



2018 REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 9:00 A.M. on Wednesday, January 3, 2018, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Maricle called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by Nebraska State Statute. Commissioners present for roll call were Hilary K. Maricle, Ken Luettel and Alan Rasmussen. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Maricle noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to appoint Ken Luettel as Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Maricle. Abstain: Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint Alan Rasmussen as Vice Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Abstain: Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to appoint the following to be on the Health Board for Boone County as required by State Statute: County Sheriff, County Clerk and Boone County Health Center Chief of Staff for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle that the budget committee for the ensuing 2018-2019 budget year is the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Boone County Clerk and Boone County Treasurer.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to reappoint Schmeits, Mueller & Martinsen, P.C., Richard Martinsen, CPA, Albion, Nebraska, to prepare the County Budget for the 2018-2019 budget year, to be paid from the County General fund.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to appoint Stacey L. Robinson, Fullerton, Nebraska, as full time County Highway Superintendent under the supervision of the County Board for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to reappoint Christopher C. Hays, Osceola, Nebraska, as Boone County Surveyor for a four year term commencing January 8, 2015 through December 31, 2018, per contract for services as provided in State Statute Section 23-1901.01.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to reappoint Jacqueline Lynne Wells as full time Boone County Veteran Service Officer under the supervision of the County Board for 2018. In addition, the office may employee an As-Needed employee at less than 20 hours per week. In addition, there is a signed agreement with Greeley County for Boone County Veteran Service Officer to provide services for Greeley County.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to reappoint Randall Bruland as the Administrator and Maintenance Director of the Boone County Ambulance Service under the supervision of the County Board for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to continue the agreement for patient billing and collection services for the Boone County Ambulance Service with EMS Billing Services, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska pursuant to an Agreement effective March 1, 2014 that continues to termination by one of the parties. Nicole Levander, Boone County Health Center, to serve as liaison for the Boone County Ambulance Service/EMS Billing Services for 2018.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to reappoint Mary Ziemba as County Planning and Zoning Administrator, Regulatory Zoning Investigator and Floodplain Manager under the supervision of the County Board for 2018. The road clerical duties for the County Highway Superintendent's office are also included as part of the County Planning and Zoning Administrator duties.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to reappoint the Boone County Veteran Service Officer as the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint the Boone County Sheriff and his staff to be the E911 Coordinator for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint Alan Rasmussen as Courthouse Custodian supervisor for 2018.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to appoint Ken Luettel as County Weed Superintendent supervisor.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to appoint the Board of Commissioners Chairman as Chairperson of the County General Assistance Program with the emergencies being handled by a Commissioner. The County Clerk or Deputy County Clerk shall contact the assistance program chairperson or a Commissioner when there is a request on a day there is no scheduled Board meeting.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to appoint the Boone County Clerk as the contact person for Boone County for the NIRMA Insurance for 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to give the County Clerk's office the authority to sign any documents that pertain to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools after June 30, 2000 under the supervision of the County Board for 2018.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel that the depository for the Boone County Clerk account will be the Boone County Bank, A Division of Madison County Bank, Albion, Nebraska with Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account; and depository





for the Boone County Imprest Vendor account will be the Boone County Bank, A Division of Madison County Bank, Albion, Nebraska with Commissioners Ken Luettel, Hilary K. Maricle, Alan Rasmussen and County Clerk's office Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen that the depository for the Clerk of the District Court will be the Cornerstone Bank of York, Albion Branch with Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle that the depository for the Boone County Imprest Payroll account will be the Cornerstone Bank of York, Albion Branch, with Commissioners Ken Luettel, Hilary K. Maricle, Alan Rasmussen and County Clerk's office Kathy Thorberg, Lorrie Nicklasson and Sarah Robinson as signees authorized to exercise the powers for said account.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen that the depositories for the County Treasurer are as follows: Boone County Bank, A Division of Madison County Bank, Albion, NE; Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids, NE; Cornerstone Bank (Albion Branch and St. Edward Branch), York, NE; First Bank & Trust of Fullerton (St. Edward Branch), Fullerton, NE; Great Plains State Bank, Petersburg, NE; Homestead Bank (Albion Branch), Cozad, NE; and Alternate Investment is Nebraska Public Agency Investment Trust (NPAIT), Lincoln, NE. The County Board authorizes and empowers the Boone County Treasurer to invest any surplus funds in the custody of the office. Any surplus funds shall be invested to assure a beneficial rate of return to the County and confirmation of all pledged securities are on file.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen that all County Officials and Department Heads must contact the County Board, as an agenda item, before buying or doing any major maintenance to equipment or furniture over \$800.00.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel that the courthouse hours shall be 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM with a one-half hour unpaid break, and that all offices will post their hours, including the lunch break; and notice shall be posted on the respective office door only if an office is to be closed when it otherwise would be open.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen that the Boone County full time employees are to receive twelve paid holidays which include the observed nine holidays as set forth in the NIRMA Guide to Creating a Personnel System for Nebraska Counties Handbook together with Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Columbus Day. In addition, Arbor Day shall be a floating holiday and is designated for Monday, December 24, 2018. The Courthouse "Closed" notices will be posted by Board directive on the north and west outside entrance courthouse doors.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle that full time employees are to receive vacation and sick leave as set forth in the Boone County Employee Handbook. The employee's vacation and sick leave records are recorded with the time clock/attendance system effective January 2014.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve the IRS mileage reimbursement rate of 54.5 cents per mile, effective January 1, 2018 as referenced in the Boone County Employee Handbook.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve County meal reimbursable dollar amount, as referenced in the Boone County Employee Handbook, for 2018 overnight travel policy: (1) Includes reimbursement by submitting an itemized receipt for actual expense up to \$11.00 for breakfast, \$12.00 for lunch and \$23.00 for supper; (2) No reimbursement of meals for one day travel; (3) If an unforeseen situation occurs for one day





travel and return is after 7:00 P.M., the meal may be reimbursed and will be taxed and added to the employee W-2; (4) Itemized receipts are required for all travel expenses.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen that agenda items must be provided to the Boone County Clerk's Office no later than noon on the Friday preceding a Board meeting in order to be considered for said Board meeting.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel that the Boone County Board of Commissioners will hold their Board meetings on every Monday except for the first Monday of each month in the year, 2018, commencing at 9:00 A.M. Meeting dates/times are subject to change due to state statute regulations. Monday meetings that are on holidays will be held on Tuesday. The Accounts Payable Vendor meeting will be on the second Monday of the month and other Mondays will be regular public meetings. In addition, the Accounts Payable Vendor meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 10, 2018, due to conflicts with Monday, January 8, 2018. The Payroll meetings are subject to change from Monday to a different day for approval by the Board with the implementation of the time clock/attendance system and the 22/21 pay period. The Board meeting dates for payroll approval are as follows: January 29, February 26, March 26, April 25, May 29, June 27, July 25, August 27, September 26, October 29, November 28 and December 27, 2018. The County Clerk's office has charge and authority of the agenda for all meetings. The agenda will be made available for all meetings on the Boone County Website and the bulletin board located in the north courthouse entrance. Also, the following will be used to post notices in advance for emergency meetings and meetings that cannot be published in the legal newspaper(s): Boone County Website; Boone County Courthouse; lobbies of the Boone County Bank; Cornerstone Bank; Homestead Bank; and Albion News Office, all located in Albion, NE. In addition, the Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids, NE, Cornerstone Bank, St. Edward, NE and Great Plains State, Petersburg, NE.

As required by law (Neb. Rev. Stat. §48-443), each Nebraska county must have a working safety committee. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel that (1) the following will serve on the Safety Committee for 2018: Region 44 Emergency Management Director; County Sheriff; Board of Commissioners; County Highway Superintendent; County Treasurer; County ADA Coordinator; Custodial Maintenance Supervisor; and (2) the Safety Committee meetings are tentatively scheduled for February 26, 2018, May 14, 2018, August 13, 2018 and November 19, 2018, commencing at 9:00 A.M.

The Grievance Procedure in the Employee Handbook says the County will use a Grievance Board consisting of five people. The Commissioners shall create the pre-designated list of ten impartial members to serve on the Grievance Board. The Board visited with county residents to create a pre-designated list. Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel, Hilary K. Maricle and Alan Rasmussen. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Keri Carraher, RN, Boone County Health Center, presented a Home Health Agency Renewal Licensure Application for the Board to review. Carraher updated the Board in regard to the services that the Boone County Health Center Home Health Agency provides for the area. The geographical area served are in the counties of Boone, Antelope, Greeley, Madison, Nance, Platte and Wheeler. The Division of Public Health, Lincoln, Nebraska approved services are nursing, home health aide and physical, occupational, speech, intravenous therapies. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman and Vice Chairman to sign the application for the Boone County Health Center Home Health Agency





renewal license as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board received the first application payment request from the contractor for the renovation of the Boone County Law Enforcement Building to review. The payment request consists of the contractor's costs for permits, shop drawings and stored materials. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, informed the Board that a preconstruction meeting is scheduled for January 30, 2018 and renovation construction to possibly start February 5, 2018. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the first payment request of \$15,731.10 submitted by Prochaska & Associates, Architect, for the contractor RaDec Construction Co., Inc. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, presented a Weather Radio Hazard Mitigation Project for the Board to review. Smith explained that the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) is funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide grants to State and local governments to implement long-term mitigation measures after a major disaster declaration. Smith applied for fifteen All-hazard Radios for public facilities throughout Boone County, Nebraska. The grant agreement total is \$478.95 with FEMA providing seventy-five percent of the cost and the County providing twenty-five percent of the cost for the fifteen All-hazard Radios for the public facilities such as the schools, city/village offices, etc. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve the County providing \$119.74 for the purchase of the All-hazard Radios to be placed in public facilitates throughout Boone County as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, updated the Board regarding emergency management activities and scheduled emergency management training(s).

Stacey L. Robinson, County Highway Superintendent, and the Board discussed the Non-Exclusive Contract for Services for truckers to back-haul aggregate for the County. Robinson informed the Board that ten trucker's completed the Non-Exclusive Contract for Services to back-haul aggregate for the County in 2017. The Board and Robinson discussed the number of contracts and decided to contact each contractor from 2017 to see if they are interested in completing a contract for 2018. The Board and Robinson discussed the contractor compensation and requirements to include an attached copy of the truck driver's CDL, insurance coverage and that the back-hauler contacts the County Highway Superintendent, before any load is accepted by Boone County. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve the back-hauler compensation for 2018 being \$7.00 per ton for road gravel and \$11.00 per ton for other aggregate and requirements to include an attached copy of the truck driver's CDL, insurance coverage and that the back-hauler contacts the County Highway Superintendent, before any load is accepted by Boone County. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Abstain: Luettel. Motion carried.

The Nebraska Legislature has enacted and the Governor has signed legislation relative to the interest of County Officers in public contracts. Members of the County Board of Commissioners on occasion engage in work for the County beyond their duties and responsibilities as County Commissioners for which they will receive a direct pecuniary fee or commission as a result of such work. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-01, (1) Any board member may enter into a contract with Boone County during the year 2018 for the furnishing of services beyond the statutory responsibilities and duties as County Commissioners. (2) Such Commissioner entering into such agreement shall comply with the statutes relating to interest in public contracts, Section 49-14, 103.01 et seq. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The primary use of the Boone County Visitors Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee received two requests for advertisement funding.

Albion Area Arts Council requested assistance to advertise the Acoustic Eidolon Concert and Art Show event scheduled for February 4, 2018. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

St. Michael's Parish requested assistance to advertise the St. Patrick's Carnival event scheduled for March 11, 2018. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the application requesting funding assistance for advertisement from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A group of approximately 100 concerned citizens attended the Board meeting in regard to the proposed Agricultural and Educational Activities Building for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The Board; County Attorney; Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. board members; Jeff Jarecki, Attorney representing Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc.; Agricultural and Educational Activities Building committee members; Steve Pritchard, UNL Extension; and the county citizens in attendance discussed the proposed \$4,250,000.00 building project. Discussion presented was both in favor of the project and opposed to the project.

The majority of the tax paying citizens in attendance want to be able to vote on the project and are asking why the citizens are not having the opportunity to vote on the building project. Some of the questions asked were answered, some questions were not answered and some of the questions the building committee could not yet address. Some of the alternative ideas presented were:

- County purchase building across the street from courthouse for the UNL Extension office and activities use, thus removing that portion from the proposed building project;
- If the present concern is the indoor show arena, obtain open and closed structure costs just for replacement of show arena;
- Look into green-solar power; and
- Do fund raising and grant writing to help lower the tax payers cost of the project.

Some of the concerns voiced by the group were:

- The initial proposed cost of the building does not include heat/air for the show arena and livestock area, livestock panels or any furnishings;
- No line by line item costs of the building construction project;
- Continued maintenance;
- Building insurance;
- Paying a manager;
- Custodial services;
- Upkeep/cleaning of show arena after each use; and
- Endowment fund for future maintenance.

Some of the support expressed for a new facility were:

- Livestock buildings in need of renovation/replacement;
- Indoor show arena to small and dangerous;
- Larger space for the 4-H youth meetings, workshops and to practice archery;





- Larger indoor show arena would allow the youth to work with their horses year round; and
- Look at the building project as economic development with the opportunity to host larger/more events in the area.

The Board plans to address the citizens' concerns regarding the building project at their meeting scheduled for Tuesday, January 16, 2018.

The County Treasurer submitted a Semiannual Statement for July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to accept and approve the County Treasurer's Semiannual Statement as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Clerk and County Treasurer submitted copies of pledged securities (collateral) for their respective offices as of December 31, 2017. As such, the Madison County Attorney's Office will serve as the fiscal agent for the grant application program. Effective dates for the MOU will be from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. Funds not used by Boone County will be used for other services in the Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Justice Partnership Plan. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Memorandum of Understanding for the Nebraska Crime Commission's 2018 Community-Based Juvenile Services Grant as presented. Roll call Vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Wellness Partners of McCook, Nebraska contacted the County Clerk's office inquiring if the Boone County Board of Commissioners are interested in their health screening services for the county employees that are interested in participating. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve Wellness Partners to provide a Wellness Health Fair on Thursday, March 22, 2018 for county employees interested in participating on their own time. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried. Mary Ziemba, County Planning and Zoning Administrator, submitted a name for the Board to consider to fill the board member vacancy position on the County Zoning Board of Adjustment. The Board and Ziemba





discussed the current vacant positions of a board member and an alternate board member for the County Zoning Board of Adjustment. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to appoint John Frey, Albion, Nebraska as a board member of the County Zoning Board of Adjustment effective January 16, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county per Nebraska State Statute 47-109. The Board conducted a routine visit of the Boone County Jail per Nebraska State Statute.

A group of approximately 50 concerned citizens returned to attend the Board meeting in regard to the proposed Agricultural and Educational Activities Building for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The majority of the citizens had attended the Board meeting on January 10, 2018. The Board; Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. board members; Agricultural and Educational Activities Building committee members; Steve Pritchard, UNL Extension; and the county citizens in attendance held additional discussion regarding the proposed \$4,250,000.00 building project. Discussion presented was both in favor of the project and opposed to the project.

The meeting started with a discussion in regard to state statutes. The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., a governmental entity in accordance with state statute, is governed under the County Agricultural Society Act, Sections 2-250 to 2-273.

The Board and group discussed the use of the County Inheritance Tax Fund. Some citizens felt that the fund should be used primarily to improve the county roads. The Inheritance Tax Fund has been previously used in the past to help keep the county levy lower. However, the fund has been used to purchase road equipment, county vehicles, renovation of courthouse and law enforcement building's, telephone system, etc. over the years.

The majority of the tax paying citizens in attendance continued to voice that they want to be able to vote on the project and are asking why the citizens are not having the opportunity to vote on the building project. Some of the questions asked were answered, some questions were not answered and some of the questions the building committee could not yet address. Some of the alternative ideas and concerns presented were the same as the January 10, 2018 meeting.

Some of the comments voiced by the group were:

- The project and cost is too large for what is needed at the fairgrounds;
- The Event Center should be paid off before another large project is started;
- The proposed indoor arena area is not cooled or heated, it would not attract use or attendance year round;
- Get back to what needs renovated/replaced, the indoor show arena and small livestock building;
- The proposed facility will be used, but not enough revenue will generate for the payments, employment of a manager, insurance, future maintenance and upkeep, will always be a tax levy;
- No line by line item costs of the building construction or furnishings:
- Building project represents a want, not something that is a need; and
- There is no need to build an office for UNL Extension at the fairgrounds, why can't they use one of the present buildings out there now for their youth meetings.

