



2022 REORGANIZATIONAL MEETING BOONE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALBION, NEBRASKA

The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska convened at 9:00 A.M. on Thursday, January 6, 2022, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Larry Temme, Chairman, called the Reorganizational Meeting to order as required by Nebraska State Statute. Commissioners present for roll call were Larry Temme, Ben Rutten and Jon Lindgren. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication in the Albion News and Boone County Tribune and Petersburg Press on December 22, 2021 and the convened meeting was open to the public.

The agenda was posted on the Boone County website; posted on the information board located in the Courthouse north entrance; emailed to the Board of Commissioners; and emailed to the Elected Officials and department heads on Tuesday, January 4, 2022. Chairman Temme acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. All who were present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to appoint Larry Temme as Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year 2022. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten and Lindgren. Abstain: Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to appoint Ben Rutten as Vice Chairman of the Boone County Board of Commissioners for the year 2022. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme and Lindgren. Abstain: Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren that the budget committee for the ensuing 2022-2023 budget year is the Boone County Board of Commissioners, Boone County Clerk and Boone County Treasurer. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to reappoint Schmeits, Mueller & Martinsen, P.C., Richard Martinsen, CPA, Albion, Nebraska, to prepare the County Budget for the 2022-2023 budget year, to be paid from the County General fund. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Lindgren and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to appoint Daniel L. Stankoski, Fullerton, Nebraska, a full-time county employee as Boone County Highway Superintendent with a Class A License #S-1512, under the supervision of the County Board for 2022, with a stipulation of annual evaluations. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to reappoint Christopher C. Hays, Osceola, Nebraska, as Boone County Surveyor for a four-year term commencing January 3, 2019 through December 31, 2022, per contract for services as provided in State Statute Section 23-1901.01. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve County meal reimbursable dollar amount, as referenced in the Boone County Employee Handbook, for 2022 overnight travel policy: (1) Includes reimbursement by submitting an itemized receipt for actual expense up to \$11.00 for breakfast, \$12.00 for lunch and \$23.00 for supper; (2) No reimbursement of meals for one day travel; (3) If an unforeseen situation occurs for one day travel and return is after 7:00 P.M., the meal may be reimbursed and will be taxed and added to the employee W-2; (4) Itemized receipts are required for all travel expenses. used beginning April 29, 2022 and before December 21, 2022, if floating holiday is not used by employee, employee shall lose the benefit. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren that (1) the following will serve on the Safety Committee for 2022: Region 44 Emergency Management Director; County Sheriff; Board of Commissioners; County Highway Superintendent; County ADA Coordinator; and Custodial Maintenance Supervisor; (2) a tornado drill will be held in March at the same time/date as the Statewide tornado drill; (3) fire drills will be conducted in May and October; (4) Ben Rutten, Commissioner, will serve as safety chair and Rod Nelson, Maintenance, courthouse safety coordinator; and (5) the Safety Committee meetings are tentatively scheduled for February 28, May 16, August 15, and November 21, 2022, commencing at 9:00 A.M. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Lindgren and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren that the Boone County Board of Commissioners will hold their Board meetings on Monday's except for the first Monday of each month; no meeting scheduled for May 31; and when a payroll meeting is scheduled on a different day of the week than Monday in the year 2022, commencing at 9:00 A.M. Meeting dates/times are subject to change due to state statute regulations. Monday meetings that are on holidays will be held on Tuesday. The Accounts Payable Vendor meeting will be on the second Monday of the month and other Mondays will be regular public meetings. The Board meeting dates for 2022 were approved on November 8, 2021 and payroll meetings are subject to change from Monday to a different day for approval by the Board with the implementation of the time clock/attendance system and the 22/21 pay period. The Board meeting dates for payroll approval are as follows: January 26, February 24, March 28, April 27, May 25, June 27, July 27, August 29, September 26, October 26, November 28 and December 28, 2022. The County Clerk's office has charge and authority of the agenda for all meetings. The agenda will be made available for all meetings on the Boone County Website and the bulletin board located in the north courthouse entrance. Also, the following will be used to post notices in advance for emergency meetings and meetings that cannot be published in the legal newspaper(s): Boone County Website; Boone County Courthouse; lobbies of the Boone County Bank; Cornerstone Bank; Homestead Bank; and Albion News Office all located in Albion, NE. In addition, the Cedar Rapids State Bank, Cedar Rapids, NE; Cornerstone Bank, St. Edward, NE; and Great Plains State Bank, Petersburg, NE. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. The Grievance Procedure in the Employee Handbook says the County will use a Grievance Board consisting of five people. Correspondence from the Internal Revenue Service, Small Business-Excise Tax Unit was received in August 2021 for an audit on the reimbursement of \$9,180.75 for calendar year 2018. The County responded with the requested documentation on September 8, 2021 and again on November 17, 2021. After review, the IRS determined that the County did not follow the correct protocol outlined in Publication 510 for the purchasing and submission of qualified fuel transactions. Per Publication 510, to make a fuel transaction eligible the transaction needed to be paid for by a credit card. The County uses the Vendor/Check process and therefore these transactions were submitted in error. Motion made by Temme, second by Rutten to sign the IRS Form 5384, Excise Tax Examination Changes and Consent to Assessment and Collection as well as approving the reimbursement of \$10,055.35 to the United States Treasury. would help the landowners since the pipeline could still pursue litigation. All parties agreed to continue learning about this pipeline as more information is sent out and presented. No action taken at this time.

