appoint Amanda Berg to complete the term of Brian Andreasen (2016-2018) and Roger Voichoski to serve his first three-year term on the Boone-Nance County Extension Board beginning January, 2017. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Tisthammer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Yosten PC LLO, representing county road workers met briefly with the Board regarding county employee vacation policy on December 12, 2016. Brandi Yosten, Jarecki Yosten PC LLO, presented their clients agreeable amended vacation time policy. The vacation policy change is for the employees hired in 2009 and prior. The change is to continue the merge of vacation policies so that all employees are on one of the same policy and that a policy is in compliance with federal regulations and labor laws. The County Payroll is a 22/21 pay period with the December 22<sup>nd</sup>-31<sup>st</sup> of each calendar year being a part of the next calendar year payroll. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the following vacation policy change for the employees hired in 2009 and prior:

- 2017- The earned 2016 vacation hours will be posted on December 22, 2016 and the 2017 earned vacation hours will be posted on the 21<sup>st</sup> of each month beginning January 21, 2017, with a carryover of unused vacation hours capped at 200 hours on December 21, 2017, with any excess over 200 hours will be paid out on December 21, 2017.
- 2018-The carryover of accrual vacation capped at 200 hours will be posted on December 22, 2017 and the 2018 earned vacation hours will continue to be posted on the 21<sup>st</sup> of each month, with a carryover of unused vacation hours capped at 100 hours on December 21, 2018, with any excess over 100 hours will be paid out on December 21, 2018.

Rayman said that the three year Community Heath Improvement Plan (CHIP) for 2016-2018 are focused on substance abuse prevention, cancer prevention, health literacy and access to health care with a particular in-patient access to mental health. ECDHD has provided a number of different services to the residents of Boone County. Some of the services provided were the WIC program, senior citizens health related presentations, elementary and junior high school presentations, disease investigations and radon test kits. ECDHD has a staff member at the Boone County Health Center on Thursday each week to help clients with economic assistance such as health care applications, food stamps and other medical needs.

ECDHD board members meet every other month. Rayman thanked Commissioner Tisthammer for his years of service on the ECDHD Board. The Board informed Rayman that a new county official representative on the ECDHD Board will be appointed at the Board's reorganizational meeting scheduled for January 5, 2017 due to Tisthammer retiring. Rayman presented a slate of names for the East Central District Health Department Board for approval by the Board of Commissioners. The Boone County representatives on the ECDHD Board are Jerry L. Tisthammer, County Commissioner and Mary Staub, Public Minded Citizen. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Motion made by Commissioner Luettel, second by Commissioner Tisthammer to open said public hearing. Present for roll call were Commissioners Ken Luettel, Jerry L. Tisthammer and Hilary K. Maricle. Also, present for the hearing were Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, Stacey Robinson, Assistant County Highway Superintendent, Brandi Yosten, Jarecki Yosten PC LLO, and Jim Cox, adjoining landowner.

The purpose of the public hearing was to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions in relation thereto the proposed vacation of a portion of county road right-of-way:

• All that portion of the right-of-way lying South of the South r.o.w. line of 360<sup>th</sup> Street and lying West of the West r.o.w. line of 200<sup>th</sup> Avenue, located in the NE1/4NE1/4 of Section 15, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, described as follows: Beginning at the SE corner of said NE1/4; thence West 33.00 feet; thence North, and on the West r.o.w. line of 200<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 2078.9 feet to the point of beginning; thence on a 539.96 foot radius curve to the left, 850.4 feet to a point on the South r.o.w. line of 360<sup>th</sup> Street; thence on the South r.o.w. line of said 360<sup>th</sup> Street, 274.86 feet; thence on a 605.96 foot radius curve to the right, 381.29 feet to a point of the West r.o.w. line of 200<sup>th</sup> Avenue; thence South and on the West r.o.w. line said 200<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 274.71 feet to the point of beginning and containing 0.82 of an acre more or less.

On February 16, 2016 the Board appointed Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent, to complete a feasibility study regarding a strip of real estate property, being a strip of roadway lying over and across the NE1/4 of Section 15, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska in regards to being identified as county road right-of-way or real estate relinquished to the county off of a former State Highway. The State of Nebraska, Department of Roads relinquished their interest in a strip of roadway lying over and across the NE1/4 of Section 15, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Boone County, Nebraska to Boone County, Nebraska in 1975. Thorin informed the Board that when he was measuring the portion of the property in question, some of the property may need to remain as county road right-of-way. Thorin suggested the property be surveyed for accurate measurements for all parties involved.

On November 28, 2016 the Board, Darrel Thorin, County Highway Superintendent and Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Yosten PC LLO, discussed the feasibility study completed by Thorin and a survey completed by Chris Hays, County Surveyor, regarding the disposition of road right-of-way property located southeast of Cedar Rapids. Larry R. Cox and James L. Cox have farmed the strip of real estate property for many years and have been paying taxes on the said property. Funds not used by Boone County will be used for other services in the Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Justice Partnership Plan. Ziemba asked the Board to hire a new Zoning Consultant for the County. The purpose of the agreement is for the project entitled Boone County, Nebraska Zoning Assistance. The agreement shall begin upon signing of the document and is estimated to be continuous until either party terminates said agreement. The agreement contains the scope of services, general conditions and payment rates for Keith A. Marvin, Marvin Planning Constants, Inc. and David Ptak, Attorney at Law. Motion made by Tisthammer, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Contract for Services Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and Keith A. Marvin, Marvin Planning Consultants, Inc. effective December 28, 2016 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Tisthammer, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.