Commissioner Maricle said that the planning committee proposed a structure with multiple uses and longer term benefits. Maricle said she committed to this project in December and I am not going back on my word. Some of the support expressed for the proposed new facility were the same as the January 10, 2018 meeting:



- The support group plans to seek grants and donations to reduce the tax load for the project;
- Livestock buildings in need of renovation/replacement;
- Indoor show arena too small and dangerous;
- Larger space for the 4-H youth meetings, workshops and to practice archery;
- Larger indoor show arena would allow the youth to work with their horses year round; and
- Look at the building project as economic development with the opportunity to host larger/more events in the area.

Commissioner Luettel said he would suggest that the Agricultural Society and building committee go back to the drawing board and come up with a new proposal. A vote to rescind the resolution that pertained to the capital construction financing of the proposed building project followed more than an hour of additional discussion. The Board action did not rule out a bond issue of the proposed project.

Concerned citizens attended the Board of Commissioners meetings on January 10, 2018 and January 16, 2018 in regard to the proposed Agricultural and Educational Activities Building project for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The public is asking for the opportunity to vote on the large proposed building project. The present proposed building project is \$4,250,000.00 and does not include furnishings or heat/air for the proposed all year-round use indoor show arena. The Board approved Resolution No. 2017-50 dated December 18, 2017 that pertained to the capital construction financing of a proposed Agricultural and Educational Activities Building to be located at the Boone County Fairgrounds. The Board received information that the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., a governmental entity in accordance with state statute, is not authorized under the County Agricultural Society Act, Sections 2-250 to 2-273, to obtain a financial loan. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2018-02, that the governing body, Boone County Board of Commissioners of the County of Boone, Nebraska, hereby rescinds all of Resolution No. 2017-50, pertaining to the financing of a proposed Agricultural and Educational Activities Building to be located at the Boone County Fairgrounds as stated in the resolution and effective January 16, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: Maricle. Motion carried.

A "Notice of Public Hearing Date Change to January 29, 2018" was posted in the Boone County Courthouse and the post office lobbies of Albion, Cedar Rapids, Petersburg and St. Edward.

There was no one present in opposition at the public hearing. The County Board is considering a cropland lease for the 2018, 2019, and 2020 crop years ending December 31, 2020 for approximately 24.68 acres, according to FSA records, of dry cropland located in a fraction of the S1/2NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 20 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, located south of and adjacent to the present Boone County Fairgrounds. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the County Payroll Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General \$96,150.05, BCBS \$52,013.60, Ameritas Ret \$6,674.27, EFTPS \$7,151.81, Section 125 Fees \$10.00, Wellness Program \$88.68; Road \$55,974.07, BCBS \$30,495.80, Ameritas Ret \$3,778.23, EFTPS \$4,211.90; Ambulance \$5,132.40, Ameritas Ret \$161.78, EFTPS \$392.62; and Public Defender Contract \$3,213.60. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings of January 16, 2018 with the above amended sentence as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Nebraska State Auditor's Office has audited several counties in 2016 and 2017. The State Auditor's Office is making County Government aware that the counties are not to be making a vendor payment to another entity without actual supporting documentation. A County must be able to point to a statute that allows a procedure to occur before the county can perform such procedure. Constitution XIII-3 outlines that subdivisions of the State cannot expend public money for private purposes. A non-profit is not a public entity. The County has to restructure the manner in which it distributes funds to other agencies. The County has supported the five public libraries for several years with an annual amount to purchase books/media for the respective libraries. The library support for books/media continued following the closing of the rural mobile libraries (bookmobiles on wheels). The County has no supporting documentation such as a procedure (agreement) in place or copies of invoices showing how the money was spent.

At the December 27, 2017 Board meeting the Board approved a motion that the libraries will be required to submit paid itemized receipts showing the purchase of books/media material for the year 2017 with the





reimbursement support to be in the amount of the itemized receipts and will not exceed the annual support threshold. The Board has been asked to define what will qualify for "media" reimbursement. The Board discussed the request of defining media reimbursement to be Web-based research subscriptions (Ex. EBSCO), magazine/newspaper subscriptions, and academic videos. The consensus of the Board is that this is not an inclusive list and that they will review each reimbursement request.

Robinson plans to research options for heating the Road District #1 Shop building.

Stacey Robinson, County Highway Superintendent, advertised for sealed bids for gravel belly dump semitrailer(s) for the county road department. Robinson and the Board discussed trading in a semi-trailer that was purchased in 2017. A representative was present from Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co. to answer any questions in regard to the company bid and product. Robinson received three sealed bids for new gravel belly dump semi-trailer(s) as follows: Iowa Trailer Manufacturing Co LLC, Storm Lake, IA, ITM-\$53,455.00 with no trade-in allowance; Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co., Grand Island, NE, Ranco - \$54,915.00 with trade-in allowance of \$26,000.00; RDO Truck Centers, Lincoln, NE, R-Way - \$50,012.00 with no trade-in allowance. Jeff Jarecki, Attorney representing Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., contacted Alan Wood, Legal Counsel for Nebraska Association of Fair Managers and presented their opinion in writing in regard to the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. being able to borrow money from a local bank and use budgeted tax levy to repay a loan. Jim Ely, County Attorney, had stated his opinion previously that the Agricultural Society could not borrow money and said he just recently received the information/material from Jarecki and has not had time to review the material or consult with outside resources.

The group discussed the differences of building project alternatives, needs and wants. The group asked who the fairgrounds building committee members were. 2018 ONE AND SIX YEAR ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BOONE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

Ken Luettel, Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Tuesday, February 20, 2018 at 10:00 A.M. in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Boone County Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Luettel, second by Commissioner Maricle to open said public hearing. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Ken Luettel, Hilary K. Maricle and Alan Rasmussen. Stacey L. Robinson, County Highway Superintendent, was present to answer the 2018 Road Improvement Program questions. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public.

The public hearing is for the purpose of hearing testimony in favor of, or opposition to, and to answer questions in relation to the proposed 2018 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The hearing is to remain open for one hour.

Stacey L. Robinson, Boone County Highway Superintendent, presented the 2018 One and Six Year Road Improvement Program for Boone County, Nebraska. The one-year road improvement plan consists of eight projects and the six-year plan consists of six projects. In addition, the one-year projects include three bridge replacements and three micro-surfacing of asphalt roads. The six-year projects include bridge replacements and road reconstruction. The federal and state regulations regarding bridge and road construction project funding is pushing more of the burden onto the county.

Attached hereto as part of the proceedings is a copy of the 2018 proposed projects one-year plan and six-year plan as presented by Boone County Highway Superintendent, Stacey L. Robinson.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, February 26, 2018 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Hilary K. Maricle, Alan Rasmussen and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

The County Safety Committee met at 9:00 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Alan Rasmussen, Ken Luettel and Hilary K. Maricle, Denny Johnson, Laurie Krohn, Rod Nelson, Stacey Robinson and Kathy Thorberg. Nelson reported for Tom Smith, Region 44 Emergency Manager, as he was unable to attend the meeting. Nelson addressed old business: noted the very good participation of county employees for the NIRMA Fire Extinguisher Training and Loss Leader Prevention Training held in December 2017; a fire drill was held in fire safety month of October 2017 with plans to schedule a second fire drill in the Spring; discussed the courtroom scanning system; and the grants received that the departments of Emergency Management, Road and Sheriff applied for in fall of 2017 through the NIRMA ASSIST program for the purchase of safety equipment. New business was discussed: (1) Tom Smith held an emergency action plan presentation in Merrick County and it was decided to have Smith do the presentation for Boone County; (2) Decided to participate in the national/statewide tornado drill the last Wednesday of March at 10:00 A.M.; (3) Smith informed the group that at the NIRMA conference each year an Outstanding Loss Prevention Efforts Award is given to a county for their proactive approach to loss prevention and safety; and (4) The committee discussed preventability and safety suggestions were addressed by the committee regarding a worker's compensation claim. The next safety committee meeting is tentatively scheduled for 9:00 A.M. on Monday, May 14, 2018. The Safety Committee meeting was adjourned by Alan Rasmussen at 9:13 A.M.

The Board heard/reviewed a general assistance utility request at their February 20, 2018 Board meeting. The Board explained the protocol procedure and guidelines regarding general assistance. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the January propane heating bill amount, less the sales tax, payable directly to the entity. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, presented three Contract Change Proposals (CCP) for the Board to review from the contractor for the law enforcement building renovation project. The CCP No. 3 is for \$115.00 for door bumpers





at cell doors to prevent breaking windows; CCP No. 5 is for \$201.00 per TV switch outside of cell; and CCP No. 6R is for \$4,106.00 additional labor/material for scope of work at the west wall of Dormitory Cell #117. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the three Contract Change Proposals (CCP) submitted by RaDec Construction Co., Inc. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, submitted a jail video visitation equipment proposal and two proposals for installation of cable for the video visitation equipment for the Boone County Law Enforcement/Sheriff building for the Board to review. Video visitation for jail inmates replaces in-person contact of regular visits with jail inmates, therefore reduces the possibility of items that may be passed from a visitor to an inmate. The Cidnet Video equipment proposal is \$7,000.00 from Encartele that does not include conduit, cabling or internet connections. Stacey Robinson, County Highway Superintendent, advertised for sealed culvert bids in the Albion News. Robinson informed the Board that no bids were received for culverts. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to authorize Stacey Robinson, County Highway Superintendent, to continue purchasing the culvert(s) size needed for project(s) at the available price and quality on the open market. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tanya Sharp, Boone County Health Center Chief Executive Officer, presented the Boone County Health Center audit report for year ending September 30, 2017 to the Board for their review. Sharp reviewed areas of the financial audit in regard to the statements of net position, revenue, expenses and cash flow with the Board. The audit report shows composition of patient receivables to consist of the following: Medicare – 36%; Medicaid – 8%; Private Pay – 23%; and Other Third-party pay – 33%. Sharp said they are working on strategic planning for a new Albion clinic due to the present clinic was built for a physician staff of five and today they have thirteen physicians in the clinic. Sharp informed the Board that the new Newman Grove clinic is scheduled to open April 1, 2018. Sharp said the health center presently has no long term debt and in year 2017 employed 225 in the health center and clinics. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to accept the Boone County Health Center audit report for year ending September 30, 2017 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board; Jim Ely, County Attorney; Chuck Rolf and Dave Noble, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc.; Jeff Jarecki, Attorney representing Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc.; Steve Pritchard and Jo Weltruski,



UNL Extension; Ed Braun; Mark Jensen; Patricia Neidhardt and LeRoy Schroeder continued the discussion regarding the legal procedure of financing a proposed building project at the county fairgrounds.

Jim Ely, County Attorney, reviewed the materials and statutes and said he still feels that the Agricultural Society has no statutory authority to borrow money and use the capital fund levy for payment of indebtedness. Ely suggested asking the Attorney General's office for an Attorney General's opinion.

Jeff Jarecki, Attorney representing Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., presented his opinion in writing in regard to the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. being able to borrow money from a local bank and use budgeted tax levy to repay a loan at the February 20, 2018 Board meeting. Jarecki discussed that if the disagreement continued a declaratory judgment could be pursued but proposed that it was best to avoid that if possible.

The group discussed the differences of building project alternatives, needs and wants. The discussion continued in length regarding the size of a show arena and the type of material for stalls in barns. Open panels for barn stalls are good for livestock, but not for horses. Rolf said depending on the type/size of a new building at the fairgrounds, an idea would possibly be to keep the current east barn and change the stalls to meet the needs for horses. The public asked if there were any concerns of alcohol being served on the fairgrounds by the Ag Society and if the Ag Society could be held responsible for any injuries or deaths. Jarecki said there is no Dram Shop Law in the state of Nebraska.

The legality of funding a proposed building project has not been confirmed today. A County bond issue for public vote on a proposed building project will need to be submitted by September 1, 2018 to be on the November 6, 2018 General Election ballot.

Commissioner Maricle suggested the Board move forward in discussion of building plan options with architect Ryan D. Stearns, Joseph R. Hewgley & Associates of North Platte, Nebraska. The fairgrounds building committee plans to have a working meeting in early March to decide on how many and type of options to discuss with the architect. Then the later part of March the fairgrounds building committee will plan to meet with the architect to discuss their option plans for the architect to design. Following the preparation of the architect designs the committee will plan to hold a public meeting for input to decide which building plan to present to the Board of Commissioners for consideration. A decision on the type of financing will follow the building plan proposal.

Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, presented a Contract Change Proposal (CCP) for the Board to review from the contractor for the law enforcement building renovation project. The CCP No. 9 is for \$6,795.00 for a desktop turret for two door control and three DPS indication and provide/install wire in empty conduit. The Board and Johnson contacted William R. Huey, III, Prochaska & Associates, by speaker phone to discuss the CCP No. 9. The control system for the cell doors was discussed at length as to why it was not included in the original contract proposals. It appears to be a communication breakdown between the companies involved in the renovation project and was overlooked during planning. Following the lengthy discussion the Board decided to allow additional time for Johnson to make some local contacts in regard to the installation of wire for the CCP No. 9 renovation change request. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table the Contract Change Proposal (CCP) No. 9 decision to the March 19, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tobin Buchanan, First National Capital Markets of Kearney, Nebraska introduced their bank services to the Board. Buchanan provided information in regard to different types of bonds, lease purchase programs, tax exempt direct loans and general obligation. Buchanan answered questions from the Board and those present at the meeting.

In August of 2012 the Boone County Board of Commissioners appointed Jeff Jarecki, Public Defender, for Boone County. Jarecki reported that the cases assigned in 2012 through 2016 are all completed. Jarecki presented a report to the Board regarding the status of the forty-nine court cases he was assigned to in 2017, with nineteen of the cases remaining open. Jarecki explained that twelve of the nineteen cases remaining open from 2017 are juvenile cases. Jarecki explained to the Board that some juvenile cases take a long time to complete. Juvenile cases may remain open until the court case is resolved or the age of nineteen. Jarecki reported that he has been assigned fourteen cases to date for 2018. Jarecki said that three of the 2018 cases are closed and that he had one conflict of interest to date in 2018. Jarecki answered the Board's questions regarding conflict of interest and closed/open cases. Jarecki explained that there are times when he cannot defend the assigned case since he is already defending one of the parties involved. The Board thanked Jarecki for the updated report and his diligent services. Jarecki thanked the Board and is very appreciative of the contract for





public defender services. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to accept the Boone County Public Defender report as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County of Boone and the City of Albion Police Department has had an Interlocal Agreement for several years with regard to a one-mile radius jurisdiction of the city limits of the City of Albion. It is a joint jurisdiction of the two law enforcement agencies for the one-mile radius outside the City of Albion. This agreement is reviewed on an annual basis. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign Resolution No. 2018-07 an Interlocal Agreement between the County of Boone and City of Albion for law enforcement purposes commencing on April 1, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County of Boone, Nebraska owns and operates the Boone County Ambulance Service. The County Ambulance unit is being housed at the Albion Fire Station building. The City of Albion shall pay for all costs of utilities and maintenance to the building and all costs to provide oxygen gas supply to the Boone County Ambulance. The County shall pay to the City of Albion \$300.00 per quarter for rental space for the Boone County Ambulance unit. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign Resolution No. 2018-08 an Interlocal Agreement between the County of Boone and City of Albion for rental space for the Boone County Ambulance unit as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Andy Devine and Darren Wright, City of Albion representatives, Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., and the Board, discussed water and well testing on County owned property south of the present fairgrounds (formerly known as the Kohtz property). There is a water well located beside a hydrant on the County owned property being a tract of land comprising a part of the NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 20 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska. Devine asked the Board for permission to test the existing well on said property. Devine said that the findings would be shared with the County. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve/allow the City of Albion access to test the existing water/well on said County property. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

An updated Interlocal Agreement/resolution was submitted in regard to an agreement dated February 16, 1961 between the City of Albion (City) and County of Boone, Nebraska (County). The 1961 agreement referred to the drilling of a well and installed adequate pumping facilities upon the land that the County owned, presently known as the county fairgrounds. There is a 1978 Lease Agreement between the County of Boone and Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. for the County owned property known as the fairgrounds. In 1961 the City agreed to furnish free water to the fairgrounds for reasonable and normal functions and the County agreed to grant a permanent easement to the property for the city water wells (Well #2 and Well #3) as long as the same existed as a well. Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator, explained that Well #2 has been decommissioned and capped and the Well #3 on the fairgrounds property is considered moderate emergency status and cannot be used by itself. The City of Albion's new water Well #4 is located southeast of the County owned property. Devine said that the City may be considering a transmission line from Well #4 in order to combine the sources of the new generator and well house to the Well #3. In addition, within the resolution the City is asking the County for permission to access the County property (formerly Kohtz property) to test and possibly develop a municipal Well #5 site.

Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., expressed his concerns of paragraph four of the revised resolution where it refers to the County transferring ownership of the site of the existing wells and associated





ingress and egress easements located upon Lots 2, 3, and 4 and those portions of Fairview, South, Park View and 11th Streets, Fairgrounds 1st Subdivision to the City of Albion. Rolf also expressed concerns of paragraph six of the revised resolution where it referred to the City for any reason, fails to develop a municipal well upon the site, or abandons and decommissions any and all wells developed upon same site, water service to the fairgrounds will be charged based on the City utilities rate schedule as established annually. Rolf said that the language in the revised resolution needs to guarantee continued free water for the fairgrounds (Ag Society) in the event that there is no city water well on county property.

Rolf and Commissioner Maricle felt that free water for the fairgrounds (Ag Society) should be locked in with an exchange for the Lots 2, 3 and 4, Fairgrounds 1st Subdivision, City of Albion, Boone County, Nebraska in the event that there is no city well on county property in the future. In addition, Rolf and Maricle would like the City to build a restroom facility on Lot 4 for use during the seasonal events, but it would not be a facility opened all year round. In addition, Rolf was wanting the City to provide electrical only hookups for three to five camper sights to the west of Lot 3 in order for the Ag Society to control some camper hookups and guarantee vendors a place for their campers during fair week. The City has plans to develop more camper sites on Lot 4 and Lot 3 if the area is feasible. There was a suggestion that possible electrical only hookups could be placed on Lot 3 and the City would hold rental position on them during fair week for the fair vendors.

Devine said that the City will try to make revisions to paragraphs four and six to better reflect the water situation. The County and City goal is to reach a mutual beneficial arrangement for all parties, liability protection for both the County and City and work together for the betterment of the tax payers. The survey and annexation plat of the Fairgrounds 1st Subdivision preparation/intention is to clarify/straighten out the property lines, ownership and areas of responsibility between the governmental entities. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table Resolution No. 2018-09, Interlocal Agreement with the City of Albion regarding municipal well test sites and free water for the fairgrounds to the March 19, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel, Alan Rasmussen and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the County Board Proceedings of April 9, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the Contract Change Proposal, CCP No. 11.2 in regard to the law enforcement building renovation project. The CCP No. 11.2 is for additional time and electrical material costs due to unforeseen circumstances of conduit and wire ran into the walls. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the CCP No. 11.2 submitted by RaDec Construction Co., Inc. for \$432.00 for additional time and electrical material costs as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

It shall also be the duty of the County Board of each county of this state to visit the jail of its county per Nebraska State Statute 47-109. The Board conducted a routine visit of the Boone County Jail per Nebraska State Statute.

The Boone County Ambulance Service submitted two uncollectible ambulance accounts for the Board to review as all methods of collection have been exhausted. The recommendation from the Boone County Ambulance Service liaison is to remove the \$1,245.00 for a July 16, 2017 ambulance service and the balance of \$256.65 for an August 19, 2017 ambulance service from the EMS Billing Services account for purposes of bookkeeping and turn the two accounts over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to turn the July 2017 County Ambulance Service account balance of \$1,245.00 and the August 2017 County Ambulance Service account balance of \$256.65 over to the County Attorney for further collection. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Will McInnis and Caitlin Schneider, East-Central District Health Department (ECDHD), presented a report of public health activities in Boone County for July 2017 through March 2018. ECDHD has provided a number of different services to the residents of Boone County. Some of the services provided were: Alcohol Literacy Challenge at St. Michael's School; the WIC program; disease investigations; Mass Casualty training in St. Edward: and conducted store audits at all tobacco retailers in Boone County. Schneider said that ECDHD encourages county residents to pick up a radon kit to test their home. Schneider said that Certified Application Counselors (CAC's) are available at the Boone County Health Center usually on Thursday's to assist county residents in applying for WIC programs, health care services and/or insurance.

In addition, Boone County citizens are encouraged to attend the Boone County Health Center and ECDHD presentation of the results of the service area's comprehensive Community Health Needs Assessment to the community on May 3, 2018, from 8:30 a.m. to noon at the Boone County Health Center.





The Board heard public constituents concerns regarding the asphalt portion of a county road known as 145th Street west of Petersburg on several occasions and on August 21, 2017 the Board approved an engineer study to be completed to determine costs and options for permanent repairs for the asphalt portion of 145th Street. The group said that 145th Street west of Petersburg is a main route for areas west and northwest of Petersburg and for the Volunteer Fire Department/Rescue Squad. The first mile of asphalt that is mostly in Petersburg village limits is in good condition with a thicker base and the remaining length of asphalt is what is in need of good repair.

Thiele Geotech, Inc. has completed an engineering evaluation of said portion of 145th Street. They provide analysis for subsurface soil, foundation, slope stability, seepage, settlement and other geotechnical engineering related items. Brian McDonald, Engineer with JEO Consulting Group, Inc., presented to the Board information regarding a study of Project C-6 (394), Petersburg west, a portion of a county road known as 145th Street. McDonald submitted information of the road foundation/soil study prepared by Thiele Geotech for the Board to review. McDonald presented five different costs and overlay scenarios for the approximate four miles of asphalt west of Petersburg on 145th Street. The East portion is 9,700 feet and the West portion 11,600 feet in regard to the five construction scenarios that range from: (1) east- mill 1" and overlay with 2" asphalt, westcomplete reconstruction with 8" asphalt pavement for approximately \$2,177,431.00; (2) east-mill 1" and overlay with 6" asphalt, west-complete reconstruction with 8" asphalt pavement for approximately \$2,592,548.00; (3) east-complete reconstruction with 8" asphalt pavement, west-complete reconstruction with 8" asphalt pavement for approximately \$3,083,398.00; (4) east-mill 1" and 6" concrete overlay, west-complete reconstruction with 8" concrete pavement for approximately \$2,772,481.00; and (5) east-complete reconstruction with 8" concrete pavement, west-complete reconstruction with 8" concrete pavement for approximately \$3,624,130.00. The estimated figures do not include upgrading the bridge, surveying costs and for the possible purchase of more right-of-way, as the west two miles would need to be brought up to standards for 55 mph. McDonald said that usually concrete will be good for 20-30 years with maybe some crack sealant now and then. Asphalt is known for 10-15 years depending on weight of traffic with overlay in warped areas more often. McDonald said that if concrete pavement is used the preference for the project is to let bids in November/December and lay the concrete pavement in the spring. Commissioner Maricle questioned the justification of the expense to upgrade said portion of four miles of road by Petersburg in comparison to other county roads within the county that may need upgrading. Commissioner Luettel emphasized that the 145th Street, when in good driving condition, is an arterial road to Petersburg from the north and west and used as a main route for fire and rescue squads.

Surveys have been completed for the current County owned properties known as the Boone County Fairgrounds and the County owned cropland. The present east fence line on the fairgrounds property appears that it needs to be moved back a few feet to the east in order to be located on the boundary lines. The Board discussed if they need to put in a new fence line or just remove the present fence line. Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., was present for the discussion due to the Ag Society's leasing the current fairgrounds property. Rolf suggested that if the fence is replaced in the boundary line location to use smooth wire instead of barb wire for safety reasons. The Recreational Trails System committee plans to walk a proposed route on Tuesday, April 17, 2018 to determine the placement of the proposed concrete trail. The County Surveyor, upon request, has offered to flag the stakes/boundary lines with a Board member present to determine if all of the east fence line needs moving or just the fairgrounds portion of the east fence line and if the south fence line/trees are on the County or adjacent land owner. No decision was made by the Board at the meeting.

Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding when the county road department may begin the four ten hour work days. The county road department plans to lease a smaller excavator for cleaning culverts/ditches to see how it works before purchasing a different excavator.



Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the Board requesting the County Board to appoint Stacey L. (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, to complete a feasibility study. The Boone County Board of Commissioners deemed it may be in the best interest of Boone County to consider vacating a portion of 310th Street. The proposed portion of a county road known as 310th Street, commencing at the intersection of 310th Street and 110th Avenue, in the N1/2 of Section 19 and the S1/2 of Section 18, all in Township 19 North, Range 8 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, running thence west one (1) mile. The said portion of county road is located west and south of Primrose, Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-14, appointing Stacey L. (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, to do a feasibility study regarding the vacation of a portion of county road known as 310th Street. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to go into executive session at 11:11 A.M., per the Open Meeting Act §84-1410, for the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual and if such individual has not requested a public meeting. The blizzard and wind caused severe damage to public and private property, disruption of utility service and endangerment of health and safety of the citizens of Boone County within the disaster area. The Public Power District costs are initially estimated at \$169,514.00 for Boone County. The County files a proclamation with the State of Nebraska; the State files a proclamation with the Federal (FEMA); and the Federal decides if funding is available for the said proclamation. The Boone County Board of Commissioners Chairman, Ken Luettel, has declared a state of emergency authorized under Nebraska State Statute §81-829.50 and signed a Local Disaster Declaration on behalf of Boone County for the April 2018 blizzard and wind damages.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of April 25, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Board, County Highway Superintendent, Andy Zoucha, Don Casper, Chad McGown and Rick Martinsen discussed the asphalt portion(s) of county road that is/are getting soft spots and breaking up. The group said that they were at the Board meeting today to make the County aware of the need to repair area(s) of the asphalt portion(s) of the road that is/are breaking up and the need for future plans for repair since they did not see any on the County One and Six Year Road Improvement Program. Some of the asphalt road areas of concern are known as a portion of 260th Street, Fairgrounds Road, Fairway Lane, Hill View Drive, Country Club Road and Highland Road. The Board and County Highway Superintendent indicated that there would be consideration of their concerns in regard to portions of the asphalt road(s) in need of repair to be listed as project(s) on the County 2019 One & Six Year Road Improvement Program. The consulting group plan and indirect cost rates as computed would be all inclusive for claiming indirect costs for all County grants including Title IV-D Claiming. The County Attorney's office has received several uncollectible ambulance accounts where the Board approves to remove the uncollectible amounts from the EMS Billing Services account for purposes of bookkeeping and turn the accounts over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection.

A 5-acre minimum for any parcel split which shall require a Conditional Use Permit including the right-of-way with three (3) or four (4) straight lines; only exception is a naturally occurring boundaries (river, creek and highway not included); and the residential density shall not exceed five (5) houses per section.

Some of the issues discussed related to the livestock setbacks, cleaning up the verbiage by taking out the written explanations and converting them to a chart/grid format, various scenarios regarding conditional use permits, the lifting of the current moratorium relating to conditional use permits and making Boone County competitive with its neighboring counties with regard to livestock operations.

The District Five Probation's fifty staff members served 2492 clients in 2017, four district court judges, five county/juvenile court judges and worked with Regions 3, 4 & 5 for Behavioral Health services. Rodriguez informed the Board that District Five Probation served thirty-one adults and fifteen juveniles for Boone County in 2017. Due to the decreased number of clients served in the county, Rodriguez indicated that the probation budget for Boone County would be reduced by approximately \$1,201.00 from \$8,496.00 to \$7,295.00. The budget has been submitted for approval to the Platte County Commissioners as the principal county for the district. Rodriguez explained some of the programs provided by the district and indicated that they have been advocating using Northeast Nebraska Juvenile Services, Inc. for detention purposes.

Discussed a maximum amount for possible real estate purchase.

BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS JULY 16, 2018 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, July 16, 2018 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel, Hilary K. Maricle and Alan Rasmussen. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

A group of approximately forty concerned citizens attended the Board meeting in regard to a proposed new building project at the county fairgrounds. Chuck Rolf (Rolf), representing the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., presented a written letter from the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. (Agricultural Society) and design/construction documents prepared by Ryan D. Sterns, Architect with Joseph R. Hewgley & Associates, Inc. of North Platte, Nebraska for the Board to review. The new building facility proposal is 54,295 square feet, with a building of approximately 150' x 300' for arena area, small and large livestock pen areas, small and large livestock wash areas, etc. and a building of approximately 150' x 75' for restrooms, concession and storage areas, classroom, and extension office. Rolf presented and read a written statement supporting a new facility at the fairgrounds.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to accept the new fairgrounds building proposal less the office space area. During some discussion Ryan D. Sterns, Architect, said that the estimated cost difference of the project would just be \$100,000.00 less by removing the extension office space, storage and classroom. Following further discussion a motion was made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to withdraw the above motion. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to accept the new fairgrounds building proposal submitted by the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Upon the acceptance of the new county fairgrounds building proposal as presented, the group discussed the financing of said building project. The County owns the real estate and leases to the Agricultural Society. If the Agricultural Society owned or was purchasing real estate they could possibly apply for a mortgage per Nebraska State Statute Chapter 2, 250-273, The County Agricultural Society Act. The Agricultural Society has no statute authority to issue bonds for indebtedness. The County cannot borrow funds for indebtedness, except through bonds. Bill Robinson, building committee member, presented scenarios of annual payments with various interest rates for bonds/mortgage loans. The Architect fee of approximately \$210,000.00 and the Agricultural Society attorney fees of \$4,800.00 have been approved to be paid from the Boone County Inheritance Tax Fund. The three million dollar project does not include the cost of the office, classroom, storage, concession area furnishings, or the livestock panels/arena bleachers in the new fairgrounds building proposal.





Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve one million dollars from the Boone County Inheritance Tax Fund and a County Bond Election issue on the 2018 General Election ballot for two million dollars for the proposed new fairgrounds three million dollar building structure of 54,295 square feet that includes arena; small and large livestock pen areas; small and large livestock wash areas; radiant heat; plumbing; electrical; fire system; all utilities infrastructure needed for building construction; dirt work/foundation; restrooms; concession and storage areas; classroom and extension office space. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Upon the acceptance of the written proposal and County Bond Election for a portion of the new fairgrounds building proposal, the county needs to work with a bond counsel and underwriter to prepare the necessary documents for a bond election. Andy Forney, D. A. Davidson & Co., had been working with the architect firm of Joseph R. Hewgley & Associates, Inc. of North Platte, Nebraska who the Agricultural Society had been working with from the beginning of their fairgrounds building proposal. The Boone County Board of Commissioners decided to retain the architect firm that the Agricultural Society had been working with at their February 20, 2018 Board meeting. The County Purchasing Act provides the Board with the option that competitive bidding is not required when obtaining professional services. Michael Rogers with Gilmore & Bell, P.C., has been retained as bond counsel upon recommendation and endorsement from Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO).

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle directing the Boone County Clerk to work with Gilmore & Bell, P. C., as the County's bond counsel and D. A. Davidson & Co., as underwriter, to prepare the necessary resolution to call a County Bond Election for two million dollars to be held at the 2018 General Election on November 6, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. requested and received bids in regard to the construction of a new county fairgrounds building project and opened the bids on June 29, 2018. Rolf presented the six bids that were received: Rathman Manning Construction of Chapman, NE - \$2,966,035.00; Bierman Contracting, Inc. of Columbus, NE - \$2,997,300.00; RaDec Construction Co. of Hartington, NE - \$3,218,800.00; Chief Construction Co. of Grand Island, NE - \$3,496,000.00; Rogge General Contractors, Inc. of Lincoln, NE - \$3,728,000.00; and B-D Construction, Inc. of Columbus, NE - \$4,329,260.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen, dependent upon the passing of the Bond issue on November 6, 2018 General Election, accept the bid of Rathman Manning Construction of Chapman, NE of \$2,966,035.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board advertised for sealed bids for a Wheel Excavator for the county road department. A lengthy discussion in regard to the agenda item number thirteen was held with concerned county citizens at today's meeting. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table the Engagement Letter with D.A. Davidson & Co. to the August 20, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The Board reviewed Resolution No. 2018-28, prepared by Gilmore & Bell, P.C., calling an election on November 6, 2018 for the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of the County in the amount of two million dollars for a new building at the fairgrounds. A lengthy discussion in regard to the agenda item number thirteen was held with concerned county citizens at today's meeting. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table the resolution calling an election on November 6, 2018 for the issuance of General Obligation Bonds in the amount of two million dollars for a new building at the fairgrounds to the August 20, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Delmer Pelster, Shelley Lueken and Todd Flinn were present to request a Board approval of a Special Designated License (SDL) for an event scheduled to be held at the Boone County Fairgrounds on September 2, 2018. Delmer Pelster and Shelley Lueken, were representatives for the Boone County Ag Society, Inc. DBA Boone County Raceway liquor license. Todd Flinn had asked the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. for permission to hold a concert on September 2, 2018, Chancey Williams and the Younger Brothers Band, at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Pelster indicated that the SDL request would be for the Boone County Raceway license. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to table a decision to a future Board meeting, dependent upon the submission of the Application for Special Designated License for the Board to review and sign. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Edmond Knott, Applied Connective Technologies LLC, and the Board discussed the Agreements that the County of Boone has regarding IT related needs for the county equipment, Managed Firewall/Cyber Security Services, Qualys Vulnerability Assessment Service, Webroot Endpoint Protection, Ninja RMM and TeamViewer Enterprise protection for the county owned computers.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the Managed Service Agreement between the Boone County Courthouse and Applied Connective Technologies, LLC for 110 service hours for \$13,200.00 for the fiscal year 2018-2019 to be billed and paid in monthly payments for only County owned equipment as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the Software As A Service (SaaS) Agreement between Boone County Courthouse and Applied Connective Technologies, LLC for Managed Firewall, Cyber Security, Qualys Vulnerability Assessment, Webroot Endpoint, Ninja RMM, and TeamViewer for \$3,300.00, for the fiscal year 2018-2019 to be billed and paid in monthly payments for only County owned equipment as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board opened three sealed bids on July 16, 2018 for a Wheel Excavator for the county road department. The County Highway Superintendent and the Board reviewed the bids. The County Highway Superintendent made a recommendation to the Board after reviewing the specifications and completed comparisons between the three company bids. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the Nebraska Machinery Company (NMC) CAT of \$240,500.00 for Model M318F with a five year/5,000 hour warranty as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.