Steve Pritchard, Extension Educator, was present to discuss a UNL quote for a new laptop. The quote contained four different proposals with varying differences. Pritchard said that he preferred the laptop with a dual monitor for a cost share price of \$1,873.68. - Annual bridge inspection has been completed with no major problems to report.
- Currently working on sign inventory and replacement.

To store an ambulance unit, the building must be a Category IV – which has specifications for what it can withstand and still be operational. It also has requirements on how to secure the unit as well. For the hospital to utilize this building it would have to have two stalls. One would be for hospital maintenance storage and the other for the county ambulance unit. Murphy would help by applying for grants and Sharp stated that she had been contacted regarding donations possibly being given for the construction of the building. Any amount remaining would be split 50/50 between the County and the Hospital. Sharp stated that the Hospital would want to own the building when everything was paid for and after discussion with the County Attorney it was determined that the Hospital would then be responsible for the bidding process. Lindsey Jarecki and Todd Ford, Boone County Beginnings, were present to discuss the feedback they had received from local, licensed daycare providers. They presented a handout of where the local small businesses were hit the hardest – increased employee pay without increased daycare costs. Discussion went over the process the County is drafting and requested that the types of licenses and qualifications be relayed to the County Clerk's office to help get a chart started. Future meetings will need to be held before anything is implemented. No action taken at this time.

Ed Knott, Applied Connective Technologies, was present to discuss the Joint Memorandum of Understanding between three other counties, Loup Power District and NPPD for broadband services. At this time the County has only committed to looking into the service further without dedicating a monetary amount. Neal Suess, Loup Power District, had emailed earlier in the month stating that further steps would need to be taken soon. Knott and the Board discussed the costs/funding and overall advantages of having this service expanded to more parts of the County. The Board thanked Knott for his continued opinion – no action was taken at this time.

The County of Boone, Nebraska is the owner of the real estate being a fractional part of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) of Section Twenty-eight (28), Township Twenty (20) North, Range Six (6) West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska commonly known as the Boone County Fairgrounds. The County Board of Commissioners has power to lease or sell real estate owned by the County in accordance with Nebraska State Statutes. The County Board shall hold an open and public hearing in accordance with Nebraska State Statute §23-107.01 prior to any such lease at which time any interested party may appear and speak for or against the lease and raise any issue concerning the County Board leasing said property. A public notice of any such public hearing shall be run once each week for two consecutive weeks prior to the hearing date. Randall Bruland, Ambulance Administrator, was present to discuss two quotes for new tires for the County Ambulance unit. Bruland stated that in prior years if the tires got around 40,000 miles on them, they were prone to blowouts. The current tires on the unit have around 30,000 miles on them. One quote from Kav Tire & Lube was for \$2,648.40 for 6 tires and the other was from Main Street Auto Sales & Services for \$2,702.40 for 6 tires. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve the quote from Main Street Auto Sales & Services for approximately \$2,702.40 as presented with the used tires going to the County Road department if they can use them. No action taken at this time.

Tim Cornwell and Gary Juracek, Nance County Supervisors, were present in person instead of videoconference as was scheduled. Both Nance and Boone Counties are involved with a pending broadband project with Loup Power District to be funded by the four counties involved, Federal Grants and the Infrastructure Bill that was recently passed. To date, the County has not pledged any monetary amount and the Power Districts involved have not either. All present discussed the project and what they could/would pledge when asked to. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to pledge 7.5% of Boone County's portion of the project, \$225,000.00, from ARPA funds when and if the project gets to that point. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren and Temme. Nays: Rutten. Motion carried.

To remain in compliance with the American Rescue Plan Act reporting guidelines, the County must submit a Project and Expenditure Report by April 30, 2022. The prepared report was presented to the Board for their





review. For the reporting period, funds have been expended for Lutz & Company, PC consulting services and funds have been obligated for some PPE air purifier units around the courthouse. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve the report as submitted and authorize the County Clerk to submit it before the deadline. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The 2021-2022 County budget was adopted on August 26, 2021 and Resolution No. 2021-36 was approved on October 12, 2021 authorizing the Boone County Treasurer to transfer funds from the General Fund (0100) to the Road Fund (0200) for the 2021-2022 Tax Year on an as needed basis. The transfer will be done through the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims process. Motion made by Temme, second by Rutten to authorize the Boone County Treasurer to transfer the amount of \$500,000.00 from the General Fund (0100) to the Road Fund (0200) through the Vendor Claims process for Transfer #4. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Rutten and Lindgren. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board received and reviewed three quotes for the remaining 2021-2022 fiscal year copy paper. The quote request was for 10-12 cases of no less than 96 bright and no less than 20 lb. paper. The cases are to be delivered at one time no later than May 1, 2022. A case of copy paper is 10 reams/5,000 sheets. The quotes received were: Albion News and Boone County Tribune - \$47.50 per case; One Office Solution - \$59.99 per case; and Eakes Office Solutions - \$50.00 per case. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to accept the copy paper quote from Albion News and Boone County Tribune and approve ordering the twelve cases as one order at \$47.50 per case for the remaining 2021-2022 fiscal year. During the Highway Superintendent General Report given by Dan Stankoski at the April 11 meeting, tractor leases were discussed briefly. Stankoski said that one unit will need repairs before it's operational, but he does not foresee the repairs lasting long. Stankoski presented a quote he received from Dinkel's for leasing a tractor instead of purchasing due to current pricing being around \$135,000.00. The quote is for \$35.00 per engine hour, with a minimum paid of 10 hours a week. The Boone County Board of Commissioners of Boone County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:01 A.M. on Monday, May 9, 2022, in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Courthouse in Albion, Nebraska.

Chairman Temme called the meeting to order, and Commissioners present for roll call were Ben Rutten, Larry Temme and Jon Lindgren. Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication in the Albion News and Boone County Tribune and the Petersburg Press on May 4, 2022, and the convened meeting was open to the public.

The agenda was posted on the Boone County website; posted on the information board located in the Courthouse north entrance; emailed to the Board of Commissioners; and emailed to the Elected Officials and department heads on Friday, May 13, 2022. Chairman Temme acknowledged the agenda and noted that the Open Meeting Laws are posted and available to the public. All who were present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to approve the County Board Proceedings of April 27, 2022 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Lindgren and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ed Hoevet Excavating won the bid for the Petersburg East (130th Street Culvert) project and the first payment was made in April 2022. A Certificate of Substantial Completion and an Application for Final Payment/Payment No. 2 were presented to the Board due to the work being completed. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to accept and authorize the Chairman to sign the Certificate of Substantial Completion and Application for Payment No. 2, Final Payment to Ed Hoevet Excavating for \$63,381.31 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Rutten and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Denny Johnson, County Sheriff, presented a quote from Platte Valley Auto Mart for a 2020 Dodge Durango. Johnson explained that he tried to get additional quotes but could not find any other vendors with a law enforcement vehicle on the lot or with any arriving in the near future due to supply shortages. Motion made by Rutten, second by Temme to approve the Platte Valley Auto Mart quote for a 2020 Dodge Durango for approximately \$34,512.00 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Temme and Lindgren. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims filed for payment from the various funds: General - \$603,055.58; Road - \$278, 206.14; ROD Preservation/Modernization (1150) - \$221.68; Inheritance Tax Fund (2700) - \$58,500.00; 911 Emergency Management (2910) - \$514; 911 Wireless Service (2913) - \$427.37; and Ambulance (5502) - \$8,088.97. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

With the Commissioners approving the resignations of three County Road employees the County is required by statute to process their payroll in a timely manner, even if it means doing it out of a payroll cycle. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to approve the payroll claim filed for payment on the Road Fund for net amount of \$5,108.96 with the withholding amounts being included in the above approved Accounts Payable Vendor Claims as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Rutten and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Kenny Carter was present per written request from the County Attorney's office to discuss a ditch issue on 325th Avenue. Also present for discussion was John Morgan, County Attorney via telephone; Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent; and Brian McDonald, JEO Consulting Group. The Board addressed the fact the ditch





had been dug out/altered without prior approval and is now uncompliant with state standards. If an accident were to happen, then the County could be liable. Motion made by Temme, second by Rutten to give Carter until December 1st to bring the ditch up to state standards. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Rutten and Lindgren. Nays: None.