The Board, Mary Ziemba, Zoning Administrator, Dan Preister and Tim Preister discussed the regulations and requirements regarding county road services to a residential dwelling. Dan Preister would like to build a new residential home on 260th Street of which 6/10 of a mile of county road is currently classified as minimum maintenance. Ziemba explained the county zoning regulations in regard to building a residential dwelling on land that would be accessed off of a minimum maintenance county road. The Board explained that the Nebraska Department of Roads regulations require involvement of a licensed engineer to provide hydraulic/hydrology studies before a decision can be made to reclassify a minimum maintenance road to a local county road. Ziemba said as it stands today the burden of the cost to upgrade a county road from minimum maintenance to local, is on the individual who wants to build on land off of a classified minimum maintenance road, and said road upgrade needs to meet the Nebraska Department of Roads standards. The consensus of the Board is to have the County Highway Superintendent contact an engineer for a cost estimate for engineering services and for upgrading the county road from minimum maintenance to local. The County Highway Superintendent plans to contact Dan Preister with the cost estimates.

The Board; Tim Cornwell, Chairman Nance County Board of Supervisors; Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff; Ben Bakewell, Nance County Sheriff; and Steve Schwarz, Nance County Chief Deputy Sheriff, discussed the possibility of merging the Boone and Nance County 911 Communications dispatching services. A regional dispatch center was discussed and a study completed in 2017 for Boone, Nance and Merrick Counties. Boone County decided not to proceed with a regional dispatch center. Since that decision Merrick County has entered an agreement with Hamilton County and Nance County is not currently fully staffed for dispatching services with the deputy sheriff's helping dispatch. A merger between Boone and Nance would move all 911 Communications dispatching services to Boone County. Boone County has been talking about upgrading the radio counsel system and Johnson said there is a possibility that the State of Nebraska may put a state wide radio on the County Communications Tower. Bakewell said that Nance County is already on the state radio system. Sheriff Johnson said that Boone County would possibly need to hire an additional two full time and one part time employee for the 911 Communications and Law Enforcement staff. Nance County does not have a jail facility and is requesting the use of Boone County's jail facility as part of the agreement, as they would like to have a centralized place to house inmates. Johnson felt that Nance County should help pay for a portion of the new radio counsels and cover the cost of two additional employees. No details have been worked out in regard to an agreement with Nance County and their portion of the monthly expenses. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to authorize Denny Johnson, Sheriff, to contact Stacen Gross, consultant for communication mergers, to prepare recommendations for a Boone/Nance 911 Communications dispatching services. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and approximately twenty-four county residents discussed the agenda item number thirteen. A request from the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. asking the Board to rescind their July 16, 2018 decision of a Bond Election for construction of a new fairgrounds building and in the alternative take action to fund the project directly, due to significant donor commitments. Members of the new fairgrounds building project said that they received a significant commitment of \$85,000.00 per year for ten years for a total of \$850,000.00 towards the building project, if the Board would rescind the November Bond Election. In further discussion, it was said that the \$850,000.00 is a match commitment over ten years. In addition, it was mentioned that the donor commitment to date figure is approximately \$950,000.00 over a ten year period, provided only if the project does not go before the vote of the people.

In addition, the discussion addressed that there is a difference between pledge/commitment/donation for a project. A donation is cash in hand and that there is no guarantee that each of the next ten years that the pledge/commitment will actually be received and used towards payment of the building.



The group discussion included trying to find other types of financing procedures for the building project with the use of the ten year pledge/commitments. The group was informed that the County of Boone, governmental entity, cannot borrow funds except by bonding. The Agricultural Society has no statute authority to borrow funds by bonding. The fairgrounds real estate was deeded to the County in March of 1944 due to mortgage foreclosure. The Agricultural Society does not own the real estate in order to secure a loan. Richard Martinsen, CPA, Schmeits, Mueller & Martinsen, P. C., prepared the annual county budget and submitted a preliminary 2018-2019 budget for the Board to review. The Board and Martinsen discussed the preliminary 2018-2019 budget requests submitted by the county departments. The Inheritance Tax Fund has been used for several years to reduce the county's property tax request, resulting in a low levy. A fairgrounds building fund for possible expenses and revenue has been added to the county budget due to the ongoing discussion of the possibility of a new building to be located on the fairgrounds. If the budget for bonds for new building construction is not used there is not a problem. If there is no budget set up within the 2018-2019 County Budget when approved at the budget hearing and a building project is decided after the adoption of the fiscal year budget, the County would have to follow statutorily procedure to amend the adopted budget. The Board asked the Highway Superintendent to obtain cost estimates for different heat options, such as propane force air or radiant heat, before deciding on the type of heating unit to install in the shop building.
- The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed a complaint received about crops planted in the county road right-of-way. It was suggested to go in and shred the crops that are in the line of sight at road intersections for safety reasons. The planting of crops on county road right-of-way has been discussed many times over the years. Nebraska Statewide Radio System (SRS) on the new County Communications Tower located on the Boone County Fairgrounds. There is some spotty coverage in Boone County that the state has been discussing. SRS is a digitally encrypted system that allows cross-communication between agencies and improves radio coverage throughout rural counties.

The State of Nebraska is funding a site addition to the SRS to boost radio coverage in the area. This coverage addition would benefit the State Patrol, State Fire Marshall, Nance County, Boone County and other public safety agencies in the area. The state outlined a plan to install the state equipment, clean off old antennas and lines, install new antennas and lines, license new frequencies and reprogram local radios. The state has offered to assist with the costs of maintaining the county tower and generators as part of the SRS maintenance. The State of Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) will coordinate and manage the project. The OCIO is statutorily responsible for the communications systems and technology solutions for State agencies, including the management of the SRS that is used by public utilities and public safety agencies/entities, including emergency and medical services, law enforcement services, fire management services and disaster relief services.

Nance County Sheriff said his agency recently converted to SRS and it has been a great benefit so far. Boone County does not currently participate in the Nebraska Statewide Radio System. The approximate cost of converting Boone County law enforcement and emergency vehicles to the SRS system is \$240,000.00, plus monthly costs per radio. Epley explained some of the equipment that would be used for SRS. The consensus of the Board is to allow Denny Johnson, Sheriff, to move forward with discussion of the SRS project.

Delmer Pelster for the Boone County Ag Society, Inc. DBA Boone County Raceway presented an application for a Special Designated License (SDL) for September 2, 2018. Gross presented the variations of estimated costs amounts for each county which is dependent upon the 911 Funds available for purchase of new equipment in accordance with Nebraska State Statutes. The present Nebraska State Statutes regulate what services qualify to be paid and what new equipment/upgraded equipment can be purchased from the 911 Land Line, 911 Wireless, or 911 Holding Funds.

Gross informed the Boards that Boone and Nance County Sheriff's offices have been considering the purchase of Justice Data Solution (JDS), Records Management Software (RMS) and Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) software as an add-on to the existing Jail Management software each agency uses today. In order to effectively share records and data between agencies and provide metrics and statistics on dispatch activity, the counties should jointly implement this technology with some costs share to reflect that portion of the system that will actually be used by each county. Wireless reserve funds can be used to pay for the "CAD and data conversion services" portion of the JDS quote. Similar to the RMS and CAD software, both agencies have been contemplating the purchase of the web-accessible GeoComm mapping system that would allow Nance County to access the mapping system remotely from their office to see the locations of 9-1-1 calls and CAD incidents in their county which are being dispatched by Boone County. This system would replace the existing Emergency Call Works map.

Gross informed the Boards that there is the possibility of changes in the future as the State of Nebraska (State) looks for reduction costs and moves for consolidation of regional dispatch services, currently Boone County is a member of the EC911 East-Central Region. In addition, the State may start charging maintenance fees for the NRIN equipment and in the future the State may reconsider changing the 911 Funds payments of services and equipment regulations. The estimated cost for new radio console, software and communications equipment, etc. is \$360,000.00 and annual recurring costs of \$7,325.00 for Boone County. The estimated figures do not include the new radio equipment for the law enforcement vehicles. Gross informed the Boards that upon a merger Boone County would receive about half of the amount of the 911 Wireless Service Funds that Nance County presently receives from the Public Service Commission. Both the County Boards' and County Sheriffs' plan to review the information provided and further discuss what would be beneficial for both counties. The Boards' and Sheriffs' plan to meet again at a later date.

Michelle Olson, BCDA, Inc. Executive Director and BCDA, Inc. Executive Committee representatives Irene Dresch, Primrose, and Danielle O'Brien, AEDC, appeared before the Board regarding the Membership Agreement and Disbursement Agreement for fiscal year 2018-2019. Olson presented and reviewed a report with the Board in regard to the economic development group activities and an overview of available resources to help business. The County of Boone, Nebraska financial contribution for 2017-2018 was \$105,784.80. The financial request from BCDA, Inc. for 2018-2019 is \$109,000.00. The BCDA, Inc. 2017-2018 budget was \$149,675.00 and the 2018-2019 budget request is \$154,050.00. The Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts recent BCDA, Inc. audit report was discussed. The BCDA, Inc. representatives informed the Board that steps are being taken to adhere to the auditor's suggestions and are implementing operational compliance and transparent procedures.





Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Membership Agreement for fiscal year 2018-2019 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Disbursement Agreement for fiscal year 2018-2019 committing a sum of \$109,000.00 payable to BCDA, Inc. from the County Inheritance Tax Fund payable in two payments as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A group of approximately thirty concerned citizens attended the Board meeting in regard to a continued discussion of a proposed new building project at the county fairgrounds. On July 16, 2018 the Board approved one million dollars from the Boone County Inheritance Tax Fund and a County Bond Election issue on the 2018 General Election ballot for two million dollars for the proposed new fairgrounds three million dollar building structure of 54,295 square feet that includes arena; small and large livestock pen areas; small and large livestock wash areas; radiant heat; plumbing; electrical; fire system; all utilities infrastructure needed for building construction; dirt work/foundation; restrooms; concession and storage areas; classroom and extension office space.

A request from the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. asking the Board to rescind their July 16, 2018 decision of a Bond Election for construction of a new fairgrounds building and instead take action to fund the project directly due to significant donor commitments was discussed at length on July 25, 2018 with no action taken by the Board. At the Board meeting today, August 20, 2018, Kevin Rasmussen said that to date the donor commitment figure is approximately \$1,635,000.00. Members of the new fairgrounds building project said that of the \$1,635,000.00, \$850,000.00 being a significant match commitment of \$85,000.00 per year for a ten year period, which is pledged with the condition of the Board rescinding their motion for a November Bond Election, and \$785,000.00 being pledged commitments payable from one to ten year periods. Kevin Rasmussen said that he is confident that the group can raise pledges/commitments for the rest of the two million for the building project and for the furnishings that are not included in the building project construction bids. Jeff Jarecki, Attorney for the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. and Kevin Rasmussen said that upon approval of a said 501(c)(3) entity, they will be able to apply for grants to help pay for the construction of the building project and the furnishings for the building that were not included in the three million dollar construction quotes. The Board of Commissioners originally committed \$1.3 million of the County Inheritance Tax Fund towards the building project. To date \$172,284.00 of the \$1.3 million has been used to pay architect and attorney fees. A three million dollar building project is not all for the construction, but includes payments for all of the regulatory permits, attorney and architect fees, etc.

In addition, the discussion addressed that there is a difference between a pledge, commitment, and donation for funding of a project. A donation is cash in hand and with a pledge/commitment there is no guarantee that each of the next ten years that the pledge/commitment will actually be received and used towards payment of the building project. James Ely, County Attorney, cautioned that the pledge agreements for said building project must be in writing and signed by the donor to assure the payments for ten years of the County issued Limited Tax Building Bonds. The Board and the building group said that the individuals that pledged/committed will be signing agreements for payment(s) of said building project. County issued Limited Tax Building Bonds are bonds approved by the Board of Commissioners, not bonds approved by voters at an election. Therefore, \$1.3 million dollars of the County Inheritance Tax Fund is the tax payer's portion of the building project, of which \$172,284.00 has already been used, and the \$1.7 million dollars funded with commitments/donations provides for a three million dollar building project. Any expenses beyond the three million dollar building project will need to come from fundraising/donations, not from the County or a tax levy assessed upon the tax payers.



Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to rescind the Board of Commissioners motion of July 16, 2018 for a County Bond Election issue on the 2018 General Election ballot for two million dollars for the proposed new fairgrounds three million dollar building structure. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the Agricultural and Educational Activities Building project at the Boone County Fairgrounds and engage bonding attorney Michael Rogers, Gilmore & Bell, P.C.; underwriter/placement agent Andrew Forney, D.A. Davidson & Co.; Boone County Attorney, James W. Ely, Jr.; and Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. attorney, Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Yosten Maul, P.C., to assist in the alternative financing plan subject to approval of the Board of Commissioners' parameters. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board tabled Resolution No. 2018-28, prepared by Gilmore & Bell, P.C., calling for a Bond Election at the General Election on November 6, 2018 for the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of the County in the amount of two million dollars for a new building at the fairgrounds on July 25, 2018. The resolution was tabled and never approved or signed. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to not proceed with the resolution calling for a General Obligation Bond Election on November 6, 2018 and authorize the County Clerk to use the Resolution No. 2018-28 for the next resolution document. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At the Board meeting held on July 25, 2018, the Board tabled the Engagement Letter with D.A. Davidson & Co., as underwriter, in connection with the issuance of General Obligation Bonds for a Bond Election at the November 6, 2018 General Election dependent upon the passing of the Bond Election. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to not proceed with the Engagement Letter with D.A. Davidson & Co. as underwriter for General Obligation Bond, Series 2018, but approve Andrew Forney, D.A. Davidson & Co., as an underwriter/placement agent to help prepare the documents to fund the fairgrounds building project with County issued Limited Tax Building Bonds. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, August 27, 2018 in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Hilary K. Maricle, Alan Rasmussen and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the County Payroll Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General \$93,245.62, BCBS \$55,399.52, Ameritas Ret \$6,452.70, EFTPS \$6,930.26, Section 125 Fees \$10.00, Wellness Program \$106.61; Road \$55,474.29, BCBS \$28,765.04, Ameritas Ret \$3,744.52, EFTPS \$4,181.27; Ambulance \$2,835.13, Ameritas Ret \$62.99, EFTPS \$216.89; and Public Defender Contract \$3,213.60. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve the County Board Proceedings of August 20, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Richard Martinsen, CPA, Schmeits, Mueller & Martinsen, P. C., met with the Board to discuss the proposed fiscal year 2018-2019 County Budget. The proposed property tax request is \$3,679,011.00, which is an increase from the 2017-2018 property tax request of \$3,606,824.00. The proposed 2018 county tax rate is 0.153638, which is different from the 2017 county tax rate of 0.150708. Martinsen provided answers to questions asked with regard to the proposed budget. Nebraska Legislation changes are as follows: eliminates delinquent tax allowance unless Federal Prime Rate is Above 10%; eliminates budgeting for anticipated litigation claims; supermajority Board approval is not needed for 1% increase to restricted funds authority, only Board approval; listing of capital improvement projects and the corresponding amount being used as lid exemption; and Highway Allocation is no longer a restricted fund and no additional calculation is needed this year. The Interlocal Agreement Report (LB 51) (2017) is to be filed with the State Auditor's office on or before September 20th and impacts the county budget hearing, audits and contracts. The overall County taxable value increased \$1,339,086.00 primarily due to the re-valuations of the Commercial and Commercial Hog Confinement properties. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to set the County of Boone, Nebraska budget hearing for 10:00 A.M. on Monday, September 17, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

On or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority shall submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board. The preliminary request shall be in the form of a resolution. The Nebraska State Statutes provides that each County Board shall adopt a resolution which determines a final allocation of levy authority and forward a copy of such resolution to the chairperson of the governing body of each of its political subdivisions by September 1st. The Boone County Board of Commissioners received levy allocation requests from various political subdivisions for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2018-28, authorizing the levy allocation requests for the 2018-2019 fiscal year for the Albion, Cedar Rapids, Petersburg, Primrose and St. Edward Rural Fire Districts, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. and Boone County Historical Society, Inc. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Jacqueline Wells, Veteran Service Officer, has registered to attend the annual Nebraska County Veteran Service Officers Association schooling in North Platte, Nebraska in September 2018. The Board received information that other Veteran Service Officers from other counties may carpool with the Boone County Veterans Service Officer to North Platte, Nebraska. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve other Nebraska County Veteran Service Officers to occupy the Boone County vehicle that is being used for transportation to arrive in North Platte on September 11, 2018 for said schooling that is scheduled for September 12-14, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Pursuant to State Statute Section 23-347, within two calendar months after the close of each fiscal year, each county officer shall make, acknowledge under oath, and file with the County Board, of his or her county, an inventory statement of all county personal property in the custody and possession of said county officer. The County Board in each county shall examine into each inventory statement so filed, and, if said statement is correct and proper in every particular, the County Board shall deliver each of said inventory statements to the clerk of the county for filing as a public record in said county clerk's office in a manner convenient for reference. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve the County Offices' 2017-2018 Inventories of county personal and real estate property as presented from the various offices and file the submitted inventories with the County Clerk's office as a public record in a manner convenient for reference. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding equipment repair/replacement, road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed different types of heating sources for the County Road shop building located at Cedar Rapids. The Board suggested that the Highway Superintendent advertise for quotes for propane forced air heat system and propane radiant heat system in order to compare the differences before installing a new heat system in the shop building.
- The Highway Superintendent presented a list of the road surplus items that were sold on the Big Iron Auctions. Upon receiving payment for the sold items, the said items will then be removed from the County insurance and inventory.
- The County Highway Superintendent informed the Board that there are some areas in the County that need attention in regard to mowing the road ditches and that a notice will appear in the newspaper addressing the landowners to mow all weeds.