The Board was notified that the County's health insurance was increasing by 17.14% and the dental insurance was increasing by 5.87%. Thirteen employees attended the meeting to discuss different ideas regarding the different deductible plans. The County has had the \$1,500.00 deductible plan for years, but this year BlueCross BlueShield is reworking their deductibles. The comparable plan would then be the \$1,600.00 deductible. The County currently pays the employee's premium (self/spouse/family) and single dental. With the increase of cost, the new health insurance premium would be \$2,522.79 for the most expensive plan – employee/family. Some ideas for cost savings were to raise the deductible plan/pay down the employee's deductible or for the county to adopt a cash in lieu policy. The Board gave everyone attending until next week to think on what was discussed and then would be picked back up at May 16, 2022 meeting.

Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to approve the following reports of the County Officials as presented for April 2022:

Rod Nelson, Courthouse Maintenance, was present to discuss the courthouse's lawnmower. Nelson had taken it in to be worked on and was told that it would need a new engine. He presented quotes for two new lawnmowers, a lease option, and an estimate for the motor replacement. The quotes for a new lawnmower were for \$16,700.00 and \$21,625.00, but they would not be available for around six months. The motor to fix the current lawnmower was estimated at \$4,500.00-5,000.00, but Nelson was told this would also take six months to receive then replace. Kayton International does have lawnmowers available to lease that the County could use while waiting for the new units and/or motor. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to lease a 2022 Grasshopper lawnmower from Kayton International for the summer at a rate of \$13.50 per tach hour. John Kuehn, Sand Creek Strategy Group, LLC/Navigator CO₂ Ventures LLC; Andy Roberts, Valero-Albion; and Ralph and Deb Schmadeke were present to discuss the CO₂ pipeline going through Boone County in the near future. Kuehn went over the size of pipe that would be installed, the pipe design and welding process specific to liquid CO₂, the 5 foot depth of installation and the continually monitoring of the pipeline that will take place after the project is up and running. Roberts went over Valero's responsibilities to their employees and community as well as the facilities that will be built to start the pipeline. Roberts went into great detail the safety precautions such as manual and remote valves that will be installed so that if anything was detected through the compression process that was in error the facility could be shut down. Schmadeke addressed their concerns over the letter that was mailed out at the beginning of the project as well as the fact that Navigator CO₂ Ventures LLC has never installed CO₂ infrastructure before. Schmadeke's asked the Board if a group opposing the pipeline could present to them as well. The Board assured them that they could and that they would just have to get on the agenda for further discussion. The Board thanked everyone present for their opinions and discussion. No action was taken.

Due to the number of people attending, the Board moved the meeting to the Courtroom. The 2022-2023 BlueCross BlueShield insurance policy was discussed on May 9th and readdressed at today's meeting. Health Savings Accounts were brought up briefly and upon review are only available for the two highest deductible plans – the Board did not want to pursue such high deductibles. Health Reimbursement Accounts (HRA) or Deductible Buy-Down options were discussed as well. It was found out that this option is available through First Concord who would be responsible for the monitoring of each employee's deductible and when to bill the county. First Concord would also administer the Cash in Lieu (CIL) policy as well. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to approve the \$1,600.00 deductible plan and Dental PPO Plan (Premier Option 3), with an HRA of \$100.00 Employee/\$100.00 Spouse or Family (\$200.00 Total), and a CIL of \$400.00 per month with no BCBS dental being offered if CIL is selected – all to be



effective on July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 and authorize the Chairman to sign the 2022 NACO Subgroup Application. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Temme and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board conducted the rest of the meeting back in the Commissioners Meeting Room. Ed Knott, Applied Connective Technologies, was present to discuss the 2022-2023 IT and SaaS agreements along with the County's cybersecurity. Knott went on to explain that the IT agreement was changed due to the County having exceeded the last two fiscal year's blocked time. It was broken down into four categories: Managed Device Plan, Managed Server Plan, Managed Network Plan and Managed Cloud Services Plan. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the 2022-2023 IT Service Agreement for approximately \$29,760.00 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Rutten and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Knott also explained the SaaS (Software as a Service) Agreement that was also presented. This agreement includes email hosting, firewall, Cylance, Ironscales, and Ninja RMM services. These are remote services that help keep the County secure. NIRMA hosted a Cyber Security conference that highlighted the importance of such programs to safeguard the County. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the 2022-2023 SaaS Agreement for approximately \$13,020.00 as presented, with it automatically renewing for successive terms. Steve Pritchard, Extension Educator, was present to discuss an Employment Contract between Boone County 4-H and Boone County to employ a summer intern for the Extension Office. The County is to pay up to \$500.00 through the vendor process with the remaining portion paid by Boone County 4-H. Through the application process Pritchard selected Lauren Seier of Petersburg, NE for this position. Her employ will be from May 23-July 22, 2022. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to accept the Employment Contract as presented and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Contract. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Pritchard also presented the Board with a quote from Applied Connective Technologies for videoconference equipment in the Extension Office's Conference Room. The Board reviewed the audit report for fiscal year end June 30, 2021. They acknowledged that the notice of audit was published in the Albion News and Boone County Tribune on May 25, 2022 and was filed on the Federal Audit Clearinghouse website to comply with the Federal Single Audit requirements. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to accept the audit report for fiscal year end June 30, 2021. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jerad Reimers, Community Liaison for Adrian Smith, was present by telephone to update the Board on the congressman's activities and federal issues. The Board and Reimers discussed several agricultural issues. Citizens that have any issues with Federal agencies are to direct the issues to the congressman's office in Grand Island, Nebraska for assistance. Reimers also updated the Board that Congressman Smith is the ranking member for trade, so he leads discussions on trade issues.

Last year was the first year the Board had a public meeting for all county employees to attend to discuss wage, insurance and the county's budget outside of working hours. The turnout and overall feedback was positive, so the Board wanted to hold another County Employee Public Meeting for fiscal year 2022-2023. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to authorize the County Clerk to advertise the public meeting for June 6, 2022 at 5:30 P.M. in the Dining Hall of the Events Center at the Boone County Fairgrounds. The 2021-2022 County budget was adopted on August 26, 2021 and Resolution No. 2021-36 was approved on October 12, 2021 authorizing the Boone County Treasurer to transfer funds from the General Fund (0100) to the Road Fund (0200) for the 2021-2022 Tax Year on an as needed basis. The transfer will be done through the Accounts Payable Vendor Claims process. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to authorize the Boone County Treasurer to transfer the amount of \$500,000.00 from the General Fund (0100) to the Road Fund (0200) through the Vendor Claims process for Transfer #5. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Lindgren and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jerry Carder was present to discuss tree/tree limb removal and ditch clean up on his property on 300th Street. A county resident was moving a house and was concerned that the trees on Carder's property would damage the house when using 300th Street. Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, had county road employees use an excavator to take care of the overhanging limbs. Carder stated that he was not contacted beforehand or given a chance to correct the issue himself. Carder does not believe the trimmed trees will survive with the condition they were left in. Carder has talked to Stankoski, and nothing has been done since their discussion. The Board and Stankoski stated that the Road Department is short staffed and wouldn't be able to get out there immediately. Carder suggested that his hired hand, Dan Choat, would do the work and the County would reimburse him for that expense. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to approve the employee's wage increase of \$0.50 per hour, within his classification range, effective May 22, 2022. JEO Consulting Group notified the Board that the Petersburg East (130th Street Culvert) Project is complete. With this JEO sent the Board Change Order No. 1, a Certificate of Substantial Completion and Application for Payment No. 2/Final for A&R Construction. The Change Order No. 1 was a credit of \$600.00 for overestimating the water to be used. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to approve Change Order No. 1 for \$600.00 credit, Certificate of Substantial Completion and Application for Payment for the remaining balance of \$14,281.07 as presented and to authorize the Chairman to sign the three documents. Upon the Board's request, Ed Knott of Applied Connective Technologies prepared two comparable quotes for a new server for the county. The current server is close to the end of its life use. With more data being saved to the County's network and server more storage will be needed. Quote 3237 was for a larger Dell PowerEdge T640 Server and Quote 3238 was for a smaller Dell PowerEdge T350 Server. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve the Applied Connective Technologies Quote 3237 for approximately \$11,695.00 with 3 year warranty as presented to be paid out of the ARPA fund. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Lindgren and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At the May 16, 2022 meeting the Board decided the NACO BlueCross BlueShield deductible plan, HRA amount and Cash-In-Lieu amount. Part of their decision at that meeting was if the employee opted out of the County's health insurance and signed up for Cash-In-Lieu (CIL) they would not be eligible for the County's single dental policy. It was discovered that if the motion stood as is the employee would not be eligible for NACO's Long Term Disability (LTD) or NACO's automatic \$15,000.00 life insurance policy either. The County's BCBS representative suggested that the Board amend their motion for the employee to still be eligible for the LTD and life insurance policy. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to offer the NACO BCBS Single Dental coverage to employees who opt out of the County's health insurance to remain eligible for the NACO BCBS Long Term Disability and the \$15,000.00 Life Insurance. Per NACO's guidance, the Board signed an Engagement Letter for consulting services with the firm Lutz & Company, PC. The term of their services is due to expire on June 30, 2022. The convened hearing was open to the public.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions concerning the approval or denial of an Application for Conditional Use Permit submitted by GGP, LLC for the modification of an existing enclosed animal feeding operation from two (2) separate units allowing twenty-five hundred (2,500) animal units (AU) per building into one (1) facility allowing five thousand (5,000) animal units (AU) to be housed in this proposed single enclosed livestock facility structure. Location for the proposed facility is in the West half (W1/2) of Section Twenty-Eight (28), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Seven (7) West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska and is located on 180th Avenue between 380th and 390th Streets in Boone County, Nebraska. This property is owned by GGP, LLC and is located in the A-1 Primary Agricultural District.