The Board and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, discussed disposal of smaller county office equipment/furniture that is valued under a \$100.00, that is in storage or no longer in use at the June 27, 2018 Board meeting. The Board approved disposal each year in the fall for any smaller surplus county office equipment/furniture that is valued under a \$100.00, to be tagged for sale in the hallway of the courthouse in conjunction with the Albion City wide garage sales. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to allow smaller surplus county office equipment/furniture that is valued under \$100.00 to be tagged for sale in the hallway of the courthouse from September 3-14, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board; Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff and John Buck, Boone County Chief Deputy Sheriff; Michael Epley, Platte Valley Communications of Kearney, Nebraska; and Mike Jeffres, State of Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer, discussed a request to install equipment for the Nebraska Statewide Radio System (SRS) on the new County Communications Tower located on the Boone County Fairgrounds.





The installation of equipment on the County Communications Tower for the SRS was discussed at length on August 13, 2018. SRS is a digitally encrypted system that allows cross-communication between agencies and improves radio coverage throughout rural counties.

Jeffres said that the State of Nebraska is funding a site addition to the SRS to boost radio coverage in the area. This coverage addition would benefit the State Patrol, State Fire Marshall, Nance County, Boone County and other public safety agencies in the area. The state outlined a plan to install the state equipment, clean off old antennas and lines, install new antennas and lines, license new frequencies and reprogram local radios. The state has offered to assist with the costs of maintaining the county tower and generators as part of the SRS maintenance. The State of Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) will coordinate and manage the project. The OCIO is statutorily responsible for the communications systems and technology solutions for State agencies, including the management of the SRS that is used by public utilities and public safety agencies/entities, including emergency and medical services, law enforcement services, fire management services and disaster relief services. Jeffres said that the Nebraska Public Power District (utilities side) and State of Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer (safety side) entered into an Interlocal Agreement to jointly own, operate, maintain and manage the SRS and created the System Operating Group to carry out the ownership and management responsibilities. Jeffres said that if the Board agrees to install equipment for the SRS on the County Communications Tower, the state's goal is to complete the project in November 2018.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize Mike Jeffres, State of Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer; Michael Epley, Platte County Communications of Kearney, Inc.; and Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff, to proceed with the drafting of an agreement and installation of equipment for the SRS on the County Communications Tower located at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A group of approximately twenty concerned citizens attended the Board meeting in regard to a continued discussion of a proposed new building project at the county fairgrounds. The Boone County Board of Commissioners reviewed bid proposals that were submitted to the architect, Joseph R. Hewgley & Associates, Inc. for a new building for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The following six bids were received: VRL Construction, Inc. DBA Rathman Manning Construction of Chapman, NE - \$2,966,035.00/455 calendar days; Bierman Contracting, Inc. of Columbus, NE - \$2,997,300.00/325 calendar days; RaDec Construction Co., Inc. of Hartington, NE - \$3,218,800.00/365 calendar days; Chief Industries DBA Chief Construction Co. of Grand Island, NE - \$3,496,000.00/300 calendar days; Rogge General Contractors, Inc. of Lincoln, NE - \$3,728,000.00/365 calendar days; and B-D Construction, Inc. of Columbus, NE - \$4,329,260.00/400 calendar days. Kurt Kruse, fairgrounds building committee, said that the two low bids were for Behlen buildings and that discussion had been held with Rathman Manning Construction where they agreed to shorten the construction days. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to accept the bid proposal of \$2,966,035.00 from VRL Construction, Inc. DBA Rathman Manning Construction of Chapman, Nebraska. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board and Jeff Jarecki, Attorney for Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., discussed the appointment of an advisory committee for/during the construction of a new county owned building at the county fairgrounds. The advisory committee will oversee construction of the building project and any change orders will need to be presented as an agenda item at a Board of Commissioners meeting for approval.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to appoint and approve the following to serve as the advisory committee for/during construction: Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners; Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc. President and one other board member (Chuck Rolf); one board member of the Boone





County 4-H Council (Kristine Schrad); one board member from the Boone County Planning and Zoning Commission (Paul Groeteke); and one Boone County resident committee member at large (Ron Coakes). Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Andrew Forney, Vice President of D.A. Davidson & Co., presented an Engagement Letter for the Board to review. The Engagement Letter is disclosures by D.A. Davidson & Co. as Underwriter/Placement Agent pursuant to MSRB Rules G-17 and G-23 for Limited Tax County Building Bonds, Series 2018. Forney answered questions and explained the ten year bond issue parameters. Forney said that current market interest rate is 2.77 percent, but the final interest rate will not be determined until the bonds are sold. The group seeking commitments for the building project asked Forney if the sale of the bonds could be offered locally first in order to try to keep the funds in the county. Forney said that priority in bond allocation could be given locally. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Engagement Letter with D.A. Davidson & Co. as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Michael Rogers, Gilmore & Bell, P. C., prepared a resolution authorizing the issuance of Limited Tax Building Bonds, Series 2018, of the County of Boone, Nebraska in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for a new county owned building at the county fairgrounds. Kevin Rasmussen, fairgrounds building committee, said that the fund pledge/commitment drive is going well and that he is confident in raising more than the \$1.7 million. Forney explained that the bond issue includes an extraordinary redemption provision that would allow for repayment of the bonds early if donations come in earlier than expected and that the County also has an option to refinance the bonds after five years if a lower interest rate is available. The bond resolution states that the first bond payment will be made by October 15, 2019 and the final payment by October 15, 2029. The October 15, 2019 payment will include two interest payments and first principal payment. Beginning with the year 2020 bond payments there will be an interest payment due each May and principal/interest payment due each October.

It was noted that all pledge/commitment agreements must be signed. The attorneys Jim Ely and Jeff Jarecki said they are in the process of finalizing the pledge/commitment agreements. The County Clerk noted that the State Statutes of the County Agricultural Society Act, does not allow County Agricultural Society's to receive gift, pledge or bequest of any type. Jarecki noted that is why a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization is being formed for the collection of the donations to repay the bonds.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2018-29, authorizing the issuance of Limited Tax Building Bonds, Series 2018, of the County of Boone, Nebraska in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for a building owned by the County and initially to be used as an Agricultural and Educational Activities Building at the county fairgrounds. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Mary Ziemba, Boone County Zoning Administrator, and the Board discussed suggested proposed changes to the County Zoning Regulations. The Board decided to visit with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads, for a better understanding of the road classification requirements, following a lengthy discussion regarding the regulation for not allowing any residential structure to be built on a minimum maintenance road. No suggestions or decisions were made in regard to the County Zoning Regulations by the Board.

On August 27, 2018 the Board approved a resolution authorizing the issuance of Limited Tax Building Bonds, Series 2018, of the County of Boone, Nebraska in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for a building owned by the County and initially to be used as an Agricultural and Educational Activities Building at the county fairgrounds. Michael Rogers, Gilmore & Bell, P. C., and Andrew Forney, D.A. Davidson & Co., prepared the Preliminary Official Statement for issuance of Limited Tax County Building Bonds, Series 2018 for the Board to review. The first principal payment of \$135,000.00 plus two interest payments will be payable beginning October 15, 2019 and semiannually thereafter with interest on April 15th and interest/principal on October 15th. The semiannual bond interest payment amounts will not be determined until completion of the sale of the bonds. The Bonds will be dated Date of Delivery and will bear interest from that date. The Bonds are subject to an "Extraordinary Optional Redemption" in whole or in part, at any time prior to maturity at the option of the County, at par, plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption, with no redemption premium upon the occurrence of the "Extraordinary Event". "Extraordinary Event" is the receiving of commitments, pledges, donations made by area residents and businesses to fund the \$2,000,000.00 (principal plus interest) bond project, without the request of a tax levy upon real and personal property. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Preliminary Official Statement for issuance of Limited Tax County Building Bonds, Series 2018 as submitted and any additional documents specifically referencing the aforementioned bonds. On August 27, 2018 the Board accepted a bid proposal of \$2,966,035.00 from VRL Construction, Inc. DBA Rathman Manning Construction of Chapman, Nebraska for the construction of a new building project for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The Board received an AIA Document Agreement to review for the new building project. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Agreement between the Boone County Board of Commissioners and Rathman Manning Construction for a new building for the Boone County Fairgrounds as submitted. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

The Rapiscan x-ray equipment that is used on court days is in need of some repairs. The portable walk through metal detector sometimes works and other days not. The x-ray screening systems has a constant annoying buzzing sound. Applied Connective Technologies, LLC was contacted in regard to the x-ray screening system and they are able to order a new replacement battery for \$95.00 in order to take care of the buzzing sound. The service agreements expired in 2012 and at that time the technicians would have come from St. Louis, Missouri. The x-ray equipment is only used on court days which is on an average of three or four days a month. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, said that they can use their wands in place of the walk through metal detector. The consensus of the Board was for the portable walk through metal detector to be put in storage and out of the hallway temporarily and for the law enforcement to use their wands. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to authorize Applied Connective Technologies, LLC to order and install a new replacement battery for the x-ray screening system. A request to install equipment for the Nebraska Statewide Radio System (SRS) on the new County Communications Tower located on the Boone County Fairgrounds was discussed on August 13, 2018. There is some spotty coverage in Boone County that the state has been discussing. SRS is a digitally encrypted system that allows cross-communication between agencies and improves radio coverage throughout rural counties. On August 27, 2018 the Board approved and authorized Mike Jeffres, State of Nebraska, Office of the Chief Information Officer; Michael Epley, Platte County Communications of Kearney, Inc.; and Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff, to proceed with the drafting of an agreement and installation of equipment for the SRS on the County Communications Tower located at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Jeffres and Johnson presented a Communications Tower and Shelter Facilities Agreement to the Board today for review. Jeffres answered questions from the Board. The Agreement outlines cost responsibilities of the parties. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Communications Tower and Shelter Facilities Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and The State of Nebraska, Office of the Chief Information Officer as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

At the Board's meetings of July 25th, July 30th and August 20th, 2018 the Board discussed the possibility of merging the Boone and Nance County 911 Communications dispatching services. The Board; Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff; John Buck, Boone County Chief Deputy Sheriff; Ben Bakewell, Nance County Sheriff; and Troy V. Cordle, ENP, State of Nebraska 9-1-1 Field Coordinator, discussed the present Nebraska State Statute regulations of what services qualify to be paid and what new equipment/upgraded equipment can be purchased from the 911 Land Line, 911 Wireless, or 911 Holding Funds. Cordle explained how and what each of the 911 communication funds could be used to pay for some of the costs involved with a merger. The dispatching for both counties would be handled out of the Boone County Law Enforcement Building and Sheriff Johnson said he would possibly need to increase dispatching staff by 2.5 positions. Sheriff Johnson proposed an estimated cost for Nance County to reimburse Boone County annually for wages of \$108,265.00 plus 3% each year for cost of living and a \$30,000.00 one-time fee towards the cost of a new 911 system. Sheriff Bakewell plans to discuss the proposal with the Nance County Supervisors on September 11, 2018.



Bakewell plans to visit with the Nance County Attorney to draw up an Agreement for both Boards to review for a final approval and a merger start date of the Boone-Nance County 911 Communications dispatching services.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEEDINGS 2018-2019 COUNTY BUDGET

Ken Luettel, Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners, called for a motion to open a public hearing on Monday, September 17, 2018 at 10:00 A.M. in the Boone County Courthouse Commissioners Meeting Room in Albion, Nebraska. Motion made by Commissioner Luettel, second by Commissioner Rasmussen to open said public hearing. Notice of the hearing was given in advance by publication and the convened hearing was open to the public. Commissioners present for said public hearing were Ken Luettel, Alan Rasmussen and Hilary K. Maricle. Chairman Luettel read the notice for the record. Richard Martinsen, CPA, for Schmeits, Mueller & Martinsen, P.C., was present to answer budget questions. Ben Rutten of Cedar Rapids, NE and Jim Dickerson, Albion News, were present for the budget hearing.

The public hearing was for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2018-2019 Boone County proposed budget in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Sections 13-501 to 13-513. Also, to set the final tax request for the 2018-2019 Boone County proposed budget at a different amount than the prior year tax request in compliance with the provisions of State Statute Section 77-1601.02 The hearing was open for one hour and the proposed budget was published in the August 29, 2018 issue of the Albion News, Albion, Nebraska.

The County Board and those present for the hearing discussed with Martinsen the differences from last year's fiscal budget in the areas of asking dollars, land valuation, tax rate, property tax requirement and fund balances. Martinsen provided answers to questions asked with regard to the proposed budget and publication. The proposed property tax request for 2018-2019 is \$3,679,011.00, which is different from the 2017-2018 property tax request of \$3,606,824.00, being an increase of \$72,187.00 from fiscal year 2017-2018. The proposed tax rate for 2018 of 0.153638 is higher than the 2017 tax rate of 0.150708. A 2017 lid limit changed the vote to exceed the 2.5% lid limitation by an additional 1% budget authority growth to a Board majority approval. The levy authority of 50 cents includes the County levy and all the entities such as Agricultural/Historical Societies, Fire Districts, etc. added together. The 2018 County valuation is \$2,394,598,707.00 compared to the 2017 valuation of \$2,393,259,621.00 an increase of \$1,339,086.00. The overall County taxable value increased primarily due to the re-valuations of the Commercial and Commercial Hog Confinement properties.

The adopted 2018-2019 County Budget has a tax request expense increase from the 2017-2018 County Budget. The County of Boone, Nebraska financial contribution to the BCDA, Inc. is 80% of the corporation budget and is from the Inheritance Tax Fund.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to close said public hearing at 11:00 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Discussion: The county tax rate will be 0.153638. If it were not for the use of inheritance tax dollars, the county rate would be increased in order to maintain the current level of services that are both mandated under state law and that our county taxpayers deserve and expect.

Martinsen explained that Inheritance Tax funding is considered a local tax. Inheritance Tax funds stay in the respective county and benefit the respective county taxpayers with a lower property tax rate. If the legislature





removes the Inheritance Tax funding, then the state and federal levels will receive the taxes generated from "Inheritance" and the local county level will need to increase their property tax rate to maintain mandated services.