Jeff Jarecki and Brock Pillen, representatives for GGP, LLC, were present on behalf of the Applicant. Jarecki and Pillen stated that the lagoon at the old location would still be utilized only if needed and that the product would be transferred by trucking only. There are currently two pits at the new location for use, so Pillen didn't anticipate needing the old location frequently. The new facility will absorb the current permit only when it is fully operational and the old facility will lose its livestock use. However, the old facility will still be utilized – just in a different capacity.

Commissioners Rutten read the Conditions for Permit #C-225 and they were as follows:

- Lagoon located in the Southwest Quarter in Section Thirty-Three (33), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Seven (7) West of the 6th P.M., Boone County, Nebraska may be utilized via NDEE Practical Permits
- May utilize current building until the new enclosed facility is completed and ready for use.





• Permission by the Boone County Commissioners shall be necessary to allow effluent to be transferred by a "DEE" quality transfer hose for injecting the effluent into the ground of approved fields. This hose may be laid near or on the Right-of-Way closest to the field from the effluent pumping machine.

Notice of the public hearing was given in advance by publication in the Albion News and Boone County Tribune for three consecutive weeks on July 20 and 27, 2022 and August 3, 2022. The public hearing notice was posted on the Boone County website; posted on the information board located in the Courthouse north entrance; emailed to the Board of Commissioners; and emailed to the Elected Officials and department heads on Friday, August 5, 2022. The convened hearing was open to the public.

The purpose of the public hearing was to hear testimony in favor of, opposition to, and to answer questions in relation thereto the proposed vacation of a portion of county road right-of-way:

A portion of Third Street specifically described as beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 17, Block 4, Loretto, Nebraska, running thence East 80 feet; running thence North 780 feet, running thence West 80 feet, running thence South 780 feet to the point of beginning. Said proposed vacated road running along the East side of Cedar and Elm Streets and Blocks 1 and 4, all located in Loretto, Nebraska.

On June 21, 2022 the Board appointed Dan Stankoski, County Highway Superintendent, to complete a feasibility study regarding a portion of Elm Street, lying South of Lot 17, Block 1, Loretto, Nebraska; further described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest Corner of Lot 17, thence South 100 feet; then East 60 feet parallel with the South line of Lot 17; thence North 100 feet to the Southeast corner of Lot 17; thence West 60 feet to the point of beginning; and a portion of Third Street specifically described as beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 17, Block 4, Loretto, Nebraska, running thence East 80 feet; running thence North 780 feet, running thence West 80 feet, running thence South 780 feet to the point of beginning. Said proposed vacated road running along the East side of Cedar and Elm Streets and Blocks 1 and 4, all located in Loretto, Nebraska.

On July 11, 2022 the Board and Dan Stankoski, County Highway discussed the feasibility study completed by Stankoski. Stankoski proposed that no part of Elm Street be vacated, but the County could proceed with vacating Third Street with all Right-of-Way(ROW) rights reverting to adjacent landowners. Jeff Jarecki, Jarecki Sharp & Petersen PC LLO was sent a copy of the feasibility study. Jarecki responded with a Legal Analysis that was given to the Board, Highway Superintendent and County Attorney for review. Jarecki's legal analysis requested that the Board not revert ROW rights to adjacent landowners in the traditional sense due to pre-existing buildings being split in the middle. The Board set the public hearing for August 8, 2022 at 11:00 for vacation of a portion of Third Street specifically described as beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 17, Block 4, Loretto, Nebraska, running thence East 80 feet; running thence North 780 feet, running thence West 80 feet, running thence South 780 feet to the point of beginning. Said proposed vacated road running along the East side of Cedar and Elm Streets and Blocks 1 and 4, all located in Loretto, Nebraska.





The Board, Stankoski, Mangelsen, Johnson's and Jarecki discussed his proposal. All landowners were in agreement that dividing Third Street in equal portions would be acceptable to them. Jarecki stated that the street would need to be surveyed in order to get the legal descriptions established for the four parcels. Discussion was had on who would pay for the surveying services. It was determined that the landowners involved would pay the surveying fee.

Motion made by Lindgren, second by Rutten to approve the County Board Public Hearing Proceedings for a Vacation of County Road of August 8, 2022. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Rutten and Temme. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to approve the County Board of Equalization Proceedings of August 8, 2022 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Temme and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Commissioner Ben Rutten, Chairman of the Boone County Safety Committee, opened the safety meeting at 9:01 A.M. to discuss routine business. The following committee members were present for the quarterly meeting: Commissioners Ben Rutten, Larry Temme and Jon Lindgren; Rod Nelson, Courthouse Maintenance; Jacqueline Wells, Veterans Service Officer; and Sarah Robinson, County Clerk. Old business that was addressed/reviewed: (1) Concrete work for the generator – concrete work is complete, we are still waiting on the generator delivery; (2) Concrete steps-Sheriff's Office – The concrete step work is complete; (3) NIRMA Training – Johnson is still trying to set a date for Fire and Safety training. New business that was addressed/reviewed: (1) Safety Drills – There will be a fire drill coming up in September or October. One liability claim was filed for multiple county vehicles due to the Hail Storm and one workman's comp claim was filed. Both cases are still open. The Safety Committee meeting was adjourned by Commissioner Ben Rutten, Chairman of the Boone County Safety Committee at 9:15 A.M. The next quarterly Safety Meeting is tentatively scheduled for Monday, November 21, 2022.

At the August 8, 2022 meeting the Board reviewed eight sealed bids that were received by the 10:00 A.M. deadline. The Board tabled awarding the project due to the need to verify all the bidders. It was found by JEO Consulting Group, Inc that the lowest bidder was not registered correctly. Motion made by Temme, second by





Rutten to award Project 211296.00, Primrose Northeast (270th Street) Project to the lowest verified bid by A&R Construction Co. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Rutten and Lindgren. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Rick Martinsen, Mueller & Honcik PC, discussed the preliminary 2022-2023 County Budget with the Board. The Board and Martinsen discussed the preliminary 2022-2023 budget requests submitted by the county departments. The Inheritance Tax Fund has been used for several years to reduce the county's property tax request, resulting in a low levy. The Board expressed their concerns regarding the continued push from Legislature to eliminate the Inheritance Tax revenue counties receive. The tax request rate with the budget as is would be 0.173547. With that in mind the Board discussed possibly raising the tax request to 0.18 in anticipation of the Inheritance Tax revenue eventually being gone. This would be an increase from the 2021-2022 levy tax rate of 0.170066. Martinsen stated that he would continue to work on the budget for the Board to further review at their August 22, 2022 meeting. Motion made by Rutten, second by Temme to accept and file the preliminary 2022-2023 County Budget with changes to be made as discussed and presented at the August 22, 2022 meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Temme and Lindgren. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board met briefly with the available Department Heads to discuss their office budgets. The budgets that were discussed were Commissioners, Clerk, Treasurer, Assessor, County/District Court, Public Defender, Road, and Miscellaneous. Due to Martinsen being directed to raise the levy tax rate to 0.18 there may be changes to the budget, but it will be discussed at the August 22, 2022 meeting if needed. No action taken.

Andy Forney, D.A. Davidson & Co., was present to discuss the Limited Tax County Road Bonds, Series 2021 and possibly using received FEMA/NEMA funds to prepay on the principal amount. Forney told the Board that if the County were to move forward with prepaying then they would have to do it in \$5,000.00 increments and use a broker to hold the bonds until they will be called in 2027 which would result in an administration fee. This option would get the prepaid bonds off of the County's books but would need to get a resolution in place to do so. With the low interest rate the County has now the savings would be minimal. The Board decided to make any changes to the payment schedule, no action taken at this time.

Rori Erickson and Chuck Rolf, Boone County Ag Society, were present to discuss a possible dog park on the County's property around the Fairgrounds area. The Board and Erickson discussed other possible choices. Erickson stated that she couldn't apply for any grants or form a 501(c)(3) until a parcel was secured. Erickson thought a portion between the shooting range and the arena would work but was told that not all of that area was owned by the County. Erickson also stated that to be an acceptable dog park it would have to at least be 1-1.5 acres. Erickson stated that she would contact the Board with an update at a later time. No action taken by the Board.

Chuck Rolf, Boone County Ag Society, was present to discuss the proposed levy allocation from the Ag Society. Rolf stated that the portion of the levy allocation that goes into their General Fund would not cover the costs of the fair by itself. The Board asked if it would be possibly for an expenditure/revenue spreadsheet could be kept for the next fair to go along with the levy allocation request for next year's budget. The primary use of the Boone County Visitors Promotion Fund is to promote, encourage and attract visitors to come to the county through advertisement of the event. The Boone County Visitors Promotion Committee received two requests for advertisement funding.