Nebraska Legislation changes are as follows: eliminate delinquent tax allowance unless Federal Prime Rate is Above 10%; eliminate budgeting for anticipated litigation claims; supermajority Board approval is not needed for 1% increase to restricted funds authority, only Board approval; listing of capital improvement projects and the corresponding amount being used as lid exemption; and Highway Allocation is no longer a restricted fund and no additional calculation is needed this year. The Interlocal Agreement Report (LB 51) (2017) is to be filed with the State Auditor's office on or before September 20th and impacts the county budget hearing, audits and contracts.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve and adopt the County Budget for 2018-2019 as published and presented with an Unused Budget Authority created for next year of \$386,092.63; and set the 2018 County Tax Rate at 0.153638, which is different than the County Tax Rate of 0.150708 for 2017. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve exceeding the 2.5% lid limitation on restricted funds by an additional 1% budget authority growth for fiscal year 2018-2019. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board expressed their appreciation to Martinsen for his assistance with the County Budget preparation throughout the years.



BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS SEPTEMBER 17, 2018 ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, September 17, 2018, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Ken Luettel, Alan Rasmussen and Hilary K. Maricle. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings of September 10, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Abstain: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

The County Highway Superintendent asked for the County Road Department employees to be on the Board agenda in regard to further explanation to their questions of the County Employee Handbook changes that were approved by the Board in June 2018. County Road employees in attendance were Stacey Ziemba, Highway Superintendent, Tom Buettner, Steve Rasmussen, Jamie Smith, and Russell Zarek. In addition, Ben Rutten, Steve Pritchard, Denny Johnson, Darla McIntosh, Mary Ziemba, Rod Nelson, and Pam Jochum joined in on the handbook question/answer discussion. The significant change is the replacement of the Longevity Pay benefit that has been in place since 1979 being changed to a yearly employee performance evaluation Merit Based Pay benefit. The road employee's questions were heard and answered during this portion of the agenda in regard to handbook policies. The handbook policies discussion continued later in the Board meeting with agenda item number seventeen.

Tanya Sharp, Boone County Health Center President & CEO, and Rita Liss, Boone County Health Center CFO, presented the Boone County Health Center statement of operations budget for their fiscal year October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019 to the Board. Sharp reviewed the budget with the Board and explained that areas of the anticipated operating revenue of \$35,548,552.00, with expenses of \$33,739,837.00, leaving a projected margin of \$1,808,715.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to accept the Boone County Health Center 2018-2019 operations budget as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Sharp updated the Board in regard to an anticipated health center building project. The anticipated health center new clinic building project would be adjacent to the south of the present health center clinic area. Sharp plans to file an Application with the City of Albion to request the vacation of the west half of Fuller Street between 7th and 8th Streets, Albion, Nebraska. In addition, Sharp asked the Board to sign the Application due to the County is a property owner along Fuller Street. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve and sign the Application request to the City of Albion Planning Commission for vacation of the west half of Fuller Street between 7th and 8th Streets, Albion, Nebraska for an anticipated Boone County Health Center new clinic building project as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Highway Superintendent updated the Board regarding road/bridge maintenance, materials and bridge/culvert projects.





The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed different types of heating sources for the County Road shop building located at Cedar Rapids on August 27, 2018. The Board suggested that the Highway Superintendent advertise for quotes for propane forced air heat systems and propane radiant heat systems in order to compare the differences before installing a new heat system in the shop building. The County Highway Superintendent advertised for bids for a propane heating system for County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids. The Highway Superintendent received two estimates/quotes: Stephens Electric & Supply, Inc. of Saint Edward, Nebraska - \$4,054.01 with 5 year warranty; Heatec, Inc. of Lincoln, Nebraska - \$2,800.00 with 10 year warranty. Following discussion of the differences between the quotes and warranties the Board suggested that the Highway Superintendent contact the representatives of the estimates/quotes and ask them to attend the September 26, 2018 Board meeting. The Board would like the representatives to explain their estimated/quoted heating systems in order to compare any differences. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to table a decision to Wednesday, September 26, 2018 of the heating source for the Boone County Road shop building located at Cedar Rapids. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Brian McDonald, JEO Consulting Group, Inc., County Highway Superintendent and the Board discussed and reviewed construction plans for Bridge Project No. C-6 (391), Albion East on August 13, 2018. The construction bid letting was advertised to open sealed bids on Monday, September 10, 2018. The Board approved Addendum No. 1 on September 10, 2018 to change the construction bid letting for Bridge Project No. C-6 (391), Albion East, with said sealed bids to be opened at 10:45 a.m. on Monday, September 17, 2018. Three sealed bids for said bridge project were received: A & R Construction Co. of Plainview, NE - \$130,880.02, start date July 2019; M.E. Collins Contracting Co., Inc. of Wahoo, NE - \$138,295.16, start date April 2019; and Starostka Group Unlimited, Inc. of Grand Island, NE - \$166,131.43, start date October 2018. The three contractors that submitted bids were represented at the meeting. The Board, Highway Superintendent and McDonald reviewed and discussed the bids. McDonald said that the difference in the bid start dates was not a problem due to the loaded weight of said bridge is posted. Upon completion of the bridge project the County may be responsible for the seeding and erosion control. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to accept and recommend approval of the A & R Construction Co. of Plainview, Nebraska bid for \$130,880.02, dependent upon full review of numbers in Group 1 and 4 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Boone County Highway Superintendent prepared and presented a resolution for the Board to review in regard to a Low Water Crossing. The plan is to replace the wooden bridge on 310th Avenue between the Northwest Quarter of Section 27 and the Northeast Quarter of Section 28, all in Township 21 North, Range 5 West, of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska, with a Low Water Crossing. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-30, replacing a wooden bridge on 310th Avenue with a Low Water Crossing located between Sections 27 and 28, Township 21 North, Range 5 West, of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The 2018-2019 County Budget public hearing for the County of Boone, Nebraska was held at 10:00 A.M. on September 17, 2018. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve exceeding the 2.5% lid limitation on restricted funds by an additional 1% budget authority growth for fiscal year 2018-2019. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to set a Board of Equalization meeting to be held on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 11:00 A.M. to set the 2018 tax year levies. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Andy Devine, Albion City Administrator, submitted an Interlocal Agreement for the Board to review between the County of Boone and City of Albion. The City of Albion requires a Street Superintendent and desires the Street Superintendent to be licensed with the State of Nebraska. Stacey L. (Robinson) Ziemba is a Class B Licensed County Highway Superintendent, a licensed Street Superintendent and a full time employee for the County of Boone. The County Highway Superintendent is a full time salaried employee of Boone County and City of Albion desires to remit payment directly to Boone County on a monthly basis for each month of this agreement. All parties on an annual basis shall review the Interlocal Agreement. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign Resolution No. 2018-31 an Interlocal Agreement between the County of Boone and City of Albion for licensed Highway and Street Superintendent services in effect for one year commencing on January 1, 2019 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Budget Act (State Statute Section 23-904) requires a budget message to be completed by the budget making authority outlining the fiscal policy for the budget period. The budget message must include a list of all cash amounts being held by officials that do not appear in the County Treasurer's Office six month balance reports. The Board has approved and authorized accounts within County Offices to receive and disburse fees, etc. Some of the accounts balance to zero and some accounts have a beginning balance. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2018-32, authorizing the accounts within County Offices as stated in the resolution. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried

Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the County of Boone passes by a majority vote a resolution setting the tax request at a different amount. The Governing Body of the County of Boone, by a majority vote by the Boone County Board of Commissioners, resolves that: the 2018-2019 property tax request be set at \$3,679,011.00, which is different from the 2017-2018 property tax request of \$3,606,824.00; and the 2018 county tax rate is at 0.153638, which is different from the 2017 tax rate of 0.150708. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-33 at the September 17, 2018 public hearing to adopt and approve the County Budget for 2018-2019 as published and presented with the above property tax requests. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Alan Rasmussen excused himself from said Board meeting at 11:30 A.M.

The County Road Department has surplus property to sell. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to advertise in the four county legal newspapers the Boone County Road Departments surplus property and accept sealed bids to be opened on October 9, 2018. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Maricle. Nays: None. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

The Board discussed installation of a fence along the East property line of the County owned property known as the fairgrounds and leased cropland. Consensus of the Board is to move forward with the installation of some type of fence along the East property line of the County owned property. The Board plans to visit with the City of Albion to discuss any regulations in regard to type of fence, permits, etc. that may be required from the City of Albion due to the annexation of property into the city limits on the east side of the county fairgrounds property.

The Board, County Highway Superintendent, Brian McDonald of JEO Consulting Group, Inc., Tim Preister and Dan Preister discussed an engineering proposal for upgrading 0.6 miles of a minimum maintenance road on





260th Street to an approved County road. The Board, Zoning Administrator and Preister's discussed the Zoning regulations and requirements regarding county road services to a residential dwelling on land that would be accessed off of a minimum maintenance road at the July 25, 2018 Board meeting. McDonald explained that the Nebraska Department of Roads regulations require involvement of a licensed engineer to provide hydraulic/hydrology studies before a decision can be made to reclassify a minimum maintenance road to a local county road. As it stands today the County Zoning regulations states that the burden of the cost to upgrade a county road from minimum maintenance to local, is on the individual who wants to build on land off of a classified minimum maintenance road, and said road upgrade needs to meet the Nebraska Department of Roads standards. McDonald presented a cost estimate of \$11,000.00 for engineering services and construction phase estimated of \$3,500.00. McDonald said that at some point a classification change would need to be requested from the Nebraska Department of Roads Classifications and Standards Board because this road is Minimum Maintenance and a residence cannot have its only access be a minimum maintenance roadway. During the discussion McDonald was asked if he had an estimate for the development of an approved County road. McDonald said he physically looked at the road and estimated development of the road could cost up to \$50,000.00 for dirt work and \$8,000.00 for culverts. Discussion was held on the following: current county zoning regulations state there is no residential structure to be built with an access from a minimum maintenance road; the burden of the cost to upgrade a county road from minimum maintenance to local, is on the individual who wants to build on land off of a classified minimum maintenance road; share the cost 50/50 between county and individual for road upgrade; or set a percentage share of cost between county and individual. The Board was reminded of setting a precedence when the regulations are not in black and white. The consensus of the Board is to find out how other counties handle these types of requests.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, informed the Board that the Nance County Board of Supervisors met on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 and approved the merge of their 911 Communications with Boone County. Johnson proposed to Nance County an annual wage responsibility for two full time dispatcher employees of \$108, 265.00 with an anticipation of an annual three percent cost of living raise each year. In addition, Johnson proposed a one-time initial payment for the new 911 System of \$30,000.00. Johnson and the Board reviewed and discussed the proposal that Nance County approved. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to move forward with the Boone/Nance 911 Communications merger, the Boone and Nance County Sheriffs and Attorneys to prepare a three year Interlocal Agreement with a December 1, 2018 effective date. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

The County employees are directly responsible to an individual elected official or the County Board. Elected officials, in working with their employees, may develop different employment practices and policies than used by other offices. The different practices and policies can result in disharmony among the body of County employees. The Elected officials of Boone County adopted a Boone County Employee Handbook on June 13, 2016 and have approved revisions to the adopted 2016 Boone County Employee Handbook within the County Board Proceedings. The Board approved revisions to the Boone County Employee Handbook on June 27, 2018. The agenda item to approve the resolution that is signed by the elected officials, in regard to the June 27, 2018 handbook revisions, is the follow-up document that follows the review of the revisions by the NIRMA labor law attorney.

The Board; County Assessor, Clerk and Sheriff; Appointed Highway Superintendent, Zoning Administrator and Veteran Service Officer; UNL Extension Educator; Maintenance; and employees Darla McIntosh and Pam Jochum held a lengthy discussion in regard to the Boone County Employee Handbook revisions.

A benefit of merit based pay system for county employees to replace the benefit longevity pay system that has been in place since 1979 was approved on June 27, 2018. The lengthy discussion was the question about who would act as supervisor to determine merit pay for various departments with non-elected official and/or



appointed department heads. The group decided that a chart would be drawn up to show who would make these final determinations of the merit based pay each year following the employee performance evaluation to be completed yearly in November.

In addition, the Courthouse Open policy during inclement weather was brought up for discussion. The current policy reads "Vacation leave will be deducted for employees unable to be present at work due to inclement weather, except that employees shall be required to use earned compensatory time before using vacation leave for inclement weather. If an employee's vacation and compensatory time have been exhausted, then the absence will be without pay. In the event that a non-exempt employee does not arrive at the normal starting time, a prorated amount shall be deducted. The payroll time/attendance system will post comp/vacation time equivalent to a 40 hour work week". Some employees feel that they should not have to use vacation time if the courthouse is open and their driveway or county road is not open for them to travel to work. The Board plans to review other county policies in regard to employee attendance when the courthouse is open to serve the public during inclement weather.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table the approval of the resolution for the County Employee Handbook revision approved in June 2018 to the October 9, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion carried.

Public Comments:

- Lisa Langan, County Court, asked the Board about the repair(s) for the Rapiscan x-ray equipment that is used on court days that was discussed on September 10, 2018. A replacement battery has been ordered.
- Commissioner Luettel reported on the advisory committee meetings held September 10 and 12, 2018 for the construction of a new county owned building at the county fairgrounds.
- Commissioner Maricle reported on the Central Nebraska Joint Housing Authority board meeting.

Chairman Luettel declared the meeting adjourned at 1:55 P.M., with the next Board meeting scheduled for Wednesday, September 26, 2018.

The General Fund receives the real estate and personal property taxes with a designated percentage transferred to the Road Fund on a monthly basis. The Boone County Treasurer is authorized to use all property tax collections, which would include real estate and motor vehicle taxes, to be in the transfer of funds. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve Resolution No. 2018-34, authorizing the Boone County Treasurer to transfer funds from the General Fund (0100) 64.299% to the Road Fund (0200) for the 2018-2019 Tax Year on a monthly basis not to exceed \$2,363,000.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.





The Boone County Treasurer requested authorization from the Board of Commissioners to set up a separate bank account for the new fairgrounds building pledged/commitment donations. The account will receive said donations for the Fair Building Bond payments. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve a separate account and authorize the Boone County Treasurer to set up a separate bank account for the Fair Building Bond payments with the Cornerstone Bank, Albion, Nebraska. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed two estimates/quotes on September 17, 2018 for a propane heating system for County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids and tabled a decision to the September 26, 2018 Board meeting. The two quotes were: Stephens Electric & Supply, Inc. of Saint Edward, Nebraska - \$4,054.01 (Enerco) with 5 year warranty; Heatec, Inc. of Lincoln, Nebraska - \$2,800.00 (Heatstar) with 10 year warranty. The Board noted the substantial differences within the quotes and asked for the representatives to attend the Board meeting on September 26, 2018 in order to explain their heating system quote. A representative for Heatec was present at the Board meeting and a representative for Stephens Electric was present by telephone conference. The Heatec representative explained the infrared and combustion technology of propane forced radiant heating systems. The Heatec quote included the heating equipment/material, but did not include the propane tank, electrical material or installation. The Stephens Electric quote included all installation, heating equipment/material, but did not include the propane tank. The Heatec representative acknowledged support for the local area quote. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve the quote for an Enerco propane heating system for County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids, for \$4,054.01 from Stephens Electric & Supply, Inc. of Saint Edward, Nebraska and with the understanding that the County purchases the propane tank. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

Stacey L. (Robinson) Ziemba, County Highway Superintendent, submitted for review and approval the annual Standardized System of Annual Reporting (SSAR). The annual report is submitted to the Board of Public Roads Classification and Standards pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. 39-2120 and 39-2510. The report includes administrative/operating expenses and cost per mile/hour for the road department equipment. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the annual SSAR report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.

The County Highway Superintendent and Board discussed the wind damaged building located on County property by the Boone County Road Department Dist. #3 shop in Petersburg. The said building received wind damage during a June 6, 2018 windstorm. REDI Engineering, Inc. received the assignment from NIRMA to complete a site visit assessment of the damaged building. The cost of repairing said building is cost prohibitive. The wood roof trusses have compressive failures and are sagging. Trusses require replacement, so the entire roof would need to be removed and replaced. Portions of the roof are at an increased risk of collapse onto equipment stored in the building during severe storm events. In addition, the Board and Highway Superintendent discussed removal of some of the trees located on the County property where the County buildings are located. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to authorize the County Highway Superintendent to seek local bids for removal of said storm damaged building located at Petersburg, Nebraska and bids for removal of trees located on said County owned property of Block 4, West Petersburg Addition, Petersburg, Nebraska. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Absent: Maricle. Motion carried.