St. John's The Baptist Catholic Church requested assistance to advertise the St. John's Bazaar Fall Festival event scheduled for September 4, 2022. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to approve the application requesting funding assistance from the St. John's The Baptist Catholic Church for the St. John's Bazaar Fall Festival event from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as submitted. Roll call vote: Yeas: Temme, Lindgren and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Rae Valley Heritage Association requested assistance to advertise the Nebraska State Antique Tractor and Horse Plowing Bee event scheduled for August 26, 27 and 28, 2022. Motion made by Temme, second by Lindgren to approve the application requesting funding assistance from the Rae Valley Heritage Association for the Nebraska State Tractor and Horse Plowing Bee event from the Visitor's Promotion Fund as submitted. Motion made by Rutten, second by Temme to approve the County Board Proceedings of August 15, 2022 as presented. Roll call vote: Yeas: Rutten, Temme and Lindgren. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Ralph and Deb Schmadeke were present to discuss the Heartland Greenway CO₂ Pipeline with the proposed installation being in 2024. Andy Roberts, Valero and John Kuehn, Sand Creek Strategy Group, LLC; were also present. Schmadeke's have dedicated a lot of their own time to educate themselves on this topic and feel that the pipeline is not in the best interest of county residents. Some of their concerns are: the easements for the pipeline and if they could be purchased by a third party; what power does the county have and who would be in charge from the county to oversee the install; and a leak if one should happen – how would the county respond and who would be responsible for damages? Schmadeke's passed out a handout that they prepared that had a lot of material to review. This packet was emailed to the County Attorney, Zoning Administrator and Emergency Manager for their review. Roberts and Kuehn responded saying that they intend to do the process right and negate the chances of anything negatively impacting the community and that the process itself is still in the beginning phases. More discussion on this matter will need to take place, but no action was taken at this time.

Lindsey Jarecki, Boone County Beginnings; Michelle Olson, BCDA, Inc; Ryan Robinson, Riverside School Board Candidate; were present to discuss the ARPA funds awarded to the County and the daycare process previously discussed. Upon discussion with Jarecki, who had a meeting with local daycare providers, it sounded like although the ARPA funds would help those businesses it would just be temporary aid to a bigger problem. It was proposed to swing the project in a different direction toward after school programs for the St. Edward and Riverside school systems to help with daycare shortages in those communities. ARPA funds could be used toward initial investments to get the programs started if the schools were interested and Boone Central's program could be used as a guide. This will be discussed again at the September 12 meeting with those interested in possibly participating. No action taken at this time.

On or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority shall submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board. The Boone County Board of Commissioners received levy allocation requests from various political subdivisions for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to approve Resolution No. 2022-24 authorizing levy allocation request for the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year with the Budget Hearing set for August 29, 2022 and the Joint Public Hearing set for September 26, 2022. Roll call vote: Yeas: Lindgren, Temme and Rutten. Nays: None. Motion carried.





Michelle Olson, BCDA, Inc. Executive Director, appeared before the Board regarding the Membership Agreement and Disbursement Agreement for fiscal year 2022-2023. Olson noted that the agreements have combined into one agreement as well as changing the commitment from one fiscal year to two fiscal years. The County of Boone, Nebraska financial contribution to BCDA, Inc. for the two fiscal years would be \$131,153.60 which is an increase from last year's contribution of \$117,000.00. The total BCDA, Inc. budget request is \$164,942.00. Motion made by Rutten, second by Lindgren to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the Membership Agreement and Disbursement for fiscal years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 committing a sum of \$131,153.60 for each of those fiscal years payable to BCDA, Inc. from the County Inheritance Tax Fund as presented. Agenda Item 5 was not acted on due to the agreements being combined into one.

Rick Martinsen, Mueller & Honcik PC, was onsite on August 16, 2022 to do real time changes to the budget to comply with the August 15 request to raise the requested tax levy rate to 0.18. The proposed budget was presented to the Board for review. Martinsen was not present for the hearing. He had stated on August 16 that after the changes, the budget worked with the lid computation and left the county with some unused authority. The County's total tax request is over the allowable growth, so the County will be participating in the Joint Public Hearing on September 26, 2022 at 6:00 PM. With the increase of BCDA's budget request a change will need to be made to the Inheritance Tax Fund, but it will not change the overall fund balance. Motion made by Lindgren, second by Temme to accept and approve the proposed 2022-2023 County Budget with the understanding a change will be made in the Inheritance Tax Fund. If there wasn't a way to water the freshly planted trees, then he wouldn't go forward with the planting.