Barb Hanson, Boone County Assessor and the Board discussed low valued structures. Hanson said that there are several different types of building structures with minimal value that are not useable or falling down. Hanson figured the minimal value has continued on such structures to try and have the owners clean up their property. Hanson said that as long as there is part of a structure it takes time to re-measure, up-date records, etc. during valuation updates. The rural village parcels are currently being updated and revalued. Hanson prepared the rural village parcels that have low valued structures for the Board to review. Hanson said that the fifty-one low valued structures tax amount collected would be \$254.04 for 2017. The Board and Hanson discussed setting a minimal value and then when the structure reaches that minimal value, the Assessor's office would automatically remove the low valued structure from the County tax roll. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Luettel to authorize the County Assessor's office to use their discretion for assessment of low valued structures. Roll call Vote: Yeas: Rasmussen and Luettel. Barb Hanson, County Assessor, and Mary Ziemba, County Zoning Administrator, presented a scenario in regard to current Zoning regulations in an A-2 District area to the Board. An individual applies for a conditional Use Permit for the permitted ten acres, a survey is completed and zoning regulations were met to build a structure. Say a few years later the individual wants a few more acres, but is less than the required ten acres. The individual did not want to go through the Zoning procedures a second time, so surveyed some adjoining ground next to the ten acres, being around seven acres with the understanding at that time the two surveys of adjoining acreages will then be considered as one parcel for around seventeen acres. The combined surveyed ground becomes one parcel due to the existing zoning regulations and that there is not twenty or more acres involved. Now a few years later the individual wants to possibly sell the combined seventeen acre parcel as two separate acreages that would create a non-conforming lot, which is not permissible within the Boone County Zoning regulations. The consensus of the Board is to abide by the existing Boone County Planning and Zoning regulations within Article 11, Section 2, 2.1 - 2.3.

Chairman Luettel called the meeting to order and Commissioners present for roll call were Hilary K. Maricle, Alan Rasmussen and Ken Luettel. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and the convened meeting was open to the public. Chairman Luettel acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public.

Jack Nordeen, County Weed Superintendent/Sign Technician employee, discussed his personal concerns with the Board regarding the County FMLA policy and sick/vacation/comp policies. Nordeen feels that it is unfair that an employee's earned benefits of comp time, sick leave and vacation are to be exhausted before using the federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). Eligible employees are entitled to a maximum of 12 weeks of unpaid FMLA leave during a rolling 12-month period for qualifying events. FMLA unpaid leave protects the employee's job position and requires the employer to maintain the employee's health coverage. The Exhibit "K" of the County Employee Handbook refers to FMLA leave policy. Nordeen also questioned the County's full-time employee policy of a forty hour work week to receive the benefits of the County. The County is currently still paying the full health premium for full-time employees. The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) requires an employer with fifty or more full-time employees to provide health care coverage for employees that work thirty plus hours per week and the employer is not required to pay the full health care premium. The County has paid the full health care premium, as a benefit, for full-time forty hour work week employees for several years. Beginning with the 2019 year the County is considering to have the employee(s) that do not work/receive compensation for a forty hour work week to pay a portion of their health care premium. Nordeen feels that the employee benefits are being decreased every time there are proposed change(s) to employment policies. The Board asked Nordeen to type out all of his questions and concerns about employee policy for the County Clerk's office to forward to the NIRMA labor law legal counsel for review.

The Board reviewed and discussed the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed for payment. The Board reviewed Vendor ID No. 1779 in the amount of \$29.60 submitted for reimbursement of meeting meals. The Board approved the meal reimbursement that included the itemized receipt in accordance with the County Employee Handbook in the amount of \$11.76. The Board partially rejected payment of Vendor ID No. 1779 in the amount of \$17.84, the County does not reimburse for meals submitted for the day/evening travel before a meeting. The replacement battery for the backup would not boot up properly and was still flashing an error code. The replacement battery will not be needed or charged to the County due to the need for a new replacement backup unit. Applied Connective Technologies submitted a quote for a replacement backup unit. The x-ray equipment is only used on court days which is on an average of three or four days a month. Denny Johnson, Sheriff; Lisa Langan, County Court; and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, plan to research for vendors in/close to Nebraska for possible replacement/repair of the portable walk through metal detector and x-ray equipment. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to authorize Applied Connective Technologies, LLC to order and install a new replacement backup unit for the x-ray screening system and that Rod Nelson, Maintenance, to be the contact person to work with Applied Connective Technologies. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tina Landauer, Commander of Boone County American Legion, updated the Board of the scheduled activities planned for County Legion Government Day. Landauer informed the Board that the Humphrey, Nebraska school system would like to participate in the Boone County Legion Government Day activities. The Boone County Legion Government day is scheduled for Wednesday, November 14, 2018.

The Board and County Highway Superintendent opened sealed bids for the three advertised fuel pumps that were surplus property located at the County Road Shop Dist. #3, Petersburg. The fuel pumps were labeled #1, #2, and #3 in the photo advertisement. Adrian Mayer, Bader's Highway & Street of Norfolk, Nebraska, and Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, County Highway Superintendent, presented estimates for crack sealing for several county asphalt roads. The estimate #351 for \$19,770.00 includes Niewohner road from Highway 91 to gravel; Cargill road from Highway 14 to gravel; Six miles of Old Mill Road; Raeville Road; and Central Highway from Highway 39 east to 340th Avenue. Bader's Highway will remove all weeds, blow out all cracks, clean, seal and squeegee all cracks. The Board asked Mayer to check the rest of the county asphalt roads that are not listed within the estimate for possible need of crack sealing. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to approve the Estimate #351 for \$19,770.00 for crack sealing of several county asphalt roads from Bader's Highway & Street as presented. The County Highway Superintendent and Board discussed the wind damaged building located on County property by the Boone County Road Department Dist. #3 shop in Petersburg at the September 26, 2018 Board meeting. The Board authorized the County Highway Superintendent to seek local bids for removal of said storm damaged building. The Highway Superintendent received one bid to date and asked that the Board table a decision for removal of the wind damaged building to allow for additional bids for building removal and disposal. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table a decision for removal and disposal of the wind



damaged building to the October 15, 2018 Board meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding equipment repair/replacement, road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- The Enerco propane heating system for County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids, was installed last week.
- The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed insulation estimates for the County Road Shop District #1 building.
- The Highway Superintendent and Board Chairman plan to interview the applicants for the advertised position in County Road District #2, Albion.

The Petersburg Community Club requested a temporary road closure for safety reasons for the Punkin' Chunkin' event scheduled for October 28, 2018. The road closure is for 140th Street, located between Sections 19 and 30, all in Township 22 North, Range 6 West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska; commencing at the junction of 220th Avenue and 140th Street, thence east one mile on 140th Street and terminating at the junction of 140th Street and 230th Avenue. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-35 for a temporary road closure relating to the Petersburg Community Club Punkin' Chunkin' event as presented. Roll call vote: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

A request to install equipment for the Nebraska Statewide Radio System (SRS) on the new County Communications Tower located on the Boone County Fairgrounds was discussed on August 13, 2018 and August 27, 2018. There is some spotty coverage in Boone County that the state has been discussing. SRS is a digitally encrypted system that allows cross-communication between agencies and improves radio coverage throughout rural counties. On September 10, 2018 the Board approved and authorized the Board Chairman to sign the Communications Tower and Shelter Facilities Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and The State of Nebraska, Office of the Chief Information Officer as presented by Mike Jeffres, State of Nebraska, Office of the Chief Information Officer and Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff. Jeffers contacted Johnson stating that the State legal department wants to use a revised and simpler Agreement to replace the previous Agreement that was signed by the Board. The Board did not receive the revised Agreement to review for today's Board meeting. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to table the approval/signing of a revised Agreement to a later date. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board approved to move forward with the Boone/Nance 911 Communications merger, with the Boone and Nance County Sheriffs and Attorneys to prepare a three year Interlocal Agreement with a December 1, 2018 effective date at their September 17, 2018 Board meeting. Denny Johnson, Sheriff, presented the Board an Interlocal Agreement draft for their review. The Board and Johnson reviewed and discussed the Interlocal Agreement. Johnson plans to review the Interlocal Agreement with Nance County following today's discussion and plans to have a final document for the October 15, 2018 Board meeting.

Jerad Reimers, representative for Congressman Adrian Smith's office, updated the Board of the congressman's activities and federal issues. The Board and Reimers discussed several issues. Reimers informed the Board to direct citizens that have issues with Federal agencies to direct them to the congressman's office in Grand Island, Nebraska for assistance.



The Board received pay application number 1 from Rathman Manning Construction for the fairgrounds building. The payment request is for a portion of the building material deposit and performance and payment bond. The County employees are directly responsible to an individual elected official or the County Board. Elected officials, in working with their employees, may develop different employment practices and policies than used by other offices. The different practices and policies can result in disharmony among the body of County employees. The Elected officials of Boone County adopted a Boone County Employee Handbook on June 13, 2016 and have approved revisions to the adopted 2016 Boone County Employee Handbook within the County Board Proceedings. The Board approved revisions to the Boone County Employee Handbook on June 27, 2018. The agenda item to approve the resolution that is signed by the elected officials, in regard to the June 27, 2018 handbook revisions, is the follow-up document that follows the review of the revisions by the NIRMA labor law attorney. The Board tabled approval of the resolution for the County Employee Handbook on September 17, 2018 following a lengthy discussion. Due to the earlier lengthy discussion regarding the County FMLA, sick, vacation and comp policies, the Board did not take action in regard to the resolution for the handbook.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve the County Board Proceedings of October 9, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of October 9, 2018 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

On September 17, 2018 the Board accepted and recommended approval of the A & R Construction Co. of Plainview, Nebraska bid for \$130,880.02, dependent upon full review of numbers in Group 1 and 4 in regard to the construction plans for Bridge Project No. C-6 (391), Albion East. The Board received the Notice to Proceed and Agreement documents prepared by Brian McDonald, JEO Consulting Group, Inc. of Norfolk, Nebraska, for their review and signature. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Agreement and related documents between Boone County, Nebraska and A & R Construction Co. of Plainview, Nebraska for \$130,880.02, for Bridge Project No. C-6 (391), Albion East as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Highway Superintendent and Board discussed the wind damaged building located on County property by the Boone County Road Department Dist. #3 shop in Petersburg at the September 26, 2018 Board meeting. The Board authorized the County Highway Superintendent to seek local bids for removal of said storm damaged building. The Highway Superintendent received two bids as follows: \$3,100.00 – Bygland Dirt Contracting, Inc. and \$2,784.00 – Seda Land Handling, LLC, both of Albion, Nebraska. Both bids included building demolition, landfill disposal, asbestos testing and leaving concrete in place. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and accept the building demolition bid of the wind damaged building in Petersburg for \$2,784.00 from Seda Land Handling, LLC as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas; Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Stacey (Robinson) Ziemba, Boone County Highway Superintendent, updated the Board regarding equipment repair/replacement, road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- The County Highway Superintendent and Board Chairman plan to interview the four applicants for the advertised full-time position in County Road District #2, Albion.
- The County Highway Superintendent and Board discussed the quality of the gravel that is being purchased for use by the County.





The new propane heating system for County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids building has been installed. A small office/break room is attached to the north side of the shop building and the new heating system was not installed in the office/break room area. The Board and County Highway Superintendent held a lengthy discussion on December 27, 2017 in regard to the need to either repair or replace the present office/break room area that is attached to the shop building and/or a new lean-to office/break room area to be attached to the present shop building. The discussion on February 20, 2018 included the mold test results (non-dangerous type) within the current office/break room area, different heating unit for the shop building, and other issues in regard to the Road District #1 Cedar Rapids Shop building. A portable electric heater may possibly be used to heat the office/break room area for now. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to authorize the County Highway Superintendent to prepare specs and advertise for bids for a new office/break room building to either stand alone or to be a lean-to building to be attached to the west side of the county shop building known as the County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The heating costs for the road shop building located at Cedar Rapids has been very high over the past years in comparison to the other County road shop buildings. With the installation of the new propane heating system in the County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids, it was suggested to insulate the roof/ceiling and possibly the walls to help lessen the heating costs. The County Highway Superintendent and the Board discussed the estimates that were presented for the 50' x 60' shop building for two and three inch closed cell foam insulation and paint for roof/ceiling and two inch foam on walls. The consensus of the Board to insulate the roof/ceiling at this time and possibly insulate the walls at a later date. The roof/ceiling closed cell foam insulation estimates are as follows: 2 inches - \$5,565.00, 3 inches - \$7,950.00, paint estimate - \$200.00, Murphy Brothers Insulation, LLC of Spalding, NE; 3 inches - \$9,000.00, no paint estimate, Mid States Sprayfoam, LLC of Saint Edward, NE; and 3 inches - \$9,072.00, paint estimate - \$3,500.00, Superior Foam and Coatings of Scotia, NE. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and accept the Murphy Brothers Insulation, LLC estimate for the roof/ceiling of 3 inches closed cell spray foam insulation of \$7,950.00 with added paint cost of \$200.00. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dan and Tiffany Preister would like to build a new residential dwelling on land with a driveway access off of 260th Street that is currently an existing classified Minimum Maintenance roadway that has a dirt surface. The Board, Mary Ziemba, Zoning Administrator, Dan Preister and Tim Preister discussed the regulations and requirements regarding county road services to a residential dwelling on July 25, 2018. The Board, County Highway Superintendent, Brian McDonald of JEO Consulting Group, Inc., Tim Preister and Dan Preister discussed an engineering proposal for upgrading 0.6 miles of a classified Minimum Maintenance roadway on 260th Street to an improved Local Classification gravel surfaced roadway on September 17, 2018. The Board, County Highway Superintendent, Brian McDonald of JEO Consulting Group, Inc., County Zoning Administrator, Steve Bygland, Bygland Dirt Contracting, Inc., and Dan and Tiffany Preister discussed County Zoning and State of Nebraska, Department of Roads regulations on October 15, 2018.

McDonald explained that the Nebraska Department of Roads regulations require involvement of a licensed engineer to provide hydraulic/hydrology studies before a decision can be made to reclassify a minimum maintenance road to a local county road. As it stands today the County Zoning regulations states that the burden of the cost to upgrade a county road from minimum maintenance to local, is on the individual who wants to build on land off of a classified minimum maintenance road, and said road upgrade needs to meet the Nebraska Department of Roads standards. McDonald said that at some point a classification change would need to be requested from the Nebraska Department of Roads Classifications and Standards Board because this road is classified Minimum Maintenance and a residence cannot have its only access be a minimum maintenance roadway.



Discussion was held on the following: county zoning regulations; share of all the cost 50/50 between county and individual for road upgrade; set a percentage share of all cost between county and individual for road upgrade; signed agreement between county and individual regarding shared costs and use of individuals land/road right-of-way during construction; possibly cut back on some of the costs by having county road employees do some of the work; the first step for road/bridge project upgrades is to be placed on the Boone County One & Six Year Road Improvement Program; and that an upgraded road meets the Nebraska Department of Roads standards and certification.

The Board was reminded of setting a precedence when the regulations are not in black and white and that it is important to remain consistent moving forward. The consensus of the Board is to set guidelines/procedures for requests to change classifications of county roads and cost share to upgrade a county road.

Brian McDonald, JEO Consulting Group, Inc., per request by the Board, prepared an engineering proposal for upgrading 0.6 miles of 260th Street starting at 300th Avenue and extending east. The engineering document proposal is in regard to an existing classified Minimum Maintenance roadway that has a dirt surface and to improve it to a Local Classification roadway that would have a gravel surface. The current regulations do not allow residential construction to be located on/accessed from a minimum maintenance classified roadway. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to table the Agreement between Boone County, Nebraska and JEO Consulting Group, Inc. for engineering services for the upgrading 0.6 miles of 260th Street starting at 300th Avenue and extending east to a later date. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jeff Jarecki was appointed Boone County Public Defender in August of 2012. Jarecki reported that the cases assigned in 2012 through 2017 are all completed. Jarecki reported that he has been assigned forty-six cases to date for 2018. Jarecki said that twenty-eight (two were conflicts) are closed and eighteen cases remain open of which seven are juvenile cases. Jarecki explained to the Board that some juvenile cases take a long time to complete. Juvenile cases may remain open until the court case is resolved or the age of nineteen. Jarecki answered the Board's questions regarding conflict of interest and closed/open cases. Jarecki explained that there are times when he cannot defend the assigned case since he is already defending one of the parties involved. The Board thanked Jarecki for the updated report and his diligent services. Jarecki thanked the Board and is very appreciative of the contract for public defender services. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to accept the Boone County Public Defender report as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Will McInnis and Caitlin Schneider, East-Central District Health Department (ECDHD), presented a report of public health activities in Boone County for April 2018 through September 2018. ECDHD has provided a number of different services to the residents of Boone County. Some of the services provided were: My Health My Choice Day for 5th graders from Boone and Nance Counties who were educated on the danger of tobacco and alcohol; the WIC program; student health screenings in area schools; disease investigations; and substance abuse coalition in partnership with Boone County Health Center. The Boone County 2018-2021 CHIP priorities are obesity and substance abuse. Schneider said that Certified Application Counselors (CAC's) are available at the Boone County Health Center usually on Thursday's to assist county residents in applying for WIC programs, health care services and/or insurance.



The Board approved to move forward with the Boone/Nance 911 Communications merger, with the Boone and Nance County Sheriffs and Attorneys to prepare a three year Interlocal Agreement with a December 1, 2018 effective date at their September 17, 2018 Board meeting. Johnson and Nance County reviewed the Interlocal Agreement draft last week. Johnson and the Board discussed the revisions to the original draft. Johnson informed the Board that he would like to discuss a few more items with Nance County before final approval. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to table approval of the Boone/Nance 911 Communications merger Interlocal Agreement to a later date. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County will be accepting bids until November 9, 2018. The bid notice will run for two weeks in all of the county newspapers with the bid opening scheduled for Tuesday, November 13, 2018 at 10:00 A.M.
- The County Highway Superintendent presented the Board a written process for the upgrading/improvement of county road structures. The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed the process and the first step for a major road/bridge project is to be placed on the One & Six Year County Road Improvement Program.

Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve Resolution No. 2018-36, Certificate of Completion of NDOR Project Number: HRRR-STWD(116), LPA High Risk Rural Road Advance Railroad Warning Sign Project Program, is completed by the County of Boone, Nebraska in accordance with the terms of the Program Agreement. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Surveyor, Christopher C. Hays, Hays Land Surveying, LLC, completed a survey for the County owned property located in Blocks 4 and 5, West Petersburg Addition, Petersburg, Nebraska. The Board



discussed the property lines and removal of trees in Block 4 at prior Board meetings due to a recent land sale of adjoining property in Block 4. After completion of the survey the trees/bushes in question appear to be mostly in the alleys or on the lots south of the county property. The Board Chairman plans to visit with the adjoining land owners and the Village of Petersburg in regard to removal of some of the trees/bushes that are located in the alleys.

Due to prior lengthy discussions at Board meetings regarding the County FMLA policy, the following revisions/language clarification that was approved on June 27, 2018 were removed from the updated handbook pages until further clarification from labor law legal counsel:

- Pages 17 & 26 The paragraphs where an employee not working/receiving compensation for a 40 hour work week within two pay periods each calendar year will be subject to paying 20% of their health insurance premium, etc.
- Page 22 No employee shall be permitted to take leave without pay. Unpaid leave is when an employee qualifies for FMLA leave and all earned benefit leave (comp, sick, vacation) has been exhausted.
- Page 26 & Exhibit "I" Unpaid leave is when an employee qualifies for FMLA leave and all earned benefit leave (comp, sick, vacation) has been exhausted.
- Page 28 & Exhibit "J" Unpaid leave is when an employee qualifies for FMLA leave and all earned benefit leave (comp, sick, vacation) has been exhausted.

Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve and sign the Resolution No. 2018-39, the revised Boone County Employee Handbook changes that were approved on June 27, 2018 with the above mentioned exclusions to the revision language until further clarification regarding the County FMLA policy. Gross's message to Johnson said that the Wireless Advisory Board made a special case since Boone and Nance Counties are consolidating, they felt this was a good way to offer some incentive and to encourage others to consolidate and/or join regions. The County Longevity Program for full-time employees that was started in August 1979 will end December 21, 2018. A Merit Based Pay Program with employee performance evaluation begins for January 2019 being effective December 22, 2018 to coincide with the 22/21 pay period. An hourly wage increase of (0-12 cents) which is based on a full-time employee's performance evaluation every November will be a new benefit beginning with the January 2019 payroll to coincide with 22/21 pay period. The employee's performance evaluation is to be placed in the employee's personnel file in their respective office and the employee recommendation performance forms will be submitted to the Board for review at the first Board meeting in December each year. The Board approved an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement/Tower Use Agreement between the Nebraska Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO), an agency of the State of Nebraska and Boone County, Nebraska, a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, for installation of equipment for the Nebraska Statewide Radio System (SRS) on the new County Communications Tower located on the Boone County Fairgrounds. Within the Agreement the State of Nebraska will be taking over the maintenance of the County owned Olympian generator located at the tower site. The annual three year generator maintenance Agreement with NMC included both the Olympian generator located at the tower site and the Winco generator located at the Law Enforcement/Sheriff's office building. Rod Nelson, Maintenance, discussed the generator maintenance change with NMC. NMC provided an updated Maintenance Agreement with no change to the maintenance fee for the Winco generator and removed the Olympian generator annual maintenance fee from the County Agreement. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to approve the revised Maintenance Agreement for the annual PM3 inspection for the Winco generator fee of \$654.00 for each year through 2020. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The County Highway Superintendent updated the Board regarding road equipment repair/replacement, road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- The new propane heating system installed in the County Road Shop at Cedar Rapids is not operating correctly and has been using an average of 40 gallons of propane per day with an average of 55 degrees inside the building. The Board directed the Highway Superintendent to contact the installer again and request that a company representative be sent to the site to check the new system.
- The contractor for the construction of a 16' x 16' office/break room building for the County Road Shop District #1, Cedar Rapids informed the County Highway Superintendent that the concrete and underground wiring would possibly double in expense if they start the construction now due to the frozen ground. The road employees stated that they do not want water services to the new office/break room building addition and would like the Board to consider bringing in a pre-built or portable building to attach to the present shop building. Possible changes will be discussed with the contractor.
- Chairman Luettel had some information on Calcium Chloride (CaCl2) Dust Control material for dusty County roads. The County Highway Superintendent will check with other counties to see what type of dust control they use and how often they apply the material.

The County Highway Superintendent and the Board discussed the purchase of a tank and liquid deicing material for use by the Boone County Road Department that would be centrally located in Albion for disbursement





where needed within the County. A company contacted in Colorado had not responded to date with a quote for either the tank or liquid deicing material. A company from Iowa submitted a quote for a 6000 gallon tank with cone stand and fittings, delivered for \$7,350.00. Smith Fertilizer & Grain of Knoxville, Iowa submitted a quote for deicing liquid material at \$1.43 per gallon delivered with a minimum of 4700 gallons. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the County Highway Superintendent to purchase a 6000 gallon tank with stand and fittings for approximately \$7,350.00 and deicing liquid material delivered for approximately \$1.43 per gallon. The County Highway Superintendent presented an updated Snow Removal Plan and Policies for the Boone County Department of Roads. The snow removal plan covers the procedure that will be followed in the event of a winter snowstorm. The maps for each area of the County show priority roads for snow removal. Snow plowing will begin when snow accumulation reaches three inches or more. The 2018 Snow Removal Plan and Policies will be posted on the Boone County website. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve the Boone County Department of Roads, Snow Removal Plan and Policies, effective December 2018 as prepared and submitted by the Boone County Highway Superintendent. The Board contacted the NACO office and reviewed the information received regarding guidelines for filling county office vacancies. In a county having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants in which no county surveyor has been elected and qualified, the county board of such county shall appoint a competent surveyor either on a full-time or part-time basis from any other county of the State of Nebraska to such office. An appointed surveyor shall serve the same four-year term as that of an elected surveyor. The county board shall negotiate a contract with the surveyor, such contract shall specify the responsibility of the appointee to carry out the statutory duties of the office of county surveyor. The Board received proposals from Brent D. Cyboron, Initial Point Surveying, LLC of Grand Island, Nebraska and Christopher C. Hays, Hays Land Surveying, LLC of Osceola, Nebraska for the appointment as Boone County Surveyor. Cyboron and Hays were both present at the Board meeting and presented their respective proposal to the Board. The Board acknowledged appreciation for their interest in the appointed position. Motion made by Maricle, second by Luettel to table the decision of the appointment of a Boone County Surveyor to the December 17, 2018 Board meeting to allow the Board to further review the two proposals. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Luettel and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Maul PC LLO and attorney for the Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., and the Board discussed the Pledge Agreements with the County for the new livestock facility at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Jarecki explained how pledges would be handled after discussion with the Nebraska Community Foundation and Boone County Community Foundation. The Pledge Agreements are between the pledge donor and the Boone County Agricultural Education Center, Inc. Jarecki said that an Account Agreement will be finalized between the Boone County Community Foundation, Nebraska Community Foundation and County of Boone, Nebraska, with specific details on how the donated funds to pay for the bonds for the new livestock building at the county fairgrounds will be held and transferred. Jarecki said that the Account Agreement will come to the Board for approval once it is drafted. The application for the Boone County Agricultural Education Center, Inc. for a 501(c)(3) status is now in final form and ready for submission. The donor funds for the Boone County Agricultural Education Center, Inc. are presently being held by the Boone County Community Foundation due to no approval of the non-profit status to date. This building project needs to be transparent and have continuous communication and cooperation between the County, building advisory committee and the foundations.





The Boone County Treasurer has set up a separate account to receive the donated funds in order to pay the bonds for the building project. Any interest earned on said building bond account will also be used towards the ten year bond/interest payments. The donated funds may be made directly to the Boone County Treasurer or the Boone County Community Foundation/Boone County Agricultural Education Center, Inc.

The Board received two change orders to review for consideration for the new livestock building project for the Boone County Fairgrounds. Leo Dwyer, president of Rathman Manning Construction, explained that Change Order #2 is for additional dirt work and excavation. The original building site was too close to the new County Communications Tower, of which any building needs to be a minimum of 300 feet from the center of the communications tower. The additional dirt work and excavation costs for Change Order #2 is \$38,680.00. The additional dirt work/excavation is due to the building being straightened from the original plan of setting at an angle; moved further east from its original planned location to avoid the communications tower and recreational trail; building movement requires moving more dirt from hilly area; and during excavation a buried dump site was found under the site containing mainly metal and wood debris that needs moving. The additional cost came to \$46,680.00 and the contractor is donating \$8,000.00 in labor cost, bringing the additional dirt work total down to \$38,680.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve Change Order #2 for additional dirt work/excavation for the new fairgrounds building project in the amount of \$38,680.00 for Rathman Manning Construction as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Dwyer explained that the Change Order #1 in the amount of \$55,893.00 dealt with various changes in the building plan and the movement of the building location. Chuck Rolf, Ag Society, was asked by Pat Neidhardt why some of the plan changes were necessary for the livestock building. Rolf replied that the building advisory committee felt the change would make the building more useable. The Board decided to approve only part of the Change Order #1 requests: changing doors to double doors with card readers; added two 16'L x 10'W overhead doors; transition with doors and squaring up the class/meeting room caused changes to floor tile, etc.; double doors and hallway changes increased the size of the class/meeting room for framing/drywall/painting expense; building movement will need to extend utilities such as electrical, water, etc. lines; and install a fire hydrant and water line. The Board tabled and did not approve Div. 03 additional concrete footing expense due to cold weather - \$3,868.00 and Div. 26, 27, and 28 additional electrical work, utility hookups, panel boxes, etc. - \$50,209.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve Change Order #1 as follows: Div. 08, 09, 22, 23 and not approve/table Change Order #1 as follows: Div. 03, 26, 27, 28 as per attached change order document. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The quote received from LifeGuard MD is for a new defibrillator, Philips HeartStart Onsite with an eight year warranty for \$1,218.00. The quote of \$1,218.00 less recall rebate of \$475.00, credit of \$60.30 using existing pads; credit of \$152.10 using existing battery leaves the quote for a new defibrillator for the courthouse lobby at \$530.60. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to approve the quote from LifeGuard MD for a new defibrillator, Philips HeartStart Onsite with an eight year warranty, recall rebate, and using the existing pads/battery for a purchase of \$530.60 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denise Ziemba, Region 44 Emergency Manager, was not present at the Board meeting to present a report on emergency management activities, due to inclement weather.

Larry Bird, Friends of the Trail Committee Chair, and the Board discussed committee representatives and several other items at the November 19, 2018 Board meeting. Bird and the Board reviewed the City of Albion Ordinance No. 273 (18) regarding recreational trails rules for use and penalties. Bird asked the Board to consider the same regulations as stated in the City of Albion Ordinance for the recreational trail portion located on County property. In addition, Bird mentioned the idea of possibly lighting up the trail, but each respective land owner would be responsible for the electric light bill. Commissioner Luettel reminded those present that the Board did not approve contributing any tax funding to the "Boone County Trails System" project. The Board received information that county government statutes do not have fines and misdemeanor language that relates to recreational trails. The consensus of the Board is to prepare a resolution regarding the trail's rules for use in accordance with the City of Albion Ordinance, but not include the language in regard to fines.

The County Highway Superintendent updated the Board regarding road equipment repair/replacement, road/bridge maintenance, materials and projects. In addition, the following topics were discussed:

- No additional information received from the manufacturer in regard to the problems with the newly installed propane heating system at the County Road Shop at Cedar Rapids.
- No information received of a date to insulate the County Road Shop at Cedar Rapids.
- The breakroom addition for the County Road Shop at Cedar Rapids may become a spring project due to the frozen ground.
- The tank for the deicing liquid material arrived on December 21, 2018.
- Deicing liquid material arrived on December 26, 2018.





The Board approved the purchase of deicing liquid material from an Iowa Company at their December 10, 2018 Board meeting. The County Highway Superintendent informed the Board on December 17, 2018 that a Colorado Company deicing liquid material price was significantly lower than the Iowa Company. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to rescind the motion of December 10, 2018 that approved the purchase of deicing liquid material at \$1.43 per gallon delivered with a minimum of 4700 gallons from Smith Fertilizer & Grain of Knoxville, Iowa. Motion made by Luettel, second by Maricle to purchase deicing liquid material (NexGen Torch) from GMCO Corporation of Rifle, Colorado for \$1.15 per gallon delivered. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Maricle and Rasmussen. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed change orders on December 10, 2018 with Leo Dwyer, president of Rathman Manning Construction, for the new livestock building project for the Boone County Fairgrounds. The Board tabled and did not approve Div. 26, 27, and 28 which included additional electrical work, utility hookups, panel boxes, etc. - \$50,209.00 at their Board meeting on December 10, 2018.

Leo Dwyer, president of Rathman Manning Construction, and Van Galusha, Galusha Electric, presented Change Order #003, 004A and 004B for Div. 25, 26 and 27 for the new livestock building project at the Boone County Fairgrounds. The Board, Dwyer, Galusha, Chuck Rolf, Boone County Agricultural Society, Inc., and by teleconference Ryan Stearns, Architect, reviewed and discussed the three change orders. Change Order #003 is for a 3-phase hook up with Loup Power and install 570' of conduit underground; repairs of concrete and asphalt from trenching; control button module change; and light fixture change for \$10,747.00. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve Change Order #003 for additional electrical work for the new fairgrounds building project in the amount of \$10,747.00 for Rathman Manning Construction as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Maricle, Rasmussen and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Change Order #004A is for the installation of two additional new panels and eighty additional Twist Lock Receptacles on arena ceiling (no cord drops) for \$52,574.00. The Boone County Ambulance Service submitted an uncollectible ambulance accounts for the Board to review as all methods of collection have been exhausted. The recommendation from the Boone County Ambulance Service liaison is to remove the \$2,230.00 for a July 9, 2018 ambulance service from the EMS Billing Services account for purposes of bookkeeping and turn the account over to the County Attorney to attempt further collection. Motion made by Luettel, second by Rasmussen to turn the July 9, 2018 County Ambulance Service account balance of \$2,230.00 over to the County Attorney for further collection and for the County Attorney to promptly pursue action for collection since the account is for a deceased individual. Roll call vote: Yeas: Luettel, Rasmussen and Maricle. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Tanya Sharp, Boone County Health Center, President/Chief Executive Officer, presented a Home Health Agency Renewal Licensure Application for the Board to review. The Boone County Health Center real estate is currently owned by the County of Boone, Nebraska, a governmental agency. The Boone County Trails System is intended primarily for pedestrian and bicycling use. Motion made by Rasmussen, second by Maricle to approve Resolution No. 2018-41, trail's rules in regard to the Boone County Trails System located on County property. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rasmussen, Maricle and Luettel. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, Sheriff, presented a Professional Services Agreement with Stacen Gross, SCG Consulting Services, LLC, for the Board to review in regard to the Boone and Nance County Sheriff's offices 911 Communications merger. Gross services will provide oversight with regard to the technology aspects of the consolidation of services specifically including vendor equipment changes and new software and hardware implementations and other relevant project tasks. The work will continue for a six month term beginning January 1, 2019 at \$625.00 per month to coincide with the planned transition of emergency 911 dispatch service from Nance County to Boone County. Motion made by Maricle, second by Rasmussen to approve and authorize the Board Chairman to sign the Professional Services Agreement by and between, Boone County, Nebraska, Nance County, Nebraska and SCG Consulting Services, LLC of Bellevue, Nebraska for consultant services for the Boone and Nance County Sheriff's offices 911 Communications merger as presented.
